## MORE EXPLICIT DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO WHITE PLAINS

Take the New York State Thruway to Exit 8. Turn right onto Route 119 at the end of the exit. Route 119 will take you directly into White plains. When you get near the conter of Thite Plains, you will pass under a four-track railroad bridge. A blue sign with yellow letters will plainly state New Yoris Central Failroad/System on this bridge you go under. As you go under thes bridge, go straight ahoad on Main Street as Route 119 vill turn off to the left. The sixth red light you come to (start counting as soon as you come out from under the railroad bridge) turn right onto varcoroneck Averme. There is an R.K.O. Theatre on your left as you are maling this right turn, Go in on Mamaroneck Avenue three blocks (second red light) and make anotiner right tarn. This riill put you on Post Road.
