Second, the announcer sounds approximately like a guv I've heard on the station. And third, the mx is a noteworthy clincher. I can pussibly visualize Rome or the USSR or Thailand playing "Hawaiian Wedding Song" or perhaps using the bouncy Tahitian cut "Tanga Tiki" as a bed for an announcement. But I can't imagine any of them playing three obscure Polynesian cuts in less than an hour. The only other possibilities are Fiji-840 broadcasting off of published languages and s/on skeds, or 2ZD-840 w/some sort of Maori special programming, if either could be 4k off listed frequencies but remain unreported & unnoticed by either the Hawaiian or Zedder DXers. I'm still careful as a result of my flu problem so I only spent a short time at the dials MM 3/2. An HNL prevailed (mostly distant lightning) but nonetheless this will go down as one of the most incredible nights I have had from here. KRLD-1080 signed @ lam for the second silent MM, that leaves one more to go. Underneath was WKIO w/weak but readable signals. I checked their pattern & they radiate llw this way, 740 miles away. Later w/wKLO nulled, I was able to catch KSCO's s/off, very weak, but unmistakable. One of their nulls faces KRLD (and me) w/a calculated power of 6w, heard 1,450 miles! This has got to be the most incredible logging I have. KSCO's pattern is relatively simple & is not very likely to be out of alignment, but I intend to double-check w/them to be sure. About 2:30, the tape nailed an ID from WTIC during a WKOO fade in between the crashes. WIIC radiates 6kw. this way & was not as strong as WKLO maintaining my experience of extreme difficulty working E past the O.-Pa. border. Last year during two of KRID's silent MMs, I listened on 1080 & got zero. This time. three logs. Last year's loggings show that my best CX, especially to the W were during early March. Maybe this year will be a repeat - I hope so. There isn't much time left before things become impossible. Earlier MM 3/2, I managed my first log of CFC -1060 & of all things, KROD-600. Texas is quite a place. El Paso is 550 miles from here. I also got an armchair quality tape of KGES after KSWS s/off. To Phul Sullivan & anyone interested in KYAK's pattern, I have the FCCaccepted proposal, C-T doesn't yet have a measured pattern. Their nulls are indeed 1150 & 2450 and are very deep. If you live along these bearings, just hope something didn't work out right at the antenna. On the bearing of 105°, 2.8kw. is radiated: 1400- 4.9kw; 1600- 11kw; 1800- 13kw (peak S). These numbers should let you figure out what your chances are. 73.

 - 919.5 Colombia. Emisoras Fuentes, Cartagena. 3/2 0530 usual Todelar "Somo Profesionales" ID. Concluding pgm "Musica de Colombia". Signal now on this (low) side of KMTH. (Richard Wood, Hawaii)
 - 980 Venezuela. "YVTV, Exitos 980" Maracaibo. Stn hrd here on 11/2 is now IDing with this slogan, was so noted 0700 2/22. (Objio, D.R.)
- 1090 Hawaii. According to local press reports, KHAI will now return to the air in May. (Wood)
- 1100 Colombia. HJAT Barranquilla. Radio Reloj. I got a positive ID for Barranquilla at 0100 3/2 including freq, Caracol, slogan and location. I didn't know they ever did such a complete ID. Taped, too. A very strong signal with the other Radio Reloj beneath them. (Conrad, Fla.)
- 1114 Colombia. My unID on MR 2/7 is Radio del Comercio, HJGH Bucaramanga, even though I hrd it for the first time on Nov. 26, I forgot all about it; hrd again with ID 2113 2/28. (Objio)
- 1171.2 Honduras. HRVW San Pedro Sula, La Voz de Centroamerica. This is my unID here. Listed 1190 as Radio Centroamerica with SW // listed as L.V. de Centroamerica. Plays various types of music, from U.S. MoR to latin fast rhythms. Listed as 1 kw d, 6 kw nights and signal seems to bear this out. (cont'd)

Colombia. Radio Calidad, Cali, hrd with pop songs, first time, ID at 0029 2/27. (Objio)

Colombia. Ondas del Puerto, HJKY Girardot. Very good. This is my stn hrd here on 11/28, heard again to check on 2/27, IDing at 0100. To GPN, could this be your unID stn in 2/14 MR? DFed 203° and I did not hear a Cuban on this freq. (Objio)

Dominican Rep. Radio Ozama, Santo Domingo, heard testing since 2/21 when on 1470, was on 1453 2/23, on 1457 the next day, then on 1455 from 2/26 to 3/1. No info available yet. (Objio)

1457 Rumania. Tester recently mentioned on this freq is almost certainly Craiova. I remember it from my days in Europe as doing far more TTing than most Europeans, and it even seemed to broadcast some "numbers" messages after the end of its RS. Very often on with TT around that time of day. (Wood) (Tnx, Richard-ed.)

🕶 1510 Colombia. La Voz Panamericana, HJHX Bucaramanga, hrd for the first time on 3/1, IDing at 2228, pop Colo, bian songs, ex-1505. (Objio, D.R.) 1575 Costa Rica. Dom. Rep. Emisora Cultural, "La Voz de las Fuerzas Armadas" (armed forces), Santo Domingo, started testing on 2/23, hrd at 2045. (Objio) 1502 W. Germany. Bayerischer Rundfunk hrd with continuous orch mx from 2245 3/1, very good reception, ID in German at 2300 and this was the first time hrd. Also noted Langenberg-1586 then. (Obiio)

International Waters. Radio Nordsee International. Pgm info. S/off is at 1900 and on at 0000. At s/off is in English and I believe s/on is in Dutch. Either that or German, but has an "english" sound to it. Was badly QRMed by a "beep-beep-beep" on 1611 and by beacon RAB on 1613 (PAA airways Rabinal, Guatemala-Ed.). Has been hrd every day since 2/ 22 here. (Conrad. Fla.)

1466 Monaco. Radio Monte Carlo sent post card verie in 2 months for 1466 kHz. Date and verie statement given only, card shows xmtr antenna and flag. Unsigned. I had sent 2 IRC's. (Chris Lobdell. Reading. MA)(welcome to IDXD, Chris!) -- ---- - ----

Back of the file...it's almost as if the season ended already, hi.. Richard Wood pens, "North American DX continues outstanding and occupies my time so still not very active in foreign DX. Am trying to boost state totals over the present 40 and provinces over 7"...We (editors/publishers) will be looking into the merits of changing our times used in the columns; we've been tossing ideas around for a while and the Eclipse DX-party on 3/7 gave us a chance to talk at length. IDXD is willing to consider using GMT; Musings and Domestic will likely stay on EST or something - let us know what you want to see used in each of the various sections. I'm willing to go to GMT if you do. Watch the Boston Publ. Comm. page for info. ... Speaking of the Eclipse. a full report on what was likely the largest assembly of receivers assembled for research without Govt. or military sponsorship should appear soon in DX News. DXing from Ray Moore's in Walpole, Mass. we noted Greenville, N.C. atop 1070 at 1345 with WKOK behind; 15 minutes later it was all CBA at s-9. Re recent report, Hue station is on 655, judging from lack of het with No. Korea, eyeballing dial calibration, etc. (Glenn originally did report this as 655; previous reports in years past had listed this one on 654 and evidently they've moved. My apologies for the change I made -EA. Qatar. QBS. Doha good 2/8 at 1402 with nx in Arabic, at 1412 playing Western tunes. Seemed to s/off around 1430. New country.

Muscat and Owan. BBC. as of 2/8 definitely here and not on 701. Noted at 1406:30 in Arabic singing // 719 and hetting 701.

Greece. Athinai, 2/8 1420 segues, 1430 TS with 3 wide pips, Greek anct. New country, aside from Rhodes. Also on 2/6 at 1428 an SAH of 115/min (almost 2 Hz) and 1509 operatic mx.

755 Rumania. While jamming at minimum, 2/10 at 1439 a YL vocal snuck thru... on relistening to tape, detect some Rumanian characteristics. New country. India. VUD Delhi at s/off 1331 2/14, anct, short vocal anthem, and OC for a while. Noted an SAH so unlikely it's on 809.5 kHz. (perhaps they have

moved here to minimize het QRM from USSR or someone on 809 even -Ed.) Rumania. Bucuresti I (but with 2nd pgm) steady and strong 2/17 1447 with chamber mx, 1448 brief YL anmt in Rumanian, into pop vocals. 1500 IS and

"aici București" and seemed to give wavelengths, then into concert. 4810 mi. Armenia. Anmt. Internationale, ending Farsi (sked) pgm from Yerevan at 1357 2/12. Think it's a new country, hard to keep track of them all...

So. Vietnam. VTVN Saigon, Viet C&W mx, talk at 1408 2/14. During the previous hour they play concert mx, great for sore ears here: always a low het from Thai (?).

Saudi Arabia. Dammam, ME (Middle-East) mx 2/8 1257, 1259 ID in Arabic, and had a TS: which maybe someone else as sun time isn't that precise.

Thailand. Noted every night until late, perhaps AN, with a warbling het against 950. Light mx, occasional soft YL Thai anmts, 1515 2/16.

Ukraine. Probably the AA I guessed was Cairo earlier. Radio Moscow, Kiyev, sked in Arabic and so hrd 1413 2/10, some strong fade-ins but bad HISA QRM. Korea. Korean talk noted for first time here at 1535 2/16; believe it is North Korea 1006 xmtr drifting. Also was an OC before 1500.

So. Vietnam. VTVN Saigon, seemed parallel to 870 with concert, in well

briefly at 1313 2/14 with Hanoi silent.

Azerbaijan SSR. Baku, 2/10 1240 talk in unID lang, probably Azerbaijan but at 1409 M&W in Russian on Vietnam; excellent modulation on fair sig. 1.5 Hz SAH too. 2 stns mixing 2/12 at 1257, and at 1259 IS, folo by "Hi Ni Baku", M&W talking, chimes, 1.3 Hz SAH with other, probably SWF. On 2/16 definitely had German talk during Baku silent minute at 1359 but latter dominated at 1400 with HS.

1020 Ryukyu Is. KSAB. FEBC. Naha 2/10 1259 fair and clear, in "Nightwatch" pgm. inviting fonecalls for colorful calendar and Billy Graham booklet, repeated at 1330, hymns. Listed I kw.

RSFSR Asia. Tomsk, Mayak IS, TS and nx, 1559 2/10. Weaker than Tashkent which evidently left air earlier...still having trouble keeping apart. Uzbek SSR. Tashkent very listenable 2/14 at 1249 with Nat King Cole song in Spanish, Comnie Francis in Italian. Some dunce in barracks area turned on a TV at 1253, ITV ruined signal.

1025 Israel/Austria. Arabic mx 1520 2/16, 104/min (1.73 Hz) SAH developed into German talk at 1521 ment Österreich twice during Israeli fade. Soviets were off at the time but a TT after 1530 was no doubt from USSR. There was Chopin mx at 1526, piano, not sure from which.

Philippines. 2/16 1622 a singing ad in English, TC for 5:23 in Tagalog, doorbell. Distinct from the 1041 variant...evidently each Filipino stn wants to squat on its very own freq.

Philippines. Station here (4 listed on 1040) must be DZRI, Bolinao, Dagupan, Luzon, if network // 's given in ARC's WRTVH'70 are to be relied upon. On 2/18, at 1336 was // 1160, calling in #4; noticeably relayed, perhaps off the air.

Turkey/RSFSR Euro. Usually just Diyarbakir here around this time, China at other hours, but 2/16 at 1429 noted usual strong Turkish talk, under which was one of the Soviet IS's. Saransk, Mordavian Rep. capital, listed.

South Ryukyu Is. Japanese talk began at 1500 2/13 but didn't catch ID,

South Ryukyu Is. Japanese talk began at 1500 2/13 but didn't catch ID, also mixing with So. Korea TS, etc. This is a Ryukyu Hoso relay, down the chain. (This is indeed a new country; see DX News Jan 3, '70 GPN's IDXD section. This qualifies under the 50-mile separation rule. -Ed.)

So. Korea. HLCW, K.B.S. Wonju, // 740 and 710 w/mx; 130/min SAH with Ryukyu Hoso stn, 1506 2/13.

Philippines. DZYL, Bolinao, Meycauayan, 2/18, 1325 mostly in Tagalog but some English, covering anti-American demonstration, calling in remote cars. SLP (special late pgm--an abbreviation originated by NASWA-gh) as never hrd this late (or ever, hi) before. Was // 1041 and later found pgm on 960 also. A low het may have been from Dushanbe. Called itself "Action Radio" appropriately, as the studio announcer was obviously excited in participating in a real news event. At 1348 he thanked everybody for their help in the coverage, esp. ABS/CBN. He mentioned only DZAQ and DZYL by name, but also "14 other stations" down country. Then a contrastingly eloquent anti-violence PSA; 1353 s/off for DZYL only, giving licence number, date of expiration, names of duly licensed operators (as all Philippine stns are required to do), 1355 anthem and off.

2/14 with some quotations from Chairman Mao on love. Taped and will enjoy this for years, hi.

North Vietnam. Hanoi, good at 1812 2/6 with folk music (Pete Seeger, Peter Paul & Mary, etc.)...almost like back home. Songs tended to be

anti-war, which tend not to be played on AFVN.... (do tell -Ed.)

1280 Afghanistan. Many moraings I have listened here in the half hour before sked 1330 s/off, and usually detect a signal, but Jap dominates. I am sure it is Kabul, and am getting a bit tired of waiting for it to override, hi. At 1325 2/17 nondescript mx mixing w/Japan, 1331 yelled a couple of words and cut carrier. Only 2450 miles.

1300 Philippines. AFPN, definitely, with news // 1510 by an airman I class 2/18, AFPN ID 1405 but no local ID; 3 listed: Subic Bay, Mactan, Baguio.

RSFSR Asia. Radio Moscow IS, opening in Chinese 1630 2/14, altho sked on "228 meters" which would be Chita, 1315 kHz. WRTVH'70 Radio Moscow, Mongolian and Peace &Progress skeds each designate a different wavelength: 228, 228.8 and 229, but skeds mesh with some gaps, and I think they're all the same xmtr and freq. Perhaps this (existence of contradictory listings) proves that P&P is an "independent" station, hi.

- Philippines. DZSI unlisted call, hrd twice during s/on 1605 2/8 by YL. DZRD also ment, as was "--- Broadcasting Corp." Later, loca ancr ment DZSI and 1320. This station evidently DZSI, Santiago, Isabela, Luzon and the other stn. DZRD-1010. NBC net.
- Northern Ireland. BBC Radio 4 under/over Asian stn 2/17 1528 w/documentary on welfare; best on lower SB; peaked over Asian 1532. My first TA logging on this channel and although it isn't a graveyard over here, it's still very satisfying. 6076 miles and new country here.

Ryukyu Islands. KSBU, FEBC Naha (some sources say Okuma -Ed.) playing Chinese mx, not noticeably evangelic, and into Chinese talk 1532 2/10. Evidently Peking doesn't bother to jam it.

Muscat and Oman. Couldn't resist logging BBC Masirah since it had a very nice, clear signal, and taped it, at 1329 2/14 ending Radio Newsreel, promo, and local ID for "Eastern Relay Station, with programs from London." Then into Theatre of the Air. I assume the reason this isn't on 1412 is that it is intended for South Asian reception where "even" numbered channels predominate.

Also, quite a few AN Japanese not so listed. 2/8 ominously produced some atmospherics, but local noise level has descended somewhat at times, permitting audibility of some signals barely jiggling the S-meter.

ll to 16 Feb was another week of DXing every night after midnight, never before and was usually too drowsy to stay up till sunrise. However, on the day I did, there were some good signs of North America. Digging deeper on TA channels, I have come up with a number of new stations/countries, plus some re-loggings for tape. My DXing hours and cx appear to favor stns to the west, but I'm beginning to think my antenna and terrain may also.

TA's remained excellent on 2/17 but were rather poor the rest of the week of 17-24 Feb. On the 18th, P.I. stns were on late with riot coverage, so some TA's may have been missed, altho several quick band scans showed only weak signals in usual places. TA's virtually absent the 19th and all signals lower than usual altho TA's reappeared slightly 2/20. Mostly Russians. --Glenn Hauser.

NOTES ON THE WRAN DX-TEST...

Due to the auroral cx which helped to stifle the possibilites for long distance reception during the 3/7 solar eclipse, cx on MM 3/9 also left something to be desired. Also, testers were all over the channel. WLAC s/off'ed @ 0200, but ran OC/TT sporadically all AM, CJRS was on w/ RS, and late in the AM, MMEX ran OC. On the WC, KSOM ran OC/TT much of the AM. First call proved the 3rd most distant, from Jerry Conrad in Haines City Fla. Later, Larry Godwin called from Denver to report that he'd secured a 15 minute standby from KSOM, and would we program w/ the 10 kw. He called back shortly, and became the 2nd most distant listener. The most distant was Dennis Pimper of Brigham City, Utah. All in all, it was a good test despite cx, tho no calls from Boston or North, or from the SW. Distant callers in other directions included Dick Truax in West Virginia, and callers from Toronto, Buffalo & St. Joseph, Mi. Also from Wes Boyd in Youngstown. Most distant reports on 1kw day pattern were from Utica, N.Y., and Greenbelt, Md. On 500 watt nite pattern, from Phila., and Utica. Yours truly, Ted Savage of WRAN, and Rich Phoenix of WHY!, a friend who lives nearby who also worked the test, were extremely pleased with the results and will be anxious to get all the reports together.
