OLDEST MEDIUM WAVE DX CLUB Established 1933

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This edition of <u>DX News</u> is our first try at what we hope will be regular bulletin production by commercial photo-offset printing. This is a highly experimental issue because the editors all have to discover the right combination of ribbons, strike produces, etc. necessary to produce the clearest and most distinct final impression. The original copy will be returned to each editor so that he will best be able to correct whatever problems do crop up.

This particular "magazine" format was chosen after an extensive study of the economics of the situation. In particular the slight reduction in overall size - which amounts to about a 22% reduction compared to the old mimeo format - represents a careful compromise between legibility and postage costs. With this present format, the postage weight breaks are at 16 pages and 32 pages; this means that the club realizes a considerable postage saving whenever a light bulletin happens to come along.

Savings from lessened postage expenses, and elimination of envelope, paper, stencil and ink costs, almost exactly balance the additional cost of printing. This is possible because of the relatively large number of bulletins produced; as the membership continues to increase in size the actual cost to produce a copy will decrease. Assuming we hit no unforeseen snags, editors will be mailing directly to the printer by Wednesday; completed bulletins - all ready to be addressed and stamped - will be ready by Friday afternoon. It'll be about as close to an automatic process as we can go.

One aspect that particularly gladdens me is the ease with which we will be able to include <u>clear</u> drawings, illustrations, and plans. First on tap'll be FET/altazimuth plans - in the next few weeks if all goes well.

Because of our folio format, each bulletin will be a multiple of 4 pages; we have arranged with the printer to supply him with a backlog of articles, etc. to draw upon each week to bring the total number of pages up to par. This material will appear on the last pages of the bulletin and of course some of these features will have to break off abruptly on occasion. It's either that or blanks.

Publication crew for the last mimeo bulletin included Bart Cronin, Ray Moore, Randy Kane. Stan Morss, and Phil Sullivan. And was hosted by my remarkably patient wife.

EX conditions continue to be fair to excellent but quite changeable and "spotty". Dangerfie in Pa. reports, "TA reception here has been spotty, but each night a few stations are good, and not necessarily the same few. 1/3 had several from Poland midevening plus AFN-1106; 1/4 AM it was Saar-1421. Iberians only so-so. Many TA's good here on Xmas Eve including Vaticar Richard Wood in Hawaii says, "12/28 a good night; N. Americans as far as WBEM, WLS, WLW; good opening to Pacific Northwest. Mexico good, TIRICA in for a new CA logging. Early fade-ins of Japan, Korea, Midway. Little DU activity." On 1/1 Richard says, "Excellent to all areas. My second Alaskan, KFRB, in very well; Pacific outstanding; early Asian fade-ins; PJB semilocal; Mainland as far as WBEM, WHAS good."

Geomagnetic activity is very closely related to long-distance MW reception; the more Northern the path the greater the effect. A high geomagnetic figure is produced by certain ionospheri processes which also tend to produce high latitude absorption of MW signals and "auroral" conditions. The great MW disturbance which began 10/29/68 produced a jump in geomagnetic index from 6 to 31 in the space of one day; the figure rose to 101 a few days later. Paths such as Europe-WCNA and Asia-ECNA are impossible during such a period. High latitude paths cort just mentioned require prolonged periods of low activity. Note that prolonged periods of geomagnetic activity are a necessary but not sufficient condition for high latitude DX; other ionospheric features often block such receptions even after a long quiet period. With this issue we will begin listing these indexes because of the close relationship between geomagnetic activity and many long distance MW receptions. Further information on this topic, including maps for particular paths, will appear in DX News in a few weeks. The geomagnetic figure we will list is the Fredericksburg A-Index. Wood's receptions will often appear anomalous due to his relatively low latitude.

This took place about a week before Radio Nordsee was due to come on and their personnel were threatened with fines and jail sentences. Spokesmen for Nordsee said they didn't believe this would be effective until March and threatened to sail to the coast of Holland - which hasn't signed the pact yet. So no Nordsee.

*Fanama City Situation. Glenn Hauser asked one of his army buddles stationed just outside Panama City to check the band and he did so 2000-2200 EST on 12/11. He couldn't check freqs closely but found the following on: 610, 645, 670, 700 (seemed off freq), 830, 870, 940, 965, 1015, 1060, 1080, 1100, 1115, and will check high band later. Not heard and doubtful if on tair: R. 850-850, LV del Pueblo-900, and R. Union-1035. Weak unids on 550 and 575.

The Character of a Column

At this exciting turnpoint in NRC history. I feel that it is necessary to explain, re-state, and perhaps re-define the goals and character of Domestic DX Digest. I have been long studying the relative presentation techniques of various DX columns, and there actually has been some discussion and comment concerning DDXD and editing problems. Those that have watched this section with any acuity, and those that even contribute, may be interested by this editorial.

The DXer who takes time to note and sort out his own DX might like to know something of the editing system used when his DX gets here. I have, very simply. transferred all "acceptable" tips onto 3x5 index cards, while checking relevant details, if necessary, with the NRC Log, F/c or CoF List, etc, marked the category (A,B,C,D) and initials of the DXer, and typed the column from the cards. It was my original intention to collect a complete DDXD file as a vast reference, but this project proved impractical and somewhat expansive. In any case, this is why I've never cared about double-spacing, post-cards, or organization of contributions. The index cards are a pliable editing medium, and permit considerable freedom. The DXer only needs to worry about the clarity and completeness of each item, and I can take care of the rest.

The object of DDXD, and that of its predecessor, "DX Down the Dial", has been to present "hot", non-routine DX tips clearly and briefly, listed by frequency. In April 1967, at the outset of DDXD, the acceptable types of DX were defined -we termed this "selective editing"- and the DX was separated into more or less specific time categories. A slight descrepancy of theory, however, has developed over 53 editions of DDXD. We have been categorically rejecting as unacceptable all tips that did not meet the editing requirements: all items that were not ETs. s/offs. changes. etc. The problem, simply, is that not all valuable DX fits these categories, and all that does doesn't belong in a column for significant DX. We have had to delete excellent RS loggings while including 50kw s/offs in the name of consistency; obviously, where consistency gained fairness and common sense suffered.

So the resolution for the New Year, if you will, is a slightly modified editorial policy. The base for the "selective" editing will be broadened to. hpefully, reap more of the best DX. We will consider all items submitted, but the most desirable types of tips will always be included. The more routine items will be included, too, but not often if current space limitations continue.

The order (always open to comment), with most likely to be included listed first:

- 1 Items effecting a change in the NRC Log, F/c List, CoF List, new ANers or ANers noted off, information on station changes or CPs.
- 2 What the DXer considers his unusual or non-routine DX. including pirate stations, carrier-currents, rare states, etc.
- Graveyard DX
- One-time (non f/c) ETs
- Routine loggings, interesting unIDs, s/ons and s/offs listed in the Log or LSR/LSS Maps, daytime DX
- Vague or "open" unIDs, dated s/ons and s/offs, locals and semilocals heard, etc.

No special attention will be given to routine s/ons and s/offs unless they very from a published listing, or have not been listed. The "time" categories will be continued; I have found them to work well, and they seem to

lend the column interest and character. Feature material, clippings, and articles are always appreciated.

The distinctions noted above and the changes in policy may seem trivial to the reader, and they probably are, but I hope to prevent the DDXD contributor from having to scratch his head and wonder. "Now why was that tip cut?"

And now, a new request: I'd like you to mark your best DX, to star or check off items that rate near the top- in effect, to "be your own editor"in the hope of making my job a little easier. Please keep an ear open for what you consider the most valuable DX, for you and for others, and send it
