KFI also has a stamp, but itts their own. To Alan Mirriman, re KBIC-'KOLD' DX: Station KOLD broadcasts on $1425 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}$. with 1 kw . porrer. Last summer the 1 kw . XR bumed up and they obtinined a 250 watt XR on $1210 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}$. with call letters of KBIC for use while the other one was being repaired. Since the time that the 1,000 watt XR returned to the air they have used the 250 watt $X R$ and the call letters of KBIC for a "fine music" station on the air from 6:00-1:00 daily their time. It is also used during other hours as an AXR for KOLD while maintenance is going on at the 1 kw . XR. The DX show put on for the DXRC was broadcast on $1210 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}$. They were to use 250 watts, possibly 1,000 . The $\mathrm{v} / \mathrm{s}$ and all otner dinfo pertaining to this and other DXRC shows were in the Clubts bulletin.
