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A STATEMENT FROM THE PUBLISHER

The 1968 National Radio Club convention in Boston was both a happy occasion and a sad one for your Executive Secretary and Publisher. I was very happy at the size of the turnout, and the generally fine reaction to the programs we presented ... but I was very sad that I had to take the occasion to announce my resignation as Executive Secretary and Publisher. The demands of being abustded and the demands of publishing the NRC bulletin, I discovered, are conflicting, particularly when it must be considered that the demands as news director of a radio station covering a community of 300,000 mean considerably more than 40 hours a week devoted to that job.

Fortunately, a solution to the problem caused by the lack of a publisher was immediately and readily available. It is a solution that will result in more and better information available to all medium wave DX'ers than ever before, but without excessive burdens on one, two or three individuals to serve what is, after all, just a hobby. Details of that solution will be presented on Page Two and elsewhere ... and, when emotional aspects are stripped away, reason tells us the solution is a course that would be wisetto take even if I could continue as publisher. Thus, I am pleased to endorse fully the report you'll read on the following pages.

Among the many items I wanted to do but had overextended myself in regard to my abilities to produce of four fronts (job, marriage, club bulletin and convention) was the publication of the NRC Log. Those at the convention who saw the first 30 pages of the log know it will be the most informative and detailed ECB log (published ... and it will be completed and available soon. Unfortunately, we will have to change the terms its availability. Because the timing of the dues change and protection change came as it did, half the member getting \$10 bulletins for \$7.75. Thus our operating expenses have had to come out of monies that had been ulated, rather than current revenues. Therefore, the governing body of the NRC has concluded a nominal change for the log ... \$1.00 ... is a necessity. Ordering information is elsewhere in this bulletin.

Now, as my two-year term as Ecoutive Secretary comes to a close, let me leave my fellow members with a few things I have learned from prarticipation in the production end of the bulletin: ... 1) Do not expect too much from any one individual. If that individual should be incapacitated, forced to resign, or ... as has happened in some clubs ... just plain quita without notice or making arrangements for a successor, the club men bers as a whole will suffer. Keep the production workload spread out among many workers, be consise in the bulleting keep it a manageable size. 2) Keep the hobby ... and the club ... in its proper perspective in your life. Do not become so involved in this or any other hobby that your family or your job or both suffer. Avoid emotional ties to the hobby itself, or to specific elements in it, lest you find yourself fighting other people (or other obligations for your time) over something that really holds little importance. 3) As the leaders of the hobby provide a publication that reflects information needed to keep up with the direction the hobby itself is going, make an eartra effort to participate in the new organization in two capacities: first, as a contributor of informillion; and secondly, as a rational and cooperative shaper of its destinies. The mechanism is being established se members will have the last word on the development of the club ... but each individual should recognize that he may not be 100% right about everything he believes the club should do. It has been my experience that most fellow members are sincere and dedicated to the club, even though their opinions on its organization may differ from mine. If everyone adopts a sincere, open, give-and-take attitude, the new club will live up to its promise.

Boston Emergency Publishing Committee Report...

The sudden loss of the NRC's Executive Secretary and Publisher has thrown a further burden onto the already overworked Boston Area DX'ers. A handful of members scattered within a 40 mile circle centered on Boston is now responsible for the editing of two sections, production and distribution of the NRC Log, purchasing of supplies, addressing and stamping of envelopes, mailing of sample bulletins, keeping track of dues and renewals, bookkeeping, mimeographing, collating, stuffing and mailing of the bulletin, and more. In spite of the fact that we are still weary from hosting the largest Convention in the history of the NRC, this bulletin is coming out on time.

In the best tradition of club spirit the Boston Area DX'ers have banded together in order to guarantee that the bulletin will continue to be published until a more reasonable distribution of club workload can be arranged.

Phil Sullivan has volunteered to take the mimeo machine and assume the difficult task of actually running off the bulletin every week. Tom Holmes has taken on the tasks of Secretary-Treasurer in addition to his already time-consuming job of weekly envelope preparation. Since the bulletin will be mimeographed some 40 miles from the metropolitan Boston area, printed pages will be transported to Boston for collation and stuffing by the rest of the active Boston area members. This arrangement is unsatisfactory for all concerned but will have to do for now.

The BEPC believes that it can continue to produce a somewhat abbreviated DX News (probably frozen at 22 pages but we'll have to wait and see if that limit is practical) until the merger goes into effect. Once (and if) the merger goes into effect, the dispersal of administrative, bookkeeping, and editorial workloads within the new club, combined with the lessened publication load made possible by the elimination of duplicated material, will make the publication workload much more reasonable. An example will make the benefits of merger (insofar as publication is concerned) clear: last season the BAD guys put out a bulletin averaging 28 pages per issue to as many as 400 members - that works out to 11,200 sheets in an average run. A number of bulletins were as large as 32 pages, or 12,800 sheets in a run. In the merged club, which has about 500 members (there are about 100 joint NRC-IRCA members), a medium-sized eastern bulletin - say 18 pages - would use only 9,000 sheets in the run. Even the largest half-bulletin now envisioned for the joint club, which is 22 pages (the postage break), would require the handling of only 11,000 sheets. In the merged club, you would receive more pages per issue (remember you will receive one bulletin from each coast each issue) than from a single club, but the publishers will have less work than they now do with one of the "envelope-bursting" issues that are becoming all too common in both clubs now.

The BEPC sincerely believes (based upon careful consideration and planning) that the proposed merger will not only benefit the entire hobby but is essential if this publication is to continue. We can continue to publish an abbreviated DX News until the merger goes into effect; once that occurs it'll be much easier sailing for all concerned.

If the merger does not go into effect, we can see no way to continue to publish and administrate DX News as we have in the past. Nor do we think it likely that any individual or even group of individuals could be found to produce a DX News like you received last year. The tentative merger date is currently set for Docomber 1st, if not earlier.

Any group of members willing to assume the burden of publishing after the merger goes into effect (the task will then consist entirely of publication, with no administrative burdens) can obtain further details from HQ. The publication task following merger will be considerably less than that now being borne by the Boston area DX'ers, and much, much less than we have borne in the past year.

We conservatively estimate that John Callarman has devoted more than 1000 hours to the production of DX News since he volunteered his services as Publisher. How can we ever express our gratitude?

I believe it has one RF stage. It has at least two IF stages w/the two lower bands on a different IF than the two top bands. It is unoikely that the BCB IF is 455k, negating mechanical filter modification; although, with the lower IF frequency the selectivity is better than w/455k. Remember, it's almost that time again - weekly DX NEWSes. The merger will not be finalized and in operation until about 11/1, so, in the meantime, we start our twenty-third year as Editor of Musings of the Mmembers. It has been a real pleasure, and not a chore, to have served in this cpapacity during these long years. We've seen a lot happen in that time - the advent of the all-nigher, for one thing, and the refinement of the techniques of Foreign DX, and detailed catches by members in their Musings, day by day. It would take hours to thank everybody enough who has been so faithful in making Musings of the Members the success it has been - adx it has been a success, we have been told. Let's keep it going, in full force, right up to the megger date - and hopefully, beyond. The details of the future we do not yet know, but the future certainly looks rosy in the DX World, and please, address any and all comments on this earth-shaking development not to the Editor, but to the BAD GUYS.

Proposed Club Merger

The friendly and spirited competition which has existed between IRCA and NRC for the past 5 years has served to stimulate both clubs to produce bigger and better DX bulletins. During this time, however, a steadily increasing number of officers and members in both clubs have come to doubt whether the MW DX hobby is actually large enough to support two sizeable organizations providing the same basic services and publishing considerable duplicate material. After lengthy and open discussion, the governments of both clubs have agreed that a merger of the two clubs is both practica and desirable. Such a merger will not only help alleviate many of the specific problems currently facing each club but - and perhaps more important - will benefit the entire MW DX hobby.

why is a merger desirable? The basic problem underlying many of the troubles of both clubs is quite simple. There is just not enough talent available to administer, to edit, and to publish two large bulletins without stifling the growth of both clubs Much of the material now appearing in one club bulletin is duplicated in the other club the following week. Some of this duplicated effort is obvious: Condition of Frequencies Lists, Frequency Check Lists, contests, etc. Less obvious but even more important is the duplication of information and effort in sections such as IDXD and DXWW. The International sections, which often make up half of each bulletin, consistently contain a large fraction of duplicate material - an obvious and unfortun ate waste of both space and editorial talent. Similiar waste of time, effort, and talent likewise occurs in practically every facet of club operation - from the cuttin of stencils to the addressing of envelopes. Even those DX'ers fortunate enough to be able to afford membership in both clubs (and there are about 100 at the present time) must pay up to \$18 a year to obtain all of the DX information available. Merger of the two clubs, with its resulting elimination of duplicate information and members, would bring all available information into the hands of every DX'er at a cost not much greater than that presently being paid for a single club's dues.

What will be the result of the merger? While final details have not yet been worked out, both clubs have agreed on the following basic points:

- a. The IRCA and NRC should merge into a single new club. The name of the new club will be decided by a vote of the entire combined membership.
- b. The publishing workload will be divided as follows. The present IRCA facilitie will produce the domestic information and Forum/Musings type sections. The NRC facilities will handle international, feature, technical, and other material. General material such as contests, government pages, etc. will be printed by whichever publisher can best handle the additional workload.
- c. Each publisher will mail his half of the bulletin to the entire membership on t present schedule of 34 issues per year.
- d. Based on the best estimate now available, the merged club should be able to publish up to 22 pages each issue <u>from each coast</u> for a dues schedule of about \$12 First Class and \$8 Third Class.
- e. The merged club will be administered by a representative form of democratic government. This will not only free the publishers from time-consuming administrative workloads but will guarantee that important decisions will be made in response to the will of the majority. The responsibilities and powers of club officials will be clearly defined.
- f. The final format of the new bulletin will be decided by the new club government and will represent the wishes of the majority of the membership. Since the clubulletins are already quite similiar in many respects, the eventual format for the new club will be quite familiar in all likelihood. The final format will represent the wishes of the majority.
- g. Dues money already paid to the clubs will be fairly and equitably credited to the new club. While neither club has had time to do a complete audit of total financial condition, noither club will be called upon to absorb debts from the other. If either club is in the red at the time of the merger, this indebtedne

will be divided among the members of the club concerned <u>before</u> the merger is effected. Based upon the expiration date of each individual subscription, an equivalent credit for membership in the merged club will be made in a fashion which will guarantee that both clubs will enter the merger on an equivalent financial basis. The final dues structure for the new club and the method for pro-rating outstanding dues will be decided after careful consideration of each club's asses and liabilities. Since this is an important matter of concern to all members, a hypothetical example will help explain the type of scheme for pro-rating dues presently envisioned. Suppose you have paid \$12 in dues to one of the clubs and have half of your dues left (i.e., you have 17 issues to go) at the time of the merger. If this club were slightly in the red at the time of the merger, your pro-rated dues toward the new club might come to \$5.75, for example. The renewal date in the merged club would then be calculated from this figure. Thus both clubs will be on an equivalent financial basis at the time of the merger.

It is important to realize that neither club is being absorbed by the other - both clubs are joining together on an equal basis to form a new organization for the benefit of all.

How will this merger come about? The Governing Body of the NRC and the Board of Directors of the IRCA have already agreed unanimously upon a merger based on the above basic principles. It is expected that both clubs will continue to publish until the time of merger with no interruption of either club's schedule. The present plan for implementation of the merger is as follows.

- 1) A committee of 10 members, five representing each club, will draft a basic constitution for the new club and will decide upon the interim format of the new bulletin. Election of a Board of Directors and a President will proceed as quickly as possible. Final details concerning bylaws, final bulletin format, and other details will then be made by the duly elected representatives of the merged club.
- 2) The committee of 10 which will draft the basic constitution establishing elections and decide upon interim format consists of:

Ernie Cooper, NRC Musings Editor Don Erickson, IRCA Publisher Larry Godwin, IRCA President Tom Holmes, NRC Secretary/Treasurer Randy Kane, NRC DDXD Editor Ed Krejny, IRCA Director Gordon Nelson, NRC IDXD Editor Mike Northam, IRCA Secretary/Treasurer Randy Seaver, IRCA DXWW Editor Phil Sullivan, Acting NRC Publisher

If you wish to make your comments and suggestions about form of government, format, and other matters known to the committee of 10, you need send only two copies of your letter: one to Box 99. Cambridge, Mass., and one to Michael Northam, P.O. Box 605, Beaverton, Ore., 97005. Xerox copies will then be distributed to the other 8 members of the committee.

3) The constitution drafted by this committee will be ratified by an open vote of the membership of both clubs and the merger will be effected upon ratification. Elections for BOD and President will then follow immediately.

*Who benefits by this merger?

You the DX'er will benefit. You will receive two bulletins each week (on the present 34 issue schedule, as currently planned) containing all of the material which now appears in both bulletins. You will receive all of this material for a cost that is much less than combined membership in the two clubs today.

The editors will benefit. Instead of wasting valuable time and effort in the preparation of material duplicated in the other bulletin, the editors of both clubs will be able to make better and more efficient use of their time and talents. The merged membership will also provide a larger pool of potential editors than is now available in either club - thus easing the perennial problem of editorial succession.

The publishers will benefit. Because of the elimination of duplicated material, the total publishing task will become more manageable. More DX'ers will become available for future publication crews, and the existence of two separate publishing
