Hi! This is my first entry in the Musings. I have a rather interesting devise to describe which can be used as a good substitute for a loop antenna. I've heard the following stations using it; WANN Annapolis, Md. through local WLIB; WBFD Bedford, Pa. through semi-local WJLK; WRRF-930 Washington, N.C. through local WPAT; WCMS Norfolk Va. and WQMR Silver Springs, Md. through 50 kw. local WMGM. On the average it cuts the signal of an unwanted station by about six S unites. It uses two non-parellel wires of 50° or more. They needn't be equal in size or height. The devise is actually an elaborate antenna tuner which adds equal and opposite signals from the undesired station while having little or no effect on the desired station. It has one important weakness which is the need for frequent readjustment to maintain a deep mull. It is not too complicated to build, and with the addition of a few switches can be made to peak as wall as null signals. If I find that there is an interest in this device I'll try in one of the next few copies of the DX NEWS to describe how to build and use it. (Welcome to DX NEWS, Marty, and that sounds fascinating to me! -ed.)

For instance: 50 kw., KNBC is 11.876; WMAQ 3/7455, WMGM .75723, 5 kw., WGAN (Maine) is 1.5912, CFRA (Ottawa) is 4.4200, WTMJ (Milwaukee) 11.733. 500 watts, WDAK (Ga.) 46.908 (my best). From W. Va.; WWNR (500 w.) 27.443, WCAW 250 w. 38.309. As of 9/18/61, WHDH and WCOP only Boston XRs on AN on Monday mornings. The rest are off approximately four hours. Also, WHDH is carrying all Boston Bruin Hockey games, home and away. In the 8/19/61 Musings Dave Gleason made a reference to PP cards. Would someone please publish an explanation of a PP card? INFORMATION FOR NRC MEMBERS

Renewal of Membership

Beginning immediately a different method of notifying members that their membership has approached the renewal date, will find their "DX-News" has been Rubber Stamped along the Left Hand Margin of the Front Page. The first stamp will read as follows "If Not Renewed Your Membership Expires with Next Issue" The other rubber stamp reads as follows; "If Not Renewed Your Membership Expires With This Issue"

Reason for using these rubber stamps means its cuts down the time getting notice to you, avoids continually rechecking the resords. This is the new system used. The first stamp will appear on the DX News you will receive a couple issues before your expiration date, the latter one will appear on the following DX News, meaning that it is the last issue before your expiration date. As you recall we address the members bulletin exvelopes with an Addressograph, using metal plates. When your DX News that contains the stamp saying this is the last issue, your Address plate is removed from the file and is not replaced until your renewal is received etc. Naturally if a renewal is received before your expiration date, the address plate naturally stays in the file.

It is hoped that no one takes offense to this method because it is being used only to lighten the book work at this end, so your cooperation will be appreciated.

Financial conditions in the States brings this request that our Canadian Members when sending in their dues, to refrain from sending checks for the following reason. Our US banks not only take or rather deduct the discount rate, but also deduct a fee, they call, commission for cashing them, thus a \$4.00 Canadian check nets the club only \$3.71 with deductions of the present exchange rate of .03½ plus .15¢ commission. So suggest Canadian Money Orders if you will. To all members in New Zealand, the bank will accept your currency and only deduct the rate of exchange that exists at the time. So if favorable to you lads, no need to get US Dollars to send.

Lastly on the Clubs money. All money received in the form of Dues, sale of Stationery-First Class postage Fund are deposited in the Liberty Bank of Buffalo in the Club's name. The only cash kept on hand is that which is received thru Postal Money Orders and this is used for the purpose of purchasing stamps to mail your DX News. If at times the cash amount on hand becomes too large to keep here, the excess is deposited in the clubs bank account.

The Books are continually kept up to date and are continually in order. First Class Postage funds along with all monies on hand that belong to our New Zealand members are recorded thus those records are not included in with the Club's assets.

Lastly regarding changes of address. First off all address changes MUST be sent to either P.O. Box 63 - Kensington Station - Buffalo 15, N.Y. or can be sent direct to me at 325 Shirley Ave - Buffalo 15, N.Y. Each change of address MUST also contain either .15¢ in coin or it can be sent in US or Canadian stamps amounting to equal value. Reason for this .15¢ is the cost to the club for a change by the Addressograph Co. However as stated before, all addresses that were in effect as of Oct 1 1960 are on file, thus if you revert back to said address, no fee is required, but if you go to a new address, a new plate must be made up, thus the .15¢ fee. The use of our addressograph and the new mimeograph has decreased the number of man hours that were formerly required to publish DX News. Thus in the future when the NRC might be looking for someone to take over the publishing job, it can be assured that they will not have to use out-moded equiptment. Remember Ole POP is past 59, and plans to retire around Sept 1964 along with leaving this area.

NATIONAL RADIO CLUB 1961 - 62 DOMESTIC CONTEST RULES

- 1 This seasons Domestic Contest will begin 00;01 September 20 1961 and end at 23;59 on July 15 1962. Stations heard and verified durthis period will be eligible for contest points as follows;
 - (A) Two (2) stations from each of the 48 States, D.C., and each Province of Canada will be eligible for this years domestic Contest. ALASKA and HAWAII are NOT eligible since these are considered Foreign DX. The first station from each of these States or Provinces will count ONE (1) point with the SECOND (2nd) station from each state or province counting THREE (3) points, for a total of FOUR (4) points possible in each state and province.
 - (B) Any Domestic DX Program arranged by the CPC Staff of the NRC verified will count an additional FIVE (5) points. This station may also be counted for the FIRST (1st) or SECOND (2nd) station in a state or province.
- 2 All members of the NRC in good standing are eligible. Entry Fee is .25¢ and must be sent to Contest Manager, Maurice W. Nittler, 1755 So. Vallejo Street, Denver 23, Colorado in order to participate in this contest. Deadline for entry will be December 1 1961 except for New Members who may enter THIRTY (30) Days after joining the NRC.
- 4 Final standings will be announced at the Annual NRC Convention in Indianapolis.
- 5 Deadline for entries for points will be August 15 1962. All stations entered must be heard and verified during contest period.
- 6 Standings will be listed monthly, beginning with the FIRST ISSUE of "DX NEWS" in December 1961. The Contest Manager reserves the right to reject entries from any contestant who does not report his entries regularly. This means a Contestant who waits until he has accumulated a large number of entries which could have been entered earlier, the Contest Manager can reject them. The purpose of this is to prevent contestants holding his entries until late in the contest then flooding the Contest Manager with a lot of additional work.
- 7 Lists of Entries (Veries) for contest must include the following; Call Letters - Location of Station - Dates Heard and Verified and Frequency of the Station.
- Prizes will be awarded to the first THREE (3) winners. Also special prizes will be awarded this year to the DXer being in First (1st) place on February 1 1962 and for the DXer verifying the most states and provinces. A special prize will be awarded to the FIRST (1st) DXer who verifies a Mystery Station, known only to the Contest Manager.
- 9 First Place winner will receive a years membership in the NRC. The other prizes will consist of NRC stationery or radio logs, depending on amount of prize money received from entrants.
- (PS) At this time, 35 members have entered this years contest with everyone else in the NRC invited to join in and enter.

- All entree fees and all lists for this contest must be sent to above.

NATIONAL RADIO CLUB 1961 - 62 FOREIGN CONTEST RULES

- 1 Contest will be open to all members in good standing of NRC. It will be divided into THREE (3) leagues. It will be known as the NRC FOREIGN CONTEST. It will be managed by Roger Anderson, 5700 Eighth Road North, Arlington 5 Virginia.
- 2 Each contestant shall submit an entry fee of 25ϕ on or before DEC 15th 1961, or in case of new members, within 30 days of the date of their membership.
- 3 Contest will run from September 15 1961, to April 15 1962 inclusive Loggings must be from ONE (1) specific location except with the permission of the Contest Manager. Entries may be submitted until July 1 1962.
- 4 All foreign stations located at least 500 miles from the listening post of the contestant are eligible. No U.S. or CANADIAN stations are eligible except that entrants in states bordering the Gulf of Mexico and Mexico may enter ONE (1) Canadian station from each Province.
- 5 Scoring will be by means of a point system as follows;
 - (a) Each Country - - 3 Points (b) Each NRC Special - 5 Pts (c) Each 1000 miles - 1 Point (d) Each Continent - 10 Pts (Maximum of 10 points for 10,000 miles or over)
- 6 The first distance catagory shall be from 500-2000, exclusive 1 Pt and for all other succeeding distance catagories shall be 2000-2999 inclusive. (2 points)
- 7 As mentioned in Rule 1, there will be THREE (3) Leagues as follows; WEST COAST LEAGUE; Calif-Oregon-Idaho-Washington-Utah-Nevada-Arizona ans New Mexico.
 - CENTRAL LEAGUE; Alabama-Miss-La-Ark-Mo-Mich-Neb-No Dak-Minn-Wisc-Ohio-Ky-Ill-Mont-Wyo-Colo-Texas-Okla-Kans-Iowa-S.D. Ind-Tenn;
 - EASTERN LEAGUE; Me-N.H.-Vt-Mass-R.I.-Conn-N.Y.-N.J.-PEnna-Del-Md-Va N.C.-S.C.-Ga-Fla-W. Va-D.C.
 - NOTE; For Canadian members, the provinces of B.C. and Yukon Terr shall be in the West Coast League. The Provinces of Nfld-N.S. PEI-N.B. and Que shall be in the Eastern League. All others shall be in the Central League with the exception of Ontario. All of Ont west of a line drawn from Pittsburgh North thru Erie and extended north will be in the Central League. All that part EAST of this line shall be in the Eastern League.
- 8 Prizes will be awarded to the Top THREE contestants in each League These will be printed certificates and groups of stamps proportioned among the top THREE contestants according to the amount of the total entry fees.
- 9 A special bonus certificate shall be awarded to the person in the contest who verifies the most countries.
- 10 Contest standings will be published monthly in the 1st issue ea Mo. Final standings will be published in the July 1962 issue.
- 11 Any member living outside the US and Canada who wants to participate in this contest is asked to apply to the Manager for a list of the countries which are to be considered Domestic (Oneligible) for him. If enough foreign members enter, a 4th League will be established.
- 12 NO STATION may be entered in the 1961-62 contest which was entered in the 1960-61 contestant by that contestant.
- 13 Distances shall be calculated by the Manager and there shall be no appeal from his decisions as to the proper distance brackets. ENTRY FEE and all ENTRIES are to be sent to CONTEST MANAGER-NOT YOUR EDITOR
