W B I E - Merietta, Georgia, 1050 kc/s., 3:30-4:00 a.m. E.S.T.

This is only TENTATIVE as we go to press. In years past, XEG has always been silent on New Year's Day until 5:00 a.m., so we have tried to get some of the very much wanted stations on 1050 kilocycles to put on special test periods on that day, when the channel is expected to be clear. Therefore, we expect, that if WBIE does come on with this test, that they will find a clear channel, unless CHUM in Toronto might be on the air. This program, if and when, will be strictly a test, with modulation by cycle tone and voice station identifications. KSTP, 1500, heard 1:30, Q5 S9 plus 36 db; WHBS, 1550, heard at 2:00 on for ET. 3:00-3:30, KEWD, 1330, DX had rough interference from WAOK but dug out enough for a report.

12/8-4:30, KXOL, 1360, Someone covered KPOR here. Just barely heard an ID before they signed off with National Anthem. It was a religious program that covered them up.

Best 73s and DX. Harvin E. Robbins - 7805 Woolworth Avenue - Omaha 14, Nebraska Alltimes EST. Starting out on the morning of 12/3 got the f/c from KBEL (1240) and KPSO (1260) along with a s/on from WIRC (630) at 5 a.m. On 12/4 got the f/c from KXRJ (1490) in Russellville, Ark. for a very welcome logging. On 12/5: KFFA (1360) with a f/c at 5:45 a.m.; KDAV (580) with a f/c at 5:30 and WNDU (1490) with an ET at 5:03-5:06 a.m. s/off. WCWR (1260) also a new logging at 5:00 a.m. s/on. On 12/7: KACT (1360) on listed f/c, VGHN (1370) on listed f/c, KPBA (1590) New Pine Bluff, Ark. f/c at 5:45 a. m., and WTRU (1600) after s/on. Jim Hagen - San Salvador, B. W. I. (forwarded by Hal Wagner) I was really surprised by the size and completeness of the MRC bullatin you sent me. I have decided to join. Enclosed is a check for 34.00 for my dues. I have been here since December 3 last year (1956). I spent $8\frac{1}{2}$ months on the island of St. Incia about 1,500 miles down range. Have been on San Salvador for about 2 months now. It is not quite the place that St. Lucia was, but is still quite livable. ACK was take to Elorida and guys have had to go back to Florida and work as they couldn't stand isolation from their families. DXing down here, especially at St. Lucia has been difficult becuase of tropical static. Best DX so far has been 2YC, 630 kc/s., in Wellington, N.Z. I was in the radio broadcasting business before coming down here. I was a transmitter engineer for WMCA in New York City. Also was a temporary studio engineer at WEVD also New York, for about two weeks. Worked part time for WAEB, Allantown, Pa. while in college during 1955. My home is in Ridgewood, N.J. Have reported several NRC DX programs this year. The engineer at KRSL said I was the most distant listaner to their Special. KRSL came in so very well here that I was very surprised to find that they were only 250 watts when the verification came.
