It shows the station that you are at least trying to speak his language. When using the NRC Spanish Pport Form and the accompanying list of expressions, your gramar isn't going to be very far off. I also think PP cards have taeir place but not on your first report to a station. They are especially useful when I widely heard station has little or no clerical staff or for a station which is seldom heard and doesn! t understand what is meant by verifying.
