KARM noted off. Also 3/5, KPIR-1500, Oregon, ET 6:00-6:15 am S-9 with 10kw. No new loggings till 3/17, then my "best catch of the season"; KICY-850 Nome, Alaska! Logged with long-hair mx 4:12-4:32, on our Pontiac Car radio. Still don't know why the car radio should bring it in very clear with 350 being blank on the Zenith. Oujda, Mor-occo (593) increased on 11/1/61 from 1 to 100 Kw., and this has just

been reported. IFRB notes one mow station, Majadahunda, Spain, on 989 Kcs. with 20 Kw." Listening comments from the monitoring station are: "An Egyptian station was at times heard on 793 Kcs. in November and on 800 Kcs. in December, 1961. A Yugdslav station was at times heard on 1490 Kcs. between 11/18 and 12/8 and on 1499 Kcs. since then. The spanish station RNE Malaga has been observed alternately on 1005.8 Kcs. ind 1007.2 Kcs. since 11/21. The Yugoslav station at Nis has been obverved alternately on 926 Kcs. and 932 Kcs. since the beginning of November. The Spanish station at Segura, was observed for the first time on 1/9 on 1316 Kcs., and since 12/28 on 1335 Kcs. The jamming transmission reviously radiated on 647 Kcs. has not been heard since the end of 0ctober, but on the other hand, a new jamming transmission has been observed on 701 Kcs. since the middle of December."

NOTES FROM THE NEW ZEALAND DX TIMES AFRS Iraklion, Crete, operates on 1570 Kcs. from 2 AM - 10 AM NZT. Verie by letter from Lawrence Stern, 1st Lt., USAF Overseas Network, 7122 Support Squadron, APO 291, New York, N. Y.

AUSTRALIA-*-2FC and 2BL have increased power from 10 to 50 Kw. It is also likely that 3L0 and 3AR will also go to 50 Kw.

MALAYA-*-Now 10 Kw. on 660, 860, and 1040 Kes. Wants reports to Them Seng Kit.

NEW ZEALAND -*- Reports for 4YX should be sent to NZES, Box 888, Dunedin, as this is only a repeater station of two single 1 Kw. transmitters. 4YW Alexandra on 640 had official opening on 2/24.

MISCELLANEOUS-*-Morocco logged on 593 (Oujda-see above), Teheran is back on 1325 Kcs. Russian on 584 Kcs. is RV78, Ijevsk, Udmurf. The one on 836 is RV450, Vinnitsa, Ukraine. Polish station now on 1578 Kcs. possibly Olsatyn. Strange Chinese on 1200 Kcs., not Macau, possible BEC27 in Taiwan.
