COOPER - 438 East 21 Street - Carrier Route 56 - Brooklyn, N.Y. 11226 A mice v/q arrived this week from XEPRS-1090 (ex-XERB) and a sad letter from Prince Rupert (the city, not the prince) telling me that alas, I did NOT have CFPR that recent MM. Who could it have been, with tide reports at 2:59am, and news of Canada's northlands? A little DX fishing, and blackfish fishing as well, this week, so here we go: Friday 10/21- An excellent twilight, & a good log on WRDI-1580, ex-WNJH, 6:03-6:17 s/off o/u WPGC and Big Wilson. MM 10/25- I got up @ 2am for two hours of DXing before heading for Captree, L.I., and a fishing date (in rain/fog/drizzle). I note that Tropicana-540 seems louder this season, but I srill haven't taken a log - it was sort of noisy this MM. Not much of interest until WEVD-1330's s/off @ 3 left uncovered an ET/mx by WFIN-1330 in Findlay, O. nicely over Big Al Knight on the Boyd-Starr station, WHOT. They quit @ 3:09 and said "See you again next Sunday, or rather, Monday, morning." Is this a weekly test? This is only the second time I've ever heard this station. I revall the other time, on a 7:30-8:00 a.m. DX TEST on a Sunday, in the dear old days when local WBER (now WPOW) signed on at 8 a.m. That was on 1/30/44! Verie signer is Edgar C. Smith, C.E. That's a common name for 1330 CEs - WPOW has an Ed Smith, and WAEW, Crossville, Tenn. did, at least recently! Or does he specialize in 1330 transmitters and commute, hi? I suspect CBEI, Bonfield, Ont. at about 200 miles. Also FF on 1090 before 7am, I suspect CBIK Kirkland Lake, but w/WBAL/CHRS it's tough going. It seems best around 6:45am but CHRS s/on @ 7 kills the frequency. I happened to catch semi-local CJET-630 off 10/2 @ 5am and picked up CFCY at last for province #10. I got a beautiful logging of KCTA-1030 10/24 7:15-7:35am, w/WEZ way down under. Other DX includes YVTA-990 R. Tricolor for a few minutes @ 6:15am 10/23, & HJCY-810 w/WGT @ 5:55am, & Libya-1124 @ 7:15pm 10/23. Veries: v/l- CFCY-630 and CJBQ-800, the latter still @ lkw but to go to 10kw soon w/six tower array. Tough to get a verie out of CJSS-1220. No luck w/PP/c to DJ. Oh well, CX look really great, so good DX to all. 73.

A little DX has been done here, to wit: 10/17- 1550 produced s/
offs of WNTN Mass. @ 5:58pm EDT, WEVM N.Y. @ 6:15, and WVAB Va. @ 6:30pm. No anthems were heard for all three - just good nights. 10/20 produced WTMR-800 Camden
s/off @ 6:29-m, no anthem heard. 10/24- I took a good log on WHCU--870 for N.Y.

#51 heard. I forgot they were there! 10/25- I overslept the WAMB TEST. I got my fourth Nova Scotian w/CJCB-1270 from 5:04-5:23am in the clear until WSPR's s/on @ 5:23. I am patiently awaiting verie #300 here. V/1 in from new WGRG-1110 says they'll send CM when they get 'em. CM from WMID w/short verie message typed on back. Where's the WYRE veries? 73 for now.

THOMAS R. SUNDSTROM - Box 205 - Willingboro, New Jersey - 08046 DX has been surprisingly good here, what with the little time I have for same. I caught an ID on the WAIN-1270 TEST of 10/4 u/WXYZ; info for WREM-1000 on 10/18 came too late. Possible logging of WAMB-1190-TEST w/CW IDs @ 1:50 and again @ 2 EDT. I was surprised to find WDEE-1500 atop all @ 1, w/ WTOP off, on 10/25. Signals the AM of 10/25 were good; armchair copy of Droitwich-1088, KFT-640. And, last but not least, a tentative logging on Tarawa-844. At 3:40 I heard what sounded like drum beats, bits of words & mx to 4 (after which WHDH-850 splash took over) but the BFO could detect a carrier even at the bottom of the 2-4 minute fades through 4:15. Signal looped 90-2700, & I'm very intrigued. As I write this @ 8:30pm on 10/25, Nice-1554 is providing very nice background mx. The Hammarlund failed me in the middle of Tarawa in that the audio out of the set itself dropped to a very low volume, but I ran it through the SSB adaptor's AM function to keep going. A shorted 6V6 was replaced this afternoon with no change, other audio tubes check out OK so I'll have to put the HQ on the bench at some point. At the same time I finally got around to adding an earphone jack and tape recorder jack to the noise blanker (from PE) and, boy, what a difference. It seems to act as a clipped top and bottom and the barrel sound due to a sharp i.f. bandpass is gone. TAS on 1578 1466 764 1554, & SRS-725 very easy to copy both through the earphones and on tape. The ARS Realistic Duofones (8 ohm) are quite nice, & I fond the blanking level is much easier to set. I can sharpen up the selectivity almost to the point of oscillation and still have decent readability. Obviously, this is being done in preparation for a try at Okinawa VOA-1178 DX upcoming. One last note, the unID TTer reported to Russ a while back is apparently an off-frequency Cuban. I noted a het on KYW-1060 while driving back from NYC on 10/17, very bad until the Trenton area. This AM, w/KYW off, I had the same thing and the het disappeared when a bearing for Cuba had the null set on it. 73.

JOHN W. HOOGERHEIDE - 3 Marquette Drive - Marquette, Michigan - 49855 DX on AM of 10/18 uncludes WJET-1400 Erie @ 2 on AN show. After WBAY went off @ 3 only WDRC-1360 Hartford ledt for new log. They must be NSP now. 10/19- I had WKAP-1320 s/on @ 5, also new log in WRUN-1150 Utica N.Y. atop an unID NBC station. This afterboon I repaired my Beverage (1,200) which was broken at 700. I was rewarded w/mu two closest unheards - WATT-1240 Cadillac @ 6:10pm w/WOMT Manitowoc and semi-local WJPD Ishpeming and WMTE-1340 Manistee Mich. This adds another 60 miles to my closest unheards, which now would become WMNE-1360 Menomonee Wis., WIBU-1240 Poynette, Wis., WAWA-1590 West Allis Wis. and WMDN-1490 Midland, Mich. all at about 300 miles. Say, who is the SS-860 @ 5am & earlier who keeps repeating "Numero Uno en Desayano." (#1 at breakfast), and seems to be ½ hour more than EST. Is this Radio Clarin? (Definitely -ERC) 10/25 brought in a couple of new Pa. f/cs on my 1200' Beverage - WPPA-1360 & WNAK-730 from 12:30-12:45. Then WBOW-1230 Terre Haute @ 1 s/off-SSB & 1:04 unn WMOH-1450 Hamilton O s/off. At 1:15, WJAX-930 briefly atop w/AN show for new log. A very loud WBBF-950 Binghamton N.Y. - are they NSP now? 697 No. Korea tentative. Chongjin listed. Net II and // 655 believe logged between XETRA mx cuts. Very weak and with long fades. 1008 10/25. (Murley)

698.9 Dom. Rep. HIDC, Radio Mao 0245 10/23 with baseball bdcst. This one wan-

ders a lot. (Gleason, P.R.)

700 Japan. JOFB or JOKD (Hiroshima or Kitami) simulcast NHK-2 under Radio Sutatenza, HJCX with WLW looped and XETRA/KMPC splash unpleasant. Only via // s, long fades, 0917 10/25. (Murley, Cal.)

700 Colombia. Radio Sutatenza, Cali hrd with a convenient TC (those "Hora Colombiana"s are really good) and nx 0630 10/18 u/WLW. (Edmunds)

mx pgms. Poor to fair with much WGBS QRM. (Gleason, PR) 719 Tunisia. Sfax noted AN o/Cuban for Ramadan, Arabic drumming noises 2318 10/20. (Edmunds, NJ)

720 China. Presumed the one poorly hrd with gal singing in what sounded like

Chinese 1225 10/17. (Pejza)

725 North Korea. Better than the unID-720 but still poor-fair 1230 10/17 (Pejza) @ N.K. listed in WRTVH as with Net I, was actually with Net II and its 655 outlet at 0958 in usual gibberish. 0959 10/25. (Assume it was the special nature of that MM's jibberish)(Murley, Cal.) (I don't understand, hi -ed)

Surinam. SRS at 0325 10/22 with local pops. (Alster, NJ) unID SA, playing tangos, pasillos, boleros, rancheros, etc. without a ** 735 single ID or anmt noted through 0803 carrier cut, this 10/25. Good signal. Ecuadorian listed. DFG? (Schatz, Fla.)(Nelson and I hrd something here,

midevening, that weekend while checking 737 -ed.)

737 Egypt. AN for Ramadan, chanting, hrd 2323 10/20; actually the freq is 736.8 per audio het msmt technique. (Edmunds, NJ)

746 Colombia. This new one in nicely 0120 10/12, call not known. (Shannon, Pa.)

750 Alaska. KFQD hrd 0916 10/20 o/u WSB w/ID, mx. (Bennett, B.C.) 750 Japan. JOIB Sapporo logged after WSB s/on (WSB looped) and under HJDK.

IDed via 770 // but audible enough without. 0914 10/25. (Murley, Cal.) @ JOIB // 770 0855 10/18. Sounded like German lessons with man and woman spkrs. 750 better strength at this time but neither at the same strength for long. (Bennett, BC)

@ JOIB pretty good 1136 10/17 about = HJDK. (Pejza)

755 unID. Hrd (date?-ed) 0400 on for at least a half hour with nonstop mx of the semi-pop type. No voice. Obviously a test. Strong, was s-9 + 40. Looped 400 which rules out the obvious Lisboa II. No idea who. (Hoffman, NJ)

** 757 Ecuador. Just a note to mention that the new HJ-- Radio Nacional was noted 10/22 0100-0300 (when tuned out) and was very stable on 757. I have sent an inquiry to Inravision to find details. (Gleason, P.R.)

770 Cuba/El Salvador/unID. CMKB, Las Mercedes in/out with YSKLC (I think that is the latest call) with WABC off for a change 0553 10/18. Cuban had usual fare, YS had upbeat indigenous mx and Latin mx. 3rd SS unID. (Edmunds)

770 Japan. JOUB, Akita, way over weak SS (presumed Cuban) and 10 or 20 db over s-9, fading to s-4. Set up on faithful standby for //s 0900 (Murley)

JOUB // JOIB-750, logged again 0845 10/20 with talk by woman; no sign of 750, though. (Bennett, BC)

JOUB under KOB 1139 10/17. (Pejza)

@ JOUB with English lessons, a real powerhouse 1022-1106 10/11. Had pips on hour. 3 pips, each a 500 ms burst of about 600 Hz followed by 2 or 3 seconds of 1000 Hz tone trailing off. Assume these are NHK2 pips. Also noted very faint Morse code (?) just before and during pips. (Karchevski, Cal.)

773 Egypt. Cairo noted 10/19 both at 2330 and 0345 with Arabic chanting in quasi-null of WABC's horrendous sideband splash. (Taylor, NJ)

780 unID. 2 carriers with het, slight audio, very weak, noted 0755 10/25. Good, whatever they be. (Schatz, Miami)

Syria. Tartus hrd loudly burying Miramar with chanting, on for Ramadan

2329 10/20 for country #68. (Edmunds)

782 E. Germany. Burg had an excellent signal at 0306 10/18, doing the first movement of Beethoven's Appassionata Sonata, for which I stayed tuned for the next 20 minutes or so, with s-9 + 20 signals. KIEV was behind, with respectable audio as well. (Page Taylor, NJ)

791 France. ORTF Limoges first hrd here 0645 10/18 with light mx. (Edmunds) 809 RE: Edmunds unID 10/2, must be Skopje as audio in Macedonian broke thru 10/18 at 0200; very strange as they are not due to be on then, acc WRTVH.

Loop bearing says Yugoslavia, too; too far south to be BBC. (Taylor, NJ) ** 810 Cuba. CMJE Camaguey is also relaying "Radio Enciclopedia" AN (CMBQ-1060) and // stns on the 660-700 range. (Schatz, Fla.)

818 Egypt. Batra logged 2300-2330 10/19 with Main Arabic pgm. Mostly chanting by a woman. At the 2-hour, clock chimes and clear ID in Arabic. Excellent audio for the half hour I listened; very little fade. (Taylor, NJ)

827 Spain/Morocco. Oujda hrd here, too, in what appeared to be a really strange French dialect 0126 10/17, in-and-out with EAJ-1. (Edmunds)

827 Bulgaria. Sofia has news in Arabic, noted in particular 0404 10/18; best 0430, programming is in Bulgarian with female ancr and stodgy dance mx. typically Eastern European. (Taylor, NJ)

830 Hawaii. KIKI Honolulu readable slightly under WCCO and still rocking at

0725 10/25. (Murley, Cal.)

830 Japan. JOBB Osaka second strongest NHK2 with WCCO way down and KIKI out under looping. s-9, fading to s-3. Naturally // 770 0915 10/25. (Murley) JOBB good 1320 10/13, start Eng lessons 1140 10/17. (Pejza) 10/10(Pejza)

830 Mexico. XEVQ, Novolato, Son. s/off with call, freq., location etc. 0205 🥕 836 Lebanon. Beirut believed the one here with Arabic mx, also femme vocalist with a quite high-range voice 2334 10/20. Ramadan. Cty#69. (wow-ed) (RjE)

840 Colombia-Cuba. Strong mixture of HJBI and CMHW dominated the freq at 0141 on 10/10, both about equal in signal. At 0145 one of them came up on top and a pretty mean jazz was hrd, which I think was probably HJBI. (Stewart Mo) ** 844 Gilbert and Ellice Is. Tarawa has been noted on nearly every MM. 9/4 and 10/11 being notable. The 9/4 reception was noted with fade in about 0750 and staying in until 0815 with patches of audio appearing with "crazy music.man. crazy". A good sized het at about s-5 on 10/11, unfortunately no audio. Am still waiting for sufficient audio to report this one. For other East Coast Tarawa-hunters - when they start to fade in. you will probably notice a very weak and rapidly fluttering signal just above the noise level. Fade in on 10/11 was at 0707 and will be getting a bit earlier (as daylight shortens in the Northern Hemisphere). (Page Taylor, NJ)

Tarawa TENTATIVE 0740 10/25 with possible drum beats, bits and pieces of words, mx to 0800; problems with WHDH-850 after. WHAS was off. BFO showed carrier even at the bottom of 2 to 4 minute fades, looped (along) 90-2700 (axis) and detectable thru 0815. (Note correlation with PT's rpt above-ed) What was odd was that KFI, KSL was audible but absolutely no trace of KORI-650 even though the freq was empty. How about it. GPN. does this make sense? (Tom R. Sundstrom, NJ) (It does make sense to me in that it apparently is the same phenomenon I saw in REW's reports from Hawaii a couple of years ago. Richard, when DXing the US, would hear frequency checks from stations in the mid-continent, even with closer coastal Alvers in Calif being unheard. This seemingly is evidence of geographical selectivity in reception, making certain areas well heard and others not so. We ECNA DXers see this, too, when, say, Iberians are well hrd, but not the Germans or vice versa. It is my theory that on certain mornings, when this selectivity in propagation is evident - when Tarawa is not being heard, were there a station a few hundred miles away from them - it might well be heard. With no transmitters available in vast areas of the Pacific, what could well be great openings to geographically limited areas go undetected - while at the same time, the Hawaiians are not being well hrd. This is a theory- any disagreements or corroborations are welcome -ed.)

Tarawa has CHANGED THEIR MUSIC selections from last year. If it was not for the familiar gal in vernacular, I could have sworn that some Honollulu pirate with a good stack of oldies (i.e., rock) was responsible for the 10 over s-9 mignal fading to s-6 0843-0853 10/25. (Murley, Cal.)

** 854 unID with Arabic chantings and wailings hrd here, looping 65 or 70° 2337 10/20. May be the new Moroccan operating Agadir: may be a new Libyan or Egyptian. Vanishingly small chance of Amman. (RjE) (vanishingly?.... ed)

863 Syria. Damascus, also with chanting, maybe // 782 2342 10/20. (Edmunds) 870 Japan. JOLB Fukuoka slightly weaker than JOIB-750, still // 770, NHK2. Great // scheme almost went haywire at 0925 with Eng vocal of "I've been working on the railroad" folo by man and woman doing Eng lang lesson. In view of the ridiculous lesson conversation that followed, / s on stronger stns hardly necessary thereafter. 10/25. (Murley, Cal.)

875 unID. A weak LA here 0920 10/20, noted earlier in Spanish. Would this be Radio Columbia, Costa Rica, rptd earlier in NJ? (Bennett VE7AZG, B.C.)

877 North Korea. Only a carrier here 1145 10/17. (Pejza)

880 Peru. Radio Union, OBZ4N caught right on top of WCBS (Aha! -ed) in their null at 0300 on 10/5 with cx somewhat disturbed, altho A-index was only 8 for that day. Phone info from GPN says solar flare began at 1335 and the A-index rose to 18. Aha! .. as GPN says. (Taylor, NJ)

881 U.K. Some Eng audio with very heavy fading to carrier, looping TA; no problem with NYC station on presumed standby low power (hi) appx 0700 10/20. Tnx Martin, Colo.; Erickson, Toyland for tip. (Murley) (For those interested. WCBS operates with 10 kw from 0200 to 0430 ELT MM's; 50 other times. Here's a great chance to calibrate your S-meters, hi -ed.)

885 Montserrat. Radio Montserrat in with a poor signal and TGJ/WCBS/WLS QRM problems at 0114 10/10. First time hrd. This was an interesting evening as several new LA's were heard AND the northern stations were in well. Cx were good in ALL dorections. (Stewart, Mo.)

890 Japan. JOHK Sendai with Eng lesson 10/17 1146. (Pejza)

890 unID TP. Hrd 10/11 1156-1201. First hrd woman talking, 1158 man talking and both sounded Japanses, but a very poor signal. At 1200 hrd pips very similar to NHK2, difference being the first 3 pips were actually double pips - each a 200 ms burst of 600 Hz, 100 ms silence, then another 200 ms burst of 600 Hz. Suggest NHK1 pips (JOHK). Refer to Gary Jackson's report in DXM 10/16. (Karchevski, Calif.)

930 Montserrat. Radio Antilles noted with nice French ID 0400 10/12 while setting the clock radio on WPAT to get up for the next day's work, hi. (Taylor, NJ) (You mean you can actually HEAR WPAT where you live?? -ed)

Cuba. Radio Musical, CMGX ID caught and taped o/u WJAX/CFBC during an extremely rare WPAT SP SP 0505 and on 9/27. (Taylor, NJ) (Guess you can, hi-ed)

Canary Is. EAJ-50, Radio Las Palmas, alone here with Spanish vocals 0700 10/18. (Edmunds, NJ)

990 U.S. WIBG, Phila. ET 0545 10/25. (Gleason, P.R.)

998 unID. Station s/on 0000 10/14 with chime IS, ID sounded like, "this is Radio London, first program". Had a good signal, and TA's in on about 20 or 25 freqs. Appeared to be in Eng. and at 0030 seemed to be in SS. (Glesson)

** 1000 Mexico. XEOY. R. Mil. noted well past normal 0711 s/off time 10/18, hrd as late as 0800. (Edmunds)

1000 Brazil. PRB9 noted in passing at 0730 10/11 w th nice ID. unn so no time spent ... XEOY must have been off. (Taylor, NJ)

1007 Netherlands. Noted testing with tones and OC 2305 10/18 (a TM). (TaylorNJ)

1010 Colombia. "1020", Bogota AN with good signal MM 10/25. (Schatz)

1020 Colombia. Radio Colosal, HJDP, Neiva reasonably audible under looped KDKA 0650 10/24. (Murley, Calif.)

1025 Austria. Noted with light mx and female ancr in German with a pretty decent signal 0521 10/18. Was expecting the usual Spain here. (Taylor, NJ)

** 1030 unID. An Eng lang lesson hrd here o/u XEQR on 10/11 fading in at 0700. A very distinct female ancr said such short phrases as "hello! how are you" folo by its equivalent in some strange lang. The signal was poor at best, and showed only in the XEQR null, a bit north of West at, say, 3150. The English seemed American dialect, rather than British accented. If anyone cares to dissect the tape of this one, let me know. (Taylor, NJ)

** 1030 Mexico. XEQR, rmx same as XEOY-1000. (Edmunds)

1040 China. Good 1320 10/13. (Pejza)

1043 E. Germany/Morocco. Dresden finally hrd here with MoR in German but with poorly modulated, strong carrier somewhat south of it. This at 0133 10/ 17/ Almost all the other Moroccans were on, possibly due to recent internal power struggles, etc. (Edmunds, NJ)

1046.6 Panama. Ondas del Canajagua, Las Tablas noted with a live music remote 0445 10/23 sponsored by Marlboro! (Gleason) (Yes. the U.S. Senate. in its infinite wisdom, hasn't yet figured a way to legislate advertising in the

Republic of Panama. But - just give them time ... -ed.)

1050 unID. Noted some weak Spanish under my ole buddy (?-ed.) XEG at 0136 10/10; just barely hrd a man speaking Spanish between the good preacher's screams. Which seems more likely: YVKZ or YSU? (Stewart)(YSU rptd more-ed)

1052 Romania. Superpower hrd here for the first time 10/18 at 0400 with beau-

tiful clear ID by female ancr all over WHN. (Taylor, NJ)

1052 England. BBC good 0542 (date?) with discussion pgm. (Gleason, P.R.)

** 1055 Colombia. 0145 10/20. Although both HJBX and HJBB have been hrd here, I listened in anyway - and found L.V. del Centro. No ID for Espinal, but definite ads for Girardot (about 5 miles from Espinal) so is obviously HJFZ from 1110. There are lots of HJ changes in that area of the country lately. (HJGH to 1190, HJGN to 1170, etc.) This was a funny night for HJ's. 919 was not in at all, and only stations in the Girardot vicinity were in (1292, for example). 1212 was weak, and the only out-of-the-zone stn hrd. New ones on 1266 and 1455. (Gleason, P.R.)

** 1059.4 Cuba. CMKG Baracoa now AN with LVdC. (Schatz, Fla.)

1060 Mexico. Call XEEP and slogan R. Educacion taken from a poster promoting the station; was seen all over Mexico City this summer. (Gleason)

1061 Portugal. Eng service of "Radio North" // 755 2315-2330 10/19 in well. ID with IS at 2330 and into other lang. (Gleason, P.R.)

1088 England. Droitwich hrd 10/25 0530 with panel show and news folo 0600 ID. Excellent signal with little fading; WBAL silent. (Sundstrom, NJ)

1100 Brazil. Radio Nacional, São Paulo noted with excellent signals o/u pesty Reloj Colombians MM 10/11 0425-0500, lots of US MoR, including "Whiter Shade of Pale" in Portuguese! (Taylor, NJ)

1106 Lithuania. Vilnius hrd here for first time 0410 10/18 and IDed 0430. They had piano interludes folo by short commentary on the mx by a woman; it seemed to be in Russian and // Estonia-1214. (Taylor, NJ)

1106 W. Germany. AFN Munich hrd with US rock. English. for new log 0425 10/20. @ AFN Munich 0540 10/25 with deejay show, promo for something-or-other to

do with the olympics, time etc. (Gleason, PR)

** 1114 Colombia. Caracol unID probably L.V. del Comercio, Bucaramanga with net 10/25 0445-0530. This conflicts with info from Caracol on the frequency

of this stn. (Gleason, PR)

1115 Kaliningrad. First reception noted on 10/16 at 0350 with a male vocal & Russian anmts. The music on these Russian stns sounds like what would have made "top-40" some 30 years ago in this country - slow, sedate and draggy with just a hint of naughty bourgeoise syncopation in the accompaniment. (Taylor, NJ) (That is not surprising - if I can editorialize the Russkiys are behind us by 30 years in EVERYTHING - with the sole exception of atomic, military and space secrets that were stolen from us -ed.)

1115 Italy. Talk pgm 0535 10/25 with much QRM from the 1114 HJ. Good readabil-

ity, nonetheless. Went into regional mx 0537. (Gleason)

1325 Haiti. Radio Haiti hrd with exceptional 10 over s-9 signals with c1 mx and French to 0355 s/off 10/20. Taped entire bit. (Edmunds) @ 4VW in very nicely in French 0003 10/12. (Shannon, Pa.)

1331 Italy. Rome noted Testing 0045 10/13, as was 845 with TT on and off. Tuesday mornings seems to be the European equivalent of MMs, as several "NSP" TAs have been noted either off or testing TMs. (Taylor, NJ)

1422 Colombia. Radio Reloj, Manizales with a good signal nightly with the usual Reloj - Caracol format. (Schatz, Miami)

1429.2 Dom. Rep. HTVG. La Vega with mx; ID was Radio La Vega and not L.V. de Momento. Hrd until 0325 s/off with anthem 10/25. (Gleason, P.R.)

** 1460 Puerto Rico. WCID, Radio Cid, Juncos, P.R. noted 10/19 on Reg Sked. They are 500 watts, daytime, directional ant. (Gleason, PR)
