This is the first report in quite a while relating the experience of our members with various types of $D X$ receivers and equipment. Such reports should prove useful and beneficial to the membership, and we invite similar write-ups from other DX'ers on the subject for inclusion in these pages.

The Heathkit GR-78 is a small, portable general-coverage receiver. Its small size (only about $6^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{\prime \prime}$ at 14 pounds) contrasts with a 6-band dial and eleven front-panel controls t give the appearance of a communcations receiver in miniature. Frequency coverage includes the standard 550 kHz to 30 MHz in five bands (with the BCB divided between bands "B" and "C" at 1300 kHz ) with added coverage on long wave from 190 to 410 kHz . Main tuning is vernier; bandspread is on a cylinder. Other features include RF gain, product detector, $500-\mathrm{kHz}$ crystal calibrator, built-in vertical whip antenna, and a tuning meter. Internally, all signal mixing (first detector, product detector, second detector, signal done via dual-gate FET's; four little red somi filtors all IF coils past the mixing stage; and there is double conversion on the 18-30 MHz "F" band. Total mailable cost of the kit is $\$ 141.95 \mathrm{U} . \mathrm{S}$.

We found the GR-78 fun to build, if only to admire the interesting manner that Schlumberger uses to fit a tremendous amount of components and circuitry in a container hardly larger than the matching speakers" of other GC receivers. The greatest difficulty in construction was with the mechanical alignment of the removable circuit boards and the external case. We had some trouble pinioning the switch wafers on the four parallel removable circuit boards with the metal shaft of the band selector, and it took an extreme amount of body pressure and endurance to close the case on comple tion of the project. Before doing that, we had to charge up the internal battery and align the works - a simple procedure. But how about performance?:

Sensitivity: Fantastic on LW and MW, good on the other single -conversion SW bands, and poor on the double-converted band "F". Beautiful reception of daytime Cubans, such as CMCI-760 and CMHW840 was noted out-of-doors using just the vertical whip. Unfortunately, every local had a set of spurs and mixing products distributed across the dial, plus some harmonics extending into the next band, and reduction of the RF gain failed to aleviate the condition out of proportion with the accompanying signal attenuation. Truब, strong images were noted on the signal-conversion SW bands, forcing us to use our spectrum amalyzer for any serious $S W$ listening. The $18-30 \mathrm{MHz}$ band was all but dead, and we finally got out money back when Heath techs tried but failed to get that last band to perform according to listed specs.

Selectivity: The four tiny ceramic filters permit 17.5 kHz +1 at 6 dB down". This is good enough for most even-channel separations, except around locals, but the only split noted in Miaml rations, except around Slop-over from locals was tremendous. Frequency readout and determination: The dial tracked only "so-so", and we were forced to eye the band at an extreme angle in some instances. We did rot determine the linearity of the bandspread for frequency measurement.

## Two Local Radio Stations Turn 50

The two are WSB and WGST. The former signed on back on March 15, 1922, and two days later.
WSB began with 100 watts power from studios based in the old Atlanta Journal building located a $1-7$ Forsyth St.
Three years later the power was increased to 1,000 watts. In 1926 the studios were moved to the Biltmore Hotel, they West Peachitree, where were then transferred to the station's present location a

1611 W. Peachtree, near Pershing Point. Durring the 30-year stay at the Biitmore, the station became a charter afriliate of the newly formed
NBC Network, in 1927, became a 50,006 -watt operation, in 1933, and became a channel outlet, in 193
WSB was the first radio staa wedding the first station in the South to broadcast base ball games, the first in the nation to present a complete church service - from AtlanChurch - and the first U.S. station to use a musical device with its station identification (the first three notes of "Over
There" were used; this was There were used; this was
later adapted by NBC for its now-famous chimes).

WGST was begun as WGM, the broadcast service of the Atlanta Constitution. The first studios were located in the old Fairlee Street.
THE FIRST broadcasting on WGST imcluded a report on an exhibition baseball game between Georgia Tech and the travei-
ing Detroit Tigers. The Georgia Peach, Ty Cobb, was the main attraction for the Tigers By the
contest.
In 1923, one year after its in itial broadcast, the station was presented to Georgia Teeh and the call letters were
changed to the present WGST changed to the present WGST electrical engineering building at Tech.

The facilities are now cated at 165 Eighth St NW. WGM was granted a license on March 15, 152, the same acy wSB began operation, bat p.m. two days liter. It is now affiliated with the ABC Radi Network. A tip of our hat and birthday greetings go to both stations.
