The Northeast is, as I write this, being treated to an ugly and oppressive bout of hot and humid weather. Even listening to the radio is an unpleasant occupation: after a moment or two, you find yourself wrapped in a pall of heavy, dead air; perspiration is cascading down your back; and atmospheric interference is making even the international broadcast bands sound like the 120mb on a bad day. Well, if this is the case as you're reading this, go sit in a nice, cool, and breezy place and mull over the interesting letters that we've received this month...

Robert Horvitz (ANARC Government Affairs Liaison, 1634 15th Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20009; (202) 232-3677) has again thoughtfully provided us with a press release (dated 23 June 86) dealing with the lastest position taken by ANARC with respect to the recent modifications to the Electronic Communications Privacy Act-1986(ECPA-86):

In a brief and sparsely attended session today, the US House of Representitives, by voice vote, passed HR4952, ECPA-86. There was no debate, and no amendments were offered from the floor.

The bill had been favorably reported out of the House Judiciary Committee on 10 June, on a vote of 34-0. The Subcommittee on Courts, Civil Liberties, and the Administration of Justice, chaired by Rep. Robert W. Kastenmeier, developed HR4952

Senator Patrick Leshy has introduced an identically-worded bill, \$2575, for consideration by the Subcommittee on Patents, Copyrights, and Trademarks. A Subcommittee aide "expects it to move pretty quickly," with a mark-up session likely sometime after July 14th, following Congress' holiday recess.

The Association of North American Radio Clubs opposes the radio provisions of the bill. By absorbing radio into the larger legal category of "electronic communications," and making it illegal to "intercept" electronic communications except for the types specified in HR4952, the bill would overturn a fundamental assumption that has governed radio reception since the first radio law was passed in 1912: that is, if someone can receive a signal in their home, they may do so. The ECPA-86 would make it a crime to detact some of the signals passing through our very bodies, by declaring them to be not "readily accessible to the general public," even though in fact they are readily accessible.

The Justice Department has indicated that enforcement of the radio provisions of the bill would be virtually impossible, except in cases of egregious violations. The FCC (which was not invited to tastify on the House bill) has suggested that the Communications Act of 1934, which permits reception but not divulgence or beneficial use, is an appropriate standard for the protection of communications when the method of transmission itself makes the communication available to anyone within range.

Also vigorously opposed to the bill is the Communications Security Association, which says that it is "ludicrous" to think that an unenforceable law can have any deterrent effect.

My thanks, again, to Robert Horvitz and all others involved for their hard work on our behalf. Were you struck, as I was, by the observation that the FCC was not invited to testify? Surely, the FCC is ideally situated to view this problem most clearly and offer the most telling opinions concerning any piece of communications legislation. It sounds to me like somebody's mind is already made up, and they don't want to be bothered by facts...

A few other comments. One member suggested putting out feelers to our State Department and suggested Grenada as a possible site. No, let's keep this nonpolitical. Our State Department need not have anything to do with the project, and donating a transmitter to Grenada could taint the project in the eyes of the countries that do not agree with U.S. actions there.

I liked Mike Nikolich's idea of a travelling transmitter. It would provide a lot of new DX targets. However, I think the amount of paperwork involved would be horrendous. First you have to convince the local version of the FCC to grant you frequencies. Also convince everybody that you're not a part of a CIA plot. Arrange to bring the transmitter through customs. Just because the station says that everything is ready for you to come, doesn't mean they've taken the time to check into those things. Third World bureaucracies can be mindboggling!

Finally, a letter from Sam Alcorn (Maplewood, New Jersey) with a number of issues we'll have to address:

Ever since Gerry Bishop suggested supplying a transmitter to a country or organization live been dreaming about chasing the likes of Bermuda, Jamaica, or Grenada on shortwave. I've thought about the British and U.S. Virgin and St. Kitts as well. I, for one, would like to see it happen.

I don't care which country gets the transmitter because I think if one country can prove that it helped to attract tourist dollars, others may begin thinking that a shortwave station is just as important as advertising in the Sunday newspaper travel section. But it has to be proven a useful tool in attracting tourism. Maybe the Curação Tourist Board can provide data as to how its advertising on R. Earth contributed to Curação's economy.

Let's keep the programming simple. Rebroadcasting a few hours of the local commercial broadcaster's program each evening with appropriate ID's at the start and conclusion of each broadcast will save production costs and eliminate headaches that go along with creating another broadcast. And, after all, it is the local flavor we shortwave listeners want most. I don't care about slick programming. Let me know the local news, weather, politics, and music. (That's why I like R. Cayman 1555kHz, and R. Grenada 535kHz, so much.)

Funding is a real stickler. Perhaps with the Caribbean Basin initiative someone can coax the money from Uncle Sam, or pick up used equipment from the government. Maybe the project could be implemented with assistance from U. S. military personal (they put R. Grenada back on AM again), the Peace Corps or one of the missionary groups in the region. (If a missionary group is involved, I suggest that the facility not be used to broadcast religious-type programming. You can hear enough of the Gospel elsewhere on the dial.)

Another funding source might be hobbyists themselves. As the Reagan Admistration has argued, let those who use the facilities pay for the facilities. If ANARC can convince member organizations like NASWA to add \$1 or so the each subscription or membership, I'm sure enough cash can be raised for a transmitter. If not, why not ask the equipment manufacturers or suppliers who profit from the hobby to put something back in the way of a no-strings-ettached donation?

There's been enough talk about the idea. Let's do something about it. Count me in for support and letter-writing.

Well, in view of the issues raised by these, and all of the previous, letters, perhaps it is time to begin to establish some goals, priorities, and to begin to fix the principles on which this project should be based. Here goes:

- \$1. This project should be as independent as possible from non-radio/SWL organizations: our purpose is to help the country/organization with our talents and not to further the goals of yet a third party (too many cooks...).
- \$2. Monies raised for this project, therefore, could most easily come from the membership of one or more radio clubs: an <u>optional</u> membership or subscription surcharge of \$1 to \$2 ought to do the trick (optional because no idea, no matter how good, ought to be rammed down people's throats).

SUNDAY

- 1415--1435: "Echoes of Korean Music" (Radio Korea). This program alternates its focus on pop and traditional Korean music. Commentary between songs is devoted to Korean culture and special cultural events in Korea. (15.575/ 9.750)
- 0110-0115: "Letter from Berling" (Deutsche Welle). The usual"Letter from-" format. A loosely structured essay about events current in West Berlin, including current charges against the mayor of West Berlin, cultural events, and other items of newsworthy significamce.(6.040/6.035/6.145/9.545. Repeated at 0310 on 5.960/6.010/ 9.545/9.565/9.640 and at 0510 on 5.960/6.120/6.130)

MONDAY.

- 0010--0030: "Matters of Faith" (Radio Australia). Unlike so many evangelicistic programs current on shortwave, this program takes a more cerebral approach to religion in general rather than Christianity per se. Past programs have featured such items as the ordination of women in the Anglican church, customs of Ramadan and the growth of Islam in Australia, and also features on the belief systems of the indigenous peoples of the South Pacific. (15.320/17.795)
- 0230-0245: "Spotlight" (Voice of Free China). Each week features an interview and some songs of either a current Chinese pop or folk artist or sometimes a musician visiting Taiwan (one series of programs featured the American singer "Lobo" who was giving a concert in Taiwan). Usually the interview will cover two to three weeks of programs, and autographed pictures of the featured artist are frequently available on request. Also, they play some of the songs. (5.985/9.680)

TUESDAY

- 1215-1225: "Airmail" (Radio Finland International). The usual mailbag corner program. Reads letters from a worldwide audience (not exclusively North American), summarizes part of the letter and reads some exerpts verbatim. Also answers some questions briefly and occasionally in some detail. (15.400/11.945. Repeated at 13 and 1400 on the same frequencies).
- 1300-1315: "Belgium Today" (BRT). A current events program covering three items per day as a general rule. Past features have included nuclear arms storage in Belgium, terrorism (especially that of the "Fighting Communist Cells"), obituaries of famous Flemmings, etc. (15.590. Also M-F; on 9.830 at 0030). T-Saturday.

WEDNESDAY

2030-2100: "Music at Your Request" (Radio Moscow). This program alternates with "Listeners' Request Club". Unlike "LRC", "Music at Your Request" plays requests for classical music only (sometimes only exerpts for lengthy pieces). Almost every edition includes

some work or exerpt of a work by Tschaikowsky. (11.840) Every other we

0135-0140: "Visitors in Cuba" (Radio Havana Cuba). This program is a continued series of interviews with those who are visiting Cuba, usually for some professional reason like a conference or convention. Stresses the benefits of a socialist system in Cuba. (6.100/6.140/9.740. Repeated at 0335 and 0535 on 6.100/6.090/9.740)

THURSDAY


- 0015-0020v: "The Struggle for National and Social Liberation" (R. Tirana). A long title for a fairly short program. Focuses on revolutionary movements in other countries, including Paraguay, Panama, Greece, etc. (7.065/9.760. Repeated at 0245 on 7.120/9.760)
- 0145-0150: "Book Choice" (BBC). This program reviews current releases in the publishing world. Both fiction and non-fiction works are reviewed, and the quality of the review (written by different people each week) is what you've come to expect from the BBC. (5.975/6.175)

FRIDAY

- 0120-0130: "Cultural Review" (Radio Prague). A review of the current cultural events in Czechoslovakia, including a jazz festival, a puppeteers convention, and an interview with John Updike who was visiting Prague. Actually one of the better programs I've heard on Radio Prague. (5.930/7.345/11.990)
- 0225-0230: "The Land and the People" (Radio Beijing). A special features programming, concentrating more on human interest than current affairs. Past programs have featured traffic problems in Beijing, the Beijing telephone operators, courtyard homes in Beijing, andthe survivors of an earthquake ten years after the event. I find this program to be quite interesting, but then I find anything to do with Asian culture interesting. (9.635/6.015 RFI relay. Broadcast earlier in the day direct from China at 1125 on 9.535, at 1225 on 9.535/9.640, and at 0425 on 15.445)

SATURDAY

- 1330-1335a. "Periscope" (BRT). I have no idea where this program got its title. It is a five minute look at current events, includir trade with Libya, the European Union (different from EEC), and other events of current newsworthy significance. (15.590. BX earlie on Friday at 0100 on 9.830)
- 0230-0245: "DX Corner" (Radio Japan). A good, solid DX program that includes a feature on the "ABC's of DXing" for the novice, special features on different stations, essays written by members of Japan's DX clubs on a variety of topics of interest to SWLs, and Reception Reports (usually three per program). The main fault I find with this program is that all reception reports are of stations heard in Japan rather than from a world wide audience, and thus the use to North Americans is a bit limited. Still a good program. (15.195/15.420/17.825).



LET'S PLAY POST OFFICE or LETTERS.WE GET LETTERS

Well by now some of you have noticed that I did not make it up to ANARCON 86. There was a great deal of discussion in the World Court at the Hauge about letting me out of the country being an act of aggression toward a foreign nation. See wiz...You perform a few indiscretions at one international convention and your pegged for life. I mean we could have blamed all those things on A*C*E, right? All kidding aside, personal and financial commitments got in the way this year. (Remember, we don't get paid for this folks) Just wait till next year. I am still on tap for the National Radio Club Convention in Delaware over Labor day so I'll see you there.

I received a lot of great feedback from the Gilfer/ E.A.R.S. SWL-FEST held in June. Keep up the good work folks. Why should the hams

have all the fun?

Anyway, this month I promised to dip into the old mail bag and actually get around to answering some of your questions.

Jim Feely is the proud owner of a Kenwood R-2000 and he asks a few questions pertaining to its use that apply to many of the new breed of communications receivers.

The first question is; Why does the Kenwood have an AGC Fast

switch and a squelch control?

Well Jim the reason is primarily that Kenwood expects a bigger market for this gear then us lowly shortwave freaks. As an SWL person you can basically ignore those two buttons except when you want to impress some YL with your radio prowess. (And over here, sweetheart, we got the AGC control. See how my bicep flexes when I turn it over to the fast position...) These features are geared to the Amateur radio operator. The AGC Fast control is used for listening to CW and SSB signals and the Squelch is used for net operations but in the case of the R-2000 it mainly exists for use with the UHF/FM converters that are available for this rig. If you do any Ham listening or follow point to point utilities you will find a use for these controls but much beyond that, don't stop just smile as you go by.

Jim also informs us that he is using a Grove Mini Tuner 3, Realistic External Speaker, and Drake LF-2 linefilter. Jim goes on to ask, Why are these features not included in radios of this quality?

Yo Jim, I already told you that you have two switches more then you need. Actually these are all fine additions that cost you just under \$100 to add to your set up. Of course they could be added at the factory and of course the price would go up and of course less people would buy the radio etc., etc. I had the chance to talk with some Folks in the marketing strategy end of the home electronics industry and they lean toward putting out a piece of hardware geared to the broadest audience possible leaving the extras to the options end of the market. Take your own R-2000 for example. If you were the kind of DXer that used tuned dipoles for specific bands and listening strategies would you then go out and buy a receiver with a built in tuner? A tuner that has raised the price of the radio by \$50+ dollars over a similar competitor? Or if you were a headphones only listener why would you want to spend extra cash on a speaker you will never use? I do agree with Jim on one point. I think a line filter should be built in. When your selling a piece of equipment that can potentially fritz out from a line surge when your neighbors air conditioner kicks in, it would seem to be good engineering to add a line filter. I guess it all comes down to costs against profits. But anyone who is operating a modern receiver without a surge protector must really get their jollys out of driving down to the service center.

Our next letter comes from Emily H. Bershad. She is having recording trouble. She can't seem to get the signal of her Panisonic RF 3100 successfully over to her Panasonic QQ 2 309A Recorder. Emily states that she is using the recommended RP 024 patch cord but she comes up with a signal that is too low in gain. She points out that the gain on the Record Out jack is set on the RF 3100 and wants to know if the output level can be changed in the receiver.

To answer the last question first, Yes but it is a pain in the lower parts. On most gear the gain is internally reduced to the input jack, usually through some manner of resistor network. This is supposed to result in a signal that will not distort when dumped to a recorder. This reduced gain can also occur via a resistor network built inline into some commercially available patch cords. In the case of the gear you are using, Emily, I would first get ahold of a VOM meter and check to see if that RP 024 patch cord isn't reducing an already reduced signal. The cable should show no resistance end to end. If it is resistive you could get a straight through patch cord at your local Radio Shack. The other possibility is that there may be an impedence mismatch. The output of the RF 3100 is low (4-8 ohms) check your recorders manual and make sure your input jack is also low. Once again if everything doesn't look kosher you can find an impedence matching transformer at the local electronics outlet or stereo store. Still no good huh? Well if you must you can look over the schematic of the radio and you will find a two resistor circuit just ahead of the output jack. You can try juggling these values until you get the desired effect. When I was deeply involved in Medium Wave DXing I was fond of modifying the Radio Shack TRF AM portables. I found the output levels to be so different from radio to radio that no two ended up with the same resistance values wired in. But there is a cheap and dirty, good old fashion way do get your signal if you already have a signal reducing patch cord on your hands. You can just hook it up across the antenna terminals or jack in through the headphone jack and you may get what your looking for. Without the specs on the recorder and cord I'm kind of half in the dark on this one. Sorry I can't be of more help, but the challenge of sorting this problem out is right up the alley of a first time radio modifier. In this case most anything you try will not result in a puddle of melted components and you can learn a great deal from the experimentation. My suggestion to anyone with a similar problem is to not go into the rig but buy some jacks to give you access to all the signal outputs, earphone, headphone, tape, etc. and conduct your experiments with resistance or impedence from these points. You will develop a healthy respect for ohms law along the way.

UN obs arrived in Asunción 9/6 to hold talks w/reps of various sectors of the citizenry on HR in Pg. Pg govt has declared the UNobs to be its guest of honour and he attended several

receptions the authorities held in his honour. Monitoring 16-18/6: Selective jamming of RN nx reports obs 16/6; intensified markedly 22-2330 17/6 when Rubín was hrd to say: "Well, this is democracy. This is freedom. This is the everyday life of the country itself. So, what more can you ask for, you cannot listen to what you want to listen to, those of you who follow this radio's broadcasts. No one is deceived, and there is no need to deceive ... These interruptions will not continue very long. Everything is going to be resolved soon, and tapes we cannot be now we will surely be sooner than people think; in a much shorter time than even the pirate thinks. We will be on the air with everything Nandutí has in its archives and it will be an historical event. In a much shorter time than people think we will be offering all the info we want to disseminate in ab solute freedom." During the 18/6 22-2330 nx, Rubin told his interviewee: "This is freedom of the press and expression as understood by pirates. If you want to continue, we are recording your words. This recorded material is being be by another SAm stn. We are sending them apx 7 cassettes a week. If you want to speak to us keeping this in mind, please go ahead". At end of iv Rubin said: "That was Dr Miguel Abdon Saguier [PLRA leader]. I repeat, we are recording everything. There is already an important network in Eu and another in SAm that are carrying the material that unfortunately cannot be bc in our country." (WBI 27/6)

Dir of Catholic stn R Charitas, he had been warned about the stn's newscasts. QRM from CHU, 30 over 9 here, is awesome, but a W & M can be hrd rendering nx in FR-sounding lang, but QRM just too severe to say for sure. 0335 W says "You are listening to..." but a beep squashes the rest. 0345, several IDs, one in FR, another in EG, which could be either Rwanda or Uganda. Definitely not Comoros, and'd arbitrarily outrule Uganda, except for the two nights noted, 28/5 & 29/5, the Afro-DX was good but not exceptional; and I'd consider Rwanda being audible beneath CHU at my QTH to be impossible from a 5 kW xmtr except for a truly major opening, such as in July 82, when such as Burundi were smashing in. Burundi, e.g. was not detectable under the Guat 28/5 or 29/5. So all the logic, however lack ing an absolutely positive ID, points to Rwanda, unless someone can establish a reasonable power for their xmtr here, I cannot accept it as Rwanda; it simply is not possible. Have I made my point? I SINPO these receptions; during the peaking at 3+143+2. P.S.: There is however one bizarre possibility, and that is CHU so obliterates QRN on its fq that the audio from otherwise weak sigs under get manifested between the beeps--laughable, perhaps, but seeking an answer as to why a 5 kW signal from afar could be noted here under otherwise rather ordinary condx (Maxfield Greenwood, Sedgwick ME)

\$ RI LANKA Xinhua mx agcy, Peking reported from Colombo 23/6: VOA new xmsn stn will be set up in Puttalam, 75 mi N of Colombo, instead of originally chosen site Iranawila, near Chilaw, 50 mi N of Colombo, per local press. Under agmt signed in Jan 85, stn was to be on kiloacre site at Iranawila; ground-breaking started in March 1985; but actual construction unbegun so far. Building of the stn has evoked a great deal of criticism from the Indian press which alleged that the US might take advantage of the stn to put the Indian Ocean under its naval surveillance. [Gee, what's going on at Diego García? gh] But offl sources here said their decision on the change of site was not influenced by India's position. They explained that setting up the facility in Iranawila would've resulted in displacement of 200 families, incl many fishermen, while that in Puttalam, only about 20 fams'd be affected. Voice of Tamileelam The following is reproduced in entirety from Jun IDXCI:::

SPECIAL REPORT

VOICE OF TAMILEELAM

The newspapers were still carrying the reports of bitter infighting amongst the rival Srilankan Tamil guerilla groups. The LTTE had brutally struck at the TELO ledership and there were stories of ghastly atrocities. And there we were in Madras to investigate into the Thamileelam Radio. The broadcasts from this clandestine station were already over three years old and still its location was uncertain. But of late it had been giving out a contact address in Madras - 11 Deshikar Street, Vadapalani, hadras - 600026. Jose had even obtained a QSL via this address. So why not anoop into this address?

Luckily for me my uncle stays in Madras and when I fixed up the trip, Asia also tagged along. Product had recorded this station last December and he passed on the cassette to us. To make ourselves more authentic looking we carried copies of ADXR which had frequently carried reports of this station. TRB had given me a Radio

veritas T Shirt which I was to wear while going to the station. That was about all the preparation we made before leaving for the "search".

Our initial mood was bouyant but uncertain. All sorts of story book pictures were conjuring up in my mind. Big dark hairy guys waiting at 11 Deshikar Street. But then Asia is a big man too - 72 kilos. In an optimistic mood I thought that we might even be taken for a tour to their transmitting site that is of course, only if we could sufficiently impress them. We started our inquiries right in the train we were travelling - Corromondel Express. There was a gentle man from Madurai and we picked up the topic of Tamil rebels. "No they bother the tourists?" "No, No, they keep to their

own". "Do they have traning camps there ?" "Yes, but all

hidden from public eye." "Do they have a radio station ?" "Yes I have heard programs in the weekends." "How big are the aerials". "No, no they are all

underground". So that was it.

The first day of our stay in Madras and it was a Sunday. Kr. Pedaki had fixed up a meet at his place. After the meeting had finished with the regular matters, I raised the topic of our investigation. Immediately there were vehement words of caution from all corners. Since the rebel groups were involved in infighting, they could mistake us to be snoopers from the other groups. And that might be dangerous. Kirubaharan who was in Sri Lanka some years ago, said that apparently there are numerous splinter groups and there.



is total chaos amongst them. Devrajan spoke of how two policeman on night beat were shot at and wounded apparently because of mistaken identity. And that was it. Everyone in the meeting were unanimous that we abandon our plans. That night a bedtime Asis and myself deceided to abandon our plan. The next day when I visited Sreedhar, I saked him about what he thought about it. His advise was that we should write to the station instead of going there Five days passed by and finally the day of return journey arrived and we were to leave that day evening at 8'o clock. And then the temptation of visiting Deshikar Street got

too much to resist. But asis backed out. It was then decided that he would stay back and if I did not return by 4 hours, he would start a "searchE. I left house at 9 AM wearing a Radio Veritas T Shirt and carrying a polythene bag containing a cassette full of VOTE recording and an issue of ADXR.

Deshikar Street is a modest lane leading a way from the South Arcot Road, in the suburbs of Vadapalni. I was relieved when I found that the lane is just next to Police station. Standing at the end of the lane is a modest two story building with a small iron gete on which "il" is casually scribbled with white. When I rang the bell, a girl came down wearing a house coat. "I have come regarding Voice of Thamileeam and this address is given out by the station as a contact address", I said. "Yea, how can I help you" - she asked with a blank expression. Immediately I started telling her about what Ding was, and that we bring out a magazine called ADXR, a copy of which I showed her and that I wanted to cover VOTE for this magazine. Does she mind ?"Of course not, we need publicity. By the way I am Malathi; I announce for VOTE's English service." I was stunned and all these happened in the doorstep. Had I hit the jackpot?

Malathi called me upstairs and told me to wait for sometimes while she was trying to get in touch with any of the "organisation" fellows. But the chief man "Candappa" wasn't there though he was expected anytime. He is incharge of VOTE. The "organisation" which Malathi referred to was Peoples Liberation Organisation of Thamilelam (PLOT), the group which runs VOTE. I was seated in the drawing rocm while she sent a messenger for a PLOT member. It was a long three hours wait and in that time we talked about many related and unrelated things. But I got a glimpse into the affairs of VOTE.

Now who is Malathi ? All the while I was quite sure that they must those well to do Srilankan Tamils who migrated with all their fortunes. But when I put the question direct to her she struck back. "No, no, no, I am very much Indian". She finished her high school this year from Adarsh Vidyalaya in Madras. Her father is an Engineer employed with the Tamilnadu Covernment. It so happens that their tennant is a Srilankan Tamil who are involved with PLOT. And that is how she got to know all these and subsequently started feeling strongly for their cause. Then she met Candappa who told her that he needed a female voice for the Thamillelaam Radio. Since Sinhalese and Tamil are the only two official languages in Sri Lanka, except for Candappa no one else knew English and with one voice, the English program was getting monotonous. This is where she came in. She has been announcing for the past eight months, with an interruption because of her class XII exams. Interestingly enough she is not taken to the studios (at least she says so) but her portion is recorded at her own house and then mixed with the rest of programs. What kind of equipment do they use ? "It!s something with a lot of controls in it and a sound engineer does that. They put somethings, on the wall too". May be what she was referring to was a sound mixer and may be they put curtains on the wall to make a makeshift studio. But where are the main studios, are they in Madras? She vaguely said that she was not sure. "What about the transmitters ?" "I think they are amateur transmitters", she said and then immediately went in for an execuse. "I don't know clearly. You see I am not in the organisation and they do not tell me everything". She also produces a women's progress in English, "Is it about cooking and sticking etc" I asked. "No, no, no, she vehemently protested. "It is about emacipation of women". All this time the power was not there and the electricity came, she got a cassette player and I played the WOTE recording for her. It sure was a poor piece of recording, full of static, feeble audio and worse modulation. But in that din she beamed at a jingle which was playing "You hear this music. It is the Anthem of African National Congress". "How are they related ?" I asked. "They are Fraternal Organasations. Same with PLO." During monitoring of this radio in Calcutta Prodyut had noted some exaggarated piece of news. So I asked her where do they get the news from. "The news on Sri Lenka is through their sources. As for the rest there is usually information on other freedom struggles, such as news about the ANC and the PLO. This is picked up from BEC World Service". After listening to the cassette for sometimes Halathi asked me a frank question. "I say, can you make out anything from this recording. The reception is so poor". I told her that she was correct. "How do you receive the station here in Madras ?" "I have not yet heard it here", she replied. So that was it. The station was quite a distance away from Madras. P Prodyut had asked me to get a QSL for him and when I asked her for one, she didn't know what it was, "Don't you get reception reports ?" I asked, "Yes" she replied. "I have seen one or two such". So she has access to the mail as well. Where do they get the letters from ?"It is from Tamilnadu, Kerala and Sri Lanka. Even Sinhalese have written to us after listening to our programs". I had been sitting at her place for nearly three hours now. She had gone downstairs twice to see if the PLOT fellow had come. And in her absence I wondered how did her parents allow her to get involved with all these Millitant activity more so because the Tamils of Madras view them with considerable caution. But Malathi had an answer to that "You see I have been brought up in a different fashion than other Tamil girls. I mean I have been given more freedom than my friends who will not be allowed alone even to visit a friend's place. May be that is because I am their only child of my parents". In a lighter mood I asked her what her plans for the future were. "I want to become veternary surgeon. I have four dogs and I have had to take them to the hospital now and then and that is how I got impressed by the vets". Our conversation, a rather lengthy one was cut when finally news arrived that people downstairs would not ne able to help me. Instead I was given; a plain white card with the address of PLOT office in Madras, written by bull point pen and the bus numbers indicated on the reverse. As I was acout to rise, Malathi asked me to write down the information which I needed, which she would collect from Candappa. I was also given an english magazine "SPARK" published by PLOT to help me to know more about their activity identity and ideology. A jubiliant me was dying to rush home and inform Asis about my breakthrough. Malathi was no less exubeant. "It is so nice to know that some one living thousand miles away takes interest in our efforts".

I reached my place at 2.00 PM in the sweetering heat (41°C) and informed Asis. I had to visit the PLOT office and this time Asis agreed to accompany me. After a quick lunch I started going through the literature on PLOT. The cover showed a star of david superimposed on Bulls eye and a bare bodied Ronald Regan holding a gun, in the inset. In the fore ground there were drawings of a soldier, a man and a woman training their gins at Reagan. The caption said "ALL GUNS AGAINST THE ENLMY". On the back cover there was the diagram of a Stengun, Olive branches and a bird. The caption said "We go to Thimpu with gun and olive branch in our hands ... we hope we will not be forced to use the gun" - Umamaheswaran. The literature was full of jargons typical of communist revolutionary groups - "fascist", "imperialists", "reactionary" etc. On first glance I noticed that there was a script of a program carried by VOTE. It was the interview of Comrade Umamaheswaran by Comrade Skantha. By the way, the verie signer of the VOTE GSL received by Jose was "Comrade Skantha". Umamahaswaran is the leader of PLOT. On close scrutiny I reached at a number of conclusion. This group is a moderate among the millitants, which is somewhat paradoxical though. In its editorial it quotes Mao Tse Tung and Che Guevera and elaborates on the "Science of Guerilla warfare". Ultimately it concludes that guerilla warfare is harming the common man of Sri Lanka and hance useless. In various places the magazine hits out at the other more millitant groups. In this contact may I quote a line from the magazine which says "a small cotiery of individuals who control large financial resorces are making use of hoodlums who go under the name ENLY. They make protensions at being liberation fighters but attack civillians both Sinhalese and Tamils" - Unamahawaran while mourning the death of two TULF MPs (3 Sep 1985), over VOTE. With this homework and with Asis by my side. I set out for the PLOT office, some where in Madras. When we reached there, at 4.00 PM two gentleman were waiting for us The room was a simple one with a table, three chairs, a telephone, a cupboard and the wall filled up with posters. "You are from that listener's club" one of them said while welcoming us. I got out a ADXR and showed him one item of Clandestine News. Then I told him that I am interested in featuring their station too. But these gentleman were tough nuts to crack. They did not reveal anything apart from communist jargons. When we asked them for the latest schedule, one of them got down a calendar from the wall. It was published by PLOT and showed all sorts of gory pictures, such as a man with slit throat, one with bullet injury etc. And then he pointed out the schedule, printed in one of the pages. It was in Tamil but the figures were in Roman numerals. "If your security permits may I know the location of your station in South India ?" I asked not very hopefully. "It is in Northern Sri Lanka" was the answer: I could make out from the man's face that he was lying. Before ending our fruitless tour to this office. I thought of some "ideological teasing". I asked this man "What your claim in your literature, is that you are fighting to liberated Sri Lanka from the "imperialists". But your primary aim is to set up a separate nation called Thamileeam. Now this is essentially a racial aim because you are dividing the Sinhalese and the Tamils. Now how do you compromise communism with racism ?" These people were not at outceased in ideology and the answer was innovative - "Our enemy is not the Sinhaleco but the Sri Lankan Government. But as a first step we want to liberate Thomileeam and then use it as a base to Liberated the whole of Sri Lanka". As we were leaving we were given a copy of "SPARK" and a "Calender" and I wrote down my address in a big bound registar which I suppose was the minutes book. In conclusion what do I write ? Nothing, but I just cannot help quoting a very frenk letter lying in my desk. It is from a IDXCI member whom I had approached for help im my investigation. "Sorry Sanatani, I can not provide you any information on WOTE. But I know well from where WOTE has been broadcasting and places they used to broadcast in the recent past. Even I know of their transmitter rig and antenna to some extent. Even I visited once "Eelam Radio" (of Eelam Peoples Revolutionary Liberation Front) base. But I do not want to leak any precise information you might have observed that f avoid to give infomation on Tamil militant stations.. I know of Tamil militant stations for sometime now. It is not due to fear but because of my love upong Tamil Tigers. After Militants achieve "EELAM", I can give you a lot of information on Tamil militants radio stations. Till, then I wish to be a silent observer. Let the information not be leaked by me. If some body gives info on Tamil militant stations. I do not mind. Let these information not be leaked by such Eelam supporters like me! That's what I wish! I hope you understand me". . ..

P.S. - Some of our members might be disturbed by the overtly political nature of this article. This in inevitable while dealing with any clandestine station, since they are escentially political.

The views expressed in this article are mine and not necessarily of the IDXCI EQ people. The latest schedule of V.O.T.E. could not be included as it is yet to reach us from the P.L.O.T. office.


Many minor errors are not included here, and it should be noted that all items are aired without proper credits and cannot be traced to the original contributors. Although a long list of corrections was sent to KCBI, not one mistake has ever been acknowledged or corrected on the air. Instead, RC host Jeff Fallon keeps praising the accuracy of Capital DXers and continues to scoff at all criticism. Can we believe a DX-Club whose president and chief editor has never heard of Radio Polonia?

Some questionable items have also appeared in Frendx Log Report in recent months, including R Santiago, DR on 9700 (Apr IR) LV del Zanda, Peru, 4820 (May IR), & R Quimbi, Brazil, 4885 (June) (Tom Laskowski, South Bend IN, June 29) On KCBI's Radio Cannection today at 1903 it ended with "You've been listening to the Radio Connection, your source for erroneous information... (short laugh) And if you believe that you've been reading too much from those who are legends in their own minds." Ironically their last report was from someone in Minnesota who gave the frequency for a hurricane network as 15325 kHz USB. The well-known freq for the hurricane ham net is 14325. Ernie Behr is right. I think this type of garbage should be avoided by those who want accurate DX information.

gh: Why am I running these? I would rather not, but the KCBI people have a platform to laugh off critics, and apparently won't quote Behr, so he and Laskowski deserve to have some platform--and their criticisms are backed up by facts. Despite this imbalance, I want to make it clear to the KCBI people that these pages are open for their response if they care to make one, in all fairness. I personally think it's a shame that a potentially useful program is marred in this way, since Jeff Fallon apparently decided to stonewall, letting his loyalty to contributors exceed his judgement, rather than simply broadcasting whatever corrections were necessary as soon as possible. I still have high hopes that TRC's error rate will gradually decrease even if they refuse to deal meriously with past mistakes. Perhaps it would be best for those so upset by the program to avoid listening to it! Except for any possible response here by the KCBI people, let's terminate this discussion. The points have been made.

The majority of these listings have been validated through monitoring. For example, Kol Israel announces 5880 kHz at 0100 UTC but they are actually on 5885 kHz. The multitude of Moscow and London frequencies have deliberately not been listed; it is an endless chore to keep up with those changes.

The database used is dBASE III Plus on a Compaq Portable with a 20M hard disk. Two files, one schedule and one dx shows, are used. A link is set from the DX show file into the schedule file to obtain frequencies and additional information when producing a screen or printed report.

ON THE WAVE:

First to make mention of an increasingly common error--Radio Monte Carlo nests in Monaco not Morocco... Didn't use this log because it was already mentioned last month, but Jim Feeley (of GA) noted in his report of Radio Sweden (9695), "Letter bomb exploded at headquarters of Finland State Broadcasting." The kind of report you don't get every day--so thought it worth mentioning. Elsewhere...

Here's a brief extraction from a slightly irate letter received (or actually, a paraphrase with own interpretation)...REPORTERS:make sure your loggings are in Universal Time; b) before reporting a station, be certain you're actually hearing it (noting you caught an ID will help dispell my suspicion, especially with more uncommon stations broadcasting in a foreign language); c) it's better to list a station as "UnID" rather than cause confusion with a "MisID"; d) and by the way (to a couple of you), pu-leeze write legibly, and not in a cursive that only a decoder could read—these are, after all, supposed to be log reports and not prescriptions. [Did I cover it all, "E"?]
