This station is very rarely heard by listeners at any distance from Bel Air, as they are daytime only, and have no early-morning frequency check period. However, are Pierce Burgess, Chief Engineer of WVOB, notified our Joe Fela that he is planning to run an equipment test on the morning of Monday, March 16th, from 4:00 to 4:30 a.m., and he hopes that lots of our members, and those of the NNRC as well, will be able to hear WVOB then. They are omni-directional. This station has been on the air less than one year. We hope the channel may be clear for this period. Let's hope so, and again, our thanks to Mr. Burgess, and to Joe Fela, for informing the NRC of this equipment test.
