I found the article on EKKO stamps very interesting. I had heard about these from some of the "old men" around here a few times but never realized they were such a big thing. I have only one EKKO in my verie collection and that's from WFBR. KFI also has a stamp, but it's their own. To Alan Merriman, re KBIC-'KOLD' DX: Station KOLD broadcasts on 1425 kc/s. with 1 kw. power. Last summer the 1 kw. XR burned up and they obtained a 250 watt XR on 1210 kc/s. With call letters of KBIC for use while the other one was being repaired. Since the time that the 1,000 watt XR returned to the air they have used the 250 watt XR and the call letters of KBIC for a "fine music" station on the air from 6:00-1:00 daily their time. It is also used during other hours as an AXR for KOLD while maintenance is going on at the 1 kw. XR. The DX show put on for the DXRC was broadcast on 1210 kc/s. They were to use 250 watts, possibly 1,000. The v/s and all otner theo pertaining to this and other DXRC shows were in the Club's bulletin. I have checked into the reason why stations have been saying from whom they received their free records. This is because of a notice the FCC recently sent out to all stations on the interpretation of Section 31' of the Communications Act, which deals with sponsorship ID. Among other things the notice said a station must ID the source of any free phonograph records it plays. There is nothing that can be done about the programming, but we can get behind the FCC and ITU and perhaps make them cut down to a reasonable power. I think the Mexican government should not license stations which do not provide service for Mexico, but let's not strain diplomatic relations, OK! In sum, let's have constructive criticism; it doesn't do any good to gripe about how bad a station is, but what are they supposed to do about it? (That's what dials are

for. Glen. hi - Ed.)
