<u>DX conditions</u> have slowly begun to return to "normal" after a period of very high auroral activity between October 29th and November 4th. While we've been refraining from publishing geomagnetic index values here in IDXD in anticipation of our extensive article on Auroral and Geomagnetic Effects, the temptation to give the values for this last disturbance is too much to resist. Subject to many qualifications which are covered in the upcoming article, the geomagnetic value given here is a measure of the amount of absorption experienced by a TA signal on a path relatively far to the North; the higher the number the weaker these signals will be and the greater the disturbance the longer the time required to return to normal conditions.

As usual, the period of excellent cx noted the week of October 20th corresponded to an extended period of geomagnetic quiet. The large jump on October 28th corresponds to the sudden decline of TA and TP receptions and the onset of "auroral" cx. The value of 101 on November 1st corresponds to the beginning of a three day period of phenomenonally "auroral" cx characterized by a complete absence of TA receptions at the same time as unusual receptions on N-S paths. The absorption produced by this activity is now decaying at an appreciable rate and TA's are once again audible. It'll be several weeks more before high geomagnetic latitude paths are fully recovered, however; this is assuming we have no further such disturbances of course. Mike Bugaj in Iceland says, "Since 10/28 no DX - cx have been miserable w/only Akureyi-737 audible at night." Discussing conditions the first week of November, Bengt Ericson in Sweden says, "Very interesting conditions lately. All strong Europeans have been blotted out and many interesting Mideast stations have been heard." (This is the equivalent of our excellent Caribbean area reception during the period - Ed) From the land of ERBA, Don Kaskey in California says, "Aurora must have hit a day or two ago (October 31st) - after 3 months of near excellent conditions everything went to pot." The latest word at presstime from Ben Dangerfield is that some of the TA's are back but that reception is "freakish" - AFN-872 very strong but almost the only TA on the band at 2100 11/17 and faded out by 2130. Glenn Jacobs reports similiar spotty reception of only the commonest TA's.

*Spain. SCDX via French Agency A.F.P. says that tests have been conducted with a 1 megawatt transmitter from the Costa Brava. Built by the US government for Iron Curtain penetration. No frequency quoted. (MWN) Anyone see anything about this elsewhere? (Ed)

*Cesar Objio has written a very interesting report on exactly which LA stns are audible in the Dominican Republic on each channel for various times of day. This is a very detailed "band survey" type of report and is of great interest to members interested in the reception and stations of the Caribbean region. It also gives a good idea of which stations are actually "getting out" - listed powers not withstanding, hi. This report is unfortunately too long to be run at the moment and we're hoping to run it as soon as possible. Because of its timely nature during the present period of LA cx we'll be glad to furnish a copy immediately for a SASE.

The Simultaneous Listening Contest will begin soon - now's the time to get the channels staked out in advance. Conditions are lousy, you say? Sure they are - but in this Contest everybody's got the same handicap. Even if you decide not to enter seriously, send in what you do hear during whatever Blocks you get a chance to try - such informal entries will help us in the judging. May Yawn, the DX god, bless us with good ex for the contest.

DX conditions have slowly begun to return to "normal" after a period of very high auroral activity between October 29th and November 4th. While we've been refraining from publishing geomagnetic index values here in IDXD in anticipation of our extensive article on Auroral and Geomagnetic Effects, the temptation to give the values for this last disturbance is too much to resist. Subject to many qualifications which are covered in the upcoming article, the geomagnetic value given here is a measure of the amount of absorption experienced by a TA signal on a path relatively far to the North; the higher the number the weaker these signals will be and the greater the disturbance the longer the time required to return to normal conditions.

As usual, the period of excellent cx noted the week of October 20th corresponded to an extended period of geomagnetic quiet. The large jump on October 28th corresponds to the sudden decline of TA and TP receptions and the onset of "auroral" cx. The value of 101 on November 1st corresponds to the beginning of a three day period of phenomenonally "auroral" cx characterized by a complete absence of TA receptions at the same time as unusual receptions on N-S paths. The absorption produced by this activity is now decaying at an appreciable rate and TA's are once again audible. It'll be several weeks more before high geomagnetic latitude paths are fully recovered, however; this is assuming we have no further such disturbances of course. Mike Bugaj in Iceland says, "Since 10/28 no DX - cx have been miserable w/only Akureyi-737 audible at night." Discussing conditions the first week of November, Bengt Ericson in Sweden says, "Very interesting conditions lately. All strong Europeans have been blotted out and many interesting Mideast stations have been heard." (This is the equivalent of our excellent Caribbean area reception during the period - Ed) From the land of ERBA, Don Kaskey in California says, "Aurora must have hit a day or two ago (October 31st) - after 3 months of near excellent conditions everything went to pot." The latest word at presstime from Ben Dangerfield is that some of the TA's are back but that reception is "freakish" - AFN-872 very strong but almost the only TA on the band at 2100 11/17 and faded out by 2130. Glenn Jacobs reports similiar spotty reception of only the commonest TA's.

*Spain. SCDX via French Agency A.F.P. says that tests have been conducted with a 1 megawatt transmitter from the Costa Brava. Built by the US government for Iron Curtain penetration. No frequency quoted. (MWN) Anyone see anything about this elsewhere? (Ed)

*Cesar Objio has written a very interesting report on exactly which LA stns are audible in the Dominican Republic on each channel for various times of day. This is a very detailed "band survey" type of report and is of great interest to members interested in the reception and stations of the Caribbean region. It also gives a good idea of which stations are actually "getting out" - listed powers not withstanding, hi. This report is unfortunately too long to be run at the moment and we're hoping to run it as soon as possible. Because of its timely nature during the present period of LA cx we'll be glad to furnish a copy immediately for a SASE.

The Simultaneous Listening Contest will begin soon - now's the time to get the channels staked out in advance. Conditions are lousy, you say? Sure they are - but in this Contest everybody's got the same handicap.
