1. Contest will bo opon to all mombers in good standing of NRC. It will bo divided into three leaguos. It will bo known as the NRC FOREIGN DX CONTEST. It will be managed by Roger underson, 5700 Eighth Road North, irlington 5, Virginia.
2. Each contostant shall submit an entry fee of $25 \not \subset$ on or beforo the dateof Novomber 30, 1960, or in the case of now mombers, within 30 days of the date of their mombership.
3. Contest will run from Septombor 15, 1960, to ippil 15, 1961, inclusive. Loggings must be from one specific location excopt with the permission of the contest manager. Entries may be submittod until July 1, 1961.
4. All foroign stations located at least 500 miles from the listoning post of the contestant are eligible. NO U. S. or ChNaDa, stations are oligible except that ontrants in states bordering the Gulf of Moxico and Mexico may enter ono Canadian station from each province.
5. Scoring will bo by means of a point systom as follows:
a. Each country------3 points. b. Each NRC special----5 phe
c. Each 1000 miles 1 point. © Each Continent--10 pts.
(Maximum of 10 points for 10000 milos and over.)
6. Tho first distance category shall bo from 500-2000, exclusive (I point) and for all succocding distance catogories shall bo 2000-2999 inclusive. (2 pts.)
7. As mentioned in Pule 1, there will be three Leaguos as follows: WEST COLST LEAGUE: California, Oregon, Idaho, Washington, Utah, Nevasa, hrizona, Now Mexico. CENTTRiL LEfGUE: hlabama, Miss., La, Ark., Mo., Micho, Neb., N. De, Minn., Wisc., Ohio, Ky•, Ill., Mont., Wyo., Colo., Texas, Okla., Kans., Iowa, S. D., Ind., Tonn., EhSTERN LEAGUE: Mo., H. H., Vt., N. Y., Mass., R. I., Conn., $\mathbb{N}_{0}$. J., Ponna., Del., Ma., Va., N. C., S. C., Ga., Flo., W. Va., D. C.. NOTE: for Canadion members, the provinces of $B$. C. and Yukon Ters. Shall bo in tho WEST CO $\mathrm{A}_{2}$ S LE $\mathrm{L}_{2} G U E$. Theprovincos of Nfld, N. S., P. E. I., N. Bo, and Que., shall be in the Eastern League. $\mathrm{N}_{\mathrm{N}} \mathrm{ll}$ othors shall bo in the Central Eeague with the excoption of Ontario. LIl of Ontario west of a line drawn from Pittsburgh north through Pric and extended north will bo in the Contral Eoague. AII that part oast of this line shall be in the Eastern League. 8. Prizes will bo awarded to tho top three contestants in each League. Thoso will bo printed cortificatos and groups of stamps, proportionod anong the top throc contestants according to tho amount of the total entry feos.
8. A spocial bonus cortificate shall be awarded to the person in the contest who verifies the most countries.
9. Contest stendings will be published monthly in the first issue of DX NEWS oach month. Finsl standings will bo publithod in the July, 1961, issue.
10. Any nomber living outside tho US and Canada who wants to participate in this contost is asked to apply to the Nienager for a list of countries which are to be considored domestic (Ineligiblo)for him. If onough foroign members ontor, a 4th League will bo established.
11. NO STiLIIN may be entered in the 1960-61 contest which was entorod by that contostant in tho 1959-60 contest.
12. Distancos shall be calculated by the menagor and thoro Shall be no appoal from his decisions as to the propor distance brackets. ENTRY FPE and all ENTRIES are to bo sont to Roger Anderson, whose addross is above, not to your Editor in Lemoyne.

No doubt you will note that the address on the envelope looks a bit different, in fact a lot more plainer than before. The roason, a new addresser has been purchased. It is a hand Model 30 made by the Addressograph Company. Its metal constructed entirely which means that it will last for many years. It is not a bit complicated and can be used by anyone having a little common sense. Before making this purchase I investigated another make which was priced $50 \%$ less but in comparrison the Addressograph addresser was in my opinion a lot more and a lot better product for the money. This will take at least 2 hours off the job of addressing the builetin envelopes for each issue. Thus with our new A B Dick Mimeograph and now this addresser, I can truthfully say at least 4 to 5 hours have been eliminated in the time required in getting out each issue of DX News.

However in order to save the Club a little money, it is requested that from now on, when sending in a change of address that you enclose 5-3 stamps or $15 \phi$ to cover the cost of having the change made which will include the postage to and from Club HQ to Addrosso.. graph and back. I dont believe this is asking too much from those who in the future have address changes. All plates now made up are with your present QRAs and I have checked them with my up to date address Iist and find them to be correct with the exception of 5 , whichwill be corrected by the Addressograph Company without charge.

Thus if and when in the future someone or some group will take over the publishing of $D X$ News, they can be assured that it will not take the hours that is has in the past, thus making it more favorable instead of believing that it would take just too much time. Example, before today it took me aprox 3 hours to get the envelopes addresses by our former method. Today I did the same amount in 32 minutes, plus when they were finished, they were in order with no reason to have to recheck to see if all were there.

Now to the other item. All of you who attended the White Plains Convention were informed of the large amount of sample issues of DXNews that were requested and mailed out this past season with very poor results as to gaining new members from them. They were also in formed that the majority of our new members came in without requesting anything, but just mailed in their dues saying they wish to join the NRC. This resulted in a fee of $25 \phi$ to be charged for future requests for sample copies of DX News, which brings this NOTICE to those who write articles appearing in publications that plug or mention the NRC.

Anyone writing such, MUST STATE THAT A SAMPLE COPY OF THE CLUB'S BULIETIN MAY BE HAD BY WRITING THE NRC AND ENCLOSING 25申 TO COVER THE COST AND MAILING. However I will not enforce this policy until Novemper lst 1960 , but after that date, no $25 \phi$, no sample bulletin.

This sheet will be received by every publication that is on our mailing list, namely (In the UBA Only) Newark News Radio Club and a copy to Popular Electronics and Radio-TV Experimenter. Naturally a request coming from a foreign DXer, will be honored, except Canada, without the $25 \phi$ fee. This exception has been made because I have found that when the NRC gets a request from a foreign DXer, it usuam Ily results in a new member. However, those required to remit a fee of $25 \phi$ fior a sample, will be credited with same, if they become an NRC member, thus their first years dues would then cost them $\$ 3.75$ instead of $\$ 4.00$, the $25 \phi$ fee would have already been paid and so the club would not lose and the interested DXer wouldnt either.

In closing I wish to thank all of you for your cooperation and wish all of you plenty and good DX this season. Ray Edge-Exec Sec.
