

RADIO 5

> "GOOD VIBES FROM RADIO 5" by Pitt McNeil, Washington DC

To understand the raison d'etre for Radio 5's existence, there is a need to give a partial history of commercial radio in South Africa.

The story starts out in the unlikely place of Portuguese East Africa in 1935. That was the year Lourenco Marques Radio, the commercial service of Radio Clube de Moçambique, first came on the air, beaming primarily to the Union of South Africa. Although LM Radio's commercial activities were somewhat curtailed by World War II, things really started moving in 1947, when Davenport & Meyer Ltd., a Jchannesburg-based company, took over the station's programming policy and the sale of advertising time, at the request of the sole concessionare to the Radio Clube, one G. J. McHarry.

During the following two decades, LM Radio succeeded in becoming not only a commercially successful enterprise, but also in making its announcers into household names throughout southern Africa. A list of past LM announcers sounds like a "Who's Who" of South African broadcasting. The likes of Eric Cordell, Eric Egan, David Davis, and Clark McKay are but a few of the "extremely well-known" personalities who have added sparkle to LM Radio programs over the years.

Between 1947 and 1967, the LM Radio format consisted of music for all tastes, comedy shows, and dramas - in fact a mixed bag designed to attract as wide an audience as possible. But in the face of increasing competition from Springbok Radio, and several RSA FM stations, a decision was made to alter the program policy in order to attract a main target audience of young people between the ages 16 and 24. This new policy meant that in 1968 the station began its "Top 40" format, involving continuous pop music with a minimum of talk, for 24 hours a day, seven days a week. A major reason for the change to Top 40 was to combat the threat of television taking over radio audiences. The new format was highly successful too, and the station's audience profile changed accordingly, with over 75% of its audiences falling within the 16-24 "young adult" bracket. With market, the economic viability of LM Radio was assured.

In June, 1972, the SABC took over the responsibilities of the sole concessionaire. The station was then headed by Roland L. Boshoff in Johannesburg, with a staff including the manager, organiser, sales and administration working with him. The LM based staff included Gerry Wilmot (station manager), Evelyn Martin, Harold West, and Frank Saunders.

During 1973, the station introduced two new 120 kW transmitters, on 41 metres daytimes, and 90 m at night. The introduction of these two powerful transmitters augmented the alread; formidable battery of equipment operating on the 25, 39, 49, and 60 metre bands on shortwave as well as LM Radio's high quality MW transmitter.

The next major step for LM Radio was on 1 January 1975 when LM Radio's shortwave transmissions were relayed by SABC MW stations in six South African cities, giving their listeners daytime MW reception for the first time.

In late 1975, Mozambique was granted independence from Portugal. Soon afterwards, the SABC was informed that the facilities of the Radio Clube de Moçambique would be mationalized by the new government.

Concious of the tremendous popularity of LM Radio, the SABC made advance plans to continue the Top 40 contemporary music format. At 5 a.m. on 13 October 1975, over the MW stations in South Africa that formerly relayed LM Radio, a new mational network was born: Radio 5. Radio 5, so named as the fifth commercial radio network of the SABC, "but retaining the best of LM Radio and moving on to greater listener acceptance as a new sound from the SABC." as Radio 5 promos said, was thus started.

It was always realized that with the existing MW transmitters, many listeners could only hear Radio 5 with sub-standard night time signals. Accordingly, on 1 August 1977, a 100 kW SW transmitter was brought into service, operating on the 49 metre band daytimes and on the 90 metre band at night.

"With these improved facilities and aggressive programming, including the coverage and participation of Radio 5 in motor rallying with the famous Radio 5 Ford Escorts, it will be seen that Radio 5 has more than held its own against television and will continue to do so in the years ahead," according to Pietie Lotriet at Radio 5.

Radio 5 now features LM Radio DJs along with SABC announcers, including John Berks, John Novik, Harold West, Steve Katz, and SABC's own "Forces Sweetheart" Marie van Zyl.

From 6 November 1977, the schedule for "Good Vibes from Radio 5", as the station slogan goes, is as follows: 3320 kHz at 0300-0530 and 1530-2200; and 7170 kHz at 0530-1530 GMT. NASWA DX AWARDS NOTES

THE NIGERIAN AWARDS: These are two awards that I'm working on at present, and have ^a found them to be quite easy to get, but this ease is due, I'm sure, to the frequency of times that the Nigerians are audible here. On any given day there are usually three or four and on a good day four or five Nigerians may be heard from almost anywhere in the U.S. and Canada.

My log shows that the first week of May 1977 was an excellent week for reception from west Africa, particularly from Nigeria. I took details for as many of these stations as possible and sent off my reception reports. When I was through, I had sent out eight reports. Of those, six verified, giving me a total of seven Nigerians QSL'd. I then waited for another opening to complete the set, and it paid off, as the second week of December opened 90 m to the same area. Unfortunately, there are only tow NBC stations on 90 m, but I got the elusive Kaduna, which is on 3396. Also noted, up on 6090, was the independent RTV Kaduna.

For the Senior Nigerian DXer Award you need one station in each of the 4 Nigerian regions plus the Federal District of Lagos. For the Master Nigerian DXer Award, you need verification of 9 or more transmitter sites in Nigeria.

DXER DE PACIFICA: This might seem like a tough one for the ECNA DXer, but it can be done. First off, you need 10 verified radio countries from the Pacific, as listed in the NASWA country list. There ore, for openers, the big four, Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii (WWVH), and now Guam. All these are easy to log and verify for an English report. Next come the two French speakers, Tahiti and New Caledonia, who QSL for a French report and a couple of IRCs. Then we have only four to go. The best bets to fill out the set are the stations in Papua/New Guinea. Port Moresby, 4890, is widely heard and friendly to QSL hunters. The rest are not too easy to hear, but are also good verifiers, with one exception - Radio Manus. It seems that they just don't like to answer the mail there. I have been trying to get a QSL for about eighteen months, but no luck so far.

There are, of course, others to try and some may be easier for you to hear, but these worked for me.

Radio Moscow

SOMETHING DIFFERENT FROM THE U.S.S.R.

On the evening of December 31, 1977 (U.S. time), Radio Moscow's North American service was on the air as usual. But Radio Moscow's programming that evening was an incredible departure from the normal fare offered by that station.

The 2230 transmission began, typically, with the news. However, the remainder of the half-hour segment was a special program entitled "New Year's in Moscow." The program dealt mostly with the holiday activities of college students in the Soviet capital. Most of the show was conducted in a manner more akin to Laugh-In than to the usual Radio Moscow format.

Early in the special, Moscow yocked it up with some jokes likely to be told by Soviet young people during the New Year's festivities. A mixture of music and laughter accompanied:

A: "I don't know what to get my husband for New Year's."
B: "Get him a book, that's always a good idea."
A: "But he already has a book!"
A: "I don't know what to get my wife for New Year's."
B: "Ask her what she wants."
A: "I don't have that kind of money."
A: "My wife has the worst memory!"
B: "Forgets everything?"

A: "No, remembers everything!"

Radio Moscow, safely assuming that its listeners' sides were not completely split by those gags, vollied some more people's humor across the Atlantic, this time a portrayal of what might happen during the oral exams of Soviet college students (of course, more music and laughter in the intervals):

A: "What's the difference between an active verb and a passive verb?"

B: "An active verb shows action, and a passive verb shows. . . passion?"

A: "What's a synonym?"

B: "It's a word you use in place of a word you can't spell."

A: "Do you think Shakespeare'd be so famous if he were alive today?"

B: "Of course, he'd be 413 years old!"

The December 31 installment of Moscow Mailbag was also atypical. Anabel Bukar began: "Here's Joe Adimov, but he's not going to answer all of your questions." Instead, Joe answered only two questions asking about the Radio Moscow North American Service announcers. He conducted informal interviews with his studio comrades and provided us with the following revelations (the spelling of names below is no doubt thoroughly botched):

Dmitri Linich is tall, dark, handsome with bushy sideburns that cover his cheeks. He is the North American Service's youngest announcer at age 26. He plays the guitar semi-professionally with a group called Zodiac, which performs mostly at colleges and universities. Linich describes the group's music as "chamber rock...a mixture of soft rock and traditional folk-style music like Bob Dylan's stuff, with a good bit of bluegrass mixed into it." A brief recording of his group's music followed.

Next, Joe Adimov spoke with Boris Neskevitch, whom he described as "tall, broadshouldered, blushes easily, has a terrific sense of humor -- by which I mean he laughs at my jokes -- is a great fisherman, and tinkers with radios. In 1977, he moved into a new apartment and got a pay rise (sic). "I'm a confirmed bachelor" said Boris, "We have these in the Soviet Union, too, you know." Nevertheless, Boris is not indifferent to the "fairer sex." As a keen radio amateur, he pins his hopes on the on the "many beautiful female IX voices on the air in the amateur wavebands -- so the rest should be very simple." (What is the "rest" to which Boris refers?)

Joe then spoke to the female announcers. Lucy Brownunov was presented with a new grandhaughter during the year. Joe opted not to ask her age. Lucy's plans were to spend New Year's Eve in the country with in-laws. Anabel Bukar, who reads the questions on Moscow Mailbag, was "indisposed" during part of 1977 (isn't that the same thing Breshnev had?) but is well now and wishes her friends across the ocean a happy new year.

Joe Adimov then describes himself: "I'm 57, stocky, I weigh 230 pounds, and whenever I go in front of a camera, they always use a wide-angle lens." Joe said he likes the suggestion of listener Brian Barry that the announcers identify thenselves when reading the news -- said Joe, "This will go down in the history of Radio Moscow as the 'Barry Amendment'." (The amendment has yet to be enacted, because my listening on January 2 revealed no such giving of names at the beginning of the Moscow newscasts. Maybe the amendment has to be approved by various committees, councils, bureaus -- gosh, it could take months, years.)

Anabel Bukar herself had some questions for Joe Adimov. She asked what his most interesting experience of 1977 was. He replied that it was in England, while he was visiting Buckingham Palace. He was looking at two black lion statues and notices a hammer in the hand of one and a sickle in the hand of the other. "Hey, a hammer and sickle! What is this?" Chuckles from the others in the studio.

Then came the high point of the evening. In response to another question from Bukar, Joe said his favorite song was a catchy tune by a Latvian composer entitled "Follow Me." The Radio Moscow North American Service staff announcers gathered to sing an English translation of the song, with Eugena Stepanova of the letters department playing the piano (yes, it really happened). "We certainly are no singers," apologized Joe, "We're all a bunch of grunters." They grunted, not badly, the tune, with Mrs. Stepanova playing very well. (Poor reception did not allow me to comprehend the lyrics.)

After this gala performance, Mrs. Stepanova stepped on over to the microphone to wish all those crazies who insist on having "via Ashkabad," etc., written on their QSL cards (she didn't say that, but I'm sure she was thinking it) a happy new year, and to students, "good marks." Following this were some boring interviews with various Radio Moscow editors. Finally, Joe Adimov wished everyone the best for 1978 and closed by saying, "I'm going to give Anabel Bukar a big hug!" "Woocooo!" went Anabel.

Nice to know, after all these years, that the North American staff is human.



Grounds

GROUND SYSTEMS


A good ground system is very essential to good DX results. The ground improves antenna efficiency, receiver stability, and also helps to cut out man made noise such as power lines, passing cars, and household appliances. The basic 6 foot copper rod is ok, but it can be improved upon. One way is to dig a hole about 2 feet acroses and 3 or 4 feet deep around the ground rod. Fill the hole with rock salt and cover with dirt. Then douse the whole thing with water. The salt water then seeps through the dirt and improves conductivity. Just don't expect anything to grow in the vicinity of the rod.




There is another variation of this design. Instead of packing rock salt in the hole, you may use charcoal. The charcoal absorbs water and improves conductivity. This method is used by some professional firms.

A ground system used by some hams is to have a center ground rod and from this extend 8 to 12 radials, 6 feet long, which are connected to smaller ground rods and driven into the ground.

Center Rod



A ground system used by some electricians on construction sites and for lightening arrestor systems is to bury a thick copper braid in a trench. You cam bury this in the garden or elsewhere and attach a lead wire. It should be about 2 feet deep, at least, and it should be kept moist for best results. Therefore, if it is in the garden or under the lawn where you normally water anyway, you will have an advantage.



Large pieces of metal may be used for grounds. Things like engine blocks, metal bed frames, and other such items may be burried in the ground. Chemicals and acids may be experimented with to improve ground rod conductivity. Just don't pollute your environment too much.

GRP Award

THE 50 KW QRP AWARD

About a year ago I wrote an article on how to acquire this award, using mostly English as the language to listen for and use in the reception report. Several factors have made that article outdated, so I now present some tips on how to earn this award now, in early 1978.

Basically, the award is an accumulation of power totals, comprising one station from each of the six continents, for a total power of no more than 50 kW.

Perhaps the easient continent to hear and verify on a low power is Oceania. The best bet, for the lowest power and a full data QSL, within a reasonable time is Radio New Zealand. RNZ is easily heard over all of North America, despite their output of only 7.5 kW. Check Log Report, Listeners Notebook, and the WRTH for schedules, and frequencies.

Asia is covered with low-powered transmitters. For those on the west coast, Indonesia may be the best place to snag a 5 or 10 kW station, though Brunei, Malaysia, and other areas all have stations with 10 or less kW output. For those on the east coast, an Indonesian is almost the only way to get 10 kW without too much difficulty. For those who don't like to get up early, there are the Turkish stations operating around 49 and 41 metres. The Meteorological station on 6900 is sometimes heard around their sign-on, and they will verify easily, provided that return postage is sent.

Africa is next, and there are two countries that can be heard in English, will QSL, and operate on a low enough power for our use. Ghana is one, and their 10 kW transmitter on 4915 is often heard all over North America. You might also try Nigeria. The stations at Lagos are all too powerful, but the regionals all employ 10 kW output. One of the more often heard is Enugu on 6025. A QSL for this one also counts as another NASWA country, due to its location in what was once Biafra.

So far we have 27.5 kW, and three more continents to go. Let's look at South America next. There are many 1 kW broadcasters in SA, and you should have no trouble hearing at least one or two. One of the easier ones to verify is Radio Occidente on 3225 in the 90 mb. If you report in Spanish, you will very likely get a QSL in two months. (What? You say you don't know Spanish? Write to NASWA HQ, send a business SASE and ask for a Spanish report form, or all three forms, for that matter. A good report form is essential unless you are fluent in the language.)

Moving on to North America, it is possible to get away with 1 kW here, also. If you live where the reception of those low powered Canadians is possible, try them! The most powerful one is CFRX in Toronto with 1 kW. You might get one even lower. Especially for you on ECNA, try for CKZN, 6160, in St. Johns, Newfoundland. This would count as a another NASWA country, and also has a power of only 300 watts.

The total is now at a maximum of 29.5 kW, leaving just over 20 kW left for Europe. Unlike other continents, however, there are relatively few low power broadcasters. In Germany, however, there are two stations that use 20 kW transmitters. Of these, Süddeutsher Runfunk and Südwestfunk, the latter is easier to hear. 7265 kHz is the place to look, and if propagation is good and the AROs are off the frequency, they will be in after 2000 GMT. Or try around 0400. Send an IRC with your report.

Tape Your DX

THE TAPE RECORDER AS A TOOL FOR THE DXER

Many a DXer has probably waited patiently for an ID from a weak station on a crowded frequency, only to find that because of a momentary distraction, or lack of comprehension, the ID is missed or cannot be understood. Another frustrating wait is in store, which severely limits the time available for logging rare DX on other frequencies.

But this need not happen too often, if you are fortunate enough to have a tape recorder patched into your receiver. The tape recorder will give you another chance to hear again the ID you just missed. It is often possible to replay your tape of that weak, noise ridden signal a few times, until the faint ID is suddenly understood.

If your recorder is equipped with a digital counter, it is possible to locate the exact part of the tape you might want to replay. A whole night's tuning can be recorded with the only limiting factor being the amount of tape you have available. A notebook is necessary for jotting down certain details such as the tape counter reading to permit quick reference at a later time. In addition, the frequency and time of the mystery ID, along with any other useful items, will provide excellent clues as to the station's identity. Adequate care in this record keeping will save yourself endless hours of replaying tapes in search of a few critical segments with station IDs on them. However, if your recorder does not have a digital tape counter or you simply do not want to tie up large amounts of tapes, an effort can be made to record only the critical portions of the station's transmission. These critical portions would encompass items such as IDs, jingles, commercials, time checks, and other clues which would lead to either a confirmed or tentative logging. As experience is gained by the DXer, certain similarities are noticed in station formats.

Eventually, a sense of timing is acquired as to when a station can reasonably be expected to identify itself. Just about every international SW broadcaster identifies itself during sign on. Most stations will do it on the hour or every half hour. Sometimes IDs will be heard at the beginning or end of commentaries & news bulletins, between musical selections, or during a series of commercials. Last but not least, there is the sign off announcement which usually is a fine source for IDs.

As soon as you sense an identification is about to come in, it is very important to activate your recorder immediately. An opportunity to replay the ID several times, usually comes right after it has been recorded. While the tape is being replayed, the station would meanwhile be in the midst of a program or selection of music. If the tape is not suitable quality, it is possible to go back to the radio and make another attempt to get a better recording. The music or the program would likely be close to ending and a station ID would soon be coming up.

Depending on personal interests, there are other ways in which a tape recorder can add to the enjoyment of the DX-SWL hobby. Many interesting programs, historic news bulletins, documentaries, and unusual music can be preserved for future use at the listeners convenience. As a tool for identifying rare DX, it is almost unsurpassed. In any event, a tape recorder is a worthwhile investment for any DXer to consider when setting up a monitoring post.

DX Aids

SIX AIDS TO HELP YOU BETTER ID THE SLIPPERY ONES by Edward Shaw, Lexington, KY

Is there just chance involved with logging those weak and faraway catches? Or, is there someway to increase the likelihood of success? The answer is YES, you can increase your chances by understanding more about how signals come to you.

THE DESIRABLE WEAKIES always seem to lie in some part of the world where no DXer can rout them out. Quite a few of them are in the tropical zones around the globe. Most of these stations are regional in nature, meaning that power is likely to be low . . under 5 kW and perhaps only a few hundred watts. Antenna designs used by those stations are likely to be simple compared to the sophisticated arrays used by the international broad-casters. Thus, the power you might receive from an inefficient antenna system could be drowned in atmospheric noise.

ANTENNA NOISE includes a number of things, but most of us are willing to acknowledge the biggest headache is static from atmospheric phenomena. In reality, such noise is not really phenomenal. It is all caused by thunderstorms throughout the surface of our globe. The noisier conditions seem, the more thunderstorms likely to be between you and the transmitter locale. In addition, there are other noises from cosmic sources which add to the bombardment of our ionosphere. Local interference from powerlines, TV radiations, diathermy sources, etc., also contribute to our headaches.

SKIP DISTANCES are important to understand. Depending on the frequency of the station heard, the skip distances of their signal may or may not hit near your listening location. If most of their signal is being reflected off the ionosphere over your head, you aren't going to hear much of them. A signal transmitted from a radio station travels out in a straight line. If it hits the ionosphere directly straight up, it will punch through and be lost in space. If the signal is reflected too flatly off the underside of the ionosphere, the signal will pass on over the horizon in a straight line, again missing the target. There is an "ideal" distance at which point the signal can be reflected properly. This distance varies according to frequency. Some frequencies require only one reflection off the ionosphere to hit down on your radio-listening area. Others may require several up and down reflections off ionosphere and ground to reach your area. But, remember . your area may often be "down" when the signal is "up". Radio Nederland's propagation course gives excellent information to those interested in determining what those

DARKNESS PATTERNS figure critically into the scheme of logging distant stations. Experience soon illustrates to the serious hobbyist that certain bands are heard only during certain times of day. Though it is only a general rule of thumb, one might consider that frequencies of 10 MHz and below are available at night and periods of dusk and dawn. Conversely, those frequencies of 10 MHz and higher are available during daylight hours. There are always exceptions to the rule. Obviously, everyone has heard such powerful broadcasts as Tahiti on 19 metres throughout the night, but consider that their signal originated in a daylight zone. Low frequencies especially can be narrowed down as to origination point with some degree of accuracy just by knowing a bit about propagation and darkness paths. The most striking example is the 60 metre band. In late daylight afternoon, stations heard on 60 metres are likely to be western Soviets, followed shortly by central and western Africans which begin to shut down by 2300 GMT. Appearing among these by 2200 GMT will be the Spanish-speaking Latins, most of which will be around until 0300, 0400, or 0500 sign-off hours. Some will stay all night. For that matter, some Africans stay all night, like SABC. After the Latins begin to subside, the Pacific Islands begin to fade in around 0800 GMT. Papua New Guinea stations and east Indonesia will appear and then fade away around 1000 GMT only to reappear again about 1100 with sometimes apparent increased strength. I call this the "Henderson Phenomenon" for lack of a better official name in recognition of Dan Henderson who was first (to my knowledge) to observe and report this predictable event. The phenomenon is most apparent on the west coast, easterners having too short of a "window" period to notice it.

KNOW YOUR RECEIVER. The best service one can do for himself is to know the capabilities and limitations of his receiver. Can you distinguish between images, spurs, and true fundamentals? Can you manipulate your receiver to eliminate or attenuate false signals? Can you determine accurate frequency to within one kHz? Professional stations of the major industrial nations will likely be "right-on" frequency - or the frequencies announced. Our Latin neighbors aren't nearly so finicky about this.

ARM YOURSELF WITH CURRENT INFORMATION. Refer to several club bulletins or subscribe to a few quality DX-information sources if you can. Admittedly, it may take a bit of money to keep in with information, but where else can you get it? If you are interested in Asian stations, then one of the excellent Japanese clubs would be a great help: For Europe, perhaps the Danish SWL club would be on interest: Australia is home for several very good clubs concentrating on the Pacific and Indonesia.

LEARN TO IDENTIFY THE LANGUAGES. Nobody says you have to learn how to converse in Urdu, but one can certainly learn to identify the sound and qualities of dozens of languages after a year or two of experience. Tuning regularly to the VoA or BBC foreign services helps tremendously. French and Spanish, German, and Arabic are absolutely essential from the first day. Anybody who cannot identify those separately, immediately without hesitance should surely study very much harder. Soon, Russian, Italian, Portuguese, Dutch, Swedish, and Japanese will come easily. Chinese is easy, too. Before long, you will be able to recognize Urdu from Tahitian.

The foregoing information is nothing new to hordes of DXers who have come and gone before you, but they are steps logically taken to aid in the positive identification of stations which have escaped you before. Who knows? You may have been hearing them all along, but not realizing it. 73, Ed Shaw.



SELECTIVITY MODIFICATION OF THE DRAKE SSR-1

Drake Co. says that the AM selectivity of this unit is 5.5 kHz plus or minus 25% for 6 dB down. I soon became very annoyed by this but was pleased to see that by the simplest modification imaginable the SSB 3 kHz filter could be used on AM mode without activating the BFO. The 455 kHz filters have connected across them a 30 pF capacitor for SSB operation, and when the mode switch is set for AM an additional 60 pF is added in parallel. Therefore it is only necessary to permanently remove the two 60 pF capacitors from the system. Actually the best procedure is to simply unsolder from the circuit board the blue and blue-white wires leading to C-96. I left the short wires attached to the switch and taped the ends just in case I ever wish to restore the unit to its original condition. The 6 dB bandwidth with this modification is between 3 and 4 kHz and I am able to locate stations adjacent to powerful locals on both shortwave and mediumwave

ZERO-BEATING THE FRG-7 by Mark Westling, 2710 Pinewood Austin, TX 78757

* * * *

A very simple modification allows the user of the FRG-7 to zero-beat a signal. In the FRG-7, the "USB-CW" and "LSB" modes add a beat frequency oscillator signal slightly below or above the carrier in frequency in the third IF stage (IF=455 kHz). To zero-beat the carrier on its correct frequency, the BFO must be tuned exactly to 455 kHz. This isn't hard if you have access to a frequency counter. The maintenance and alignment section of the instruction manual gives information on adjusting the BFO. A tuneable coil, $T_{\rm 406}$, is used to set the USB-CW beat frequency to 457 kHz. It may be possible to tune one of these to 455 kHz, but I took a fancier approach. I inserted a capacitor in series with $TC_{\rm 404}$ which may be bypassed with a switch mounted on the back of the 455 kHz, while the switch will allow you to change back to 453 kHz if you desire.

I tried using several variable capacitors that I had handy, but the minimum capacitance on each of them was too large. My solution was to make my own capacitor. I took two pieces of plastic insulated copper wire and twisted them together until I had a piece a few inches long. I then started snipping off the end until the frequency counter read 455 kHz.

I find this very useful for tuning.



Antenna

UNUSUAL BROADBAND DIPOLE ANTENNA

by Frank Hermann, Kitchener, Ontario

Shown below are plans for a rather unusual broadband dipole antenna that was used some years ago by a university in radar studies. This should be mounted at least 15 feet above ground. The length of the center section is determined by dividing 325 by the desired frequency in MHz (example: for 10 MHz the center section would total 32.5 feet) and the total length is 460 divided by frequency in MHz. Construction is recommended of 7 x 22 pure copper wire or copperweld. The antenna has small loops at each end which are carefully hooked and soldered. The section for the center insulator where the antenna wire ends and downleads meet is also soldered. Two insulators are recommended at each end. The spacers in the loop section should be of plastic, pexiglass is good. The spreaders should be equal in number and spacing at both ends of the antenna.




Propagation Conditions

Solar activity is picking up. The solar flux reached its highest point since October 1975

on 02 January 1978. Below are two graphs showing the difference in solar flux values between similar periods between September and January 1976-77 and 1977-78.



This diagram illustrates the general increase in the level of solar activity in the past year and the fact that monthly peaks are becoming more pronounced.

The forecast is that activity should be low until 22 January when the level should increase. The next flux peak would be near 29 January. Geomagnetic activity should be quiet until the 30 January to 06 February period. Flare induced disturbances are possible after 27 January. 73 till next month. Keep the material coming. -Jerry A. Lineback

These monitors have straight demodulation, and the FM warble cannot be detected on them, since there is no local oscillator to beat against, but it does show up on typical consumer IF superhet receivers. There was a less than 1% chance that FM would develop in the signal. All eight synthesizers WYFR has for the six transmitters had their FM-null adjustment set by the manufacturer; and this problem was just a fluke (Arthur Thompson, WYFR) Glad to set the record straight. It seems FCC is to blame for not requiring monitoring on standard superhet receivers! (gh)

<u>AFRTS-Washington almost died as a SW station</u>. On 8/12, AFRTS overseas stations were advised that SW would be discontinued as of 1/1 at OSOO, because VOA had requested reimbursg ment for use of SW xmtrs, effective 1/10/77, after having provided them at no cost to DOD since 1966. A Review indicated that the vast majority of US Forces overseas do not receive AFRTS-W news via SW, but by superior quality cable and satellite circuits. (via Rita M. Vernetti, Marshall Islands) The impending execution was announced 19/12 at 1835, and further developments were given at this hour on Program Notes, such as on 30/12 that there had been an extension to 17/1/78 at 0500 GMT (Louis Goldstein, MA, Review of International Broadcasting) On 5/1 I learned from an Armed Forces source that the odds were 9:1 that SW would <u>not</u> be closed down after all, due to the large amount of listener protest already received; and this was revealed on my 8/1 RCI DX Digest report, and confirmed on the 15/1. Sure enough, 0500 17/1 came and went, and AFRTS continued as usual thru our closing (contd.) NASWA-FRENDX

Meanwhile, press reports continued to predict a 17/1 closedown (gh) AFRTS-W will be discontinued on SW starting Monday 'because of costs and the increasing use of satellite transmission', a US DOD spokesman said Thursday. Beats me since it wasn't there at 1200 (Perry Ferrell, NJ, TDXN 20/12) Would have to be 4 x 1190 (Phred Heutte, TDXN Ed.) Or 7 x 680! On neither freq can I find any stn listed in the NRC log in a Waynesboro, nor near such a town, checking atlas and PO list 4668 another mystery time signal, hrd often after 0100; open carrier except for SP TC (gh) on the minute in GMT. Ideas? (Pitt McNeil, DC)

2810 SP BC stn at 0307 15/1; all I could catch was an ad mentioning "9 de la mañana". Possible funds: 1405; 936.7; 702.5; 562, none of them very likely (gh)

CLANDESTINE CRANNY In Nicaragua". It calls itself "YNS, R. Sandino, the official voice of the FSIN", (Ed. Note; The Sandinista National Liberation Front) and can be heard in the 41 & 49 metre bands. One of the stn's BCs starts at 0430 acc. to the Prela report which added that news bulletins have referred to guerrilla activities carried out by Sandinista groups in northern Nicaragua close to the Honduran border (BBCMS 12/1) No luck finding this one so far (gh)

<u>R. Abdala</u>, 7085, hrd in TN 25/12 as in Jan IN-10. A week later I was in Puerto Rico, and couldn't hear it. However, when I arrived at San Juan airport, a guy from Agrupación Abdala was handing out handbills discouraging travel to Cuba. He <u>said</u> the xmtr was in Florida and that they hoped to put another one on from Central America, maybe Costa Rica or Guatemala. Gave me this address: Angel Estrada, Publicación Periódica ABDALA, P.O. Box 243, Blizabethport Station, Elizabeth, NJ 07206; reported (gh)

"<u>HJVR</u>", pirate on approx 1620 kHz, hrd 12/1 0600-0700 with excellent sigs; Hal Hayes saying this 'free speech stn' was in NYC. Used the old "WCPR" phone system; people called in from as far as Albany, Philadelphia and central CT. After he went off the air, I called and spoke with him about WJJR (you mean WJVR? gh). He has an elaborate studio including audio synthesizers, accounting for superior audio. Said he was connected with the old WCPR, he is WDDX and WFAT. Mentioned a friend's station, "WOOR" using a portable cassette machine and the stock mike for audio! He seems to be a great guy who is interested in the listeners...

UnID on 1615 kHz with apparently non-stop Greek-Macedonian mx 2355 tune in 25/12 past 0330. Fair to mostly poor reception at SWNS HQ. Similar to a stn which operated from Hamilton Ont area in 1974-5, subsequently written up in Elementary Electronics. But this time modulation somewhat distorted; hrd again 0203 tune in 31/12 (SWNS, Crystal Beach, Ont)

"<u>WSLD - Solitary Radio</u>" hrd Sat 7/1 on <u>4830.6</u> 2040-2140+, playing moldy-oldies; southernaccented DJ in often with IDs, wx (temps 5° warmer than DC), and slogan "bringing you the best in oldies but goodies." Good strength, bad QSB, decent audio. Guess it's in VA (McNeil)

Free Radio Broadcasting Co., on 6213 0932-1034 1/1: pops, golden oldies, accented EG DJ, IDa for FRBC, TCs, freq anmts, addr. in Denmark. Said would stay on to 1200. Fair at first but poor by 1034. All tnx to phone call from Dan Robinson! (Pitt McNeil, TDXN) Congrats! A very rare logging of a 6 MHz-European pirate in NAm! (gh)

A<u>BC England</u> will suspend for 6 months due to 'staff shortages' and for equipment overhaul, but the DX bulletin will still be available, says Euro Music R on 6265 (Keith Devereux, WDXQ)

The "Aida" Station (cf Jan LN-10 unID) Hrd it on 4740 twice, both on rather good African afternoons. 9/12 IS 2026-2033 lost in noise; 23/12 2030 tune in -2036 when suddenly disappeared, when Get this--man in SP or PT reading off in monotone, one-digit numbers. Yep, a numbers stn. Is the March from Aida a patriotic song, anthem? (Richard Stoller, NY) No.

I heard the same stn on 6675.0 3/1 at 2313-2320* just with music over and over; no numbers (Glenn Hauser, PR) Re the 4740 unID in Jan LN-10. Sounds like the stn I heard on 4740v while in England Oct-Nov 1976. The IS was the trumpet fanfare from the Grand March in the Verdi opera "Aida"; the 8 seconds on, 5 seconds off pattern is about right. It is definitely a somewhat amateurish clandestine operation. It may not be audible in Am thru the QRM, but the last note of the IS descends in pitch as if it were recorded from a phonograph and the recorder turned off too soon; in a Slavic lang and heavily jammed, probably by USSR, just as soon as a speaker comes on at 2030. Certainly somewhere in Europe; the signal was strong and clear on my XCR-30 with only the built-in antenna. Strong signal + high powered jamming is puzzling, since you can scarcely hide a hi-power xmtr in WEu for a year without someone finding it; my guess is Albania or Yugoslavia. Hope this info helps and that other NASWA members will be able to ID it (Robert Clark, AZ)

Voice of the Free Sahara pgm in AR & SP, presented by Polisario, transmitted thru R. Algiers facilities, recently traced on 575 kHz 2300-2400. Last IDed on 7/10; the 575 kHz xmtr is in Bechar, a town in western Algeria near the Moroccan border (BBCMS 5/1)

Voice of the People's Front for the Liberation of Eritrea pgm is on Mon/Wed/Sat, while the Voice of the Eritrean Liberation Front, is on Tue/Thu/Fri/Sun, at 1500-1600 via Omdurman, Sudan on 6150/5038, in AR and Tigrigna (BBCMS 5/1)

R. Tanzania cland pgms sked: 0415-0430 Sun Voice of Namibia; Wed PAC=Pan African Congress; Sat ANC Programme, on 15435/6105. 1815-1830 Mon/Wed/Fri ANC Pgm; Tue/Thu/Sun PAC Pgm; 1815-1845 Sat Voice of Namibia; 1830-1845 Sun VON; 1830-1900 Mon-Sat VON; 1845-1900 Sat PAC, Sun ANC; all on 15435/6105 (BBCMS 1/78, per R. Tanzania)

Voice of Cyprus anc'd sked on 755 kHz is 0500-0700, 0900-1200, 1500-1700; site believe in Anamur, Turkey. There is a weekly GK pgm Tue 1615, "Last week in the Greek Cypriot Community" (BECMS 5/1) Neil, TDXN)

Voice of the Communist Party of Turkey, 6200, very good signals 23/12 *0806-0841* (Pitt MS-Voice of Lebanon (Cf Jan LR-C-1) on 6550, La Voix du Liban, fantastic sigs at 1410 with rauc and disco mx; FR ID 1420, AR anmts too; Peking QRM (Geoff Cosier, Vic., DUDXS) VOL heard daily at 1400 in AR, FR, EG (Mike Willis, Australia, 4/1)

Voice of Palestine, Voice of the Palestinian Revolution, believed to be in Lebanon, ops on 1508 (nom. 1520) kHz, in AR 0400-0500, 1400-1500, 1800-1900 (BBCMS 12/77) The 1400 now lasts to 1600. The 0400 & 1800 were announced as 'experimental' (BBCMS 5/1) A Qatar News Agency report 4/1 said Iraq had decided to close down the VOP stn supervised by Abu Nedal, the former dissident of the Fatah organization. QNA, quoting the "Al Arab" newspaper said the VOP pgms would be resumed from Iraq but under the supervision of the PLO. However, a BC from the Iraqi-based VOPVOPR 4/1 emphatically denied the suspension (BBCMS 12/1)

Voice of the People of Burma hrd on 5110 at 1128 banging on a hollow log, wailing. 1130 news (?) in Burmese, best ever 1/1 (Pitt McNeil, DC, TDXN) Since 1/1 the 6304 kHz xmsns have been at 1400-1500; in Dec it was at 1030-1130. Timing varies month to month, but no pattern has so far been identified (BBCMS 12/1)

<u>Voice of Kawthulay</u> (Cf Jan LN-11) Often transliterated as "Kawthoolei", originally Karen words meaning 'full of peace' or another book says 'blossom land'. But usually the word indicates the 'Karen State' itself. The Burmese ID actually means Kawthulay Broadcasting Station, or Karen State Radio, rather than "Voice of" Kawthulay. Stn appears to be operated by "Kawthulay Govt", the govt of Karen National Union, which has the biggest military power of all the 9 minority rebel groups of NDF. Karen State is a small one in SE Burma, but the Karens are the largest minority in Burma, many living outside that state. Such a station was heard 17/11 at 1304-1320 on 4880 in EG with pop songs including "I'm Leaving It All Up to You" and "Mama Mia", but not IDed (Isao Ugusa, Japan, FEDXR 29/12)

<u>Radio Tanafo</u>, New Hebrides says its evening xmsn is still suspended, only on in the local mornings. But they plan to restore eve BCs eventually, and have pgms in EG and FR for their 'overseas friends'. (John Campbell, Australia, DUDXS 12/12)

FUTURE PLANS <u>YUGOSLAVIA</u> When R. Yugoslavia is fully equipped it will play a significant role in providing info for Yugoslav workers abroad in cooperation with other Yugo domestic stns. RY's audibility is expected to be good in all Euro countries and even much further afield. (BBCMS 5/1)

(UNITED NATIONS) BBC Review of the British Press 24/12 included a report from the NY correspondent of the Daily Telegraph: "The UN will be seeking cooperation of radio stations in both WEu and communist countries to help relay anti-apartheid programs to South Africa. BBC, R. Moscow, Peking Radio, and stns in France, the Netherlands, West and East Germany will be asked to transmit one hour of anti-apartheid pgms each day" (Kim Andrew Elliott, MN) 15 min each in EG, Afrikaans, Zulu and one other dialect. It is hoped to begin in March, and a 146,000-pound annual budget has been voted. The measure was voted for by Britain, but was part of a large anti-apartheid resolution, and the item received scant attention. The MW stns of Mozambique, Botswana and Zambia are also to be asked for air time. (Contd.)

BEBRUARY 19/8

A BBC spokesman said they had not been approached by the Foreign Office and said "We would look into the idea only when we are told about it." A UN Radio official said it would be the first time they had broadcast to a specific country without the concurrence of the country's government (Mick Kitchener, Jan WDXC Contact) Fugitive South African editor Donald Woods has been invited to make the first UN broadcast using the new facility via Botswama and Mozambique. <u>SWAZILAND</u> TWR is getting two more 100 kW xmtrs to reach SAs, N & WAf (Rieth(?), GFR, SCDX 10/1)

SRI LANKA Deutsche Welle just announced that they have the final 'go' for a relay stn in Trincomalee, expected to be ready in a year. We can expect two 250 kW xmtrs to beam to Asia & Oceania (Oliver T. Goonawardena, UADX 15/12) Per the W German news agency DPA, DW's relay stn will cost between 25 & 30 megamarks. At present DW has 28 xmtrs and a staff of 1330, increasing to about 1600 in the next two years (BBCMS 22/12) TWR will not be able to use its new MW stn here to transmit in EG, Sinhala or Tamil, as the law does not permit anyone but SLBC to broadcast in these lagnuages (The DX World Monitor, Sri Lanka; see PUBLICATIONS) I should think this law would hamper DW (George Wood, SCDX) Well, VOA-Colombo gets away with EG, see WRTVH-77, so maybe inapplicable to SW? (gh)

COLOMBIA Rdif. Nacional has two 50 kW and two 20 kW xmtrs. ENTEL plans to install five 50 kW xmtrs in the next year, to use the most favorable frequencies possible (Carlos Arturo ---, R. Nederland Espacio DX-ista 21/1 via gh)

<u>BRAZIL</u> Brasília will soon have a 100 kW stn on 4845, by far the most powerful on the tropical bands here, to cover remote areas lacking local radio, such as Fernando de Noronha (Roberto Medina, on R. Nederland Rádio Atividade, 20/1 via gh)

ASIA Adventist World Radio is to operate its own stn in Asia by 1979; site is not yet decided but will consist of two 100 kW and one 250 kW SW xmtrs (Allen Dean, Jan WDXC Contact)

The Night Watch, book by David Atlee Phillips, Athenium. A former psywar expert attempts to rescue the public image of the CIA. It contains some interesting info for DXers & SWLs, while the info withheld is even more interesting. The omissions are important because they provide solid clues as to which BC operations, even some apparently no longer connected with the CIA, Phillips is trying to protect--such as WRUL's role in the Guatemalan revolution; R. Swan SW operations; R. Cuba Independiente, believed to have operated from the yacht "Matusa Time" prior to the Bay of Pigs. The explanation Phillips offers for these and many other omissions is: "Finally, Colby said, there are 'good secrets', those which protect the identities of American intelligence sources (the people and equipment producing intelligence) and methods (the manner in which men and machines obtain the information). I have used literary license where necessary to protect good secrets". But how can international broadcast stations no longer connected with the CIA have anything to do with intelligence sources? (SW News Service, Ont.)

IN MY OPINION (Ed. Note: This was written several months ago; I circulated it immediately among NASWA Executive Council members --gh) Roger N. Peterson, CT: FRENDX vs. SPEEDX. I wrote for a sample of SPEEDX and was very surprised to see a good, clean printing job, much better make-up and, in my opinion, far better organized issue than FRENDX. So SPEEDX got a new subscriber. Now that I have seen 3 issues there is no question that SPEEDX is a far better presentation than FRENDX--except for IN. But what good is all that info if it can't be read because of poor printing? I also like the way SPEEDX organizes their Log Sections--by continent instead of by frequency. Much easier to check on a country or station that way. NASWA is obviously much larger than SPEEDX. Income for NASWA was \$21,202 as against only \$8,930 for SPEEDX. Mailing costs for FRENDX about double that of SPEEDX. But get this--printing costs were \$8,058 for FRENDX as against only \$3,499 for SPEEDX! Twice the quantity should not cost twice as many dollars. Either SPEEDX is getting a bargain or FRENDX is being grossly overcharged for a poor printing job, month after month.

gh: I think the SWL/DX hobby is big enough for both SPEEDX and NASWA, with their different approaches and presentation; though I feel in their log sections, SPEEDX has a commitment to mediocrity in discouraging intelligent comment on program details, allegedly to keep it simple (read boring) for the benefit of SPEEDX's many members in Japan. FRENDX printing was definitely inferior, but the best we could do under the circumstances. Our new prigter has promised to do a much better job, and time will tell.

Richard Larson, MN (from Jan. RIB) Why can't or won't NASWA, or better yet, ANARC, put on an ad to get people interested in SWLing/DXing? Ad few months ago on WCCO-830 during the CBS Radio Mystery Theatre, urging people to become Radio Amateurs. I believe it was by the ARRI.

gh: This was very likely free public-service advertising. ANARC and NASWA would have to establish standing with the Advertising Council in order to qualify. Worth looking into.

Louis Goldstein, MA: Any indication of FRENDX improvements in format? Have not found publication up to expectations for fee charged. When they added the final straw of not publishing up to date list of members, that did it for me. A secret mailing list of members from outsiders might have merit...but to keep membership secret from members is not reasonable. Members are not even able to communicate with each other in an outfit promoting better use of worldwide communications!

gh: I detect no such motivation in Mac's announcement on Oct FRENDX-3. It is a big job. Would you be willing to volunteer to do it, if that suited Mac? However, once published, it would be difficult to keep the list from falling into the 'wrong' hands. I will be glad to publish full addresses of any IN contributors who request me to.

WICE "Free Speech Radio" is being reported widely as of this writing, a pirate from New York City(according to anmts). Most recently measured on 1626.5, was // 3261 on 1/21 from 0504 through 0730 t/o. IDs as "WICE 1625," "This is ICY Radio, WICE" Frequency varies from 1625 to 1630. On 1/21, fairly professional-sounding talk show host taking calls ranging from Albany to Washington, D.C., most of them lacking much intelligent content. Said that WGOR is also on the same frequency, and the two are likely closely related if not one and the same. "You learn a lot when you go on a pirate radio station ... a lot about people" In DX HOTLINE of Feb. '76, Bob Foxworth reported on WCPR with just such a talk show/free radio format, and postulated that the telephone numbers used (most recently 626-9906 & 830-9900) are "internal usage loops" for phone company purposes only. Thus, one of the participants might well be a "frame-man for Telco and going up into the frames and either clipping across (exchanges) onto another phone line which reaches the radio station, or arranging for a transfer of calls onto an otherwise unidentified line." Presently, seems to run an extended/extensive schedule with current and oldies music, Simon & Garfunkel, etc...Many calls from Brooklyn which led Foxworth to believe the location was there...And, when one calls, the line is simply busy until you get through--but there is no actual ringing, only a quick connection. Whether they knew of the harmonic 90 meter frequency I don't know, but when I called I was led to suspect they might -- they were very evasive about studio equipment in response to caller's queries, understandably so(Robinson 1/21/1/22 credit to Bob Foxworth)

Makes LR-A a bit easier to read, and I usually try to type this section up at about a 70-80 w.p.m. clip so it makes for easier typing as well.






