MODEL NO. RF-2800 THE PANASONIC RF-2800- USER REVIEW by Jerry A. Lineback, St. Joseph, IL

I recently indulged in a long standing desire to have a receiver with digital frequency readout without spending an arm and leg. When I heard about the Panasonic RF-2800 it seemed very interesting. The advertising material that I printed in the March SWC convinced be to give it a try. This review presents your editor's first hands-on impression of the RF-2800.

The RF-2800 is the middle unit of Panasonic's "Command Series" of shortwave receivers that includes the popular 2200 model and the larger and more expensive RF-4800. The 2800 and 4800 feature digital frequency counters.

My first impression of the 2800 was its size. It is described as a portable, but its size precludes easy portability. It is certainly not a receiver you would like to stuff in a suitcase, unless you wanted to listen on vacation while wearing dirty clothes, because you certainly could not put much else in with it. The RF-2800 is larger than the Barlow Wadley XCR-30, which is only marginally portable itself.


The receiver is black. It comes with 6 carbon batteries in size "D", a power cord, the usual Japanese earphone, and an operating manual with a limited amount of information in it. The RF-2800 is a conventional double conversion (on shortwave) superheterodyne receiver with three shortwave bands (3.1-8, 8-16, and 16-30 MHz), plus the AM and FM bands. The receiver has a single swivelling whip antenna for SW and FM, and an internal antenna for the single conversion AM band. The battery case is easily accessable from the back and separate from the receiver inards. There are also two clips on the back to attach an external SW or FM antenna. The power cord plugs into the left side, disconnecting the batteries for mains usage. The remainder of the controls are conveniently located on the front panel.

The RF-2800 has no built-in handle on top. Two military type handles at each side serve both as handles and as protection for the control knobs if the receiver falls on its face. Two protruding feet also help provide this important protection. The receiver comes with a webbed carrying strap that can be used as a shoulder strap for carrying the receiver for short distances. I shortened it to form a make-shift carrying handle.

The controls are well laid out and labeled. Each knob is surrounded by a white circula scale. Why this is needed for the volume, treble, and bass controls and the main tuning knob, I do not know. It is just for looks, I guess. The location of the controls is shown in the illustration below. Their function is mostly obvious, so I will mention the more important features only.

The dial is small, which is no problem on shortwave, where the counter works, but limits the usability on AM and FM to the usual guess work. There is a logging scale, but that is what we are trying to get away from, isn't it? The frequency counter is a bright red LED display, 5 digits, in MHz with a fixed decimal point. It is quite readable. The dial has a light with a switch and the frequency counter can be switched off to save batteries. The spring loaded counter switch can be pulled down for a quick frequency check, or pushed up for continuous operation. The S-meter can also be lit up, it deflects to the left, and may be of most use in the battery check mode.

Tuning. Tuning is by means of a single knob, pushed in for fast tuning and pulled out for slow (fine) tuning. The appropriate shortwave band is selected and the receiver fast



tuned to the approximate frequency by reference to the dial or counter. Actually you quickly learn to ignore the dial. The tuning knob is then pulled out and the fine tuning takes place. In using the RF-2800 there is a tendency to crank in a frequency to see what is there rather than just tune around until you find something and then see what the frequency is (as with non-counter receivers). The tuning is quick and easy, but it does take a light touch to tune up or down only 1 kHz at a time.

Since the receiver is conventional, the tuning dial is non-linear. This means less turning of the knob per kHz as you go up in frequency. The following table illustrates the point.

On 13 metres it requires a very light touch to move up or down a kHz at a time, but it is still possible, and really works quite well, once you get the hang of it.

. The RF-2800 was compared to an XCR-30 with the following results. Tests were conducted side-by-side with battery power and using the built-in whip antennas.

<u>Sensitivity</u>. The sensitivity of the RF-2800 was as good as the XCR-30 and in overall consideration was adequate for general listening and for moderately serious DXing. The rating is 1 to 2 uV depending on the band.

<u>Selectivity</u>. The wide position is inadequate for any use. Leave the selector on the narrow position. This provides about a  $\pm$  5 kHz selectivity that is about equal to the XCR-30, or for that matter, the SPR-4. 5 kHz is marginally adequate for normal listening

or DXing. It would really be nice to have a narrower position, but . . .

<u>Stability</u>. There is no discernable drift in the RF-2800 in AM operation and the frequency counter seems to remain  $\pm 1$  kHz on known frequencies once set. The BFO can be switched on (with the pitch control centered) to zero beat the frequency. The counter calibrator is then adjusted to read the known frequency. The receiver can then be zero beat with unknown frequencies to provide a  $\pm 1$  kHz frequency check. There is a short-term stability problem with BFO operation in both receivers that makes SSB reception less easy than on some other receivers.

<u>Problems</u>. Developing the light touch necessary for tuning may be a problem for some RF-2800 owners. There are also images that crop up at unexpected places (for example, Cuba on 4880). There are not too many of these in the bands and familarity with the bands is the only sure defense. Such images are found in other receivers than the RF-2800 too, to be sure.

Images in the RF-2800 normally appear 4 MHz below the actual frequency, but because there is little overlap with the shortwave bands, there usually is no problem. There is a 30 dB attenuation of images, but that is not enough. For example, the 31 metre band can be found as images between 5500 and 5775 kHz. WWV at 10 MHz can be heard sometimes on 6000 kHz. So be careful of the -4 MHz images. If WARC 79 results in expanded bands, the image problem may become more significant in the RF-2800.

Operating the RF-2800 from mains power will net a slight increase in performance. It also will relieve your mind of worry about battery life, since you will want to leave the counter on as much as possible.

The addition of an external antenna and ground will also result in increased performance. Therefore, to get the most out of the RF-2800, it may be operated in a semipermanent location with mains power and external antenna. This is generally true of other "portables" too.

When compared to the SPR-4, both using mains power and external antennas, the selectivity and sensitivity are very close, with a slight edge to the SPR-4. The RF-2800 however, does not appear to be capable of exalted carrier reception, the mainstay of difficul DX reception with the SPR-4.

In general, the RF-2800 is a conventional receiver of modest capabilities. However, the counter quickly spoils the user and makes the whole package worthwhile. In my opinion, the RF-2800 should not be considered as a "portable". It is just too big to be more portable than the picnic basket in the back seat on the way to the beach. It cannot be carried far and it certainly is too big for a suitcase unless you need it worse than clean clothes. The Sony ICF-5900 is a more likely canadate for portability.

However, as a table-top receiver, the RF-2800 will become a popular addition to the homes of many SWLs and DKers. If you have 100-250 (the probable price range) to spend on a receiver, there is no point now in not getting a receiver with a digital frequency counter.

#### RF-4800

THE PANASONIC RF-4800-USER REVIEW

I had the opportunity to use two RF-4800 radios made by Panasonic. It left me with a few impressions that I would like to share with other shortwave listeners. Please refer to the March 1978 FRENDX Shortwave Center for specifications of the RF-4800.

I find the appearance of the radio to be very impressive. The cabinet is large compared to the room needed inside, but maybe they had to do this to get all the controls on the front panel.

For comparing the RF-4800, I used a RF-2200 and the HQ-180.

The broadcast band dial is calibrated so poorly that one may be off 20 kHz. A ferrite core antenna is used on back of the radio. The cabinet has an effect on it so one must adjust the antenna away from the cabinet for maximum sensitifity. This means that it cannot be adjusted for best directivity. An external antenna will cause lots of images.

The FM section is identical to the RF-2200. This is a very selective unit with good audio quality. If you live in a meteropolitan area you may have a problem with an external antenna causing images.

The first SW band is sort of an afterthought. The calibration is as good as you can read from 1.6 to 3 MHz. If you attach an outside antenna you will receive broadcast band stations on this band. Image rejection is poor on the band.

The shortwave bands from 3-31 MHz are where this radio performs. The digital readout is in use only for these bands. These are some of the conditions I checked:

Audio - good quality - sufficient audio (2 watts), has bass and treble controls, could use more treble attenuation (see Selectivity).

- Images No real problems with images, FM or TV stations as found with the RF-2200. Excellent rejection.
- Spurious Signal internal oscillators are generating birds on certain frequencies. One was found at 11.7 MHz which causes QRM on weak signals. On one of the radios this signal was S9 and on another it was S3. The weaker one had less gain and less interference. This problem may be overcome to a degree by increasing the RF gain control and retuning the dial.
- Drift No real problems for the SWBC listener. There is a problem of drift when using the BFO.
- Sensitivity Very good; one can use a ten foot wire. In fact, my outside antenna caused overloading which caused excessive QRM. I had to turn down the RF gain control half way to eliminate this problem on 49 and 31 metres.
- Calibration The digital readout is what really makes the radio. Once adjusted on a band it needs no more adjustment. There is a change of about 2 kHz between bands. Calibration is easy. The display can be turned off when not in use. It is very easy to read.
- Tuning Dial On fast tune, it is a little hard to tune. With the 12:1 reduction, tuning is a little slow, but is very easy. Some play in the dial is noticed on slow tuning back and forth.

Antenna Terminals - Separate terminals for SW, SW 1.6-3 plus BC, and FM.

Selectivity - This seems to be a problem area. After reading the specifications, I was confused (spec. is ± 1.7 kHz @ 6 dB and 6 kHz @ 60 dB). When stations are spaced at 5 kHz intervals, you may have to listen to a 5000 Hz whistle. If there is a strong station on, you may have trouble with stations 10 kHz apart at times. When comparing this radio with the RF-2200, I found that the 2200 was more selective. I was very impressed with the 2200 and I thought the RF-4800 would be better (RF-2200 specs are ± 1.7 kHz @ 6 dB and ± 10 kHz at 60 dB).

I built an audio active filter (similar to what the FRG-7 has) and this solved the whistle problem but didn't help adjacent channel selectivity. I know for a fact that for a few dollars more they could have installed a better ceramic filter. My HQ-180 has super selectivity in the wide position and the specs there are  $\pm$  3 kHz @ 6dB and 7 kHz at 60 dB. I called Panasonic locally and in New Jersey. I talked to an engineer who told me that the filter was better in the RF-4800. I was told I can't compare the two radios and was questioned as to whether I could prove by measurement that the specifications were in error. I can't, but to most of us comparing is better than test data when we don't know all the test conditions. I have some ideas what they did but it is not within the scope of this article. They did send me a service manual and the engineer said he would contact Japan.

CONCLUSIONS: The only thing I find objectionable about this radio is the poor selectivity.

# **HF** Africa

AFRICAN BROADCASTS ON THE HIGHER FREQUENCIES by Mike Willis, Nedlands, Western Australia

There are a surprisingly large number of African radio stations which broadcast on the higher frequencies, and this article will give details of the ones I have heard over the past few months. My listening has been done from Melbourne and Perth, but I think that American readers may find that they will be able to hear all the stations I mention. However, the times that you hear them may be different. I should say that my survey is not a complete one. I include only stations that I have definitely identified and some of the easier items are omitted, such as R. RSA and R. Cairo.

At the moment, the most interesting broadcaster on the higher frequencies is Mozambique, which has put in good signals in the last few days. Try for their A programme, in Portuguese, at 1500 past 1800, on 9623, 7238, and 6115 kHz. The latter two frequencies were especially pleasing for me, and it does seem that Brazzaville no longer uses 6115 kHz, which accounts for the fact that Mozambique makes it to Australia.

You can tune into the Voice of the Zimbabwe from 1800 to  $1845^*$  (note the new times), on 6005, which is quite good, even if the BBC does cause some problems. The programme is in English, is very interesting, and is // to 3265, 4856, and 1079 kHz. These transmitters are owned by Radio Mozambique, and placed at the disposal of the Voice of Zimbabwe African National Union, which denounces the present Smith/African political arrangements. The station often plays the Zimbabwe liberation song, and signs off with the echo announcement "Victory is certain".

Turning from Mozambique to Angola, we find that Radio Nacional is easily heard, in Portuguese, from 1400 to past 1900, on 9535 and 7244 kHz. The latter is perhaps the better, although there is some interference from jammers on 7250.

Radio Zambia always puts in a good signal when it signs on at 1553 on 9580, after playing a distinctive bird call. The opening announcement is usually by a man and is in English. He was mentioning that the station has various Zimbabwe programmes and one such goes on the air at 1715 GMT. 9580 is a good frequency to hear, even though there is some interference by a myriad of stations. Radio Zambia is an excellent verifier. For those interested in African music, this station plays some excellent examples of music which has only minimally been influenced by western concepts, values, and idioms.

From Zambia, we move over to Tanzania. Radio Tanzania, which also is a good verifier, is well heard on 15435 from 0330 to 0430, in various languages, and from 1300-1500\* in Swahili, on 9684. This latter channel is rather nasty to hear due to interference from Moscow, Taipei, and others, but it is there and reveals itself to the patient listener. The foreign service on 9750 is not at the moment audible, although it used to be heard at 1500. Malaysia plus one other English language unidientified is heard at that time now.

Zaire used to be an easy one, what with Lubumbashi on 11867 (from 0400-0600), and the national probramme, from Kinshasa, on 15351 and 15246v. Frankly, all these appear to be off the air at the present time, which is a shame, for 15245 used to boom in from 0400 to past 1700. It may come back, though, or it may have moved too!. This station is also an easy verifier, for those who are interested in such things.

The Congo, on the other hand, is an easy country to log, and Brazzaville simply leaps in from 1100 to 1400\* and from 1600-0100\*. No parallels are at the moment noted, although 6115 could still be there. Some people have reported hearing the station around 9610 kHz but this hasn't appeared here so far.

The Ivory coast is a country which is also easy to hear, at 0600 to 0800 on 7215 kHz. It does not appear to be using 11920 at the moment, although it may be hidden by other stations. Still, 7215 is heard well all the year, and should be a fairly easy catch.

Guinea is a country which has proveided some exciting listening for me, as it can now be heard from as early as 1200 to past 2000 on 15308 kHz. That fade in is very early indeed, and shows that all those propagation rules one reads about may not be quite as rigid as we might think. Guinea has some interesting programming too. The station used to run 06000900 on 7126 and 7253 kHz, but these are not at the moment audible, although 7253 was once heard, a few weeks ago, at 2000. This has not reappeared. 6155 and 9650v are two other Conakry channels which seem defunct also.

Bamako, in Mali, is heard well too, on Sundays, when it signs on at 0800 on 7110 and 11960 kHz, as well as 5990 kHz. The language is mainly French and the stations sign on tune is a curious brass band march, not very well played. And if you can get a QSL out of this station, good luck!

Where to now? Well, what about Algiers? However, let me warn you that this station specializes in frequent and odd changes of frequency. I have heard them in Perth recently as follows. At 0600, when the Arabic service signs on, you can tune in on 9685, 9705, 15163v, and 21560 kHz, whilst at the same time. French is beamed on 7245 kHz. Kabyle is listed, but not heard on 11910 at 0600. At various times of the year, the station signs on at 0500. Algiera is an easy verifier, and many will be familiar with the white and blue card which is sent out in response to most reports.

The Sudan is another matter. This country has tended to close down some of its high frequency transmissions. It does seem that both 11835 and 7200 kHz are off the air at present. I suggest you try between 1400 and 1530, for Radio Sudan on 6150 kHz, which is very good, and // to 5039. At 1500 the station relays the Eritrean Programme, which is quite interesting. The Eritrean liberation forces, at present organised into two camps, which are in a loose alliance, is attempting to break away from Ethiopia, and recently the two groups, the Eritrean Liberation Front, and the Eritrean Peoples Liberation Front, has considerable victories in northern Ethiopia. However, it is suggested that the Sudan may drop the Eritrean programme, as some reports attest that the Sudanese and central Ethiopian governments are slightly closer than in previous years, althouth these claims have yet to be proven.

From Sudan to a much easier station, the National Radiostation at Tunis. Tunisia is indeed a very easy country to hear even if it has a curious QSL policy. I found that they often would not QSL a report for a frequency which had been in operation for less than a year, arguing that the frequency was not even there! However, do try from 0600 to 0000 on 7275, 11970, and 15225 kHz. All these frequencies are excellent, and this station is noticeable for its heavy emphasis on arabic music and programming.

I hear Radiodiffusion Television Marocaine on 11735 and 15360 kHz from 1100 to 1800, and 9615 is noted from 1800 to 0000 here. True, 11735 is no longer listed in the WRTVH, but that need not detain us; it was there in March. These frequencies emanate from Tangiers. The other frequencies of 7225 and 6190 come from Sebaa Aloun, but neither of these once easily heard frequencies are at the moment noted here, and I am not sure if they are still on.

Radio Malwi is one of the more enjoyable African Broadcasters, and often has fun filled programmes of hi-life music, which is hard to resist even if you tend to be more interested in "authentic" traditional African music. This station is heard here from 1500 to 1700 on 7130 where, Peking and Taipei not withstanding, the signal is very good and often beats 3380.

The National Radio at Yaounde, The Camerouns, has been heard for many months now on the 100 kW channel of 9745 kHz, where it presents English and French between 0600 and 0800. The station is also heard at 1600. The programmes are rather interesting, and a good deal of emphasis is placed on talks and news.

The radio station at Cotonou, Benin, is sometimes audible on 7190 kHz, which is an alternative frequency for 4870 kHz. Try between 0600 and 0800, when the signal can be very fine. This station plays lots of African music on one sort or another, and the bulk of the announcements are in French. The station is reputed to verify reports too.

I have just been reading an interesting article on Chad, and so I tune to the radio statim at Ndjamana with renewed interest. It seems that this country is rather poor at the moment. Furthermore, it is plagued by a "liberation" organisation supported by Libya and called FROLINAT. The group has captured much of northern Chad. It will be interesting group. It seems that Chad has decided to turn to American aid due to a downturn in Russian aid. It is always worth knowing something about the countries we listen too. The station at Ndjamana was heard by me from 0630-0800 on 7120 on a Sunday. Beware the EBC on the same channel though! Lots of African music, interspersed with a variety of African songs.

Radio Niger is also a station which tends to be less well heard on the higher frequencies these days, although there was a time when it put through a very good signal on 9705, from around 0555 sign on. Curiously, the sign on always varied with what the schedule of the station showed, yet the signal was undoubtedly the station. There was some kind of interference from RFE in Romanian, and RTVA, yet the signal was fair enough. It may still be there. Sunday was the day to try. Radiodiffusion de la Republique Rwandaise is the most interesting operation emanating from Rwanda and was, if my memory serves me correctly, built by the Germans when they set up their easily heard transmitters in this country. The national station, which is 50 kW, is easily heard on 6055 kHz from 1500 to 1700. It is one of the African stations which delights in presenting much hi-life music, and is a delight to listen to.

Togo has its national radio station located in Lome, and it can be easily heard signing on at 0800, over the German regional on 7265 kHz. The signal is usually good, although it must be admitted that 5047 is even better. The language is French, and this station is reported to verify easily, although I never got a reply.

Radio Uganda is also very well heard, which is hardly surprising given the power of its transmitters (250 kW for external service). Try 9515 at 1630 and 6030 at 1700. News was the main feature at these times, and it was presented in English. Tastes vary, of course, but I confess that the programming was rather dull, at least at the time that I heard it. This is one of those stations which aims to present a political type of programme with plenty of commentaries and so forth.

The SABC Home Service channels are suitable material for our survey, at least those on the higher frequencies. The SABC high frequencies are at present: 11790 (English from 0635 to 1520), 9680 (English 0520-1620), Afrikaans service on 9560 (0520-1620) and on 11885 from 0636-1520 GMT. Springbok Radio may be tuned in to on 11935 (0637-1520) and on 9710 from 0522 to 1622). Unlike all the other stations listed in my survey, this has been taken from the actual station schedule, because, for some reason, the SABC outlets have been poor on the high frequencies this year. We should immediately state, however, that 11935 is the exception here, it is well heard nightly from 1100-1520.

The Seychelles are well heard via the FEBA. Although I have no schedule, I have picked up this information just by tuning around (which is my main way of getting information!); 11755 signs on at 0315 in Swahili, whilst 11860 is heard with the FEBA interval signal at 1640 signing on. 15325 is easy at 1230 to past 1500, whilst 11945 runs from 1400-1530. I can attest that all these frequencies are absolutely first rate here in Perth, and were fairly good in Victoria too.

Somalia, which has been busy fighting wars here and there with Ethiopia, is well heard via Radio Mogadishu which runs from 1000 to 2100 on 9585. Various languages are presented via this frequency. 6097 kHz is also heard, emanating from the same site from around 1030 to 2100. It is now known that the stations were financed by Russian aid, which they never got back! Radio Hargeisa, also located in Somalia, may be off the air altogether. For whilst it has been off 7120 kHz for some months, it now has vacated 11644 kHz too. We used to log this station from 1400 to 1600. Some of the programmes were relayed from Mogadishu. The station may have changed frequencies, and may have moved to a lower frequency where it will "capture" the majority of listeners who listen to the lower freqs.

Which brings us to Ethiopia. Let me confess that all is not clear with this country. It used to be heard on 7165 and 6015 where it announced itself as "The Voice of Revolutionary Ethiopia". The times that were best were 1200 to past 1500, and often English was presented. The programmes consisted of a barrage of cliches such as Imperialism, colonialism, fascism, and so on, although there was little indication that the speakers knew the exact meaning of these oft used, but sometimes misunderstood words. Anyway, the Voice of Revolutionary Ethiopia is no longer heard on these frequencies and although it has been reported that they may be using 7155 and 9595, I cannot hear these frequencies here. My guess is that both, or at least one, will eventually gravitate to the tropical bands so as to collect the majority of African listeners.

I should also, I guess, mention that there are two countires that I would like to deal with, but which present problems. The first is that Ecuatorial Guinea, which is listed but not heard here on 6250. The second, Mauritus, is listed to 1300 sign off on 9710, and is in fact seemingly there, signing off daily just before 1300, but no ID has come to hand as yet so I cannot be 100% sure, which is a shame!

Before I conclude I should mention that here in Australia we receive the African stations via two main paths or routes. From 0500 to 0900, we hear the stations via the so-called long path, which means they travel past America and over the Pacific Ocean. From 1100 to past 2300, we hear the Africans via the short path, or over the Indian Ocean. In Victoria, the former mode of reception is very good, in Perth it is nonexistent, but the latter, short path reception is excellent.

For my monitoring, I use a Trio 9R59De, which is not an expensive radio by any means, plus a LED crystal display digital frequency meter, which gives me that much needed readout to 1 kHz and better. I also use an aerial tuning unit which is a real help. And apart from that, I use patience, which is a necessity for all DXers.

Although these stations were logged in Australia, our American friends should have no trouble getting most of them, judging from the pages of FRENDX.

 $60\cos^{-1}\left[\sin(\text{LAT}_1)\sin(\text{LAT}_2) + \cos(\text{LAT}_1)\cos(\text{LAT}_2)\cos(\text{LONG}_1-\text{LONG}_2)\right]$ To get statute miles, multiply by 69.09 instead of 60.



ALGERIA Due to local DST, EG to Eur/NAf/ME now at 1800-1900 on <u>7060</u> and announced but not confirmed 7145; target areas are our assumption; channels are subject to constant variation and from Oct 1978, program likely to be one hour later (BBCMS 4/78)

ANTICUA Because of harmonic problems, the WS relay on 6195 from 2000 moved as of 17/4 to 6175, so now sked 2000-2430 to Carib, 0030-0730 to Ams+Pac; whilst Sąckville moved to 6195 at 2200-2330. (BBC World Radio Club 19/4 via gh) Antigua 6195 had been a regular on 24780 --4th harmonic--but was usually weaker after the former 2330 switch to 6175, on 24700. I'm not sure why, and neither harmonic appeared to QRM any other station. This last-minute change is not reflected in May London Calling. One that was planned earlier was 17830 ex-15420 at 2000-2115, so that harmonic moves from 30840 to 35660 as of J78 season, which begins Sun 7 May. 17830 designated not only for Ams, but SAs! (gh)

ASCENSION For J78, the WS relay at 2000-2245 on 15260 is designated not only for N&C&NSAm, but also for South Asia! Little change in other transmissions (gh)

AUSTRIA ORF's new NAm svc at 1230-1300 moved as of 19/3 from 15425 to <u>15320</u> (Pete Grenier, CA) Not bad, even managing to override DW co-channel, but no telling where for J78 (gh)

BANGLADESH R. Bang at 1230 to Eu on new 21460 //15520 (Noel Green, BBC WRC 19/4)



<u>USA</u> WYFR. Re their off-air monitoring receiver, a direct demodulator Belar that did not respond to the FMing caused by a 'buzz' in the xmtr frequency synthesizer. FCC requires BC stns to submit reports of Proof of Performance in which, i.a., the audio frequency response is measured. If a superhet rx were used, the high-end response would become an artifice of the IF response curve used in the rx/demodulator. It would be impractical to employ an IF strip greater than 30 kHz wide that would not have serious passband ripple and/or envelope delay distortion. In order to accurately measure freq response, direct demod is used. This has not been a problem in the past as virtually all broadcast transmitters were crystal controlled, and this type of 'buzz' problem just did not exist. Even with the advent of synthesizers for generation of SWBC freqs, this type of problem should be quite rare-assuming a well-designed synthesizer is used--and my advice to any station operator using one would be to check his received off-air signal with both the station monitor and a regular receiver at periodic intervals, and to pay attention to incoming reception reports! (Bob Foxworth, NY) After all this time, the WYFR 'buzz' is frequently heard still, e.g. on 21525, making their signal almost unintelligible--but if they don't care, why should we (g)

KCEI. We have a very extensive research program to help us know our listeners and to make decisions that will affect our ministry in a positive way. FEBC froze our budget, so we had to make cuts. In June 1977 we began a research project to discover where we could trim our broadcasts without hindering our ministry. Over the air we offered a color photo of the Golden Gate Bridge, requiring listeners to state the time they heard the offer. We learned that our morning and evening program skeds drew approximately the same amount of response. However, the morning schedule had a higher average response per hour. Altho there are more potential listeners in the evening, there is also more competition from other SW stns, and more interference. In the morning only R. Havana and KGEI are on. Our project revealed that our frequency change at 0300 GMT caused a great drop in our response and was slow to build up again. Our Asian schedule has already been trimmed to only l hour in Japanese, Mandarin and English each and 2 hours in Russian. KGEI would save \$2,450 per month if Asian languages could be put on the 50 instead of 250 kW xmtr, but the signal would drop drastically unless we spent \$100,000 for a better antenna for Asia (Steve L. Overstreet, KGEI Newsletter exc., 4/78)

<u>AFRTS</u>. Tho they have had a budget cut and 95% of their programs are sent by satellite and cable to AFRTS stations, there is a considerable audience who listen to AFRTS SW. Reinhardt said the 'core management' of ICA will consist of a director, a deputy director, and four associate directors. Internal struxure of VOA remains essentially unchanged, but elevation of the VOA chief to assoc. dir. is intended to recognize VOA's importance and preserve the integrity of its news operation (Federal Times, 20/2 via Will Martin, MO) A panel of leading newspaper and radio personalities has recommended sweeping changes in the role of the VOA's news broadcasts and the development of new protection for VOA correspondents from interference by the State Dept. The role of the Voice, the govt's official broadcast arm, and particularly its freedom to use its correspondents as it wants, has been a long-running battle in Washington. The independent panel argued that the VOA 'must have the right, free of diplomatic restrictions, to gather and send news to Washington headquarters.' (The Courier-News, 14/3, via Ed Insinger, NJ)

When an all-female chorus completed the Lucky Seven theme song, the station's logo--dice rolled to seven-appeared on the screen (UPI via UT Daily Beacon, 20/4)

It would, we believe, be impossible for the phone company to subsequently bill the station for such calls: once the loop connexion was broken there would be no way of tracing the station. Voice of Namibia via R. Tanzania hrd 2/4 at 0417 on 15435 in EG & vern (Mike Maghakian, NY) Via Brazzaville, in EG Mon-Fri 1630-1700 obs on 15190 & 4765, also mentioning 9 & 6 MHz channels (BBCMS 6/4)

Voice of Zimbabwe, via R. Mozambique, 1800-1845 daily on very loud freqs: 3265/4856/6005; all in EG, ends with words "Victory is certain"; the pgm, prepared by ZANU condemns the settlement Smith has secured with what the pgm terms 'the help of black renegades'. Much playing of the tribal liberation song which mentions Zimbabwe (Mike Willis, W. Australia) Voice of the People of Burma extended sked 28/3 to commemorate 30th anniversary of Burmese

Communist Party's struggle, by one hour. On 2/4, retimed 6304 Sun/Tue/Thu/Fri xmsn from 1330-1430 to 1030-1130 (BBCMS 6/4)

AUSTRALIA ATC is planning for installation of xmtrs at Cox FUTURE PLANS Peninsula near Darwin for the Northern Territory domestic SW service. Site selection study for the permanent RA stn in the North West Cape area is continuing. Investigations proceeding for sites further inland, and as far south as Geraldton, to minimize risk of possible future cyclone damage (Robert Jones, Apr ADXN)

BRAZIL Tony Jones' report about our SW stns moving from HF to tropical bands rather than going off is not correct. Most of the stations affected are south of the Tropic of Capricorn and would not be assigned to tropical bands. Brazil's forthcoming international service will be needing all the channels it can get (Luiz Roberto de Medina, DX Clube Brasil) GUATEMALA AWR America to put on a 20 kW 'SW xmtr on 25/31m this year (AWR DX, Barraclough) IRAN ordered 16 x 500 kW SW xmtrs from Thomson-CSF for 300,000,000 French francs, to be set up at one site near Teheran, largest in the world (Georges Cany & Louis Aubrée, SCDX 28/3)

<u>PORTUCAL</u> R. Renascença, the Catholic stn, was to launch a campaign 10/4 on the occasion of its 40th anniversary, to acquire new xmtrs thruout Portugal, but its first objective is to reach all groups of Portuguese emigrants thruout the world on SW. Xmtrs for this were purchased 11/77 and delivery will be made by yearend 1978. R. Renascença expects to be on the air at yearbegin 1979 to CEu, SAf, NAm, SAm (BECMS 13/4)

SINCAPORE BBC is replacing its Tebrau, Malaysia "Far Eastern Station" site with one only 15km away in Kranji, Singapore. Two xmtrs already in operation. Since 1975 the 14 ha swampland site has been filled to raise its level by about one metre and at one point 800 lorry-loads of soil were being tipped into the swamp each day by local contractors. Even so, because of the swamp the actual relay stn transmitter house has been built on piles, and eight of the aerial support towers from the total ot 17 which have been erected at Kranji and the receiving station at Ponggol, some 15 km away, have been built in the sea. This new SW relay stn will transmit the BBCWS in EG and the vernacular ES to the same area as the present Tebrau stn. The work will, it is hoped, be completed by spring 1979 when all the xmtrs will be transferred from Tebrau to Kranji in an orderly fashion so as no loss of broadcasting is incurred. The buildings and masts are complete and half the aerials are finished (BBC Staff Journal and Mike Barraclough, WDXC Contact)

SOUTH AFRICA There is no possibility of R. RSA jamming the new UN transmissions to South Africa. The SABC would not waste their new SW xmtrs. Propaganda has been pumped at RSA for some years and no attempt has been made to jam. The new 500s are giving excellent reception in USA+Canada+West Africa+Holland+East Europe, but not the UK. There will probably be an antenna slew to put a better signal into UK. There is talk of reintroducing the West Coast USA xmsn either 11/78 or 3/79, but not official yet (Gerry E. Wood, R. RSA, 3/78)

<u>SRI LANKA</u> DW has been given go-ahead to build a relay here, as previously widely reported. But as we understand it, the only permission given was by the Ministry of Defence of Sri Lanka. No notification was given to the SLEC. The stn is expected to have 2 x 250 kW SW xmtrs and one 100 kW MW xmtr at Trincomallee, in northeast Sri Lanka, the famous British harbour of WW II. There still is a law forbidding anyone other than SLEC to broadcast in the 3 principal langs in Sri Lanka, that is EG, Sinhala & Tamil. So, if DW hopes to xmit pgms in EG, it will have to hand over controls of the stn to SLEC. Otherwise, we can expect a new law legalizing these xmsns! (Victor Goonetilleke (?), RDXL DX World Monitor)

SUNSPOT CYCLE 21 -- THE PEAK, HOW MUCH, AND WHEN Likely the most accurate method has been devised by Soviet scientist A. I. Ohl, and enhanced by H.H. Sargent III of SESC Boulder. The theory is based on the regression of recurrent geomagnetic activity recorded from the priorcycle to predict the sunspot maximum of the forthcoming cycle. Accuracy appears to be w/in 1% to 5% of predicted values. The Cycle 21 predicted maximums of 50-60 have already been exceeded; the 2/78 smoothed sunspot level already reached at least 90 with the peak still some two years in the future! Predicted arrival date of the maximum cycle 21 is early 1980. Predicted Smooth Sunspot Maximum for Cycle 21 by Ohl/Sargent: 153.6. Twelve-hour periods with geomagnetic "A" indices of 100 or more expected in next ten years: 81 (an A-index of over 50 indicates a major geomagnetic storm). It is clear that if predixions hold true, Cycle 21 will be a whopper and will likely parallel Cycle 18 and have an impact almost as severe as Cycle 19. During periods of high solar activity, many services will be detrimer tally affected. USA VOA has received funding to add a new language as of Fall 1978--Hausa. The problem is finding qualified journalists who speak it. VOA is also adding 12 new xmtrs by 1980-81, 4 each in England, Liberia, and Philippines (Peter Straus, VOA Dir., National Press Club 28/3 via gh) VOA has decided to mothball two relay stations, at Bethany Beach (sic), and Dixon, and switch to a satellite program feed. This is causing concern among VOA workers employed at the two stations. They object on economic, political and technical grounds. High solar activity may affect satellites, there will be vulnerability to 'killer satellites', this is contrary to an international agreement not to broadcast propaganda via satellites, and spectrum allocations would have to be surrendered. An AFGE spokesman who works at VOA said he did not understand the rationale for installing 12 new overseas xmtrs and closing down 20 existing domestic ones. A VOA official responded that solar activity would not affect bands used by satellites, the VOA does not broadcast propaganda, Delano could be used as backup in an emergency, better signals are needed in Monrovia, and in the long run the change should be technically and financially beneficial (Federal Times, 13/2) ZAIRE VOZ regional Bukavu may soon be able to resume transmitting, now that spare parts have arrived from Germany, AZAP reported 3/4. Was on 4839 (BBCMS 6/4)






