Jim Ernst - 134 Edward - Halifax, Nova Scotia Hope y'all had a "Cool Yule" and a "Frantic First." 1/8- KHEY-690 3:11-3:25 good log. 1/9- KWCB-1300 really pointding in on f/c 1:47-1:54. KVET-1300 s/off 1:55-2 (Thanks. Bob K.) Finally KELP-920 3:05-3:27. No CHWK-dx, only HIUA and CJMS slop. Sent KELP a tape so hope they answer. Weries WIVI WMFJ WAGN WNLC and get this - Torun-1367 posttively verified my tentative tape which I later believed to be Porto-I, nice letter plus QSL. That gives me two Europeans on 1367, with Poland verified. Only Portugal to conquer on that neat September morn when I bagged three from there. I doubt it is CKBL on 1248 as DoT is very strict with Canadians off frequency. I know when I was at CKBW we were off once 30 CPs and the monitoring station here in Halifax called Ottawa and we received a wire from the DoT the same day telling us to get back on 1000. So I can't see a 2 kc/s. error going unnoticed. 95% of Canadian stations don't f/c because they are continuously monitored as to programming and frequency. The only one I know of is Something that may be of interest to you is why there are fewer stations per city in Canada than in in compartively same dize U.S. cities. The DoT figures an area can get saturated so it comes to a state when two or three make all the money and a couple others might just make it financially. There are something like 20 in the Devver area and two of them occupy 85% of the audience and that leaves 15% for the other 18! That is why KXXI went off according to an item in Canadian Broadcaster. This is why the station was refused for Dartmouth. The audience is now split eight ways -CBHT CJCH CHNS CBH CKEW CKCL CJCH-tV CHSJ. If CJCH-TV makes out OK then Dartmouth will most likely get the go-ahead. Programming is watched quite strongly here also. When a license is applied for it has to be proven a station will contribute somet ing to the education and thinking. It should inform, give views and entertain. If a station does not do this it will usually be denied any demands made by it. CKOY Ottawa applied for It was denied mo tly because of its stereotyped juke box programming. CKGM has been taken a very dim view of as far as the officials and DXers are concerned; something like WKBW WPTR etc. isn't looked upon too highly by the authroties here mailly

Not too much since last report, but still a few. New calls, 12/31 HIUA-1270 with NX at 4:00 a.m., this one best Mondays with WXYZ off. Sometimes WKYR comes on later than 4:00. 1/2- WPCC-1410 and WRIX at same time on 4:55 a.m. s/on and later. 1/4- CFAM-1290 briefly and poorly through WNBF etc. 1/7- WNTT-1250 really giving WCAE's AN show the works during r/c-TT to 4*15, then musical show to RS time of 5:30. (Not audible at all through WCAE during December check). 1/8- 4VEH-1035 at 5:40 a.m. s/on and later, not logged before due to fact $4 ext{VEC}$ (on another frequency logged long ago). 1/14-KHAM-1580 with test from 3:40 to 4:00. 1/15- WMIC-1590 with special ET at 3:40. barely readable through WAKR/WETT, and WSOQ-1220 RS s/on for Sunday at 7:30 and soon blocked by WJUN s/on. That's it. Also hearing a mystery on 1040 Sundays after 5:30, Spanish speaking, does not appear to be Cuban or Mexican. In fact hear kc/s. given for several channels, BCB and SW, but no call noted. Only veries are nice letters from KCEE and WYAL and form from WPCC. They sure come slowly these days. Have finally relented and sent a few reports out of U.S., 4VEH and YNOL as they seem to verify for most. The latter is heard often and well now on 835 but "Swan" on 1160 has become a mess here and rarely readable, due to Cuban QRM. Sunday morning dawn session found Cuban on 860 at 6, also KONO, later someone mentioning Florida and at 7 o'clock WTEL came on and heard nicely. The other channel checked was 1230, Mexican there at 6, missed call. Later, at 7 o'dock WENC (first U.S. call now being heard on 1220 Sundays). At 7:30 several on, including WFAX and WSOQ, the latter new here and held just long enough for some data before WJUN took over at 7:34. Shappen the selectivity with your Q multiplier or crystal control and tune 1 kg/off 1340 and turn on your BFO adjusting it so it will produce the most audible tone while beating on the 1 kc. tone. If the station is running MCW IDs the rest is easy as you can copy the code or tape it and send it in. I have noticed I can clearly hear a tone using this method, that I culdn't heat at all by tuning the normal fashion. It doesn't look as if the KAGO DX will make it here through the Cuban.
