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PREPARED CARDS...
seem to be a topic of discussion recently. To use them or not to use them... Zots of discussion going on. Several persons say it's the only way to get a verie from some stations. Others say they would never use them, and further, they shouldn't be used. A proposnl to have special club-printed sL's (prepared) has been hancing fire for some time. Ye Pub plans to vote agoinst this, for several reasons. First, Ifeel the use of preptred cards indiserimmatly ( (Xany DX'ers mall them out on first report) cause station personill who might otherwise verify by letter to wait and verify only by prepared cerd. If a standard, fill-in-the-blank club form were made available, it would further increase this tendency. Secondly, I believe the peepared card should have some kind of individuality to it. A specially done prepared cerd such as Hank Ward uses is an attractive addition to a collection, for example. Automated KX , where you fill in the blenks an a report form and fill in the blarks on a prepared card certainly takes sores of the individuality out of the hobby. Most of us will find our verification percentage, on first report, without follow-up, runs around $70 \%$, purely from the station's own resources as fer as the kind of verification. The normel usage of prepared cards is to send a good report, then a follow-up, and on third (or later) try, send a prepared card. Efforts by Jerry Starr's committee to provide ASI's for some of the tougher stations, and by individual DX'ers to visit reluctarit stations and explain the hobby ... or help with their verification problems, I believe is a much more constructive way to solve the problem than to flood the stations with the same style prepared carcs. I would not, of course, favor any kind of legislation AGAINST prepared carrds, but an ocensional hint about overdependence upon them.

It is currently being hrd in New Zealand on 640; according to a QSL from the Supervising Technician of the Civil Aviation Department on the island, the station usually operates with 250 watts; currently it is radiating only 50 watts however. This is a NEW COUNTRY for the NRC country list. *At a recent press conference, the Czech Minister of the Interior announced that the Czechoslovak government had terminated jamming of all radio transmissions "except for some transmissions from Radio Free Europe which Czechoslovakia does not regard as a radio station"; he also added that a proposal to terminate jamming even of these programs has been submitted to the government. (Id)
*According to a Polish Press broadcast, preparations are being made for the construction of a 1500 kw central radio broadcasting station in the region of Gostynica; the antenna will be the tallest in Europe ( 600 meters) and the station is expected to provide coverage of the entire country. No frequency has been announced yet. (Ed)
*Malta. According to a letter recently received by a NASWA member, the BBC's iiddle East relay station in lialta has been closed down; the station had operated on 1178 with 10 kw .
*American Samoa. Word has come at press time that WVU's long awaited 10 kw transmitter is now in operation and being widely heard throughout the Pacific area. Sked as given by NZDXPL is 1230-0415. A. good bet on the West Coast!
*Kuwait is getting 3 Marconi transmitters of 750 kw apiece; two will be used in parallel, according to an item in the Feburary Broadeast Engineer. (Sullivan) *ike Silvera reports thet quite a few Colombians are now running AN; in addition to the usual $A N$ pests, he's also recently noted:

The character of broadcasting in China continues to reflect the political and social confusion associated with the so-called "Cultural Revolution". As China continues to drift back towards prerevolutionary centralization (but with "Provincial Revolutionary Committees" replacing earlier political structures), the amount of locally-originated programming broadcast by regional stations continues to provide an indication of the mercurial relationship between the central regime in Peking and the local authorities. Since the beginning of the year there has been a slight but apparently significant tendency for the pattern of regional broadcasting to revert to the prerevolutionary mixture of locally originated programming and relays of CJKT programming from Peking.

As of May, 1968, only Foochow, Lhasa, Sian, and Urunchi continued to broadcast CJKT relays exclusively, with no local programming of any sort. This is believed the result of still unresolved political tension in these areas. As reported previously in DX News, many Provincial JKT stations also dropped all local programming in favor of nonstop CJKT relays at the height of the disorders in 1967; local material gradually crept in again as some measure of order was restored in these areas. Not unsuxprisingly, expansion of the Chinese broancasting system has effoctively come to a standstill since the beginning of the "Revolution".

For further information concerning the Chinese broadeasting system the reader is referred to My Broadeasting in China, published in the March-June IDXD in 1967.

DX PROFILE: JERRY STARR
Equipment here in Youngstown, Ohio, includes: Hammarlund $\mathrm{HQ}-180 \mathrm{~A}$ receiver with a Collins mechanical filter. Dissimiliar filter (Japanese) will be added when it arrives to help smooth out passband ripple. The 180 A also has been modified with tracking error correction tuning assembly and exalted carrier equipment using a QF-1 multiplier. A. R-55A rx is used for standby with a 1650 IF erystal filter modification. It's not a great rx , but OK for standby purposes. Other items incliwe a $4^{1}$ box loop made of RG-174A; a FET loop booster, a $2^{3}$ spiral loop and timing unit, a 320' longwire running NE-SW about $45^{\circ}$ above ground and associated tuning unit, and traps, a 20: vertical with counterpoise. Frequoncies are measured with a BC-221 IV frequency meter, accurate to $0.01 \%$ (so they say). ALl foreign reports include a tape made on my Ampex "cheapie" with Pultec-curve audio filtering, should the audio need touching up. Additional Ampex dubbing facilities are sometimes used at work at WHOT. A "T" notch filter helps prevent me from DX'ing only my color TV set which has sweep harmonics everywhere. Future plans call for a new scope for SAH, outboard IF amplifier with the new filter, and negotiations on a new Hammarlund SP-600-JX (about $\$ 1400 .$. ouch). Plans also include moving to a quieter location, preferably in Youngstown's western suburbs where 5 of the 6 full-time locals all have directional nulls.

As for myself, I'm 28 and a disk jockey at WHOT, Youngstown's Number One station out of the 13 in the marketing area. I do the 11 AI to 3 PM shift rionday through Friday. ## Safety for DX'ors and Proventative Maintenance <br> By Jerry Starr, WHOT

You're probably saying "What? Safety for DX'ers?". Well, my friend, right there in your $D X$ den there might be some dangerous gremlins lurking. when improperly used or poorly maintained, electronic equipment can be very dangerous, particularly if you're an "automated" DX'er who DX'es while asleep with unattended equipment. Here is a checklist of do's and don't I have accumulated from a good number of years of working with electronic equipment. Some of it was learned the hard way. Please don't you learn it that wayl

## RECEI VERS:

a. Periodically inspect all your receiving equipment. Remove the chassis from the cabinet and check closely for signs of over-heating and frayed or melted wiring. If something looks suspicious and you're not sure about it, have a qualified person evaluate the situation for you.
b. Clean your receiver's "innards" well; don't let gobs of dust accumulate insidn the cabinet - dust can burn. Use a soft bristle brush and vacuum cleaner at least twice a year. Keep it clean!
c. Ventilation of equipment is most important. Don't shove your equipment into something. Don't pile one piece of equipment on top of another. Tubes and transformers give of'f great amounts of heat so leave the equipment out in the open where it can breathe; equipment all cramped together just doesn't last as long or operate as efficiently when things start to heat up.
d. Work carefully. If you are planning to modify or repair your receiver, always unplug it tirst. Even if it's turned off, you can still get a dangerous jolt if the plug is still in. Be careful of power supply capacitors - even after the set has been turned off and unplugged it may take a few minutes for the charge to "bleed off". If you are doing alignment or some other repair requiring the equipment to be turned on, be careful. The average receiver is likely to have a few hundred volts floating around in it. There are several important rules-of-thumb for working on live equipment. Keep one hand in your pocket - the natural tendency to rest your other hand on the equipment has jolted many a man! Keep all tools on the table, not in your shirt pocket. It's too easy to forget and bend over the equipment, dropping a screwdriver or a pair of pliers into the works. This might producio a short circuit or you might get a nasty shock trying to retrieve the tool. Don't work on equipment if you're tired or sleepy - that's when mistales happen. The dangers of working on "live" equipment can't be stressed enough; even if one of these shocking experiences doesn't leave you permanently damaged, your equipment may be dashed to the floor and ruined when you instinctively jerk back. And remember, don't even start on a repair job unloss you know what you're doing. The Radio Amateur's Handbook provides a good introduction to construction practices.
TAPE RECORDFRS:
a. Don't let the recorder run for long periods of time unattended. I know many DX ers: like to let the recorder run while they sleep and many have a timer wired in for this purpose. I hate to spoil the fun, but this is a dangerous thing to do. I can porsonally recall three different times I've seen unattended tape machines catch fire because of overheated motors. These were all heavy-duty units, so needless to day, home recorders can be even more prone to overheating. Suppose a bearing goes dry or something in the transport system jams - it does happen you know. Fither of these problems will place undue strain on the motor and it can start to smoke in just a few minutes - and where there's smoke there may soon be a fire! If your machine is running when you're not around, be certain that someone checks it frequently.
b. Lubricate the recorder as recommended by the manufacturer. If a bearing goes dry and becomes scored or gouged, no amount of oiling will fix it. On the other hand, don't over-oil! If the motor should heat up, excess oil could start a fire just that much faster; excess oil can also find its way onto transport belts and wheels. Follow the maintenance schernle in the instruction booklet carefully.

Ventilation is very important for long life in a tape machine. If your recorder has a ventilation fan opening on the bottom or rear, don't cover it up and don't place the machine so that the opening is flush with the tabletop. Just like you, your recorder needs lots of fresh air.

## ANTENNAS:

a. Disconnect 2.11 outside antennas when not in use and during nearby electrical storms. Even though an electrical stom might be miles away, static charges and induced voltages can appear in an antenna system and damage receiver components. Even lightening arresters, while they are a good idea, will not always offer sufficient protection to your valuable equipment.
b. Never suspend your antenna from a power pole. I've seen this done many times. It's not only dangerous but illegal. Keep your antenna well clear of all power lines. Wind storms have been known to blow antennas across near-by powerlines with disastrous results, even though they were a good distance apart. Make sure your antenna is mechanically strong for the same reason.

## FUSES:

a. Check all your equipment for fusing. Many smaller pieces of equipment, ospecially tape recorders, do not have fuses. If have such a unit, install a fuse or have your serviceman do the job. Alternatively, fused power strips with 8 or 10 power receptacles are available. Fusing all your equipment is quite inexpensive and could well save you the price of new equipmert or even a new house should trouble develop.
b. Don't ignore a blown fuse. Fuses aren't like light bulbs - they don't just "wear out". Whether it's a Iuse in the equipment or a house fuse, don't just plug in a new fuse and forget about it - locate the reason for the fuse blowing and repair it.
c. Intermittent shorts in power supply filter capacitors are a common cause of mysteriously blowing fuses; sometimes the equipment will operate for hours before the replacement fuse blows. If this problem is suspected, look for signs of overheating or charring of resistors in the power supply. Trust your nose - often the smell of overheated resistors or insulation is the first sign that something is wrong somewhere. Be particularly alert for the smell of overheated components after you've turned on an untested piece of gear for the first time; by the same token, equipment which has been unused or stored for a long time should also be treated with special care. Electrolytic power supply capacitors very often go "sour" after prolonged storage.
d. Always use the proper fuse. Don't replace a fuse with one of higher rating, a penny, paper clip, or such. İ's generally better not to use "slo-blo" fuses if it can be helped - your equipment may suffer extensive damage in the few seconds while the fuse is "slomblo'ing". To defeat the safety factor of a fuse is to invite big trouble!

## GROUNDING:

a. Fquipment should be grounded for safety to a common ground - that is to say that all ground wires should terminate at the same point. The most popular and easily available ground is a cold water pipe. Ground clamps are available for this purpose at any electric supply store. Don't try to ground to a hot water pipe or a gas pipe. If your den has an outside window, a better solution is a good grounding rod, also available from the electrical supply store. Be certain to drive the rod deep into ground that will always be damp. For the best ground, if you want to do it well, bury the rod or a large piece of copper screening in a mixture of marble dust and charcoal. Ask your electrical supplier to recomend the proper heavy ground wire.
b. Keep all ground wires as short as possible and be certain all connections are clean and tight.
Safety and preventative maintenance go hand-in-hand to keep your equipment in good working order and to keep your equipment..... period!

## By Ray Moore

The semiconductor industry produces a device called the Voltage Variable Capacitor (VVC) or Varactor Diode, which is used in large numbers in commercial and military equipment. There are several areas where they can be used in sophistinated home built receivers and modifications when one is interested in ultimate performanco and operating ease. This article will describe one such application where a VVC is actually in use and suggest other applications for the same basic circuit.

The VVC is a variable capacitor that can be used for any of the normal variable capacitor functions such as tuning and trimming; unlike ordinary variable capacitors, however, the WVC is entirely electronic and contains no moving parts. One advantage of the VVC is that it can be physically located anywhere yet it can be tuned from the front panel of the receiver with a potentiometer. Most circuits with which variable capacitors are associated require that the capacitor be located close to the circuit itself and the capacitor must be tunable from the front panel. With mixer and antenna trimmers, main tuning and bandspread gangs, BFO tuning, and $Q$ multiplier tuming all clamoring for front panel space along with the associated circuitry, the receiver designer finds it necessary to compromise the preferable circuit layout, in order to meet the desired front panel layout.

I have added Electronic Vernier Tuning (EVT) to my homebuilt receiver using a VVC. The circuit is similar to that used in various ham transceivers to vary the VFO in the receive mode. The EVT control solves two problems which have been annoying:

1. It can be used to "zero" the main tuning dial of the receiver. When one uses a dial with an extreme ratio (e.g., the National PW dial where $1 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}=3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ ) even a small amount of oscillator drif $t$ is very distracting.
2. When using Nelson's exalted carrier technique ${ }^{1}$ I find it necessary to tune within 50 cps of the carrier. This is difficult even with the PW dial. A. 10 turn potentiometer coupled with a $0-1000$ counter to control the EVI circuit makes such close tuning a simple operation. (Using the reverse procedure of setting the main tuning control of the receiver and tuming the $Q$ Multiplier is a less desirable procedure because any drifting of the receiver local oscillator will change the position of the carrier in the IF passband).

To install EVT in a receiver you must disconnect the high side of the oscillator trimmer capacitor at point "X" in Figure 2. Point "X" of the EVT circuit (Figure 1) is then connected to point "X" of Figure 1. All the components enclosed in the dashed lines in Figure 1 must be mounted as close to the oscillator coil assembly as possible. The rest of the components can be mounted anywhere. The capacitance of C 1 is not critical, anything from 0.1 to 0.01 mfd is okay but it should be good quality mica or mylar. The voltage rating can be anything from 25 volts up. Diode D1 must be selected to have the same capacitance as the original CT in your receiver. The V20 diode which I used has a value of 20 mmfd at 4 volts and can be tuned from 15 mmfd to 35 mmfd as the bias is varied from 1 to 8 volts.

R1, R2, and D2 make up voltage dividers. If a positive voltage source is used the polarity of both D1 and D2 must be reversed. The values shown for the three components should be satisfactory for any voltage source from 50 to 200 volts. An even simplier arrangement (particularly suitable for transistor and car radios) is to eliminate D2 and R2 and connect a 9 volt transistor battery across R1.

R1 can be any value from 50 K ohms to 100 K ohms or more. It should, however, be a good quality potentiometer if smooth tuning action is desired. In my case I used a Bourns 3500S-1-503 ten turn potentiometer with a readout dial that can be read directly to one part in 1000 . If you wish to use a standard $270^{\circ}$ potentiometer for R1 it is advisable to use a different arrangement for the voltage divider across D2 in order to obtain a good vernier action. The arrangenent in Figure 3 is recommended with $\mathrm{R} 1 \mathrm{~A}+\mathrm{R1B}=2 \times \mathrm{R1}$. First it is necessary to determine the voltage nceded to bring D1 to the proper capacitance value to track the oscillator. This is done by temporarily connecting R1 as shown in Figure 1 and adjusting it to "zero"
the receiver main tuning dial. Measure the voltage from the arm of R1 connected to ground with a VTVM. Then calculate the values of R1A and R1B which are needed to give this voltage with R1 at the center of its range. This is done as follows:

assume voltage ( E ) found above was 3 volts and $R 1=50 \mathrm{~K}$ ohms:
$R 1 B=0.57 \times 10^{5}-25 K=57 \mathrm{~K}-25 \mathrm{~K}=32 \mathrm{~K}$ and $\mathrm{R1A}=2 \mathrm{R} 1-\mathrm{R} 1 \mathrm{~B}=100 \mathrm{~K}-32 \mathrm{~K}=68 \mathrm{~K}$

## OTHER APPLTCATIONS AND NOTES

1. What $Q$ Is Noeded? A low $Q$ diode is usually satisfactory when the diode is used to trim an oscillator as described above. The V20 diode which I used is specified to have a minimum $Q$ of 15 at $50 \mathrm{mc} / \mathrm{s}$. Since $Q$ is inversely proportional to frequency, it will have a minimum $Q$ of 750 at $1 \mathrm{mc} / \mathrm{s}$.
2. Remote Tuning of Loop Antennas. The VVC is ideal for remote tuning of a loop antenna. By "remote" we mean several feet - serious technical problems appear in really remote loops such as rooftop installations; these are explained by Nelson in his loop article ${ }^{2}$. The VVC should be used as a trimmer across the regular. Joop tuning capacitor. A VVC with a capacitance of about 35 mmfd a $Q$ of 25 at $50 \mathrm{me} / \mathrm{s}$ is suggested. See Figure 4 for a recommended circuit for this application. R1 and the battery can be located at any convonient location within a few feet of the loop capacitor. In practice, the loop is rough-tuned to the desired frequency With the variable capacitor and fine tuning is done with R1. This circuit will eliminate the hand capacitance problem that is troublesome with sare high $Q$ loops and allow the loop tuning control to be placed in a convenient location.
3. Mixer and Antenna. Trimmers. Use the circuit of Figure 1 for these applications. The same considerations apply except that there is little necessity for really fine tuning and use of a ton turn potentiometer would be an unwarranted extra extravagance. The $Q$ of the diode should probably be 25 or more at $50 \mathrm{mc} / \mathrm{s}$.
4. BFO Tuning. Use circuit of Figure 1 and same considerations apply.
5. Q Multiplier Tuning. Use either Figure 1 or Figure 4 depending on whether both sides of the capacitor must be isolated from ground or not. Incidentally, the Heathkit GD-125 Q multiplier has the tuning capacitor connected across only one of the feodback capacitors which is rather undesirable when operating close to the point of oscillation since varying the tuning control will change the feedback ratio and cause the circuit to go into oscillation. The tuning capacitor in the GD- 125 can be replaced with a VVC using the circuit of Figure 4 and give smoother operation when used for exalted carrier operation. It should be connected across the whole coil, not between one side of the coil and ground as in the original circuit.
