

ROBERT E. FISCHER - Box 94 - Newark, Delaware - 19711 I took a trip to John Wederbrand's shack 11/19 to have the noise blanker in my SPR-4 aligned. It was way out of whack when I first installed it. Now it works like it should - sharp oulse type noise is reduced by 8-9 S units which is a considerable reduction. Now I have to contend only with a fluorescent lamp & 2 TVs instead of a fluorescent lamp, two TVs and crackling noise which often went up to 10 db o/S-9. The M.B. now keeps that (the crackling sound) down to a "tolerable" S-3. It was nice to meet Ben Dangerfield up there too and discuss DX in general. John gave me plans for building a low frequency antenna tuner which I hope to build in the next couple weeks (if I can build one, anyone can, hi!) With it the full sensitivity of the SER-4 should be realized on the LW band & on BCB using longwires. The SPR-4 works very well on BCB with the SM-2 since it is a high impedence output antenna. Using a longwire on the BCB or Li, signal reduction is 40 db or more because of mismatch.

#### SPECIAL TECHNICAL TERMS

Ar. - Fredericksburg index of geomagnetic disturbance; the best easy measure of high latitude auroral conditions; broadcast from WWV at 19 minutes past the hour.

Aurora, auroral oval - high latitude region of extreme absorption to medium wave signals: related to Northern Lights and magnetic storms.

Beverage antenna - Special type of antenna for long wave and MW reception, very long low single wire with special ground connections

D region - Region of ionosphere where daytime MW signal absorption occurs; height is from 40 to 100 kilometers. Also involved in auroral disturbances.

E layer - One of the primary reflecting layers for MW signals at night; height is about 105 kilometers above the surface of the Earth.

E20 - Computer program to predict dawn-induced fade out times for specific stations.

FET - Field effect transistor, popular amplifier for MW applications

FET AAZ loop - Field Effect Transistor Altazimuth loop antenna; high gain and very deep nulling loop design

F layer - Main reflection layer along with the E layer responsible for night MW DX reception; height varies from 260 to 400 kilometers.

Geomagnetic - Pertaining to the Earth's magnetic field; strongly affected by auroral disturbances

Ground wave - MW signal component which travels along surface of the ground; most daylight reception is ground wave

Heterodyne - Audio tone produced by two stations close in frequency; the pitch of the tone depends upon the frequency separation - thus two stations 3 kHz apart in frequency (i.e., 770 and 773 kHz) will produce a 3 kHz audio tone in the receiver.

MF, Mechanical filter - Electronic component which produces improved receiver selectivity for separation of stations on close frequencies; commonly added to MW receivers by DX'ers to upgrade performance.

MwA - Midwinter anomaly. A well established but little-understood phenomenon which produces days of unexpectedly weak signals during the midwinter months; most evident when the sunspot cycle is high.

Null - The direction of minimum signal pickup on a loop antenna. Also the act of selectively eliminating reception from a station with a loop antenna, e.g., "WTOP was nulled out".

SAH - Subaudible heterodyne. Heterodyne produced between stations so close in frequency that beat note tope is not audible; sometimes shows as wavering of S meter needle, best displayed on oscilloscope with long persistence phosphor.

Skywave - The signal reflected from the layers of the ionosphere; the primary mode of MW reception at night; as distinguished from ground wave.

Splash, sideband splash - Crashing sound produced by programming of a strong station on a nearby frequency; reduced or eliminated by better selectivity, a loop antenna, or both.
