REPORTEDLY IN OPERATION ...

USSR. Regarding the Finnish-originated item about the 'powerful Vladivostok station on 1525' mentioned in DX NEWS #32, I do not entirely agree... There is a Soviet stn on 1525 carrying Majak programs, but it is not powerful and probably not in Vladivostok. Our guess is rather Khabarovsk (perhaps the one listed on 1586 that I haven't been able to hear after 4 years here?). But, there is another strong Soviet stn currently on a frequency somewhat lower than 1530, causing a heterodyne on 1530 - perhaps on 1529. This station has been around for at least a year but was not noted regularly here until last August when it started to cause the het. Carries the Chinese language Foreign Service of Radio Moscow and the "Peace and Progress" program. S/on is at 0900 GMT; heard past 1930. Signal is fairly powerful but in no way as strong as 1250 which is heard with local strength on any kind of radio in Tokyo. My guess is that 1529A is highly directional towards China from a location in NE USSR. To further complicate the USSR Pacific Coast picture, the station that used to be on 1550 (listed as Khabarovsk) has disappeared as of last summer, leaving AFNT alone on the freq. The Russian on 1025 kHz (listed as Tomsk) can be heard from about 1250 GMT with Majak programming // 1150 and 1525. (Lars Ryden, Japan)

SOUTH KOREA. It seems as if South Korean stations are adopting the idea of split channel operation from North Korea. The KBS powerhouse HLSA (nominally on 970) seems to have settled definitely on 967. This leaves a North Korean on 970 and the USSR station on 976 in the clear. Some local South Koreans tend to slip off channel now and then but this probably is due to accident. However, HLKG (nominally 750) has been on 745A now at least since mid-August in parallel with 750. (Ryden, Japan)

BOTSWANA. Gaberones is now operating on 971 with 50 kw; s/on is 0400. (ARC)

GABON. Yes, 989 is Franceville with 20 kw, not // to 1554. (ARC)

GERMANY. Frankfurt 0n 593 iw now 400 kw NSP with directional antenna. SDR on 998 and 1169 are now AN. (ARC)

GREAT BRITAIN. Moorside Edge on 692 (Radio 4) is now 190 kw on the way up to 300 kw. (Blodorn, Germany)

GREECE. VOA at Kavalla tested with 500 kw but due to power shortages is currently down around 150 kw. (USIS via ARC)

IRELAND. Conamora is on 599 with 2 kw; Corca Dhuibhne is 1 kw on 1250; Conamora is 2 kw on 962. (ARC) These regional Irish stations remain unheard on this side of the Atlantic...

PORTUGAL. Mirandela on 728 is now 10 kw. (Blodorn, Germany)

ROUMANIA. M. Ciuc is now 14 kw on 944. (Ericson, Sweden)

PIRATES AND BOOTLEGGERS ...

Radio Veronica left 1562 at 1130 GMT on 9/30/72. One second later, Radio Nordsee International started on 1562 with test transmissions with a new 10 kw transmitter.

They gave frequent announcements that Veronica was now on 538 meters. At 1200 Radio Veronica started programming on 557. First was a speech from Bill Verwey, one of the Directors. This speech was also relayed by RNI on 1562! In the first Veronica newscast at 1300, Radio Veronica stated they had nothing to do with RNI's use of 1562 and that they considered it very unfair. The test transmissions lasted only a few days. Veronica is actually still using 1562, with a tiny transmitter (I estimate the power at 100-200 watts) broadcasting a jingle and announcement that they are on 557 now. There were two reasons for the Veronica frequency change: increasing QRM from the Swiss during the night hours, and to increase the effective groundwave coverage to provide better service over all of Holland. (ARC)

COMMENTS ON ERNEST BEHR'S RECENT ARTICLE

*Olle Alm, Sweden

I just read the article about the SPR-4 and would like to make a few comments as I have been an SPR-4 owner for 18 months. Numbers refer to points in Behr's recent article:

*1) Yes, the sensitivity is low. However, in many locations you just can't use a high sensitivity because of local noise. Furthermore the SPR-4 is very sensitive to antenna mismatch. On MW & LW the antenna input is designed for very long antennas and does nc not work well with the 100' antenna which satisfies most other sets. I have connected the central heating system (fourth floor) with good results. However, at least 300' outdoors would be much better if the space is available. On the tropical bands the sensitivity may be sharpened by using preselector settings of about E2 for 60 meters and D2 for 90 meters.

*2) The two strongest spurs result from the receiver being tuned to the same freq as the VFO. 4972.5 may be eliminated by using the next higher band crystal.*3) On my set the noise blanker works exactly as promised. It removes impulse

noise, like that from ignition and switches, very effectively. However, of course it does not work so well on other types of noise. A clipper circuit should have been included as well. Thanks to the NB suppressing sharp impulses, these do not affect the AVC. With the NB switched on I do not experience any gain cutoff caused by noise impulses. Where the noise is of other types, however, it is made worse (!) by the NB. *4) Indeed the 4.8 bandwidth is too wide. This drawback is easily remedied by cutting the mode switch shaft between the two rearmost switch sections and threading a substitute shaft from the back of the set through holes already existing and through the rearmost section which controls the bandwidth. You can easily hear which bandwidth you have at any moment. I have found that the 2.4 kHz bandwidth is yery well adapted

^{*} for MW DX'ing. The filters, if properly adjusted, should give a flat passband with very sttep sides, like a mechanical filter. The notch could preferably be turned to 7 O'clock to further decrease the 60 db bandwidth.

*5) On my set the notch shows a single frequency attenuation of about 60 db anywhere in the passband. Hets as near the carrier of the wanted station as 500 Hz may be suppressed, of course depending on relative signal strength.

*6) See 3) above.

*9) Calibration and exact frequency readout is always done by nulling the beat with the BFO switched on. Unless you have a very narrow bandwidth there would be no other way. With a wide band and no BFO you can make neither exact calibration or readout. I have made a one-time calibration and the few times I need an exact frequency reading (on an off or odd freq station) I just measure the difference to the nearest calibration point or a known station with the BFO switched on (CW).

*10) Yes, this is annoying.

*11) The audio sound of the SPR-4 is much better than what is normal for a communications receiver due to the elaborate audio section - that is if you are listening for enjoyment only. However, when you are listening to something far away and in the noise there is too much bass. With a suitable speaker or an additional amplifier with proper tone controls there should be no problem. SSB listening to AM signals also results in sharp and clear audio.

On the European scene with its crowded bands, the direct frequency reading and sharp selectivity plus the het attenuation are the most needed qualities, which makes the SPR-4 very useful (if properly aligned and adjusted). This might not be the case in the US where most of the listening is done on the domestic BCB scene. Thus there might be quite a difference in our judgements of the same set...



Boston's most unique radio station signed on the air shortly after 2 p.m. yesterday amid cheers from some 100 people who were on hand for the event.

The station, whose call letters are WTMC, is unique for being the first "carrier current" radio station in the nation, besides being the first radio station built specifically for a public housing project.

WTMC, located at 640 on the radio dials of those who reside in the immediate community of the Bromley-Heath Housing Project area, operates through electricity rather than the regular air waves. "Carrier current," a

form of cable radio, eliminates the need for an outside antenna by transmitting the radio signal over the normal AC power cables in the area, permitting only the people using the same power cables to pick up the station's signal.

This new radio station, the brainchild of the Bromley - Heath Tenant Management Corp., (TMC), is located on the second floor of the Bromley-Heath Community Centtr at 10 Lamartine st., Jamaica Plain. At yesterday's ribboncutting ceremony many residents, city and Federal officials turned out to tour the station.

Thomas W. Weeks, of the TMC, said at a press conference: "This is a great day for Bromley-Heath. We are witnessing a new era in public housing for public housing tenants.

Norman Watson, assistant secretary for Housing Management of HUD, said the radio station has great potential.

"I will probably do all I can to steal the idea and plant it in other communities across the nation," Watson said.

The opening of WTMC was significant because it occurred 23 years to the day from the opening of the first black-owned radio station in Atlanta, Ga.

Weeks said that the station will provide air time for all community agencies servicing Bromley-Heath and will have a staff made up predominantly of Bromley-Heath community members.

Programs will be informative, as well as entertaining, Weeks said.

Nathan Peace Ship Stops for Drydock En Route to Mideast

Abie J. Nathan's floating radio station Peace logged the first dozen miles of a planned 5,100-mile voyage to the Eastern Mediterranean last week from West New York, NJ., to a New Brighton, S.I., shipyard, under tow.

The 180-foot former Dutch coastal freighter is to remain at the facilities of the Brewer Dry Dock Company for at least 10 days for such work as drydocking, cleaning, painting and having her tailshaft drawn.

All this work, Mr. Nathan said last week, was in preparation for a one-way trip to a point in international waters between Haifa, israel, and Port Said, Egypt, for a one-year stay at anchor.

"We plan to leave for our destination the first week in November," he said, adding that informational broadcasts, telling some 30 million. Arabs and Isræelis of the ship's presence, are scheduled to start on Dec. 15.

on Dec. 15. Regular broadcasts from the ship's .50,000-watt AM transmitter, he said, would start New Year's Eve. Schedules call for 12 hours of daily broadcasting.

"Right now," Mr. Nathan said, "we are in the process of recruiting a crew of about 20. We are asking them to sign up for one year. Most of them will be volunteers, but we are also looking for eight paid tako looking for eight paid volce of Peace." Programing in the beginning,

Programing in the beginning, he said, will consist primarily of Arab, Israeli and pop music, interspersed with regular news bulletins.

Mr. Nathan added that he hoped it might be possible to foring responsible representatives of the Arab and Israeli points of view on board by launch for face to face dialogues to support his efforts to bring about an Arab-Israeli raprochement. The radio station's signature

The radio station's signature tune, he said, would be "Give Peace a Chance."
