Well, now I guess it's come time for me to write my editorial views for the year: Over my Spring vacation, I had the opportunity to pay a visit to Mr. Harold A.Dorschug, Chief Engineer for ALI of WTIC's facilities- AM, FM, \& IV - which were very impressive. One of the highlights ( I think) of this visit was the chance to read over the vast file of letters and cards requesting verifications. To say the least, I was appanled at what I saw. For instance, one report read: "I heard your station at 2:48 on January 5. Please verify my report." And we wonder why stations don't verify. Iuckily, WTIC still veries reports, IF they merit it. Obviously that one, written almost illegiby ly on the back of a postcard, is unverifyable. There was no indicatioy - AM or PM; of EST or what; of Program details; of reception conditiltion; or even of frequency!!. While this report was not from an MRC member, there were some reports which were, which were also totally unverifyable. The point here is obvious. Lets clean up our own ranks so that stations may at least verify reports from DX'ers from not onl: NRC, but also other clubs, which we hope will also police their ranks One good way would be for everyone to either use the NRO report.forms available from Ray Edge, or to pattern their own reports after these forms, perhaps adding other data which they individually feel should be included. So let's go, all of you ... take a look at your reports. Are they neat? Do they carry correct date, month, year, time (completr and accurate program details? Do you include the frequency? the call letters (CORRECTLY), CX of reception? RX? Antenna? I noticed one NRC', er stated in his musing that he had mailed a report to a station. WMUF. He wondered why it had been returmed marked "insufficient address". The station in question was WNUS-1390, obviously, from his descriptior Mext time you ask why your percentage is so low, look at yourself 1 ist.

While on the subiect of penorting nroctione. I'd lime to point out
 this area. As I write this, I have copies of 5 of WTIC's reports before me. 2 are from Sweden; 1 is from Finland, another from England, (whoops, I have six), one from Colorado, and 1 from Alabama, which also included a tape, which I also have. The two reports from Sweden and the one from Alabama are of superior quality. One of the Swedish DX'ers included his location in degrees latitude and longitude, also hịs URA's height above sea level. The DX'er from England went so far as to list 15 or so other $\mathbb{N}$.A. stations received at about the same $t$ time. He also stated the direction of HIS antenna. As his letter wxs states that he is a regular $B O B D X^{\prime} e r$, I intend: to write him and enclose a copy of DX News. ${ }^{\text {NThff }}$ said about that.
My next point of business is a review of this season's Musings. The results go thisaway: 52 members have reported only once; 78 only twic 28 have reported 5-10 times (that 78 figure was for 2-4, pardon). Only 14 members made 11-15 reports, while only 9 made $1.5-20$. From here, I'll mention a few names, as they deserve the credit. Chris Lucas hit for 20; Don Eggert, Ken Butterfield and myself hit for 21; Ralph Johanns had 24, Sheldon Millor 22. ERC, hit $100 \%$ (why not,hi) with 28. The big gun for the non-editors was Stan Morss with 27 muses in 28 issues. This accounts for a grand total of 187 members with a musing this season. While this is better than last year's percentage, it's maybe $\frac{1}{2}$ of our total membership. Credit is also due Dave Schmidt who has mused 15 -times since he joined the club in December. Somehow, I suppose this editorial of mine will look monsterous, and, perhaps a bit poison-pen (or typewriter), but, I think it can alsc be termed beneficial in other ways. Now that i've made a few freinds and probably a few enemies, I'll make one final request: Let's all stop arguing about such things as DJ's, music, who logs stations fror where, who counts what as a new station, and so forth. It's my opinion that each DX'er should determine for himself, and himself alone, what he will log, and how he will log. it. Remember the old proverb: "One man's DX is another man's URiv" (Pardon the paraphrase, please)

I checked that evening, and at 2200 when Barbados had BEC news on SW relay, there was another BBCer behind, but apparently it was behind the SW station being relayed, and was not on 795 kc . At 2214 Barbados signed off, and there was no one left there. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Wonder if they might tape that newscast, and have faulty eraser to be QRir red by earlier newscast on tape? (Ed.)
800 COSTA RICA. TIGPH2, R. Centro, San Jose, in often after PJB s/off 2330. Verie last year states 5 kw ., not 3.5 as in IDXD list. Most regular of all CA's on this channel. (Niller, Fla.)
820 AUSTRATIA. 2GL,' Glen Innes, poor signal, always mixed with one or two others 3/28. 7 pips at 0400. (Seaver, Fla.) On $4 / 12$, at 0115 check, the WFAA/WBAP tone was OFF!! Static level too high to do any good, however. Will hope it's regular. (Ed.)
840 AUSTRALIA. $4 R K$, Rockhampton, OsId. heard first time this season $3 / 14$ with ABC ID and 8 pips at 0500. (Seaver, Calif.) BRAZIL. ZYD8, R. Excelsior de Bahia, Sao Salvador, ID heard $3 / 27$ at 0321 , finalIy. (Seaver, Calif.)
CHINA. R. Peking outlet fair 3/29 at 0650. (Seaver, Calif.)
845 ITAIY. Rome II, has been good lately during mid-evenings. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
854 PERU. OAXLA, Lima, the best ever $3 / 15$ at $0600 \mathrm{~s} / \mathrm{on}$. (Seaver, Calif.)
855 NETH. ANTITES. PJC2, R. Curom, Willemstad, Curacao. With a fine signal 3/15 from 0530-0600 OAXLA $\mathrm{s} / \mathrm{on}$. Evening reception out of the question for me. (Seaver, Calif.)
860 VENEZUELA. UNID, there defiritely seems to be a station in Maracaibo on 860 nows but hardly ever up enough. Seems much weaker than other coastal SA's. Note that Maracaibo stations on 970 and 1030 have now switched to 980 and 1020. (Miller)
865 HONDURAS. HRU, R. Centro, Tegucigalpa, was heard $3 / 15$ at 0610-0650. Very good signal. Have, not heard here since. (Seaver, Calif.). Back on 860. (Ed.)
870 PANAIA. HOHO, R. ITusical de Panama, almost certainly the ANer here under jammer Sis, which I had previously thought was Ecuadorian. ID very distorted by said jammer, but $99 \%$ sure he said R. Musical, not Cristal. (Miller, Fla.) Wonder when Castro's gonna discover he sounds pretty silly jamming a station that isn't there!!! (Ed.)
877 NO. KOREA. R. Fyongyang outlet very high, even with TGJ $3 / 29$ at 0700,3 pips and tone. (Seaver, Calif.)
880 COLOMBTA. I just got a net pennant from R . Bucaramanga indicating 880 kes onda larga, and citing 30 anos, 1934-1964. I DIDN'T hear them here, but Nike Silvera had mentioned this station as being heard on 880 . The pennant I got came with a duplicate verie from HJGE-1030 (1033) (Dangerfield, Pa.)
NEW ZEAL/ND. IYC, fuckland. Very good signal 3/15 at 0433-0502. Has been hindered since by WCBS OC/TT. (Seaver, Calif.)
885 MONTSERRAT. Plymouth, had very good signal $3 / 15$ at 0517. (Seaver, Calif.)
900. NETH. ANTIITES. PJA6, R. Victoria, Aruba. Back here again every evening after all the E.C. domestics go off. Sure didn't last long on 915, did they?? (Miller, Fla.)
990 UNID. I.A. Who was the weak Spanish-speaker here past 0120 MM $4 / 5$ ? Certain it Wasn't XET. Mexican WC 'er? Does anyone in the West know for sure??? (Miller, Fla.) XECL, Tijuana, has been a regular here, pre CEW AN. (Ed.)
998 MOLDAVIA. Kishinev, heard on 4/9 fairly well at 20L5, and again after 2200 . (Dangerfield, Pa.)
1000 BOLIVIA. No sign of CPI9, La Paz, on MM $4 / 5$, on their scheduled DX. Just a lot of static, and PRB9, Sao Paulo, quite strong through the noise. Someone way behind, tho ... (Dangerfield, Pa.) They'll be on early for awhile yet,says IRCA.

1000 COSTA RTCA. MINEC, R. Cima, San Ramon, ID heard $3 / 1$, at 0,27 . (Suaver, Cali.) PEXICO. XEOX, R. Mil, Mexico, D.F. often heard evenings, but best at s/on around 0700. (Seaver, Calif.)

MEXICO. XE. Unid. Mexican s/off at 2015 during liarch, later in April, maybe 2045. Gives only one ID during announcement. Have heard several times while still daylight in $S D$, and no Texan 50 kw . coming in. Possibly Sonora? (Seaver, Calif.)
NEW ZEATAND. 12D, Tauranga, great signal $3 / 15$ at 0447, better at 0521. (Seaver, Calif.)
VIRGIN IS. WBNB, heard very weakly $3 / 15$ at $0530 \mathrm{~s} /$ on, rough with 1ZD QRM. (Seaver, Calif.)
1015 EL SALVADOR. YSC, San Salvador, had the best signal I've heard from them $3 / 15$ at 0600 s/on. (Seaver, Calif.)
1070 NEW ZEALAND. 12B, Auckland, fair $3 / 15$ at 0447 parallel to 1000. (Seaver, Calif.)
1100 NEW ZEALAND: 32B, Christchurch, parallel $3 / 15$ with 1000 and 1070. Have heard several times since before 0500 SM's and IMI's. (Seaver, Calif.)
1110 COLONDIA. HJEW, Cali, runs AN with poor. signal. "Cadena Caracol Desde Cali en su. Emisora Radio Reloj." Believe this is the only Radio Reloj in Colombia on Caracol network. (Miller, Fla.)
1120 VENEZUELA. YVIF, Ondas del Lago, Maracaibo, ran AN for local pageant $M M / 5$. Sometimes over KMOX here! (Miller, Fla.)
1190 CUBA. CMJP, Ciogo de Avila. This is a move from 580. CMJD, listed here, probably off the air or on a completely different frequency. (ililier, Fla.)
1200 UNID. here was up very briefly $4 / 5$, woman in UNID language, but sounded more Oriental than Spanish. (Seaver, Calif.)
1230 PUERTO RICO. WNTK, Arecibo, dominates AN MM's here with new NSP programming. Much talk, very little if any in English. This is the only AN SS on this frequency audible in the East. Veried promptly in 1963. (Niller, Fla.)
1240 DOM. REP'. HIAU, La Voz de la Libertad, Puerto Plata, very good atop all here 4/5, 1715. (Silvera, Jamaica)
1280 PUERTO RICO. WCMN, Arecibo, with music request program at $1737 \mathrm{~L} / 5$. (Silvera) 1295 SINT MAARTEN. PJD2, Voice of Eastern Caribbean, Philipsburg, got it finally, with gospel music program $0432 \mathrm{~L} / 6$. Nust be 5 kw . now. (Silvera, Jamaica) Si. (Ed. PJD2, Philipsburg, difficult here between KMEN and KYNO, but pulled some audio $4 / 5$ at 0438. Never give up! (Seaver, Calif.)
1310 COIOMBIA. HJNB, here from 1300, announcing as Transmisoras Guias, on tip from Pichael Silvera. Seems to s/off 0030 Sirts. Overmodulating, slightly off frequency. Location is Bucaramanga. (Niller, Fla.)
CUBA. Unid. in Oriente province, ran til $0115 \mathrm{w} /$ baseball championships. IDed as Cadena Provincial de Oriente, very weak; probably very low power. (Miller, Fla.)
1320 COIOMBIA. HJFR, Ondas de Huila, (Location?) Fair to poor signal atop a raw sound like a drill 0227 4/5. (Silvera, Jamaica)
1340 DOM. REP. HIBZ, R. Centro, San Juan de la liaguana, had DX program $4 / 5$ at 0100 for FRA. (Silvera, Jamaica)
1358 EAST GERMANY. Still a strong station signing on nightly at 2200 in German. News programs seem to be parallel to DDR. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
1410 UNID. here, heard the last 3 pips at $0500 \mathrm{~L} / 5$, wonder how many I missed? 2 KO , the Aussie here. JOIF listed w/10 kw., but no other Japs heard all Ait. (Seaver) 1540 BAHAMAS. ZNS, Nassau, much improved day signal lately, better than WHBM-1490. Seems to have adjusted modulation from British to U.S. standard, and will give WRIZ-1550 problems if they ever get on the air. Have not heard ZNS mention any improvements, though. (Miller, Fla.)

My absence from the DXing Worldwide show at 1400 Saturdays these past few weeks has been my fault, no one else's. A few weeks ago, when I had flu and laryngitis, I got out of the groove. I've been quite surprised at the response to this feature, and those who checked the station April loth heard the NRC's return. If you have some interesting tapes, let me borrow them. I still have feature shows to do on Cuban jammers, from Ron Schatz, and New Zealand reception, thanks to Roy Nillar.

Victoria, which should come through, and six Brazilians. Africa has none out of two, Dakar and Agadir (optimist!) Id like to hear some comparative totals. Some of the SS yet out I expect back. Can't complain, though, about an SS percentage which may near that of domestics!
