It's become rather discouraging, to put it mildy. I suspect that my $\mathrm{HQ}-160$ may be partially to blame, as I've never been too pleased with it. But I've noticed on the car radio after WNYC has left the air that WABC WOR et al. are there on 830 just as on the Hammarlund. I suppose that these traps and things of which members write might help, but I'm not at all up on the technical aspects of radio. As for the possibility of getting the $H Q-160$ tuned up, I just think back and shudder when I recall my attempts at having my olil S-4OB fixed up. I guess it would be okay if you had a good repairman, but I've yet to find one.
