

Welcome to what is generally considered to be the beginning of the depths of the DX/ SWL season. Atmospheric noise makes the low bands difficult to deal with, and the still-low solar flux index doesn't permit a lot of listening to the higher bands (particularly for us here in North America). I suppose that things won't get very much better until the Fall (at least). Still, don't let SFI statistics rule your listening. You might try listening in the early morning when you get up (see below).

Letters this month were a little on the light side — though in number only, not in substance. We begin with a letter from Vern Nicholson (Toronto, Ontario, Canada) who suggests an interesting way of making the most of limited time for listening:

Lately, I've been thinking about the problem of "time management and DXing," that is, when I have the time to do so! Given the constraints of a full time job and my studies in graduate sociology, I find I have little time available for DXing and other recreational activities. I'm sure there are others in the same predicament, and though I certainly haven't solved the problem, I have a little experiment that I'd like to share with you that (so far) seems to have helped.

After endless weeks of barely turning the radio on, I tried the following strategy. Each month, I go through FRENDX, highlighting with a pen the countries and stations that I wish to hear. These are then narrowed down to a "top ten" (or "top five" if you prefer) list, and this becomes my "goal" for the month, to hear and hopefully QSL as many of these stations as possible. Narrowing the list down is difficult, but, given the time constraints, it is better to start with a goal that is attainable instead of being overwhelmed by the vast amount of DX that is reported each month that you don't have time to hear!

Of course, each person would use different criteria in making up their lists, but these have been helpful to me. First, the broadcast must fit into my schedule somewhere, i.e., I should be able to be at the radio at least once a week while that station is on. Second, the station should be a challenging but not impossible catch; setting your sights too high can be discouraging if you have little time, and you may be confronted with a practically empty logbook at the end of the month! Certainly there will be times when, wonder of wonders, you actually have an extra hour to fiddle about, or perhaps you awake bleary-eyed at 0800UTC because you're worried about your upcoming term paper! These are the times to tune the dials a little more spontaneously, perhaps in search of more exotic DX catches.

So far, my experiment has yielded four new countries, and I'm anxiously waiting for goodies in my mailbox! I hope this information has been useful to other leading frantic, 20th Century lives, and if anyone else knows of any "time management" tips for DXers, I'd be very interested.

Structured activities are invariably more productive, and use time more efficiently. So, Vern's suggestion makes a lot of good sense. A part of my own listening structure, for example, is to listen, without fail, for roughly an hour in the morning (about a half hour after I get up [0400 local], that is — man may not live by coffee alone, but he/she does come to life by means of it). My senses are at their sharpest, and HF propagation conditions are usually at their best. True, at present such listening is confined to approximately 12MHz and less; but then, I have always had a great interest in the tropical bands. By all means, let's see lots of discussion of this topic — helpful hints and approaches to structured listening.

By the way, keeping good records is another useful technique for getting more out of the time that you spend listening. I still have available various forms for keeping track of the details of what you have heard. More information in CONTACT NOTES.




It is with no little embarrassment that I come to the next item. Some time ago I received a copy of an article that appeared in the *New York Times* (to be discussed presently). Unfortunately, as a result of a failure in my filing system, I lost the cover material that would allow me to give credit to the person who was good enough to send me the article. Many apologies for this — whoever you are, drop me a note (& call me a few choice names, if you like) and let me know who you are. Again, my apologies.

The article (from the NYTimes of 26 May 1987, and written by Philip Shenon) is entitled: YEARS OF JAMMING VOICE OF AMERICA HALTED BY SOVIET. Essentially, it describes the discovery by the VOA that its broadcasts were no longer being jammed. The suggestion is put forward that this may have been done to free up some jamming equipment to be used against other broadcasters such as RFE and RL which, indeed, seem to have experienced increased problems in this regard — this according to Malcolm Forbes Jr. (who is quoted, and who is the chairman of the Board for International Broadcasting which oversees RFE and RL).

It is suggested that this may be another effort by Gorbachev to demonstrate the new glasnost ("openness" in Russian). Various similar examples are cited: for example, the stopping of the jamming of the BBC when PM Thatcher visited the USSR. Other services continue to be jammed — Deutsche Welle and Kol Israel, for example — and the level of jamming has even intensified against those services: more evidence for the supposition pointed out above. On the other hand, it is pointed out that increased levels of jamming are frequently associated with crises in which the USSR has some involvement: for example the Soviet occupation of Czechoslovakia (1968), and the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan (1979).

I find it interesting that the word "shortwave" is nowhere mentioned in the entire article. You would have thought that this would be like discussing the Royal Family of Great Britain without ever once mentioning the Queen. The entire burden of technical explanation is carried by the very last paragraph:



The jamming technique used by the Soviet Union disrupts radio broadcasts with a sound like the hum of an airplane engine. In cities, jamming often comes from radio signals transmitted close to the ground. In rural areas, a technique called "sky jamming" is used, in which the jamming pulses are bounced off the atmosphere.

That's all there is – for the uninformed it, raises more questions than it answers. How different is the treatment of similar matters by the Christian Science Monitor (although for very obvious reasons).

Do you get the feeling here, as I do, of an opportunity lost? In the USA, where SWLs are more likely than not to be called HAMS (displaying an impressive display of ignorance of two related subjects *at the same time*), we need to encourage education about the ways in which the peoples of the world communicate with each other in general, and specifically about SWL.



I have received some very encouraging response to the SWL Forms that I made available. These are printed on the LaserWriter and are very useful for keeping records of what you've heard. Additionally, there is a sheet of forms for reporting your catches to NASWA, and a form for keeping track of solar/geomagnetic data. If you are interested, drop me a note and I'll send them to you. NOTE— please use these forms as *masters*: Xerox ^(R)

and then use the copies for your work. Suggestions for additions & changes are always welcome from those who have used the forms.

SUNDAY

- 2210-2230: "Turkish Panorama" (Voice of Turkey). Recent programs of this show have centered mainly on ancient civilizations in Anatolia-pre-Hittite civilization, the Hittite Empire, the Uratur civilization and the Lythian Federation of the Hellenic era. I'm not sure what other kinds of information are included under the rubric "Panorama", but certainly history is one kind. (9.560. Repeated at 0410 on the same frequency).
- 2315-2400: "Music from the Ukraine" (Radio Kiev). The program concentrates mostly on classical music performed or composed by Ukrainians. Jeveral excerpts per program and some background information on the performer or composer featured that week. (13.645. Repeated at 0245 on the same frequency).

MONDAY

- 2205-2230: "Across the Map of Bulgaria" (Radio Sofia). A program that sometimes; but unpredictably, shows up on Monday nights. It is a tourist guide book to the most interesting sites of Bulgaria and has a featured an ancient cathedral in the Balkan mountains and a natural rock formation of some magnitude. (9.700. Repeated 2335 on the same frequency.)
- 0145-0200: "Sports Roundup" (Radio Korea). Although technically a sports program, very little actual sports reporting is done, and most of the program is centered on the preparations for the Seoul Olympics in 1988. Quite a bit of information about that. (15.575. Bx earlier at 1345 on 9.750/15.575).

TUESDAY

- 2110v-2115: "Stamp Album" (Radio Berlin International). Program describes the latest stamp releases from the G.D. R., comemorative issues, etc. Describes the stamp pictures and the various denominations. (6.125. Repeated at 2225v on the same frequency plus 6.165/6.075. Repeated at 2325 on 6.080/9.730).
- 1130-1145: "Health Report" (Radio Australia). A program devoted to medicine and health issues in Australia. One program was a two part series devoted to the incidence of AIDs in Australia, another featured overcrowding in Australian hospitals, and still another was an essay devoted to the importance of the sense of touch. (9.580).

WEDNESDAY

0010-0025: "This Land" (Kol Israel). Since Kol Israel changed its programming schedule to North America, this program is only heard once on Wednesdays at 0010. It is Kol Israel's tourist magazine and past programs have featured alternative housing for tourists, a feature on the kibbutz immigration center, resorts on the red sea, and historical landmarks of Jerusalem.(9.435/9.855/11.610). 0000-0200; "The Jazz Show" (WRNO). This is the popular NBC radio program picked up by WRNO and hosted by David Sanborne. Each week features a particular artist--like Winston Marcellus or Bobby Freeman--and plays some of the best known names in jazz, including Chick Correa, Thelonius Monk, etc. (7.355).

THURSDAY

- 2310-2325: "Studio Three" (Kol Israel). Kol Israel's arts and culture program. Past programs have featured Arthur Rubenstein, a worker's theater in Tel Aviv, and popular theater productions in Jerusalem. Now on only every other week. (9.435/9.855/11.610).
- 0310-0400: "Daybreak Africa" (VOA). A current events magazine program featuring issues in Africa, the United States, and the world at large. Past features have included the announced trade restrictions against Japan, the Libyan defeat in Chad, border tensions between Uganda and Kenya, etc. Each night features a sports report and a couple of musical interludes, usually featuring a single artist. (7.280/11.835). Sunday--Thursday.


FRIDAY

- 0215a-0220a: "Cultural Bulletin" (R.A.E.). A brief five minute survey of some cultural event of importance in Argentina. Past programs have featured an Argentine music academy, the international meeting of anthropological theater, and other events of cultural significance. Now that Radio Moscow has appropriated 11.710 and 9.685, this program will be a lot harder to hear. (11.710/9.690. May be repeated at 0515, but I'm not sure.)
- 0245-0300: "Castles, Palaces, and Legends" (Radio Polonia). A program devoted to Castles in Poland. Gives the background, historic and legendary, describes the appearance and the present day efforts at maintenance. (7.145. Repeated at 0345 on the same frequency).

SATURDAY

- 2230-2245: "DX Corner" (Voice of Turkey). Very little of issues relating to radio, but some DX tips taken from Media Monitor or other sources, interspersed with top 50 hits from <u>Billboard</u>. (9.560. Repeated at 0430 on the same frequency). Every other week.
- 0230-0235:"Current Events" (Radio Cairo). A brief run down of important events making the news in Egypt, including the performance of Aida at Luxor City, new treaties with other countries, and efforts to regulat the oil industry. (9.475/9.675).

This wonth's column marks the beginning in a series of informational articles done along the style of what was seen in <u>Short Wave Center</u> in issues past. The goal of these articles will be to provide a better global understanding of SWBC outlets that are available from a particular country or region as well as what needs those broadcasts might be designed to meet. By using the NASM country list to set criteria as to the scope of content, different geographical and geopolitical areas of the world will be explored by using the VASM country list to set criteria as to the scope of content, different geographical and geopolitical areas of the world will be explored by spotlighting the SMBC outlets now available from those areas.

The depth of understanding and knowledge of particular regions or countries in the world should rank high on the list of what motivates and reinforces our Short Wave Listening Hobby. Understanding the culture of a particular country or area can not only be a fascinating and enjoyable study but, is often considered one of the SWBC DX'ers most valuable skills. Certainly, the ability to recognize and identify different cultures of the world is a measure of the competence level and experience of any DX'er.

Personally, I feel that the our hobby's most skilled and competent individuals have built their reputations on foundations comprised of the in depth understanding of three very important concepts:

- * A knowledge of how to determine what is available at a particular time and frequency.
- * An intimate knowledge of each SWBC band and what is normal listening fare on a given band at any one time.
- * The understanding of and the ability to accurately identify varying cultures in the world as they are reflected through a particular SMBC broadcast.

These skills cannot be purchased yet they have tangible value. They do not come cheaply; many hours must be spent to learn and develop them. All the expensive, feature laden radios in the world cannot take their place.

These individual skills can be summarized by a single word: Experience!

No one can just acquire this knowledge simply by reading an article or book. However, authors of DX related subjects can break down the material and manage it in such as to present each subject in a more easy to understand, digestible form. This is essentially the goal of our presentations here in respect to the different countries and regions in our SUBC hobby "diet."

This month, Dr. Harold Cones is offering the benefit of his experience in DX'ing the African countries that were colonized by France. Among his many DDby accomplishments, Harold recently received NASWA's <u>African</u> <u>Continental DX'pert</u> Award, a notable achievement by anyones standards.

SHORTWAVE OF FRENCH COLONIAL AFRICA

Africa. The very mention of the name of this continent conjures up thoughts of loin-clothed natives engaged in pagan dance, charging elephants, and headhunters stalking the beautiful Hollywood maiden. Nothing, of course, could be further from the truth. But, since Africa remained isolated longer than most countries and had the advantage of not being introduced to our form of civilization until very recently, our imaginations easily run wild. Actually, much of Mediterranean Africa was known to the Greeks and those who came after them, but contacts with inland Africa have been relatively recent. The native culture and primitiveness of these people (by the standard of the day) created great interest in the European explorers of the 19th century. In a very short period of time the French, Germans, Spanish, English, and Portuguese pioneers were walking the continent, sending back information on the abundance of natural resources, and easily subjecting of the native peoples. Yes, unfortunately, the 19th century history of Africa is based on the rape of the land and the vast slave trade.

The history of the native peoples prior to the arrival of the early Europeans is practically nonexistent, although historians have pieced together a story of warring tribes, famine and disease. The native population of Africa was highly varied and territorial; territorial conflicts appear to have been most common. The variability of the native Africans is without question. There are numerous unrelated linguistic stocks whose evolution puzzles modern linguists but attests to the relative isolation of the "tribes" that inhabited the continent before the arrival of the Europeans. Over five dozen dialects are found in the area of French Colonial Africa.

THE BARBARY COAST

Although debatable as to exactly when French involvement began in African affairs, it is known that the French easily captured and occupied Algiers in 1830. The government of Algiers was the center of Barbary piracy and needed to be subdued. By 1848, the conquering of all Algeria was complete and it was made a part of France. Independence, after a long history of political unrest and guerrilla movements, came in 1962. The official language of Algeria is Arabic, although French is universally used. Radiodiffusion-Television Algerienne can be heard in English with popular and classical music programs on 9.510 MHz between 1900 and 2000. There is also an Arabic, Kabyl, and French home service. Verification is by QSL card and is spotty.

The French occupied Tunisia in 1881 as an extension of the protection to shipping that they had started with Algeria. It became a French protectorate and remained so until 1957. As with Algeria, the official language is Arabic, with French as the universal second language. Radiodiffusion-Television Tunisienne is often an easy catch on 7.225 MHz at the 0430 signon and just as often is nearly impossible to receive. Broadcasts are in Arabic with and occasional newscast in French. Verification is rare (although improving) and is by letter.

Morocco, once the home of the vicious Sale pirates, found itself in numerous clashes with the French and Spanish. Finding a weakened Moroccan government, France and Spain divided the country into French and Spanish protectorates in 1912. In 1923 the port of Tangier was declared an International Zone, free of military and permanently neutral. Spain and France recognized the independence of Morocco in 1956. Later the same year, the International Zone of Tangier was abolished. Co-major languages of Morocco are Arabic, French, and Spanish.

The national shortwave outlet is Radiodiffusion-Television Marocaine which broadcasts chiefly in Arabic. When conditions are favorable, their Arabic broadcast on 15.335 MHz is an easy catch around 2000 GMT. A "new" shortwave outlet is Radio Mediterranee International, which broadcasts on 9.575 MHz from Nador (once part of Spanish Morocco). Reception is a sometimes affair but is best around 0200 GMT. A third choice is the VOA relay site in Tangier, but your knowledge of Moroccan culture will not be enhanced by this station since it serves as a standard relay of Washinton-originated VOA programs.

FRENCH EQUATORIAL AFRICA

French Equatorial Africa (Afrique Equatoriale Francaise) was until 1959 a federation uniting four territories in west-central Africa under French rule. In 1960 the territories (formerly French colonies) became independent republics: Central African Republic (former Ubangi-Shari); Republic of Chad; Congo Republic (former Middle Congo); and the Gabon Republic area has neither geographical nor ethnic unity. In the south it is inhabited by Bantu-speaking Negroes of the Guinean race, with several Pygmy groups found in the forests. Along the Ubangi and Shari rivers swell Negroes of very tall stature. In the Lake Chad area is a mosaic of Negro tribes and "Chad Arabs" who have acquired Negro blood; and in the northern desert are found the Tebu, who are Negroes with European features.

Coastal areas of FEA were discovered by the Portuguese in the 15th century and used as slave ports. Between 1839 and 1843, Capt. L. E. Boret-Willaumez captured the Gabon estuary for France, where a refuge for free slaves was founded and call Libreville. H. M. Stanley (Dr. Livingston, I presume?) discovered the course of the Congo River between 1874 and 1877, whereupon a French explorer, Pierre Savorgnan de Brazza (remember Radio Brazzaville?), made treaties with the inland tribes, putting them under French rule. Very heavy wars between France and local tribes in the Chad region resulted in subjugation of the natives in 1900. In 1910, all colonies were federated into French Equatorial Africa. This area supported Free France in WWII, and in 1946, all FEA residents were made French citizens. In 1960 each state became independent.

Modern-day shortwave outlets from this area are varied and broadcast chiefly in French, along with an assortment of vernaculars. Radiodiffusion Nationale Tchadienne is the national station of Chad. Try for this one on 4.905 MHz from 2300 until 2400 GMT sign-off. Although often a difficult catch, it is worth the try since Chad plays some of the best "highlife" music to be found. And for the DXer, Radio Moundou in Chad is a very nice catch. Try 5.288 MHz at the 0457 sign-on. Both stations are spotty verifiers, but will verify with letters at times.

Radiodiffusion-Television Centrafricaine in Bangui is the national station of the Central African Republic. A very poor verifier but an excellent music station, try for them on 7.220 MHz between 2230 and the 2300 GMT sign-off. The most well known and easiest received of the Africans is Africa #1 from Gabon. Another good provider of "highlife" music, their strong signal is heard on 15.200 MHz around 1500 GMT. They will QSL if you are persistent. Radio Japan also uses the facilities of Africa #1 for relay of their broadcasts. A good DX catch from Gabon is the national station Radiodiffusion-Television Gabonaise. They issue a very nice QSL if you are lucky enough to hear them: try 4.777 MHz about 2330 GMT.

The Congo no longer has Radio Brazzaville, the station that issued QSLs with topless ladies on the during th 50s, but has replaced it with Radiodiffusion-Television Congolaise. They have not been heard much on shortwave lately, but try 15.200 about 2000 GMT (or after Africa # 1 shuts down). Radio Brazzaville was a topnotch verifier but it is very hard to pry a card out ot RTVC.

FRENCH WEST AFRICA

French West Africa (Afrique Occidentale Francaise) was until 1959 a federation uniting eight territories. The territories were easily broken into two distinctly different geographical groups. The first group included Senegal, Mauritania, French Sudan, Upper Volta, and Niger, all in the northern tropical zone. The area has a dry climate with a single rainy season and grows baobob, tall grasses, millet, peanuts, and humped cattle. The inhabitants are Sudanese Negroes who settled the land and converted to Islam early. A little further north in this area the savanna gives way to the Sahara desert populated by nomadic Moors and Tuaregs. The second group comprised Guinea, the Ivory Coast, and Benin (former Dahomey) which are in the northern equatorial zone with two rainy seasons. There the usual vegetation is green savanna with cathedral forests, which on the lower Ivory Coast give way to dense forest. The inhabitants are Guinean Negroes who are Christians, Muslims or pagans. Principal crops are millet, yams, oil palms, coffee, cocoa, and bananas. Most of this region is flat.

The French were long established on the west coast of Africa where they engaged in gum and slave trading; the chief gum factory was in Senegal. Submission of the inland areas started in 1854 when French explorers subdued much of Senegal and Niger. From these outposts they expanded their influence outward to include all of the area that came to be known as French West Africa in 1895. The area supported Free France in WWII, and in 1946 the colonies were transformed into territories of the French Republic and the inhabitants made French citizens. In 1958 territories became autonomous states, and in 1959 French West Africa ceased to exist. By 1969, all the former colonies had achieved independence.

The great variability of the people and the land is reflected in the great diversity of shortwave programming now coming from this area. Office de Radiodiffusion-Television de Mauritaine broadcasts chiefly in Arabic and is a good provider of middleeastern music. They can be heard on 4.845 MHz after 2245 GMT. Their QSL record has been spotty until recently; they are now good verifiers.

The national station of Senegal is the Office de Radiodiffusion-Television du Senegal (old-timers will remember "Radio Dakar"). They are often heard with French and Arabic programming on 4.890 MHz between 2300 and 2400 GMT. QSLs are spotty, but they do issue a very nice card.

Listen on 6.015 or 4.940 MHz around 2300 for Radiodiffusion-Television Ivoirienne from Abidjan. Much of their programming is in vernaculars, which will provide you with the opportunity to listen to many different African dialects. They do QSL with an attractive card, but it is rumored that many SWLs have offered their first born, wives, and mothers and yet are still without this much sought-after card.

A rare piece of DX is offered by Sudan via the National Radio and TV Corporation outlet on 5.039 MHz. Try for them at the 0400 sign-on, but don't hold your breath. Their programming is chiefly Arabic and they do verify by letter (my letter was several pages long, handwritten, and held together with a bobby pin!).

Upper Volta is now Barkino Farso and their shortwave outlet, Radiodiffusion-Television Burkina, is usually heard between 2300 and 2400 GMT on 4.815 MHz. They program chiefly in French and some vernaculars and are good verifiers; their QSL often arrives with beautiful stamps attached.

Radio Niamey, the "international" service of the Office de Radiodiffusion-Television du Niger, is a spotty catch (and verifier) on 5.020 MHz around 2300 GMT. They provide a different style of "highlife" music from the other Africans and are worth the listening when reception is good.

Tune to 4.870 MHz between 2230 and 2400 and chances are the "highlife" music you will be hearing is from Benin via the Office de Radiodiffusion et Television du Benin. Programming is chiefly in French, but the multiple vernaculars used at times are most interesting. Benin is a good verifier and sends an attractive card with colorful stamps.

An often difficult catch is "la Voix de la Revolution" (Radiodiffusion National) from Guinea. Try 4.900 MHz between 2300 and 2400 GMT, but do not expect a QSL. Mot SWLs feel there is a monthly drawing to determine the single QSL recipient.

Listen to Africa. LIsten to the variety of music, programming, and languages. Listen to learn (and learn to listen). Your QSLs and the detective work you did to receive them will mean much more if you understand the culture and the country from which they originated.

SUMMER FUN or PASS THE BUG SPRAY

By the time this magazine hits your hot little hands another annual ARRL Field Day will have come and gons. Every June, amateur radio operators trek out in to the wilderness with equipment, generators, and beer coolers to prove their process at portable operation. There is a sober purpose to this nonsense in that it serves to demonstrate ham radios ability to serve as emergency communications under adverse conditions. But for most operators, it is a trip in the woods with friends to have fun playing radio. Over the years hamdom has developed a body of knowledge about such things as quick and dirty antennas and emergency power sources, thanks to the efforts put forth on field day stations. Since I no longer belong to one particular Amateur Radio Club, I have the freedom to visit several Field Day installations each year to examine the state of the art and the quality of the fried chicken.

GET TO THE POINT SKIP!!!

Why can't SWL folks have just as much fun as the hams??? The fact is we can. With a little hardware savvy and antenna ingenuity we can have our own field days. This looks like a lead in to... (drum roll please)

UNCLE SKIP'S GUIDE TO BEVERAGE PARTIES

First off, the "Beverage" we are referring to has nothing to do with what you tote out to the field in your cooler. The BEVERAGE ANTENNA is simply a length of wire, one or more wavelengths long (41 meter band...41 meters of wire, no problem) it can be terminated at one and with a 200-500 ohm resistor to earth ground but in practical applications this serves directionality for transmission purposes. Since we are listening and not sending you can live without it. This then translates into a long long long wire antenna. Best efficiency is to have the antenna between 10 and 20 feet off the ground. It also helps if the ground conductivity is fairly low. You probably have little control over the operation site but if you can find a place with hard clay ground for a hundred meters or so leading to a salt marsh you might want to move there.

Anyway the goal is to get with your friends, find a safe and legal place to go and string the longest possible length of wire you can for an all night DX session. If you are an apartment dweller you might just want to go out in a field somewhere and play with a properly tuned dipole just to see how the other half lives. The goal is to log some things you might not get at your normal location and to have a lot of fun in the process.

FIELD OPERATIONAL RECEIVERS

This has become less of a problem in recent years with the advant of reasonable priced, high performance portables. You could chug all night with a SONY 2010 and a box of D cells. Or you can pack a generator and use the hottest rig you've got. The only word of personal experience I can give is that some portable receivers are all too prome to overloading when hooked up to too much antenna. Since this is a party you can very easily take multiple receivers and hook them all up to the wire. Yes you can even have more then one hooked up at a time. How do you think you get TV reception in a highrise apartment??? Just don't let some ham radio friend try to transmit at the same time, that could end the party a little early.

POWER SOURCES

If your location happens to be in someones back yard and you have access to mains, no problem. But if your going out into the boonies you are going to need alternative power. Since you are working with receivers and not transmitters your power curve is reasonable and you can most likely get along on batteries. Check you receivers manual to determine current consumption and bring enough cells to get you through the night. If your equipment can operate off of 12 volts you can consider the more sturdy automobile battery but remember two things. First, wet cell batteries must be handled with extreme care. Secondly, it would not be too smart to run down the battery of the car you plan to drive home in. In the case of portables, some folks might want to try experimenting with alternative power sources such as solar or wind. You might even come up with a new idea in this area in which case you can either publish it here in my column or get really smart and figure out a way to make a buck from it.

LOCATIONS

Most important consideration. DON'T GO WHERE YOUR NOT WANTED!!! Never venture onto anyones property without permission. With that said let me assure you that, in your quest for the ultimate spot, you will be surprised how easy it is to get permission to operate almost anywhere.

Getting permission is strictly a communications issue. If you make your intentions very clear and give all proper assurances to the owner, you should have little trouble. One thing you will need in these days of litigation is a formal written statement concerning liability to the landowner. If you climb some farmers tree, break your leg, and then try to sue the farmer, I don't think you will be invited back. Insurance concerns are the main concerns of property owners these days. When in doubt, obtain legal counsel on such matters. One alternative to the LA Law game is to pursue access to public land. If you can get permission to operate in a state or federal park most liability issues are cleared up. You are just another camper who brought a radio along.

Please be kind to your environment. Take nothing but pictures, leave nothing but footprints. That is the key to future operations.

SAFETY

In addition to the above admonishments about tree climbing and battery handling, you should give every consideration to safety. The camper model is a good one. Dress for the environment, plan for bad weather, have a first aid kit and emergency plan. Check your local library for books on backpacking. They can be a good start for field planning even though it is unlikely you will go that far off the beater path. If you do happen to bring beverages to this Beverage party, try to exercise moderation in all things. Do not violate parks regulations on possession of alcohol as you will not only never be invited back, you may face a continued period of dxing from a jail cell.

WHY FIELD OPERATIONS

As my dear departed Daddy used to say. "Go on outside and let the stink blow off you"!

As a bunch, we radio types rate just above couch potatoes on the activity scale. Also, one of the things I have never enjoyed about this hobby is that it tends to make us all solo flyers. Getting together with a bunch of fellow SWLs must be fun or we wouldn't have ANARC conventions. Instead of just getting together to talk about DXing, field operations gives you the chance to get together and do it. You might even convince some non-radio types to try the hobby. The important thing is to XAVE FUN



REALISTIC DX-65 RECEIVER

This receiver has been reported to be discontinued and now being cleared out at a reduced price, from US\$49.95 down to US\$29.95. (via World of Radio)

Icom IC-R71 Problem

In the April 1987 TCA magazine from the Canadian Amateur Radio Federation there is a small article warning of damage to several Icom products (R71, as well as IC-751, 751A and 745 transceivers) if the power switch is turned off and on rapidly. The fault is the failure of a multivibrator in the display circuitry which brings about a loss of display and audio output.

SONY'S NEW RECEIVER

According to a report on Radio Netherlands Media Network program on April 9th, the ICF-7600DA will be the model number used in Europe. The North American model number is the ICF-7700, which was chosen to avoid confusion with the previous ICF-7600 and 7600A models.

The ICF-7700 is slightly larger than the ICF-2002 and weighs 610 grams with the batteries in. It is not a continuous coverage receiver, but rather receives 15 bands: LW, MW, FM and 12xSW (90, 75, 60, 49, 41, 31, 25, 22, 19, 16, 13, 11 meter bands). It is dual conversion and has an LCD frequency/time display. Frequencies are displayed to the nearest 5 kHz, there are five memories and the clock comes with a timer. The suggested list price is US\$269.95.

TEN-TEC RX-325 RECEIVER

Ten-Tec has discontinued production of this receiver because of its high cost. (Media Network)

YAESU FRG-9600 VHF/UHF RECEIVER

Yaesu itself is now selling converters to extend the frequency range of the '9600. The FC-965DX converter adds 20 kHz to 60 MHz to the receiver, while the FC-1300 converter extends reception up to 1300 MHz. Yaesu's LPF05 filter is recommended for reception below 500 kHz, to prevent mediumwave signals causing overloading.

A California company, Engineering Consultants, have developed what Yaesu calls "excellent software" to allow the operation of the '9600 from an Apple computer. (via Media Network)

Sangean/Emerson

Sangean is now advertising directly in North American publications. The ATS-803 is listed for US\$189.00 and the ATS-801 for US\$99.00. The address is Sangean America, Inc., 8531 Wellsford Place, Suite K, Santa Fe Springs, CA 90670, telephone 1-800-992-4045, ext.325.

According to MONITORING TIMES the Sangean SG-789 will soon be available in the United States under the Emerson label. This version of the popular receiver has been available in Canada for some time as the Emerson SG-789 and has even been marketed through Sears catalog sales.

Actually this receiver is now available in the USA through DAK Industries, Inc., a mail-order firm. They are selling the Emerson SG-789 for US\$49.90 and orders may be placed by calling 1-800-325-0800. DAK's address is 8200 Remmet Ave., Canoga Park, CA 91304. (Thanks to Harold Riddell)

In Canada the <u>Sangean ATS-803</u> is now being sold by Atlantic Ham Radio, 378 Wilson Ave., Downsview, Ontario M3H 1S9, tel. 416-636-3636, for Cdn\$299.95 (list price Cdn\$459).

Radio Shack to sell the Sangean ATS-803 : Larry Magne reported in "Shortwave Listeners Digest" that Radio Shack will be introducing a version of the ATS-803 later this summer.





A NASWA EXCLUSIVE

My thanks to R.C. Watts of Louisville for sending along the schedules of AWR Guatemala and Radio SWA. South Africa. Another gremlin last month: Iraq on 11705 starts 0000, not 2300-, and now runs a full two hours on 11705 kHz. Lou Josephs reported on June 3 via Pinelands that it appears that Radio Australia is no longer relaying the BBC to Fiji and the South Pacific. He is hearing regular RA programming in the time slot.

At the other end of the spectrum, noted on the evening of May 31 and almost any evening I listen now is a new and powerful Algerian on 153 kHz. On a reasonably quiet evening, it runs 5 or 7 s-units over the background noise level all evening long. Don't know the town or power yet, but it is consistently stronger than France-162 and Monaco-218 kHz. Once the summer static dies down, this ought to be easily heard all over NA.

Other notes: Radio RSA has exchanged 15185 for 15140 in most or all services. At 2100 5980 replaced 11900, with 9585 and 7270 in parallel. Despite daylight here, 5980 is the best of the three frequencies. Dubai is changing frequencies again.

If you have a computer and do not have or do not use a modem, you are missing current information with delivery times that the post office cannot possibly match. Lou Josephs posted on Pinelands RBBS late-breaking information on a special transmitter test from Norway for the next morning; a few callers got the information in time. With Bob Brown out of town, George Wood kindly emailed SCDX #1941 to me, from CIS into MCI Mail, the same day it aired on "RSI; I ported it onto the Pinelands RBBS within a few minutes after replying to some other messages. Even if your budget won't support long distance and lengthy telephone calls to BBSs, you can afford an MCI Mail account at \$18 per year plus \$0.45 per message. For convenience and timely exchange of 'information, it sure beats waiting for two-to-five days for the USPO to do its thing.

Have you noticed the commercialism creeping into the DX shows? It's been getting worse. A recent incident really rubbed me the wrong way. Larry Magne really stuck one to the listeners of RCI's SWL Digest on June 13. After touching on the differences between the NRD-525 -U, -E, -J (models destined for the USA, Europe and Japan), he started to discuss the improvements made to the NRD-525 since the model was introduced. After piquing the listener's interest, the discussion abruptedly stopped. If you want to find out what the changes are from him, you have to buy his RDI White Paper! Either run a commercial for White Paper, or give the entire set of facts, but don't leave leave listeners hanging in mid-air. I am surprised Ian Mc Farland let Larry get away with that one...

Updates may be a bit scare for a while. I am down to the Sony 2010 and the Kenwood TS-940S. The R-71A was sold and, on the evening of June 22, 1 had a very close lightening strike. There was damage to computer components, a TV set, a 2m FM radio, but most serious was the damage to the NRD-525. Whether the set can be fixed or replaced, it may be a while. The BBS went down for a while, but fortunately I had enough parts to get that running again.
