Well, I seem to have gotten behind in this business of reporting to the Wiusings". so I am going to have to sumarize my DXing for the last month. First of all I have beon batting about 70\% as far as specials go. I am not going to list here all the ones I have heard as you will see them intthe contest listings. Ditto for the call latter contest. You've also' seen most of my foreign stuff in Fred's column. Some other catches which I've had which are not for any of the contests are CKRC (630) in Winnepeg, CHAB (800) in Moose Jaw, and KECA (790) in Los Angeles. That last is not new. I've been doing quite a bit of work on the marina band lately. Aside from foreign harmonics which were listed in Fred's colimn I've also seard broddcast stations ZQI ( 2330 ) in Kingston, Jamaica, ZYV30 (2340) in Brazil, and GRC (2880) in Iondon, England. I've heard a number of beacons above the BCB; TAM (1710) according to intemational call allocations this one should be in Thrizey but I don't believe it is tacause according to "World Radio Handbook" (last year's) this call is assigned to a S" broadcast station. CUC (1670) in Portugal or Portuguese Colony, MDE (1690) somewhigr in the British Empire, FMB (1615), this one should be in Russia but I have ry doubts as it has been heard in the AM. IZT (1620) in Italy, EMVI (1690) probably in Fussia, and PPE (1690) in Brazil. Below this broadcast band approximately $53.5 \mathrm{lkc} / \mathrm{s}$. Ir ve heedr DDY in Cemany, FUFU in France or a French Colony and IZDZ in Italy. All these are, of course, beacons. Ani lastly I've had some police stations and some ameteurs. Pulice stations are: KLA367 (1735) in Ios Angeles, KNA575 (2420) in Hanford, Cal., KMA437 (2420) in Fresno, CaI, and the Winnegeg police radio. Ametaurs are: W7CAK in Dundance, Myo., WoKWB in Fargo, N.D. and W\%JRJ in Southeastern Utah. Well, that take care of my DKing and probably my 30 lines too but I still have to ask one more thing. You probably recall in Fred's column a couple weeks ago what I thought were Russian jarmers being heard throughout the afternoon.
