THE SHORTWAVE CENTER INTERVIEW: GERRY DEXTER

No real DXer can claim that he hasn't, at some time, benefitted from the insight that only a hobby veteran can provide. For me, the single, biggest influence on my DXing has been Gerry.

You might know him as author of "The QSL Address Book", currently available from Gilfer Shortwave (P.O. Box 239, 52 Park Avenue, Park Ridge, NJ 07656) or perhaps through his monthly column and in-depth articles for "Popular Communications" magazine. Others still recognize his name as one of the best the hobby has produced, collecting those veries that most of us can only dream of.

<u>SWC:</u> I asked Don this question recently--and it's a subject that Tascinates me--how have you managed to stay so active in the hobby .7 all these years?

DEXTER: I guess when the bug bit it caused a terminal case of DXing interest. It hasn't been a "full speed ahead" situation all of that time, far from it. I think everyone has slumps, periods of a couple of weeks or even a few months when they couldn't care less. I certainly have. But then you get a good QSL in the mail, or something exciting happers on the bands, or you attend a get-together of other listeners and you're off and running again.

<u>SWC:</u> You hear so much about competition in the hobby, especially among the veterans, does co-editing the NU bulletin with Don provide the incentive to keep going?

<u>DEXTER</u>: I think statements about "competition among the veterans" is greatly overstated. There's friendly competition of course, but I haven't been aware of anything stronger than that. Co-editing NU does keep interest up because one is more involved so any doldrums which might exist don't last for long.

<u>SWC</u>: The latest edition of "The QSL Address Book" is out and, as expected, it's excellent. It obviously involves a great deal of work, What kind of preparation goes into it?

<u>DEXTER</u>: It was almost constant. Bulletins and other sources were checked every month for new information. Every six months or so during the time between the 3rd and 4th editions, this information was cut into strips and checked against the card file with any changes being made in that step of the process. That way the file was pretty much up to date when the time came to prepare the manuscript.

<u>SWC</u>: Did you find quite a bit of **difference between your addresses** and the ones listed in the WRTH?

<u>DEXTER</u>: I've never really made a comparison. An address is either right or it isn't I guess. I always try to use a P.O. Box or Apartado number as against a street address, when there's a choice.

<u>SWC</u>: I know you'll deny this, but you <u>are</u> considered an authority on QSLing and the hobby in general. Without giving away any secrets, what tips can you offer the DXer who wants to improve his reception reports and, consequently, his returns?

DEXTER: I deny it! I think this business of the deep, dark secrets of QSLing is a fallacy. If there is a secret it's simply to take an organized approach, to never abandon hope of one day cracking the station that just won't answer. It takes a great deal of patience and determination. Not many DXers are willing to send ten or even twenty follow-ups if necessary but sometimes that's what it takes.

<u>SWC:</u> Multiple follow-up reports seem like such a chore. Is it a simple matter of perseverance?

DEXTER: Yes, as I stated, perseverance is a large part of the answer. You just never know when a staff change or ownership change will take place and suddenly reports start getting answered. Often the enthusiasm for replying doesn't last long and if you've sent regular follow-ups your chances for being one of those receiving a reply are obviously improved.

<u>SWC</u>: With the large number of veries you've received over the years, I'm sure there are some that, for one reason or another, are borderline as far as counting them as legit veries. Where do you draw the line? When is a reply not really a verie?

<u>DEXTER</u>: I think you have to go with that old "what was the intent" philosophy. It's unrealistic to expect every little Latin or Indonesian to send you back the date, time and frequency on the QSL.

On the other hand, you can stretch "intent" too far. I don't think a Christmas card, or nothing but a pennant can in any way be construed as an intent to verify. I'd say any written or printed reply which refers to your letter or report and does not state or imply you didn't hear the station could be counted as a verification.

SWC: What have been the toughest veries to crack over the years?

<u>DEXTER</u>: Toughest? Too many of them. The Burma Broadcasting Service took 15 years during a period when Burma was even more closed off than now. It turned out permission to issue a QSL had to be obtained from what would be the equivalent of our Secretary of State! China took about ten years and John Moritz and I really bore down on the last two although the general opening up of the country had more to do with it than we did I expect. And there have been quite a number of others over the years, as well as a current list of stations I'm not too fond of at present.

SWC: Tell us about your latest projects in the world of clandestine broadcasting.

DEXTER: Well, there's a book called "Clandestine Confidential" coming or just published by Universal Electronics which offers some background on clandestine DXing, the history of some well-known clandestines, a survey of current activity, tips on QSLing and a list of station addresses. I'm also publishing an every-other-month newsletter of the same name which will deal with the current situation, new stations, frequencies, QSLing information and so on.

SWC: One frequently heard comment from would-be clandestine DXers is the reluctance of many to contact the political groups behind the stations since many are radical. Is this ever a concern of yours?

<u>DEXTER</u>: It hasn't been a concern for me. Maybe it should be! I can certainly understand the reluctance of some, especially those DXers located near where the groups are.

SWC: Is it safe to assume that clandestine veries, especially, are a "take what you get" situation? Where do you draw the line there?

<u>DEXTER</u>: I haven't found there's much difference in the content of replies from clandestines vs. other stations.

<u>SWC</u>: You have an amazing ability to come up with addresses for these type of stations. How do you do it?

<u>DEXTER</u>: I've been successful with a handful of them, no more. Basically it's simply a matter of asking myself who might have the information I need and then contacting them. It has involved a lot of letters and the reply rate is a lot lower than sending reports to South America!

SWC: Which clandestime stations are highest on your QSL "want list"?

DEXTER: Right now I'd say the three FDN stations - Quince de Septiembre, Miskut and La Voz de la Libertad.

<u>SWC</u>: How did your association with "Popular Communications" magazine develop?

DEXTER: I got a call from Tom Kneitel, the editor. I'm very grateful to him for the offer incidentally.

SWC: Has the magazine evolved into what you had hoped for or expected?

DEXTER: I had hoped it would be successful and from everything I hear, it is. I never expected it to be a totally DX-oriented publication. Had that been the intent the magazine wouldn't be around today. There just aren't enough DXers around to support that kind of publication effort.

101112 C SWC: So, what's ahead for Gerry Dexter?

DEXTER: There are two more books in the works which should be out during the summer. Beyond that there are some other possibilities in the "future file". Meantime I hope to finally hear Scotland via WMR and add some more Peruvian QSLs to the collection this year.

Gray-Line DXing the Tropical Bands

If you were an astronaut out in space and observed the earth, you would note that one half of the earth is always in shadow while the other half is always in daylight. The line between day and night, that divides the earth into dark and light is called the circle of illumination or terminator. This circle, actually a band, is called the gray line in the radio hobby.


For any site on earth the gray line is in effect twice a day, one hour in the morning - plus or minus x minutes from sunrise and then again in the evening - plus or minus x minutes from sunset. See graph Figure 1 for duration of winter gray line conditions at your latitude. Over the years Ham Operators and SWL's have noticed signal enhancement for propagation along the gray line. This is due to the fact that the D layer which absorbs high frequency signals is disappearing at the station on the sunset side of the gray line while it hasn't yet built up on the sunrise side. There are also additional reasons not yet fully understood.

The condition of approximately sunrise at your QTH and sun-set at the broadcast station or vice versa must exist or it's not gray line reception: For example, if you live in NYC and hear a station in Sao Paulo on 60 meters on 1 January at 2300 GMT, that is simply a full darkness path transmission.

The annual orbit of the Earth around the sun is more than 600 million miles and is responsible for our seasons. The axis of the Earth - that is, a line through the Earth from pole to pole - is inclined $23-1/2^{\circ}$ from the axis of the sun. This means that the Earth


GRAY LINE DXing (cont'd)

exposes different parts of itself to the direct rays of the sun in its yearly orbit. The Earth's orbit is counterclockwise around the sun and the $23-1/2^\circ$ inclination is outward, away from the axis of the sun. Therefore, the southern half of the Earth's surface is exposed to the direct rays of the sun on the right hand wing of the orbit, and the northern half is exposed on the left hand wing of the orbit. Note that the eccentricity of the orbit puts our Earth closer to the sun in winter than in summer.

The limits of maximum movement, north and south, of the direct rays of the sun are known respectively as the Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn. When the sun reaches its northern zenith on 21 June, the phenomenon is known as the summer solstice. It reaches its southern zenith on 21 December for the winter solstice. When the sun crosses the equator on 21 March it is called the vernal or spring equinox and the 21 September crossing is the autumnal or fall equinox. See Figure 2 for a graphic of this information.



GRAY LINE DXing (ount'd)

During a two year search I found much interest in gray line DXing but a paucity of information. However, I did find an excellent article by Peter Dalton et al in the September 1975 issue of CQ Magazime. Subsequently, the same information appeared in "The Shortwave Propagation Handbook" by Jacobs and Cohen, published by Cohan Publishing Corp.

To determine where the gray line is at your sunrise or sunset time. Dalton's method requires only a world globe, a table of the inclination of the Earth's axis in relation to the sun at about 15 day intervals (more frequently if you wish) and a few cardboard devices. For complete details see either of the sources mentioned above. Dalton has been DXing the gray line since 1966 and has worked 300 countries on 80 meters which attests the efficiency of the method plus his skill and enthusiasm.

In 1981 a device called "THE DX EDGE" came on the market. The "Edge" consists of a plastic map case plus twelve plastic overlays, one for each month. It's never out of date, you can easily determine those areas of the world which are in light and darkness at any time. Each plastic overlay has the shape of the gray line shown on it. By placing the gray line on your QTH at your sunset or sunrise time you can quickly determine those countries through which the gray line passes, offering a good chance for DX. Since this device is designed for hams and because of its small size, the sites are designated by country prefixes. Perhaps a larger, SWL version will be available in the future. I've made that suggestion to Mr. Anthony Japha, President of Xantec, Inc. Which produces "THE DX EDGE". One of the best uses I have found for this product is that one can determine at a glance if there is a full darkness path to a site you may be interested in. However, the ultimate feature is that you can determine if there is a time of the year when your QTH and a station which you want/need both lay on the gray line.

For the purpose of this article, I developed a simple method of determining the potential for gray line DXing. Since we want to know which sites are at sunset when it's sunrise at one's QTH, and vice versa, I simply tabulated those conditions on a chart for each month, based on data from a comprehensive sunset/sunrise table. Since the table was based on the 15th of each month, the same data was used for local sunrise/sunset time. You can get that from your local newspaper. Sunset/sunrise tables are available from many sources (some NASWA members offer them for sale).

Figure 3 is self explanatory. 15 January sunrise in Neenah, Wisconsin occurs at 1325 GMT. Concurrently, it is approximately sunset in Finland, Iran, Kuwait, etc. Similarly, when the sun sets at 2221 here, it is approximately sunrise in Bali, Tokyo, Taiwan, etc.

GRAY LINE DXing (cont'd)

Charts like these can be prepared for all twelve months in about 3 hours. Once prepared the charts are valid forever for a given QTH as the slight deviations of the Earth's orbit which occur yearly are of no significance for our purpose.

The beauty of these charts is that you are readily aware of when you have the best "shot" at some of the toughies like Bhutan, Maldives. etc.

My thanks to all who have encouraged the writing of this article and especially to Jack Jones who drew the graph for the winter gray line duration.

DXing in Europe ... not a whole lot different than DXing from North America. Or is it? Michael Schmitz is a German currently living in the Canary Islands. He offers a look at DXing from Europe. (JH)

EUROPEAN STATIONS

As a result of our different locations on the globe, DXing in Europe is quite different from DXing in the States. Europe, the Old World, offers a great number of countries, cultures and languages on relatively little space and this variety is also visible on our radio scale. Far distance receptions are usually made on the shortwave bands, but also medium wave offers a large amount of stations from different countries. Furthermore, Middle Eastern and North African countries can usually be heard on medium wave. Depending on reception conditions and equipment used, some West African and Central American stations can also be heard on medium wave. This article, which aims to inform you about reception in Western Europe, will therefore deal not exclusively with shortwave reception, but also medium wave.

DXing IN EUROPE (cont * 2)

More or less, every European country operates shortwave transmitters which are easy to receive in every part of Europe. These stations mainly use the 49 meter band for their broadcasts to Europe. This band (which is also called the "European shortwave band") offers the best reception conditions for Europe all day long. Many European stations have special European services or frequencies in the 49 meter band, such as Deutsche Welle-6075, Austria-6155, Swiss Radio Int'1-6165, Prague Interprogram on 6155, Radio France Int'1-6175, etc., where their program is broadcast to Europe all day long. Others operate only external services on shortwave, such as Radio Berlin Int'l, Norway, Finland, Sweden, etc. Of special interest are the regional services on shortwave, like the SSB service from Varberg in Sweden, the 5 West German ARD stations; Bayerischer Rundfunk, RIAS Berlin, Sender Freies Berlin, Suddeutscher Rundfunk and Sudwestfunk, or the Albanian shortwave transmitter at Gjirokaster. Not only does Austria operate the regional transmitter at Aldrans, which serves the mountain region of Tirol, but also a military station with regular programs in the 60 meter band. Italy offers quite an interesting field of activity. Since the Italian government is more tolerant with owners of private stations, the number of Italian stations has increased rapidly and is increasing still. Italian local stations are low-powered but well heard which may be a result of their out-of-band frequencies. Some of the Italian shortwave stations serve as relays for German or Dutch studios which are not allowed to operate their transmitters. Radio Milano International relays, for example, broadcasts of World Music Radio in the Netherlands or Radio Victory in West Germany. For the DXer interested in local programs, the medium wave offers the greatest field of activity. There are more than 70 local radio stations in the U.K. and many of them are receivable in the evening hours. There are a few low-power stations that make their way to the continent and therefore are special interest to the DXer. As an example, I want to mention the 250w transmitter of the Cardiff Broadcasting Corp. which sometimes reaches me on an overcrowded medium wave at a distance of more than 400 miles. Also remarkable is the QSL reply rate from the British local radio stations, which is close to 100%. Other interesting regional stations can be heard from Spain in the late evening hours. Spain has about 200 local radio stations and many of them can be heard in the winter nights. To close our medium wave roundabout, there are still the French FR3 regional stations which offer interesting programs and confirmations.

A changing number of hobby pirates from the U.K. and Ireland are on the air on Sunday mornings. They operate between 6200 and 6900 kHz and might therefore also be heard in the States. Ireland seems to have a dazzling law concerning radio transmissions and is therefore always good surprises either on medium wave or shortwave.

External Services: A Survey of Motives Part I

Around eighty countries are currently engaged in international broadcasting. Among these countries are members of the First and Second Worlds, along with an ever-increasing number of Third and Fourth World countries. These new members of the international broadcasting community have added to the problem of the overcrowding of the international broadcast bands and have very often, unfortunately, offered vry little in terms of programming in return.

Countries enter the field of international broadcasting for a variety of reasons. It should be noted that the apparent motives for international broadcasting set forth below are deduced from the monitoring of a number of external services. They are by no means mutually exclusive. Even when a high degree of overlapping does occur within a foreign service, however, one gets an impression of the general "tone" of the station by monitoring its programs.

The most obvious motive for international broadcasting is propaganda. Programming consists mainly of news and polit-ical commentary, with little (if any) time being devoted to the presentation of the national culture or to entertainment programs. News items are almost invariably selected to enhance the sending country's image in the eyes of the world.

A prime example of the use of an external service as a tool for propaganda is Albania's Radio Tirana. Tirana's programming generally consists of news about the implementation of past five-year plans and the successful completion ofstill other five-year plans. Political commentators lambast Washington, Bei-jing, and Moscow. Very little time is devoted to the presentation of the Albanian culture, the sole exception being an occasional Albanian pop tune. Indeed, if one were to describe the Albanian lifestyle based solely on the information presented by Radio Tirana, one would picture a xenophobic society with its members(all dressed alike and with perpetual frowns on their faces) carrying blueprints of the current five-year plan.

Another apparent motive for international broadcast-ing is to present "unvarnished" information. The BBC offers the primary example of this motive. Although the BBC also devotes a large amount of its air time to programs outside of the realm of news and information, it maintains at least eight different About Britain, The World Today, Radio Newsreel, Twenty-four Hours, Financial News, Review of the British Press, and numerous features concerning such subjects as newly-marketed products and advancements in medicine. One can fully appreciate the dynamic character of the BBC's information service when following a major world event, such as the war in Lebanon. The events in Lebanon were discussed, described, and analyzed in six of the seven programs mentioned above. The depth of the BBC's coverage of this event can only be rivalled by the print media.

The Electra Bearcat DX-1000

Divers and SWLs have waited in anticipation for the availability of the Electra Bearcat DX-1000 since it was first introduced at the ANARC Convention this past summer. Specifications, taken from the manufacturer's brochure were published in the October "Technical Topice". Unfortunately, production problems have caused numerous delays in getting this receiver to dealers. Finally, several firms are advertising the DX-1000 in the various amateur radio and shortwave-related magazines, with reviews having been made by <u>Bob Grove</u> of <u>Monitoring Times</u>, and <u>Larry Magne</u> on <u>RCI's "SWL Digest.</u>"

Bob Grove has provided us with a copy of his review at it appeared in the February issue of Monitoring Times. He mentions that it was obviously intended to compete with the eminently successful Kenwood R-2000, with a number of similar features including 10 memory channels, dual tuning speeds, FM and squelch modes. The DX-1000 offers some improvements over many of its' competitors including three selectivity bandwidths (12, 4, and 2.7 kHz) which may be selected regardless of mode. Total frequency coverage is 10 kHz through 30 mHz with somewhat reduced sensitivity below 150 kHz.

Frequency stability is extremely good, claimed to be 100 Hz per hour, which was confirmed by Bob. Tuning is accomplished by either direct-entry keypad or analog dial. Readout is to one kHz and memory is good to one kHz; a fine tuning control allows infinite resolution between the 100 Hz step increments.

Although the DX-1000 has image and IF rejection of at least 70 dB, it's high sensitivity results in susceptibility to intermod from strong in-band and out-ofband signals. Bob recommends that use of a preselector like the Grove TUN-3 Minitumer will help when the DX-1000 is used with an outside antenna. Alternatively, the frontpanel attenuation control may be used to eliminate the intermod interference with a sacrifice in sensitivity.

Audio quality is excellent; the tone control effectively skews bass and treble during its' rotation. The dual-position noise blanker allows a choice of time constants and rejects fast or slow pulse interference(i.e., electrical line noise or the Russian "woodpecker") on AM.

Synthesizer noise is quite prominent while tuning the receiver on AM as the 100 Hz steps interrupt the signal path, but this annoyance does not affect the performance of the receiver once the dial is set.

Overall, the receiver packs a number of features for the SWL and, while not a communications receive: in the strictest sense, the DX-1000 will provide reliable reception of all signal modes.

The DX-1000 lists for \$ 599.95, available for \$ 499.00 from Grove Enterprises.

Larry Magne recently reviewed the DX-1000 on <u>RCI's "SWL Digest.</u>" Larry mentions that the DX-1000 has two 24 hour clocks, one for UTC, the other for local time, plue 5 On/off frequency comfigurations to allow listening to favorite programs. This timer can also control the operation of a tape recorder.

Dynamic range was found to be moderate, largely due to the lack of adequate highpass filtering, as mixing products from within the medium-wave AM band appear in the shortwave ranges between 2-3 and 6-8 mHz. The -20 to -40 dB attenuator cures this, but it also reduces the sensitivity. Larry mentions that an RF gain control, or less coarse attenuator would have been better, but a relatively short antenna will suffice. f the three I.F. selectivity positions provided, the narrowest works reasonably for listening in conjested situations. The 6 kHz, however, has modest skirt ctivity. The 12 kHz position is too wide for SWBC reception, but is appropriate FM reception of amateur or commercial FM services.

here is no built-in A.C. power supply, but an AC/DC wall transformer is included, h has the minor disadvantage that AC fields tend to be more easily picked up by antenna than when the power supply is inboard and thus shielded by the receiver l wrap-around. The set can also be powered by 8 "D" size alkaline batteries, battery drain is high, in fact, $2\frac{1}{2}$ times that of the Sony 2001. Rechargeable i batteries do not provide adequate voltage to power the set properly.

SB tuning is further aided by the excellent analog fine tuning control which rpolates between the 100 Hz synthesized tuning increments.

here are a few software peculiarities: The memory requires 3 buttons to activate, going from one memory channel to another requires depressing of 6 buttons. The t, which shares the digital counter with the frequency readout is activated by a on. This button also returns the tuning to the keypad mode from the analog tuning mode. Unfortunately this requires retuning following each time check. unately, this only affects reception of SSB, CW, and broadcasts tuned by exalted ier. This can be avoided by dialing in 1 kHz rather than 100 Hz increments and using the analog fine tuning control for all interpolations between 1 kHz points.

arry L. Hartwell, Lompoc, CA writes that he acquired a DX-1000. He mentions that c pictures show the receiver as black and tan, but it is in fact black -trimmed aluminum. Harry uses it with a McKay-Dymek DA-100D active antenna and a McKayk DS1ll external speaker. He also uses a Mosley SWL-7 in addition to the DA100D. Inds that the receiver is better than the Gilfer-modified Yaesu FRC-7000 that ad used previously. For the money, it is an excellent choice for those who don't to venture into the one or two thousand dollar class. Since you can go directly any frequency to any other frequency without bandswitching, it is quick and to operate.

nsinger, Summit, NJ sends additional information on the Sony 2002 portable:

rhaps more than anything else, the 2002 is a true travelers' delight: compact, slim, built-in LCD clock with sleep and alarm functions, AM and FM to complement d SW reception, and ten very handy memory presets for your favorite stations in wand, including FM.

ensitivity: using either AA or C batteries, sensitivity is only fair, with the t-in whip antenna fully extended. I would hope that peak performance occurs with use of internal batteries and the whip antenna, with a small receiver of this . Unfortunately, sensitivity is very limited under these conditions. The 2002 ot supplied with an AC adapter, so performance in that mode is not known.

Sattery life: the manual states that four AA cells will last approximately twelve of listening time. To compensate for this short battery life, Sony provides a rypack and connector. This unit holds four C cells and plugs into the left side e 2002. By using C cells, battery life increases to approximately 40 hours of ning time. While this is a substantial improvement, the battery clip is large, st one-third the size of the 2002) thus it can be seen that all of the advantages ze and portability of the 2002 are sacrificed by this rather unusual idea. Perhaps appy medium is to use AA alkaline batteries, maintaining the advantages of ultrability, while swallowing the cost of alkaline batteries these days.

uning increments: the LCD display can only read frequencies to 5 kHz. Any ency in between a 5 and 0 must be manually adjusted, using a fine-tuning control, on the right side of the 2002. Thus, if one wishes to tune to 9912 kHz, isplay will read either 9910 or 9915, depending on your choice. The remaining g must be done by hand, and a certain amount of built-in guessing is required termine if you are on the frequency desired. This is an advantage of the 2001 the 2002.

iniaturized controls: the clock setting is made difficult by the extremely small ns which must be pushed and their positioning close to one another. This condition occurs on the right side of the receiver for SSB and fine tuning. The mini ols are so small that one must possess the smallest and thinnest of fingers der to properly use them. The listener with large hands is at an unfortunate vantage and might become frustrated. In all fairness to the 2002, this is a one must pay for a small, compact receiver. Cost: the 2002 can be purchased at a discount electronics supplier for under \$ 200. In terms of cost vs. performance, the price is high. There are also obvious advantages which Sony built into the 2002 that deserve mentioning.

Selectivity: perhaps the strongest point of the unit after portability. The selectivity is very good and easily outperforms the 2001 in this respect. I was surprised at how well the filter system reduced nearby interference.

Memory presets: Sony has cleverly designed ten memory presets into the 2002- one for each entry key. This feature is further enhanced by the ability to simultaneously program FM stations into the memory as well. Thus, one could program the 2002 for six shortwave, two medicum-wave, and two FM stations, all accessible at the touch of a button.

LCD clock: what might at first appear to be an extra accessory or gadget on the 2002, the clock is actually a useful, integral part of the radio. Besides having the time at your fingertips, the clock can be programmed as an alarm for waking or turning the unit on in-time for your favorite station. The clock runs on 2 AA cells, can be syncronized with WWV or CHU, and can be adjusted for 12 or 24 hour format. The manual lists battery life for the clock at approximately one year.

Audio quality: despite its' size, the 2002 puts out crisp, clean audio, especially appreciated on FM. There is also a switch to adjust the audio spectrum frequency response from "music" to "news". The audio quality is, however, slightly reduced on the SWBC bands, due to the presence of an internally-generated hiss commonly found with small transistorized portables.

Dual frequency display: a very useful added bonus on the 2002 is the display of both frequency and meter band when tuning a shortwave station. For example, when tuned to WWV on 5000 kHz, the display will read also read 60 meters in the lower left corner. The meter bands are also listed on the back of the receiver, along with a map and time zones.

True portability: as stated at the outset, the Sony ICF-2002 is truly a portable receiver in terms of size and weight. The SWL who travels alot will welcome its' size and features. It will indeed make an excellent travelling companion.

The February issue of CQ Magazine carried an ad on the back cover announcing the new Icom <u>IC-R/IA</u> receiver. At first glance, the obvious changes from the R-70 appear to be the addition of a keypad frequency-entry system in the space that previously held the speaker, and the addition of 32 programmable memory channels in place of the R.I.T. control. There are separate buttons (left side) that provide selection of USB and LSE, plus choices of wide or narrow filter bandwidths. It will be interesting to see if the narrow bandwidth filter is operable on AM, and if retuning will be required when switching from AM or LSB to USB, as in the R-70. One very interesting option is the IC-RC 11 infrared remote control (wireless) which appears to be similar to a large calculator, and allows access to mode, frequency, and memory recall at some distance removed from the receiver.

<u>William McMahon</u> of Oxnard, GA sent a copy of the ad, and asks "Aren't you glad you didn't buy an R70 last summer? - or did you?" Well, Bill, I didn't buy an R-70 last summer, I bought one January 24th, just a few weeks ago. This set replaces an R-390A, so it is, in fact, quite a change for me. In spite of the R70's idlosyncrasies, it is a fine receiver and I doubt that it will become obsolete in the near future. Incidentally, I got the FL44 filter while brother John has an earlier production model without the sharper filter. The improvement in selectivity when using the pass-band tuning (PET) with the sharper filter is obvious to our ears. The most dramatic example was extracting audio from a 60 meter tropical band station covered by an annoying TVI het. We also found that it was possible to extract low-powered Latins operating slightly off-frequency from dominating stations by tuning one kHz higher or lower and off-setting the PET for best readability.

BROADCASTING IN NEWFOUNDLAND, CANADA

In 1949, Newfoundland became the tenth Province of Canada. The province covers some 156,000 square miles and consists of the island of Newfoundland and the much larger Labrador portion of the Province on the continental mainland. Newfoundland is located in a time zone unique in North America, that is half an hour later than atlantic time or 1-1/2 hours later than eastern time. This is the only place in North America with a split in the variations of one hour between time zones. Knowledge of the split time zone interval is a useful devise to help identify a station as being located in this area.

Historic Newfoundland was part of some great accomplishment in communications. In 1866, the cableship "Great Eastern" landed the first successful transatlantic cable at the Trinity Bay settlement in Heart's Content. In 1901, Newfoundland hosted Guglielmo Marconi's experiment when he received the first transatlantic wireless signal at Cabot Tower on Signal Hill, overlooking the harbour and city of St. Johns. Signal Hill was the receiving point for the first ship-to-shore wireless telephone transmission when in 1920, listeners at Signal Hill heard a concert aboard the liner Victorian at sea.

At first radio broadcast in Newfoundland was aired over station VOS in St. John's on July 9, 1922. Ten years later, on November 14, 1932, Radio Station Vonf, which is still in existence today as CBN in St. John's, became the first outlet of the Dominion Broadcasting Corporation. In 1939, this became the Broadcasting Corporation of Newfoundland, the BCN, a publicly owned corporation. The BCN and the CBC joined together in 1949.

Presently, there are 32 AM radio transmitters in Newfoundland and Labrador ranging in power from 40 watts to 10 kilowatts. This enables the CBC to cover about 97% of Newfoundland. In addition, there is a shortwave outlet - CKZN broadcasting in the 49 meter band at 6160 kHz - operating out of St. John's that carries the same programs as CBN.

CBC's Manager of Regional Engineering, Dave Uttaro, says he receives reception reports from listeners in North America and Europe. The Newfoundland stations that receive the most numerous reports are:

The January issue had a listing by country 11-1/2 pages in length, with the listing by time 21 pages long. In addition, the January issue had 2 additional lists presenting the broadcasts to North America extracted from the main lists. Over 40 pages of data were included in the January issue. Presently, plans are for the Harch issue to also have all four lists, though the smaller extractions of broadcasts to North America likely will not always be included. The main lists, by country and by time, will, however, be included in each issue.

GESB is published every other month. Cost of a single issue is \$3.00, or six issues for \$15.00, in North America. It is available overseas by airmail; rates available on request. 

Pretty good signal on morning when lots of other Peruvians were also in. (Relphus, TX)+++R. Huanta 2000, in SP on 4754 and reactivated on this frequency 2-3 at 1110 v/ clear ID, ex-4746, ex-4754. (Ralphus, TX)+++R. Madre de Dios, 4950, in SP daily at *1030 w/ moderate power. Opens w/ brighter version of OA na than usually heard, then over orch playing "Tonight We Love" M anner as follows: "desde el Centro de Medios de Comunicacion Social, una voz al servicio del pueblo, OAX7L en la banda de 60 metros 4950 kcs onda corta, OAX7J...onda media...desde nuestro estudios en Puerto Maldonado...muy buenos dias, senoras y senores...nosotros iniciamos nuestra emision corespondiente al dia de hoy...".(Ralphus, TK)+++R. Los Andes, 5030, in SP 0316 1-29; answering Finnish listener's letter. (Ralphus, TX)+++LVdel Altpiplano, 5815, in SP 1030 1-23 w/ bassy, Puno-style husyno followed M anner w/ 5:30 t/c. (Ralphus, TX)+++R. Colonial, 61373, city of Nueva Cajamarca, Depto. San Martin, finally IDed after a month of trying. First noted 1-9 and later on 1-17, 2-1, 2-4 and 2-6. Rough part is that this seems a nominal #1200 though often heard before that w/ segued Peruvian folkloric melodies until 1200 opening ID. But this is getting fairly late for OA path and latest signal held up was to 1220. Have heard carrier s/on variously at 1126, 1150, 1158, 1149 but never annumts before 1200. Several interesting items in our feature spots this month. First from Ralph Perry some interesting information about a Peruvian station and network. Then from Hitoshi Miyashita in Tokyo, more information on clandestine stations being hrd in Japan. Finally, but certainly not least, we have more of the superb LAM DX reports from Juan Carlos Codina. Enjoy!

Upon hearing R. Esmeralds on 4501.8 last August, I wrote to LV Nasca (listed on 4495 kHz) a brief postal card asking how I might hear them since many attempts had brought no Nasca. Out of the blue, a lengthy reply to my postcard has just arrived from the Director General, Sr. Ing. Fernando Cruz Rondinel, which covers the following:

(a) LV de Nasca, nominal 4495, is not yet on SW due to no SW authorization from gov't yet. However, they are operating on a "provisional" MW freq of 1530kHz although they are licensed on 1510. Sr. Cruz says they are at times emitting harmonics in the SW spectrum, he believes. The stn has received reports for "LV Nasca" from Portugal, Australia and South Africa, but all indicated freqs between 4500 and 4502, which means Esmeraldas. Sr. Cruz thinks that Nasca's harmonics may be sudible beyond Peru's borders.

(b) Second, Sr. Cruz states that he is the manager of technical quality for the network "Emisoras Cruz del Peru," to which LV Nasca is affiliated. He would like to receive recep-

tion reports from abroad (including tapes--about 15 feet of tape w/ no cassettes)on the affiliates and promises he will verify the same. Stns in network are: R. La Voz de Husmanga, 6070 on letterhead but "6199 mueva frecuencia" acknowledged by Cruz, Ruancavelica, 4885, LV Nasca 4495, R. Mineria 6145 "en operacion (111)", Andina, 4996, Andahusylas, 4840, R. La Voz del Chire, 1490 MW and R. Horizonte, 4785 ("no opera hasta nuevo aviso"). Address formetwork reports c/o LV Nasca to Sr. Cruz attention. (Ralph Perry, TX)

From Hitoshi Miyashita our reguler report of clandestine stns plus a bit more besides:

VoNujshedin Khalgh, #1725-1900*, now using 4190nf // 6600v. Hy earlier report of this in 1300-1500 slot seems to be VoIranian Kurdistan. 4190 first noted January 12. Correct early sked for this is #1300-1430* and its opening and closing theme is the same as "VoI Iraqui Kurdistan."

R. Iran (via Iraq) noted 1-20 *1332-1435* on 11775, 9594.9, 7180.6. Always check + 10 MHz if not noted on first try.

OTHER AREAS

Lace National Radio-Hous Phan, 4656v and 6141v, noted around 1200. 6141 intermittently used since December 1983. The signal on 4656 is good but there is much QRM. Tax Toshiyuki Watanabe, who specializes in Indochinese stas.

Mauritius MBC noted 1730-1835 on 4855.3 varying down from 4859. Usually s/off after NAbet on 1-18 s/off was preceded by 2x IS chimes. And, on 1-22 s/off was later by one hour.

We conclude with our regular feature from Juan Carlos Codina; whose reports this time are from January:

3249.5 HOHDURAS R. Lus y Vida reading reception reports 0040 including one from John Moritz. 4554.8 BOLIVIA Although previously moted with poor modulation, this one has cleared, though heavily distorted yet but did get the following: "Esto es Bolivia," and later "informs tu Nueva America." Finally IDed as R. Nueva America and confirmed because style is similar to big city stns, but this does not conform to any harmonic of the MW freq of 840, which gives a clear harmonic on 2520.2 here in Lima. I believe that this is a genuine SW b'cast rather than a spurious or harmonic. Also noted listed 4796.5 but very poor there. This much stronger.

4898.1 PERU R. San Juan de Caraz, Caraz, Ancash; end of year prgm going late to 0222.

- 5224.5 OCIONSIA La Voz del Caucaya, Laguiasmo; also with special new year's prgms at 0330%. 5339.9 FERU LV del Nororiente, Peru noted as follows: this one, originally on 5340 even moved very slightly and was noted 1-1 from as early as 2000 w/ usual anner Mario Centnrion who is also owner, disc jockey, technician and all else! Asked for children of town to come and sing at stn. Suddenly, however, ID was given for Radio Continental, an obvious change from previous ID. Later heard explanation. Got a final annent at 2200 as follows: "Asi finaliza su primera transmision corpspondiente al dia de hoy, Radio Continental, que transmite desde Andabamba, Santa Cruz, Cajamarca, Peru, quedamos muy reconocidos por so sintonia." Then anned back on at 2300for second transmission of the day. Same people at makes, same theme mx and so on so what this implies, I think, ás that this is a mobile xmtr or that our anner has changed his address. Not entirely sure yet but believe the former. This is what makes DXing the Peruvians so much fun-and drives people like crazy. Later heard Nororiente ID again'!!
- 5505.1 BOLIVIA Radioemisors 2 de Febrero, Rurrenabaque; Heard opening with a mass 0000
- 5879 PERU R. Bolivar, Cajabamba varying from here to 5870 to everywhere else from 2300-2306* w/ strong signal but very distorted.
- 6546.8 ECUADOR RJ-1, LV de la Juventud, Loja, noted 2100-2300 1-1 and again 1-5 w/ political annumts, mentioning Gonzanama, Catacocha and Canton Platas, so I presumed this stn is located in the Canton Paltas and the Catacocha area.
- 7308.3 PERU Radio Selva, Moyobamba, San Martin, noted here on a stable basis for about a week closing G450* after heving moved as high as 7309.7 and as low as 7308.5.

Thanks again to this fine corps of reporters who knops you informed with the bast DK news anywhere. Stay tuned for more next time.

Hi everyone. I hope that Santa was good to you and brought you that new receiver or QSL. I have a letter from Norman Bobb of Minneapolis that describes an odd antenna....take it Norm.....

It uses 6 lengths of bell wire (2 each of 30,20, 10 feet) which make two cables by loosely winding the 20 foot lengths around the 30 and 10 feet lengths around the both of them. One cable is strung near the ceiling of the living room and one in the bedroom with connected ends of cable elements near the bedroom door. The central part is a 15 foot extension cord with plug end removed and can be connected to cable ends and hang down and pass under the bedroom and then plugged into the central part socket (WHOA!!! I hope you are referring to your antenna connection on your receiver- otherwise a serieous shock hazard could result. mja). I believe..this gives me 3 T antennas of 90, 70, and 50 foot counting the cables and the central part and adding up the footage involved.

Ingeniuos, no? With the caveat expressed above, that might just work out- particularly if a tuner could be coaxed into the act. Just keep well away from any AC wiring and everything should be kosher. To complete this item, I could use more stuff like this from the membership. mja
