Do not take the by-pass but contime on South on U.S. 68 and City Route $2 J$. This will bring you right in front of the hotel. For those of you using U.S. 2Z from either direction, all you will need to do is to go to the South when you cons id rain Street. For those coming from the South or Wouthwest and using U.S. 25, follo: the by-pass till you came to Route 12 interchange, turn right and follow Route 12 and it will bring you: out to the hotel. For those of you using U.S. $30 N$ you will go on it until you come to U.S. 68 which will be at Williamstown, Ohio, then turn Nortil on it and go 16 miles and you will be at the hotel. For those coming by place you :illl have to come to Toledo as Fimlay does not have its commercial hocicup get. You also might get comection with Lima. As for those of you who are wantirg to know about the way to come by train, that is the big problem here now as they errs trying to take off so many of them that I can't say just now what the connections will be. They foll me they should know by August 1. May we remind you the hotel would like for you to have yous reservations for your rooms in to us oy August 1. The reason for that is so that they will know how much help they are going to need for over the fabor Day season. Only activity at this den dyring the past couple of months has been the logsing of several new stations being received here during daylight hours. Reports have goio to WAGE 1290, WJDI 1470, WELK 1010 and WAQE 1570. All have verified with the exception of W/JDY. In all, this past season was a slow one with reports going to 86 BCB stations. Teries have come to hand from 65 of these stations for a return of 75.3\%. 0nly six f/ups were nciled with three answers being received. Forty-three domestic stotions have verified for an average or $82.6 \%$. Twenty-two foreign veries back to wate for a $64.7 \%$ retum. Reports went to 33 stations conducting DX programs with 81.3 verifying as of June 2Ath. Best domestic veries for the season included CKDM 730, KWIZ 1480 , CJKL 560, KIUT 990, KTNC 1230, KRCK 1360, KGMS 1380, and KMED 1440. Two long sought foreign stations finally verified - IICS 855 and GMJZ 1582. By far the best foreign verie was received from ZYB-5 1270 which enclosed a clipping about my reception. Fyecatching QSL cards were received from WHOW 1520, HJAV 1185 and a very beatififul card from $2 \times X \times 92270 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}$. Most clever verie was the letter of KQDY 1320, and tho ridst Priendiy letter was sent by EOU-44 1015. BCB totals now at 1,956 verified from ? ${ }^{2}$ countries. Had a fine season on IN adding 160 veries to bring my total veries ont that band to 251 stations in 30 states and 24 countries. Most distant foreign beacons were Ecundorian stations GYE $420 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s} .3 \mathrm{kw}$, and ESM 385 with 1 kw . Most distant U. S. beacon was "ON Point Arquello Light Station, California, $302 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}, \quad 800$ watts. Best catch on the low Irequencies is nov" Oakville, Namitoba, $412 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s} ., 20$ watts. Just had picture tube replaced on TV set, so hope to get in some DX from this poor TV locetion, using only an indoor antenna at present. IV totals, 70 verified from 25 statos and three countries. Top TV veries include KFEL, Denver, Ch. L, received with indoor antenna; CJBR Riraouski, Que. 3, and CME, Santa Clara, Cüa, 3. No matter where you DX on the radio spectrum there are many hours of enjoyment to be had in this wonderiul hobby. Quite likely I ll miss the Convertion as I have to take vacation starting the 26 th of Jume. Will tour ontario. 73 s .
