The capacitor belongs in the eight turn winding, not the single turn. The RX should be connected to the single turn. This arrangement is much better both theoretically and in practice. I have also found a new gadget for souping up medium priced receivers - it's called a mechanical filter. Does wonders for both gain & selectivity however, it does require some mechanical knowledge of radios to install one. I bought mine from a local radio outfit for \$25 w/quite a bit of associated hardware that I might have beenable to build up myself from the junkbox. Could mever get the thing to work on the SX-43, so I bought a used S-40B & installed it. For instance, one report read: "I heard your station at 2:48 on January 5. Please verify my report." And we wonder why stations don't verify. Luckily, WTIC still veries reports, IF they merit it. Obviously that one, written almost illegibly on the back of a postcard, is unverifyable. There was no indication of AM or PM; of EST or what; of Program details; of reception conditition; or even of frequency!!. While this report was not from an NRC member, there were some reports which were, which were also totally unverifyable. The point here is obvious. Lets clean up our own ranks so that stations may at least verify reports from DX'ers from not onl; NRC, but also other clubs, which we hope will also police their ranks One good way would be for everyone to either use the NRC report forms available from Ray Edge, or to pattern their own reports after these forms, perhaps adding other data which they individually feel should be included. So let's go, all of you ... take a look at your reports. Are they neat? Do they carry correct date, month, year, time (complete and accurate program details? Do you include the frequency? the call letters (CORRECTLY), CX of reception? RX? Antenna? I noticed one NRC's er stated in his musing that he had mailed a report to a station WMUF He wondered why it had been returned marked "insufficient address". The station in question was WNUS-1390, obviously, from his description Next time you ask why your percentage is so low, look at yourself 1st

While on the subject of reporting practices, I'd like to point out that we hadred the era seem to be second to but haropean intends in this area. As I write this, I have copies of 5 of WTIC's reports before me. 2 are from Sweden, 1 is from Finland, another from England, (whoops, I have six), one from Colorado, and 1 from Alabama, which also included a tape, which I also have. The two reports from Sweden and the one from Alabama are of superior quality. One of the Swedish DX'ers included his location in degrees latitude and longitude, also his QRA's height above sea level. The DX'er from England went so far as to list 15 or so other N.A. stations received at about the same # time. He also stated the direction of HIS antenna. As his letter ***xx states that he is a regular BCB DX'er, I intend to write him and enclose a copy of DX News. 'Ninff said about that. . My next point of business is a review of this season's Musings. The results go thisaway: 52 members have reported only once; 78 only twic 28 have reported 5-10 times (that 78 figure was for 2-4, pardon). Only 14 members made 11-15 reports, while only 9 made 15-20. From here, I'll mention a few names, as they deserve the credit. Chris Lucas hit for 20; Don Eggert, Ken Butterfield and myself hit for 21; Ralph Johanns had 24, Sheldon Miller 22. ERC, hit 100% (why not, hi) with 28. The big gun for the non-editors was Stan Morss with 27 muses in 28 issues. This accounts for a grand total of 187 members with a musing this season. While this is better than last year's percentage, it's maybe \frac{1}{2} of our total membership. Credit is also due Dave Schmidt who has mused 15 times since he joined the club in December. Somehow, I suppose this editorial of mine will look monsterous, and, perhaps a bit poison-pen (or typewriter), but , I think it can also be termed beneficial in other ways. Now that I've made a few freinds and probably a few enemies, I'll make one final request: Let's all stop arguing about such things as DJ's, music, who logs stations from where, who counts what as a new station, and so forth. It's my opinion that each DX'er should determine for himself, and himself alone, what he will log, and how he will log it. Remember the old proverb: "One man's DX is another man's QRM" (Pardon the paraphrase, please)

There will be some AMs when the static level is light, and for those of us in the Western areas of the country, this will be a good opportunity to look for some of the Down Under stations, from areas where it is fall and winter. Summer DX'ers as far East as Texas have heard Brazilians, Chileans, Aussies and Zedders around 0430-0700 after the big East Coast clears have signed off. My own best reception under these conditions brought a July 8th, 1962 verie from PRE8-980. On the East Coast, it might be worthwhile to try for South Africa, Angola, Mozambique, and perhaps even Malagasy Rep. at s/on times. There has been no such reception in recent years, to my knowledge, for the East Coasters, but it could be worth an attempt. The principle should work both ways.

VIRGIN IS. WBNB, heard very weakly 3/15 at 0530 s/on, rough with 1ZD QRM. (Seaver, Calif.) 1015 EL SALVADOR. YSC, San Salvador, had the best signal I've heard from them 3/15

at 0600 s/on. (Seaver, Calif.) 1070 NEW ZEALAND. 1ZB, Auckland, fair 3/15 at 0447 parallel to 1000. (Seaver, Calif.)

1100 NEW ZEALAND. 3ZB, Christchurch, parallel 3/15 with 1000 and 1070. Have heard

several times since before 0500 SM's and MM's. (Seaver, Calif.)

1110 COLOMBIA. HJEW, Cali, runs AN with poor signal. "Cadena Caracol Desde Cali en su. Emisora Radio Reloj." Believe this is the only Radio Reloj in Colombia on Caracol network. (Miller, Fla.)

1120 VENEZUELA. YVMF, Ondas del Lago, Maracaibo, ran AN for local pageant NM 4/5.

Sometimes over KMOX here! (Miller, Fla.)

1190 CUBA. CMJP, Ciego de Avila. This is a move from 580. CMJD, listed here, probably off the air or on a completely different frequency. (Miller, Fla.)

1200 UNID. here was up very briefly 4/5, woman in UNID language, but sounded more

Oriental than Spanish. (Seaver, Calif.)

1230 PUERTO RICO. WNIK, Arecibo, dominates AN NM's here with new NSP programming. Much talk, very little if any in English. This is the only AN SS on this frequency audible in the East. Veried promptly in 1963. (Miller, Fla.)

1240 DOM. REP. HIAU, La Voz de la Libertad, Puerto Plata, very good atop all here 4/5, 1715. (Silvera, Jamaica)

1280 PUERTO RICO. WCMN, Arecibo, with music request program at 1737 4/5. (Silvera)

1295 SINT MAARTEN. PJD2, Voice of Eastern Caribbean, Philipsburg, got it finally, with gospel music program 0432 4/6. Must be 5 kw. now. (Silvera, Jamaica) Si. (Ed PJD2, Philipsburg, difficult here between KMEN and KYNO, but pulled some audio 4/5 at 0438. Never give up! (Seaver, Calif.)

1310 COLOMBIA. HJNB, here from 1300, announcing as Transmisoras Guias, on tip from Michael Silvera. Seems to s/off 0030 SM's. Overmodulating, slightly off frequency. Location is Bucaramanga. (Miller, Fla.) CUBA. Unid. in Oriente province, ran til Ol15 w/baseball championships. IDed as Cadena Provincial de Oriente, very weak; probably very low power. (Miller, Fla.)

1320 COLOMBIA. HJFR, Ondas de Huila, (Location?) Fair to poor signal atop a raw sound like a drill 0227 4/5. (Silvera, Jamaica)

1340 DOM. REP. HIBZ, R. Centro, San Juan de la Maguana, had DX program 4/5 at 0100 for IRCA. (Silvera, Jamaica)

1358 EAST GERMANY. Still a strong station signing on nightly at 2200 in German. News programs seem to be parallel to DDR. (Dangerfield, Pa.)

1410 UNID. here, heard the last 3 pips at 0500 4/5, wonder how many I missed? 2KO, the Aussie here. JOIF listed w/10 kw., but no other Japs heard all AM. (Seaver)

1540 BAHAMAS. ZNS, Nassau, much improved day signal lately, better than WMBM-1490. Seems to have adjusted modulation from British to U.S. standard, and will give WRIZ-1550 problems if they ever get on the air. Have not heard ZNS mention any improvements, though. (Miller, Fla.)

My absence from the DX ing Worldwide show at 1400 Saturdays these past few weeks has been my fault, no one else's. A few weeks ago, when I had flu and laryngitis, I got out of the groove. I've been quite surprised at the response to this feature, and those who checked the station April 10th heard the NRC's return. If you have some interesting tapes, let me borrow them. I still have feature shows to do on Cuban jammers, from Ron Schatz, and New Zealand reception, thanks to Roy Millar.

(See IDXD 11/28). My Oriental was mixed with Trinidad, so I sent an inquiry, and the card confirms my reception, but does not give time and frequency. I am very suspicious of 'SL cards, and think in this case a personal yes or no note from the station would be more persuasive. (Dangerfield, Pa.)

773 EGYPT. Cairo, fine air QSL. Egyptian girls and beautiful stamps. (Tyndall, Vt.)

791 GREECE. V.O.A. Thessaloniki. Signed confirmation re my Jan 5th reception. Guess I now won't be able to count the Greek home service on this freq. if I get an answer to another report out, but it would be some kind of a first. Greece, by the way, is country #98 under the revised country list. I gained a net of 6 new countries on this last shuffle. (Dangerfield, Pa.) I gained none. By the way, how you count the Greeks here, I'd think, would depend on how you count call letter changes, or, say, WBAP/WFAA on 820. (Ed.)

863 ARMINIA. Yerevan. Regular air verie with 9 lovely cards like Ben D. and others

got. Collector's item is right, Ben. (Tyndall, Vt.)

875 COSTA RICA. TISS, La Voz del Tropico, San Jose. Nice v/1 and pretty postcard

signed by Juan B. Araujo Fernandez. (Silvera, Jamaica)

880 BRAZIL. ZYU33, Porto Alegre, rubber-stamped "Radio Itai Ltda." on Int. Reply Card. Scribbled signature. #55 for Brazil. (Tyndall, Vt.) Believe this is first

Brazilian verie anyone's reported this year. (Ed.)

910 VENEZUELA. "R. Aeropuerto," Maiquetia. Re correct call, John, letter was like Hank W. got, no call. I used YVPF call because that was call when heard in 1963, and also I sent last try via Int. Reply Card and they put that in envelope, no correction, which means nothing, I realize. That's it. (Tyndall, Vt.)

995 ECUADOR. HCEW2, R. Suceso, Guayaquil, sent letter, pennant, and second letter asking for picture for station album. All in Spanish for English report. Quick.

Four weeks. (Calkin, N.B.)

1030 COLOMBIA. HJGE, R. Bucaramanga, duplicate v/l from them, probably for last season's follow-up. I heard 'em on 1033 kc. Are they still there, or 880? (Danger-field, Pa.)

1045 PANAMA. HOJ2, Ondas del Canajagua, Las Tablas, with v/l in 12 months by air in

Spanish. Country #34. (Calkin, N.B.)

"There is nothing more there," I think. May be an "Other ide of the mountain" type joke! How about it RFS? (Ed.)

C OMPLAINTS have been heard bout the slowness this season of foreign veries, yet a tabulation I recently completed shows that for me, at least, the percentage of response has soared. For example, from Spanish America, I have received 20 veries for 34 reports, 59%. Percentage is usually around 30%. N.A. other than Spanish runs 75%, better than my domestic, no-f/up rate. Europe shows 13 veries out of 15 reports, with Toulouse-944 and Parede-1034 not out long enough to worry about. South America other than Spanish has only 1 out of 8, non veried so far are R. Victoria, which should come through, and six Brazilians. Africa has none out of two, Dakar and Agadir (optimist!) I'd like to hear some comparative totals. Some of the SS yet out I expect back. Can't complain, though, about an SS percentage which may near that of domestics!
