

RADIO NEDERLAND'S MADAGASCAR RELAY-STATION

The relay-station consists mainly of two centres located some 6 miles apart. The administrative section (where programs are prepared for broadcasting) of the station is six miles northeast of Tananarive. While its transmitter site is six more miles further north and equipped with two digital controlled Philips 300 kw shortwave transmitters. The units will be used as much as possible to broadcast two programs parallel during 18 hrs. per day.

The antenna-section consists of 13 antennas, eleven of which are threeband-antennas and suitable to transmit in 3 adjacent sw bands. These antennas are composed of selfsupporting masts between which an array of horizontal dipoles have been erected. Depending on the main directions of radiation required, a grounded reflector network or a second dipole array has been built behind this first network. The height of such a short-wave antenna depends on the wave length used. For the lower frequency-bands, antennas of about 330 feet high have been built in Madagascar. In order to further increase the efficiency of the antennas, a system is used whereby the main direction of radiation can be varied over an azimuth of 15 degrees to the left or to the right of the nominal direction. This continuous horizontal beam slewing is one of the latest technical refinements in antenna-techniques. This antenna-site has been designed and developed by Brown Boveri.

To maintain the new Madagascar relay-station, nine European families will be posted in the country, for whom special bungalows were built in the northern suburbs of Tananarive. Further some 25 Malagasy personnel have been trained for operation jobs and guarding activities, some of whom have spent one year in the Netherlands for their training.

This particular relay-station will be used to serve the countries of Africa, Australia, Indonesia, and South Asia. Building is nearing its completion and full operation is expected by May 1972. However, test transmissions may begin sometime between November '71 and February '72, for a limited period per day, between 1230 and 2130 GMT. Later, broadcasting-time will be increased up to 0200 GMT, while the Sunday-transmissions will begin somewhat earlier, namely at 0800 GMT.

Radio Nederland...via John Banta

RNE'S NEW VOICE - NOBLEJAS, SPAIN Gregg A. Calkin

Radio Nacional de Espana has recently commenced transmissions from a new transmitting site at Noblejas, hear Aranjuez, some 58 km south of Madrid. An area of 144 hectares, which is largely flat and at an altitude of 750 m, had been selected for the site and equipped with a network of curtain aerial arrays operating in all SWBC bands. Twenty-five metal masts with heights ranging from 46-112 meters support twenty-two aerials, enabling the transmissions to be basmed in any of the target principal bearings (230, 260 and 290° in either direction) with the possibility of deviating the beam by $\pm 12°$ if required.

The station has six 350-kW transmitters, each of which may be feel to any appiel by

means of a switching grid; two transmitters may feed the same aerial, thus giving a power of 700 kW on the required frequency. A central building houses the transmitters, the coaxial switching installation and two dummy aerials; space has been left for the installation of two additional transmitters of the same power. The station is supervised from a control room which dominates the transmitter hall, and which is equipped with frequency synthesisers and electronic memories. From a large control desk illuminated diagrams display the arrangement of intercommections between transmitters and aerials at all times.

The programmes are monitored in a subicle above the control room. They are sent from the Radio Nacional de Espana studios in Madrid by means of a 7-GHz radio-relay link and are distributed to the various transmitters as required. The volume of these signals is monitored by pen and magnetic recorders with a view to later analyses and verifications.

The transmitting station is supplied with electrical power by two 46-kV lines and a 7.5-MW substation. A second transformer unit supplies low-voltage loads; the connections and protective arrangements are operated by a remotecontrol system. The residential accommodation, adjacent to the transmitter building, includes test-recens, a kitchen, and a dining room for the use of the technicians.

The Noblejas transmitting station is backed by a consortium of Spanish and foreign companies, under the direction of the Technical Department of the Broadcasting Authority, and will be used primarily for transmissions to Central and South America although other programme transmissions directed at Central and Eastern Europe are also envisaged.

KGEI - LA VOZ DE LA AMISTAD Edward J, Insingér

Radio Station KGEI, "The Voice of Friendship," has its shortwave facilities located in Belmont, California for the purpose of broadcasting to Mexico, Central and South America. Programs are broadcast in Spanish, Portuguese and English; being sent out via a 50,000 watt GE HF transmitter and a 250,000 watt custom-built HF transmitter, offering frequency capabilities between 6 and 21 MHZ. It is interesting to note that KGEI delivers up to 5,000 micro volts/m to most areas during optimum propagation periods.

KGEI operates from 2230 to 0500 GMT on 15.280, 11.955, 9.695, and 9.670 MHz. Their programming is defined in purpose as "to be a window through which listeners see Jesus Christ." Actual program elements include education, culture, information and spiritual, which are capable of being picked up by some 55 million shortwave sets. KGEI listeners that write to the station in greatest numbers come from Mexico, Argontina, Brazil, Colombia, and Guatemala, of which 80 per cent are under 30 years of age.

ODDS AND ENDS 1971

<u>Ralph Perry</u> notes that there are avid stamp collectors working at Radio Mogadishu. With his QSL came the note "...Since we have several stamp collectors at the Radio, could you please send us .. any US commemorative stamps in order to distribute them to our staff members. Thanks a lot." Now is OUR turn to do a beasting station a good turn!

UPI reports in the <u>Columbus Dispatch</u> that the Swan Islands were given to Hondurad in November - good by Radio Americas! Also noted was a report that RNI broke loose from its moorings and drifted toward the Dutch coast in a severe winter storm. It was towed back to its proper location and continued broedcasting.

"This is Austria calling. The Shortwave Service of the Austrian Radio ..." is the call which reaches hundreds of thousands of shortwave receivers around the world each day. Known officially as the Oesterreichischer Rundfunk, this broadcasting organization was a pioneer in radio, beginning transmissions in 1926 on 49.4 meters (approximately 6070 kilohertz) with 300 watts from the Vienna-Rosenhuegal Station.

During the period 1928-1937, the ORF broadcast the "National Service" from a mobile transmitter. Programming consisted of news bulletins, music, reports and commentaries for one hour four times a week. The Second World War interrupted the progress of broadcasting in Austria, as the facility was controlled by the German Nazi Ministry of Propaganda. Following the end of the War, various Allied stations operated within the country, among them a revitalized "Austrian Radio" Four 400 Watt shortwave transmitters were utilized in the 49, 41, 31, and 25 meter bands for Europe.

February 1955 brought a series of specific broadcasts in English and French for foreign listeners (previous language programs had not been designed with this specific purpose in mind). In May of the same year, broadcasts from the transmitters at Kronsterf and Bisamberg (4000 and 300 watts respectively) enabled European listeners to hear coverage at the signing of the Austrian State Treaty. The eleven year sunspot cycle provided a fine opportunity for the station to cover the Americas and in 1956, the Fleckendorf Station was leased from the Austrian PTT. This 20,000 watt outlet operated on 25615 and 25945 kilohertz.

The beginning of the new decade saw the development of two new transmitter sites. Moosbrunn began operation with one 50 kilowatt transmitter and five 200/300 watt transmitters. Aldrans carried the Home Service program on its 200 watt transmitter on 6000 kilohertz. In addition, new omni-directional aerials carried the Medium Wave program (relayed by Moosbrunn) to Europe and the Middle East. During the spring of 1961, additional advances were carried out. The Short Wave Service began its own program production and received special studios for this purpose. The Kennedy-Khruschev Meeting in June provided the opportunity for the first live reports (in German, English, French, and Russian). Provisional directional rhombic aerials were placed in operation at Moosbrunn directed to North America, South America, South Africa, India/Indonesia, Australia/New Zealand, and Japan. Facilities from Radio Austria A.G. at the Deutsche-Altenburg Station were leased to provide a 10 kilowatt transmitter for North American service.


Though in existance for only a year (as a separate program facility), the Shortwave Service programs were widely accepted and shortwave listeners placed the Austrian Radio 17th in a poll of international radio stations, in a special poll conducted in 1962. Certainly a rapid advance in such a short period of time.

1963 saw 20 hours of programming daily with directional overseas broadcasts on Monday, Wednesday, Friday; the other days devoted to radiations to Europe.

In 1964, the Innsbruck transmitter power was increased to 1000 watts. This facility is better known as Aldrans and carries the Home Service on 6000 kilohertz. A photo of the tropical aerial utilized for these non-directional transmissions may be seen on page 4 photograph 2. This aerial emits a signal designed for a service range 0-300 kilometers and there is no dead zone.

A 40th Anniversary Exhibition was held in the Vienna Technical Museum in the autumn of 1964 with a display of objects concerning shortwave broadcasting. The continual development of the ORF led to a total of 56 hours omni-directional and 101 hours directional for overseas transmissions per week by 1965. At that time, five sites broadcast ORF programs: Moosbrunn, Fleckendorf, Deutsch-Altenburg, Kronstorf, and Innsbruck (Aldrans).

On May 1, 1966, construction of the first part of the permanent building at the

Moosbrunn Transmitting Center. Two 100 Kilowatt Telefunken transmitters were placed into operation. During 1966, output increased in total hours per week to the following: 119 hours omni-directional for Europe, 147 hours directional transmissions for overseas areas. All transmissions became daily and the program alternating, begun in 1963, ended. New reversible rhombic aerials made coverage of the Middle East and Central America possible.

A tremendous program of expansion was proposed and adopted by the Austrian Government in 1966. The law was effective in 1967 and stated:

Rundfunkgesetz (Broadcasting Law), 3.(1) Furthermore, by authorization and payment of the Austrian Federal Government the Austrian Radio is obliged to provide an adequate external service on short-wave

After the passage of this law, planning was begun on new and more powerful (250/ 500 kw) transmitters as well as high-gain curtain arrays. The projected total cost of expansion: 232 million A.S.

On the first of March, the third 100 Kilowatt transmitter began operation from Moosbrunn. Weekly overseas broadcasts now totalled 106 hours, compared to 147 in 1966. May 5th...a logarithmically periodic horizontally polarized aerial (turnable) was placed in service for sectional coverage to Northern Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa. The Kronstorf Station was closed on November 5, 1967, while Fleckendorf and Deutsch-Altenburg Stations ended emissions later in the same year. By Christmas of 1967, the 4th 100 kilowatt transmitter was ready for use at Moosbrunn.

Additional transmissions from the logarithmically periodic aerial were carried out in March 1968. These beams were to Europe (directional to North, East, South-East, South, and West) and to parts of North Africa. During the crisis in Czechoslovakia, the four 100 kw transmitters were used simultaneously and special news was re-transmitted from domestic services.


On the 1st of January 1969, the Moosbrunn Transmitting Center began regular operation with all 4 transmitters of 100 Kw. The Shortwave Service had reached the following total of daily transmitted hours: directed to overseas target areas..76 hours Domestic service via Aldrans...19 hours. A size of the listening audience can be gained from the number of reports received. During the period D(1965), that is, from November 3, 1968, to March 2, 1969, <u>8088</u> shortwave listener reports were received from 72 countries.

The program content had an interesting make-up - - on the average, 46% was spoken word, while 54% was musical selections. Continued technical expansion resulted in service to East Africa via the logarithmically periodic aerial. The requests of the DX "community" were met in 1969 with the beginning of the German DX-program every second Sunday at 1930 GMT (since expanded). The number of reception reports increased to 10,384 during the period of (1969), May 4, 1969, to September 7, 1969.

The logarithmically periodic antenna at the Moosbrunn Transmitting Center can be seen on page 4 photograph 1. In addition, the inside of one of the 100 Kilowatt transmitters can be seen in photograph 3 on the same page. A High Frequency Technician is checking the equipment in photograph 4.

in 1970, broadcasts of the DX Program began on a weekly bacis (sach Sunday at 1100 and 2110 GMT). "Report From Austria" in German, English, French, and Spanish was broadcast five times per day (each language). Finally in 1970, the beginning and ending of all transmissions were only on the even hours GMT (with the exception of 2300 GMT).

The Technical Department of the Austrian Radio is always quite interested in

reception reports from listeners within the target area. For the past several years, transmissions to North America have been aired on 9770 and 6155 khz. and the station is always interested in observations dealing with these channels. Correct reception reports are verified with verification cards picturing scenes in Austria. This advance came after several years of using the same format card.

Developments in 1971 include the adoption of the Austrian Radio's new Information Statute, which came into force on July 1, 1971. This law obliges the Austrian Radio to provide the general public with objective information in the form of news bulletins, reports, commentaries and statements, and official comments and objective criticism. The general welfare of the Austrian people must be maintained and the image of the country must be preserved abroad. This is done in the context of freedom of information and opinion, which is a constitutional guarantee. A listener to the ORF will discover that the current programming is admirably achieving these standards. A recent schedule shows the following program highlights (English broadcasts only)....a talk on the Austrian economy, Report from Austria, an Austrian musical trip, classical music, contemporary musical selections, folk music, and more. The Salzburg Festival of international fame was well covered this past summer in a series of programs.

The programming personnal constantly seek improvement and welcome comments from listeners. Photograph 3 on page 6 pictures the staff of the Shortwave English Section. They are: David Hermges (spectacles), Editor, and Deputy Editor David Wilde....with (left to right) assistants Ann Bowers, Olga Hardy, and Elizabeth Blane.

Also pictured on page 6...photograph 1 - a control panel for the High Frequency transmitters at Moosbrunn and (2) the view approaching the Moosbrunn site.

I wish to express my thanks to the Austrian Radio for their most kind assistance in making this article possible. Special appreciation is extended to the Technical Department for providing the photographs as well as information concerning the more technical side of broadcasting aspects for this article.

MALAWAI BROADCASTING CORPORATION

Broadcasting in East and Central Africa has developed over many years. At the time of the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland, the countries now known as Malawi, Rhodesia, and Zambia, were served by the Federal Broadcasting Corporation based in Salisbury.

When the Federation was dismantled in 1963, it immediately became necessary to set about the creation of separate organisations to serve the needs of the three new units. In Malawai, the problem was particularly acute as the only basis on which to build was the small studio center at Blantyre. From an early strength of one small studio and a few dedicated broadcasters (most of whom are still with the Malawi Broadcasting Corporation) the service has grown steadily.

Radio Malawi was officially founded at the end of 1963 and established as the Malawi Broadcasting Corporation by the Act of Parliament later in 1964. Once the service had been established, and the voice of Malawi began to grow and be recognized, the main priority became to ensure that the programs should reach the great mass of the people. To reach the goal, the following transmitter development was accomplished... (details of the medium wave changes deleted)

The station is proud of its West German 100 Kilowatt transmitter which was formally opened by His Excellency, the President, Ngwazi Dr. H. Kamuzu Banda on July 3rd, 1970.

The orginial studio at Blantyre were supplemented by facilities at Lilongwe, Zomba, Chileka Airport, Karonga, Mzimba, and Fort Johnston.

Output of the MBC has increased over the years - from 56 hours per week to 127 hours per week in 1969. Special broadcasts which have taken place over the years include ... the visit of Emperor Haile Selaisse in 1965, the Celebrations marking the declaration of the Republic of Malawai in 1966, and in 1968 the first two-way broadcasts from Europe.

The station has declared,"The technical coverage of the country by transmitter and studio networks will all help too in one of the great challenges facing us as broadcasters. The standardisation of language is an undertaking in which the broadcasting organisation is ideally qualified to play a leading role. The challenge to M.B.C. is to fight for the true standard for Chichewa and the broadcasters of Malawi are fully aware of the privilege they have to be among the standard bearers in this battle."

<u>PERU</u> The 11 November 1971 issue of the New York Times indicated that the military government of Peru has "placed all television and radio stations under effective state control by decree today." The new law is said to be "the most sweeping formal state intervention in broadcasting in Latin America outside Cuba."

"Under the new law, the state is to 'acquire at least 51% of the shares in all television stations, and 25% of the interest in radio outlets'."

Specific changes include a reduction in the use of foreign programs, a reduction in commercials ("'We find that 37% of broadcasting time is given over to commercials. This will be sharply changed in the next two or three years.'"), <u>de-urbanization</u> of stations (could change the DX pattern there), and the prohibition of foreigners from participation in this new set-up. (New York Times via Larry Magne, Bill Berghammer)

At one time, these days offered the only possibilities for logging most of the Angolan stations, and many other Africans, and Latin American stations. In recent years, many of the Africans have extended their normal schedules, providing good chances for hearing the stations at other times of the year.

General feeling now is that Christmas Eve might produce some good DX from East Africa, in afternoon (EST). There may also be some Latin American stations operating late, after many of the stations which normally prevent reception have signed off. Another country which might provide improved reception by late operation is Cape Verde Islands. And, of course, Turks Island Radio, mentioned above. (DF)
