A Hsppy Holiday Season to all the members & their families of the National Radio Club: The latest DX loggings included the DX TEST on 12/8 from 10kw. daytimer WITI-1530 Dalton, Ga. from 2:15-2:30am, w/a good signal into the Midwest. Then a test was heard from StationKTUI-1560 Sullivan, Mo. on 12/11 from 2:27-2:37am, in the clear. The latest verification added to my collection was Station WUBE-1230 Cincinnati, the 24-hour "Country-Politan" station which never goes to bed. In my last report to DX NEWS, I told of Station KFNF-920 in Shenendoah, Iowa, which ceased operations on 7/6/69, after broadcasting continuously since 1924. In just a short period of time, the FCC had received FOUR applications for the vacant frequency, which was 1,000/500 in Shenendoah. And. speaking of Iowa radio, a brand new station has taken the air for the first time in the NW part of the state, namely Station KVBX-1090, Sioux Center, w/500D. owned by the Tri-State Broadcasters, Inc. I wonder if either Ernie Wesolowski or Dave Fischer has logged them on RS yet. The DX TEST from Station WYSE-1560, Inverness, Fla. which was sked for MM 11/10 for the NRC members, did not materialize due to a death in the CE's immediate family. It is hoped that another date for the TEST can be set in early 1970. Unfortunately, the time set for the WUPR DX on the same morning was misinterpreted by the staff at WUPR, and they broadcast the 30 minute DX for the NRC, but one hour earlier than planned.

FDXC: The question has been raised in the F- contests as to how synchronized common wave signals are to be counted. For example, 1214 BBC & 908 BBC use. the same transmitters & towers. Such will count separately since there is a difference in frequency and thus a likely difference in both propagation and reception difficulty. Note to all FDXC entrants: When you send in next form or so include comments on what kind of awards should be given winners - open to any ideas/ suggestions, but do how have some already in mind. I have submitted a couple of antenna (loops) articles to both DX NEWS and DXM for possible publication - one on details of DCL. Now there is an aspect of BCB DXing which, it seems to me, has had little organized publicity but one which methinks would prove rather interesting - day DX on the BCB. There are a few of us who have been impressed by the recent how-tobuild-it articles of the past few months who just happen to have ten left thumbs. when it comes to anything more complicated than turning a screwdriver or kicking a loop assembly. For those who share the hangup of not being able to talk somebody into building the new GPN Loop, but still are hassled by a few 50kw clears practically hanging over your back yard, there's hope. Take one old-fashioned loop w/all the gadgetry mounted on a slightly over-sized board in the middle. & find out how far you ve got to tilt the thing in normal WX to knock out the groundwaves of the big locals. If you find angles like 600 & 700 applying, as they do here when the abode is bone-dry, just kick a few supports into an empty beer case, nail a pair of wooden blocks onto a narrow end (just far enough apart so the weight won't be on the fragile-looking gadgetry), and rest the loop on the upended case of brew. If you've got to null out a less extreme angle (say. when it rains/snows or you're working against a partial overwater shot such as KNX here), simply insert something more substantial under the box. For delicate fine-tuning, last year's Broadcasting Yearbook or an old standard rate is most satisfactory. The rig will take some kicking around and not look any worse than the usual empty case most of us are familiar with. All you gotta do is steal a few blocks from a little pre-schooler, empty the contensts of one 24-can case, & test the rig out. If you do the whole project in an hour or two, TP reception on local EC clears and TA reception on local WC clears is practically assured! Locally, reception of most everything isn't worth talking about. To make it worse, the wife feels the Christmas tree stand at the base of my loop should be relocated temporarily. On that note: Merry Christmas/Happy Chanukah to all.

CLENN HAUSER - FR448 42 7204, 388 CSG, AFTN, Box 1466, APO, San Francisco 96288 Or just name, box, & APO # will suffice. Greeting from the Land of Smiles! I'm at Korat RTAFB, just outside cit of Nakornrajsima, to use one of its many spelling variants. I am living in the barracks so far, and making do with a 50' longwire attached to my HQ 160 & MF, which arrived intact aside from a few scratches. After having been here two weeks, just barely getting accustomed to a totally new MW environment. Just think! Not a single stateside NSPer to worry about. Instead, AFRTS and Chinese NSPers, hi hi. Thailand's radio situation is extremely complex; I hope eventually to come up with an accurate listing. I've noted some interesting splits on 563 1356 1595, etc., which aren't in m: lists (FBIS is still in transit). Locals here at Korat are on 725 797 (nom 800) 950 975 & 1450. Only 1450, AFTN is NSP, or even AN, & despite being only a few hundred feet away, is no stronger than 797. Reason: Nominal power is fiction; is kept much lower to keep Thai happy. It ought to be wired or carrier current under these circumstances, instead of broadcast. There is always an HNL here, & TVI in the evening, thanks to AFTN TV. I understand there are no TV sets on Nauru; I may go there next, hi. To give you an idea of my location, I'm 12 hours ahead of EST, which would be convenient, but I'm a GMT diehard. On opposite meridian from places like Pittsburgh, & Lima, Peru, is the closet city to the antipode. Roughly equidistant from Alaska, South Africa, & Western Europe. Hawaii is a kilomile farther. Canada in the 7000s, USA 8000s, & Mexico 9000s. mmy hints on which NA powerhouse beam N will be welcome - or NW from WC. LA & NA will be difficult (like Europe to Wood), but at 15°N I don't expect too much Auroral blanketing over other paths. INDIA. An extremely powerful station is now being heard in Calcutta on about 580 kHz; it is believed that this is the new megawatt station testing. (ARC)

PHILIPPINES. Lars Ryden reports hearing a very strong new station while in Manila recently; they are programmed in Englsih and Tagalog and give time checks for Makati (a Manila suburb) so probably located there. This one gives the call of DWKR - apparently there are so many stations in Luzon that they've run out of DZ calls hand have had to resort to issuing DW calls now!

SOUTHERN RYUKYU ISLANDS. A new station on 1150 is operated by the R.B.C. at Hirara; power is 500 watts. This station is on Miyako Island, in the Sakishima group located midway between Okinawa and Taiwan. By our 50 mile rule, this is a separate country and should be added to the NRC Country List as such. (ARC)

TRUCIAL AMTRATE OF ABU DHAET. Abu Dhabi Broadcasting TV Service, P.O. Box 17, Abu Dhabi, is operating with 50 kw on 809 in Arabic; schedule at present is daily 2030-2310, 2310-0310 Fridays, 0630-1250 daily. The exact status of this station relative to our country list is unclear at the moment. (ARC)

SUDAN. According to a QSL recently received by an Arctic member, this country is currently using 764 with 100 kw and 960 with 60 kw; 575 is a 50 kw standby. (ARC)

Projected operations

CONGO. The UN General Assembly has voted to erect a "Radio Liberty" station in Kinshasa to beam programs to the black population in South Africa. (ARC)

HATTI. A Catholic priest and a radio technician have arrived from Canada to establish a 30 kw MW station to be located west of Gonaives. (ARC).

LIBYA. FBS on 833 will close down when RAF troops depart in March, 1970. (ARC).

SOUTHERN YEMEN. In a broadcast interview, the Controller-General of Radio and TV announced that the 50 kw station on 755 will have a power boost soon; "It is now planned to increase the power of our transmitters so that they can be heard loud and clear throughout the Arab world. The equipment is about to be installed and it is hoped that the Voice of Aden will soon be heard clearly". (Ed)

AIGERIA. A new high-power station in the National network is to be established in the Tanduf region according to Algiers. (Ed)

PAKISTAN. "The first shipment of radio transmitters for East Pakistan under Soviet aid has arrived in Chittagong. A second shipment is due at the port shortly. These include a 1,000 kw medium-wave transmitter... and six smaller transmitters". (Radio Pakistan)

GREECE. The VOA is to install a 500 kw station to replace the present 150 kw station at Thessalonika; the new station will be on Rhodes and the old station is to be given to the Greek government. (NZDXRA)

ANDAMAN ISLANDS. A new high-power station will be installed here in 1972. (NZDX)

ZAMBIA. The Minister of Information has announced that the 3 high-power MW stns presented to Zambia by Red China will be erected 11 miles west of Lusaka for security reasons; construction will begin when the Chinese finish surveying the area. (Ed)

MOROCCO. Azilal on 209 LONGWAVE has returned to the air; seems to have increased power considerably; now the most powerful signal on LW here. (Ed)

RADIO NORDSEE INTERNATIONAL. R. Nordsee Internaional on board the Mebo II will commence test transmissions from Portual around December 15th. Will later be on from anchor some 20 miles west of Schveningen and 25 miles North of Hoek van Holland. Will operate on 1605 100 kw; will get supplies from Spain by Mebo I under Panamanian flag. (Sweden Calling DX'ers)

A new commercial pirate radio station is expected to start during December 1969. Edwin Bollier and Erwin Meister are the founders and owners and they have just visited Slikkerveer shipwharf near Rotterdam to make last minute preparations. They are both from Zurich, Switzerland. The ship is the former Swiss coaster "Silvretta"; the name has been changed to "Mebo II" after the initials of the owners. Our member Aart van Eck has sent us a picture from a Dutch paper showing the owners in front of the ship.

The transmitters are from the U.S. and were installed in Lisbon. There is a 100 (?) kw MW transmitter, two 10 kw SW transmitter, and one for FM. The FM outlet will be used first when Radio Veronica has ceased operation due to the Dutch anti-pirate legislation. The MW coverage is expected to be about 1000 miles; the antenna will be over 100 feet high.

The location will be 8 miles off the Dutch/Belgian coast. The programs will be in Dutch, German, English, and perhaps French. The staff will consist of 18 persons and all programming will be live, except for taped programs from the Mormon and Baptist churches who have already purchased time. Over 4 million Dutch florins have already been invested by the founders and time has already been purchased by several international concerns.

Programming will be 90% popular music; the remaining time will be divided between commercials and anti-drug spots. The schedule will either be NSP or 0500-0100 local time. The frequency has not been announced but according to a press item it will be "89 meters" - an obvious misprint.

The two engineers, Bollier and Meister, are optimistic and they have planned this organization, Radio Nordsee Division in Zurich very carefully. They have also assumed that the Dutch or Belgian authorities will attempt to close the station; in such an event they plan to sail to the Mediterranean for a new position to cover Southern Europe. The address is P.O. Box 1136, CH-8047, Zurich. (ARC)

RADIO CAROLINE has reportedly been testing on 1187 with 20 kw; regular broadcasts are supposed to begin on December 24th. This information not confirmed. (SCDX)

THE VOICE OF SAVING THE COUNTRY AND SAVING THE PEOPLE. This is a station reportedly operated by anti-Macist factions in Shantung Province; it is heard by ships on the Hong Kong - Shanghai run and is apparently quite low powered. Recent press reports indicate that this station has been broadcasting anti-Mac programming off and on for the last 18 months; does anyone have any more information on this one? (Ed)




A WRYT GOOD TEST!

The show opens with "Ambassador College presents The World Tomorrow." American stations close with "The World Tomorrow has been brought to you by Ambassador College, P.O. Box III, Pasadena, California". In Canada, the address changes to "P.O. Box 64, Vancouver, B.C.".

Most, but not neccesarily all, of either the daily or Sunday-only shows run day and date, so parellels are quite easy. Below is the current BCB log, which will be updated as significant changes occur. Special thanks for assistance are due to Marilyn Doorley, Media Director at M.B. Scott, Inc., the Hollywood advertising agency that handled the placement of these schedules, and Marion J. McNair, of Ambassador College, Pasadena, California.

KOA 45 Years old

Dec. 15, 1924, KOA (850-Denver) signed on the air. An article in the Dec. 7 Rocky Mountain News described the first program and other historical data in honor of the stations anniversary.

The program began at 8 p.m. with a program of live music from downtown Denver, interspersed with speeches by the mayor and president of the University of Colorado. The show lasted two hours and 27 minutes.

Typocal programming in the early days consisted of a sign-on at 1 p.m. with 35 minutes of music, followed by livestock reports. The station then went off until 8 p.m., returning with music until 9:45 p.m.

By the spring of 1925, the programming became more sophisticated, including coverage of a bankers conference in Colorado Springs (its first out-or-town programming), fo loved later in the year by its first football game. Also, in the beginning there were no commercials!

National Anthems of the World; ed by M. Shaw, H. Coleman, and T.M. Cartledge; Third Revised, Enlarged Edition; Blandford Press, London, 1969. This book contains the national anthems for over 150 countries—melodies and complete arrangements. List of countries covered include such as W. Samoa and the Faroe Is. Useful for IDing foreign stations at s/on or s/off. (Gray Scrimgeour, Toronto, Ont.)

From Crystal to Color-WFBM; Gene Vaughn and the staff of WFBM, 190 pgs., \$5.95. This book tells the behind-the-scenes story of local radio and television, an industry that has grown from garage hobby to Big Business in only 40 years. WFBM Radio-TV of Indianapolis, in its 40 years of service to Indiana has played a major role in this development. From its studios have emerged many of the great names of show business who established themselves there before going on to national and international fame. The style of this book reflects the characteristic informality of a personal chat with the friendly people of radio and television. (Len Kruse, Dubuque, Ia.) (slightly condensed by ye ed)

Geomagnetic Observatories; L. George Lawrence; EW, Feb. 1969, pgs. 41-44. This article shows the Fredericksburg (Va.) Magnetic Observatory and the instruments used there to measure the earth's magnetic field and the changes in it—this is the data that is used to compute the value of Afr. An explanation of the various quanities measured is given, as well as a description of how they are measured. A basic knowledge of magnetic fields would be helpful but not essential for reading this. (ye ed)

**A Phase-Locked AM Radio Receiver; L.P. Chu; IEEETrBTR, Oct. 1969, vol. BTR-15, #3, pgs. 300-308. This paper describes a BCB receiver that converts directly from the received R.F. to baseband audio by means of a synchronous detector and thus avoids entirely the I.F. circuits. A good, concise mathematical description of the synchronous detection process is given and the results are analyzed for the case of a signal plus noise. Comparison with the conventional envelope detector shows the two methods to have equal performance when the signal is much stronger than the noise, whereas for a signal buried in a high noise level the synchronous detector is vastly superior. The threshhold effect present in envelope detectors does not occur in synchronous detectors. Equally important to the DXer seeking to use this method is the phase locking scheme -- I and Q audio channels whose outputs are phase compared to derive the locking signal. This receiver was designed mainly to eliminate the I.F. circuits so that it could be miniaturized (I.F. xfrmrs don't fit into IC's very well), however it does offer some performance advantages over the conventional design. The theory in this article is definately college level; a good practical background in electronics would be needed to duplicate the system. (ye ed) (An article on a similiar system appeared in 73 some time ago and it too will be reviewed when I find it -- PLS)

I'm beginning my sixth year w/the NRC. DX here has been confined to daytime recently & it is indeed slight. 12/13- WHAM-1180 Rochester w/WX & ID @ 11:30am, semi-local signal. This one really shocked me because while trying for WHAM during the daylight hours of Spring & Summer, I was never able to pull it in. However, now that cold WX has reached these parts, it seems to be a regular here. Hearing WHAM would not have surprised me too much if I had heard it a few hours after sunrise or a couple of hours before SSS, but I heard it very clearly in the middle of the day, & as near as I can figure, Rochester is o/300 miles from D.C. where I live! Maybe Jerry Bond can tell me for sure. Also, trying to log any stations daytime on 1330 here is almost useless due to WOOK-1340 D.C. being so close w/its constant Soul mx splattering all over the dial between 1330 & 1350. However, about a year ago I was fairly certain I heard WESR-1330 Tasley Va. one day, so I logged it as such. Recently while tuned to 1330 one day I heard an ad for a place in Havre de Grace through WOOK's mess which, of course, led me to believe I had WASA in that town. THE GOOD OLD DAYS OF DX

Most of us relative newcomers to the DX hobby love to listen to veteran DXers' stories of the "good old days" when channels were clear and long distant DX was less of a challenge. It seems a shame that there is relatively little written history of the early years of the hobby.

One publication, Radio Broadcast magazine, which was active in the mid-1920's, does provide a little information on DXing in the pioneer days of radio. This interesting publication covered both technical and programming developments in radio and, in the process, occasionally mentioned the activities of DXers.

Modern day DXers who battle over-crowded channels and 50 KWers can look back with envy to mid-1925 when only 571 stations were on the air, and at 5 KW WOC, WLW, WSAI, WCCO, and WCBD (Zion, Ill) were the highest powered stations in the country.

However, by August of 1925 WGY was testing with the unheard of power of 50 KW and WJZ was reported to be preparing to go on with 40 KW. Radio Broadcast noted that ten stations had called it quits since the July count, including such notables as WDM, Church of the Covenant in Washington, D.C.; WWAD, Michigan College of Mines; WVAY, the Milwaukee Civic Broadcasting Station; and WRAA, Rice University.

In a letter to the editor in July, 1926 Mr. C. M. Rebok of Philadelphia commented on his DXing: $\ ^{\circ}$

"No doubt you have received during the past winter many complaints from radio fans about poor reception, but in this connection I am glad to report my reception for the first year I have possessed a receiver, to be very good. I purchased in August, 1925, a five-tube receiver (factory built), and installed it in my home in Philadelphia. I use a 1/4" wide copper-tape antenna, about 50' long (single wire) and my lead is about 12' long. My receiver is located on the second floor and is grounded to a tin roof, which is about 12' square. The ground wire is about 5' long and is soldered to the tin roof.

I have tuned in about 200 stations, representing 31 states in the U. S., together with Cuba, Mexico, and Canada, and have received proof of reception from 180 stations, including: KFI, KGO, KPO(S.F.), CZE, WFAA, 6KW, KOA, CNRA(N.B.), CFCA(Toronto), and many others. I have tuned in several 100 watt stations from St. Louis, Florida, and New York. I have received KOA as early as 10 P.M. I had CZE one night in January about 10:30 P.M. EST. The greatest number of stations I have tuned in any one night is 77. (From 7 P.M. - 2 A.M.). The following is a list of

some of the stations from various states: 26 from New York, 23 from Illinois, 10 from Missouri, 3 from California, 4 from Texas, 20 from Pennsylvania, 7 from Iowa, 10 from Ohio, 9 from Florida, 8 from Canada, 3 from Wisconsin, 10 from Michigan, 12 from New Jersey. I can prove reception of these stations, both by letter and verification stamp. All these stations were received on the loud speaker.

I think this is very good reception for what is known as a poor radio receiving year, and I think I can do better, if conditions are more favorable next winter."

A December column proclaimed:

"Hear ye, O DX Hounds! Radio's queen is Mrs. Flossie E. Erickson of Bloomington, Illinois, according to the Radio Manufacturer's Show Association. Mrs. Erickson's record is summarized as follows: 326 stations in 178 cities, 55 states and provinces, and 9 countries, including four stations in Mexico, three in Cuba, one in Puerto Rico, one in France, 1 England, 1 Peru, and 1 Spain. She has hear 17 stations in California, 6 in Washington, and one in Oregon. At 250 miles distant she has received 172 stations, 66 at more than 1,000 miles range, 3 at more than 4,000, 4 at more than 3,000, and 5 at over 2,000. There are only five stations operating in the U.S. on 280 meters or above which she has not heard: WQAQ-New York, KOIN-Portland, KOMO-Seattle, KOAC-Corvallis, and KFQA-St. Louis."

In the same issue Jack Moskivita of San Pedro, California reported reception of Australian and Japanese stations around 3 A.M. PST, and an advertisement in the May, 1927 issue claimed a world DX record for Arthur Wald of Hoboken, New Jersey. Wald heard JOAK-Japan on 4/15/27 at a distance of 7,270 miles using Zetka tubes.

Other items of interest appear in the pages of Radio Broadcast, which might be found in your local public $\overline{\text{or}}$ $\overline{\text{college Tibrary's reference room.}}$ The May, 1925 issue even carried this poem to DXers: (The poem originally appeared in $\overline{\text{The New Yorker}}$)

"The Distance Fiend" by A. H. Folwell

He was a distance fiend,
 a loather of anything near.

Though WOOF had a singer of opera fame,
 and WOW a soprano of national fame,


He passed them both up for a Kansas quartet
