AP Radio airborne to plaudits of 210

Another 20 stations indicate interest in new service that started Oct. 1

With minimum problems, AP Radio, the broadcast arm of the Associated Press, commenced operations last Tuesday, Oct. 1). The first cut-an agricultural newsman John Holliman-went down the line to 210 stations at 9:30 a.m. NYT. It was one of 198 reports filed on opening day.

"Everything went better than we had planned," said APR Managing Editor Bob Bensen of the first day's results. "The complimentary calls were running about 10 to 1 against the problem calls.

The only snag of any consequence, Mr. Bensen reported, involved four stations to which AT&T could not provide a hook-up in time for the initial service. Two A1&T regional vice presidents, Jim Green and Tom O'Connor, stationed themselves in APR's Washington office throughout the first day to handle problems. The last station was connected to the line by 10:30 a.m. Wednesday.

Stations offering feedback after the first day's service were particularly complimentary about the technical quality of the APR transmission. "The line quality is excellent," said Ron Tyrell of KcIM-(AM) Carroll, lowa. "A good line," echoed Paul Maze, WYND(AM) Sarasota,

APR uses what it claims to be a revolutionary "spoke-and-hub" transmission system, in which signals are fed from Washington to 12 regional reception centers—each serving four or five states. From those points, the amplified signal is sent to local AT&T test boards for transmission to the member stations. The arrangement, Mr. Benson claimed, "has given us a definite advantage in signal quality."

On the first day of service, APR fed 141 international and national cuts and 57 regional reports. Anchorman for the first five-minute newscast was Tom Martin.

APR is available to any station subscribing to the AP broadcast wire. Its cost is based on a formula depending on several variables, and is tacked on the sum stations are already mails for the wire service.

Mr. Benson reported that some 30 stations signed up for the service in the last week prior to the initiation of service, bringing the total line-up to 210. Another 20 stations are said to have expressed intentions to join the network.

New stations, changes, skeds, etc. . . .

COLUMBIA Radio Tonchala in Cucuta on 1130 khz and Transmisora Universal in Pinar del Rio on 1580 khz are new stations. La Voz del Progresso in Cucuta is now on 960 khz (ex-1490 khz). (DXCB)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC New station is Radio Monte Rio (La Novia del Sur), HIMR on 1200 khz in Azua. This station is owned by Rodolfo Lama Jaar (Apartado 101, Barahona); the network includes Radio Barahona-1240 khz; Radio Pedernales-1560 khz and Radio Neyba-1580 khz. (Jaar)

INTERNATIONAL WATERS With the Anti-Pirate law now in effect in Holland all of the Pirate stations are now off the air. Radio Veronica is trying to form Veronica Omroep Organisatie (which I think is a land based operation via Radio Nederland, ED) and Nordsee is planning to move to the Mediterranean. (DICB)

JAPAN JOPB Shizucka 2 is now on 640 khz. JOGK Kumamoto 1 is now on 760 khz, both with 10 kw. JOPG Kushiro 1 is now on 580 khz (ex-640) still 10 kw. JOHK Sendai 1 on 890 khz is now 20 kw. (Ryden)

MAIAYSIA 1475 khz is located at Sandakan and has a power of 600 km. (Ryden)

MILIPPINE The new FEBC station at Iba, Zambales, North Luzon will operate on 1470 khz with 250 kw. The transmitter is already built and is in storage in California. Will be shipped to the Philippines as soon as the transmitter building is completed. They hope to be on the air by early 1975. (FEBC, via Freeman) *A new company, Baranguay Broadcasting Company (BBC) has taken over the property of the deactivated ABS-CBN chain. BBC now operates 3 channels in Quezon City: DWWX-620 khz, 50 kw; DWNA-1160 khz, 10 kw; DWW0-1340 khz, 15 kw. Address is Bohol Ave. Cubao, Q.C. (Ryden)

SOUTH KORFA According to Japanese Diers, the former VUNC transmitters are mow operated as "Korean Army madio" (Radio Station of the Department of Defense. They are: Seoul, 1150 khz, 5 kw; Chulwon, 1240 khs, 5 kw; Kangham Island, 1270 khz, 50 Seoul, 1320 khz, 1 kw. These transmitters are still being used to relay the VOA Korean programs. (Ryden)

USSR 647 khz: As per a recent sked of Radio Moscow, this frequency replaces 548 khz. It may therefore be presumed that transmitter is in the Vladivostock area. It is not yet confirmed, however, whether 548 khz is inactive and that the transmitter has moved to 647 khz, or if 647 khz is a new transmitter. Japanese DXers may help us find out. (There are numerous changes and additions to the Soviet BCB list. WRH75 will reflect this). (Ryden)

AUSTRALIA/NEW ZEALAND Heres the setup this year, per Arthur Cushen's DX World, monitored on NZBC-9540 khz, 0645 10/2: W.A. am +9; QSID. 10; S.A. 102; N.T. 92; NSW/VIC/TAS 11; and for the first time N.Z. experiments with [MT +13, all starting 11/3. So look for s/off one hour earlier than before, except for N.T. and QSLD. /(Hauser)

CANARY ISIANDS Local time is now CMT +1 hour. (Jaar)

JAMAICA Since 1/6/74 local time has been GMT -4 hours (EDT). (Jaar)

SPAIN Local time is now GMT +2 hours. (Jaar)

And now, whats actually being heard. This column should be filled with TAS this time of the year; but condx continue rather poor. Only half decent opening was noted here on 10/7, but it didn't produce much audio, just a dozen or so carriers. Things seem to be a bit better on the WC with many TPs being reported. I expected the first half of October to produce some good TA openings, but not so far. Will things ever improve? Lets hope so!!!

RICA TICAL Radio Rumbos, Cartago. Caught out of what was apparently s/off w/anthem following at 0501 on 10/7. This surprising as condx. from CA were below normal. Quiet allowed full volume to get this. No QRN or sideband splatter. Seemed back on 525 but not measured. (Freeman)

-COLOMBIA HIM Horizonte, Bogota noted after XEMA s/off w/IA mx. ID mentioning Colombia but weak so couldn't copy to get a good tape. ERC and PT II helped. No CBK. 0610 9/9. (Shaftan)

-MRXICO XEWA San Inis Potosi, SLP. 0602 9/5. In like a local w/TC and II 📷 Is Vox de los America latina or something like that, had mx and s/off, mentions of SN freq, also mentions of Monterey. (Shaftan)

600 -COLOMBIA HJHJ Radio Libertad, marranguilla made its first appearance of the season (also first time tried, hi!) way u/CMRV in mull of latter which explains my situation here. Couldn't get anything definite on this one to positively ID but gets to be fairly regular here by mid-winter. Heard 0801 on 9/21. ID at 0735 clearest: "Totally different music from KIPA, Hilo. Rock and Roll". Then back to mx. Good sig w/KGN partly mulled and in talk show. Never heard them when they were on 1110. (Hardy)

640 -CUPA CMQ Havana heard w/Ia Voz de Cuba 0750 9/21. In rather weak w/usual propaganda. (Shaftan) # # 10/7 1000 w/fast latin mx and male announcer giving names of songs. Iylophone heard at 1025-1029 followed by marching mx and ID as Radio Liberacion. Next, news in SS. KFI off but on later w/open carrier at 1035. Was still able to hear CMQ underneath, however, till 1039 when KFI too overpowering. (Lobel)

-CHIMA Radio Peking 10/1, 1400-1405, martial mx w/male/female announcers over

-CURA CMBC Havana noted w/Cuban mx, also first time noted this season but reg in winter. Usual type program, 0503, 9/27. Do they carry LVDC? (Shaftan) -UNID (Quatemala tentative) Radio Mundial, possibly the IA noted here 9/14 0333-0352 w/SS pop mx and brief anmt and/or ads. Fair signal except for ORM from the Cuban on 690. Freq could have been closer to 694, but I have no way of measuring accurately, (Burns) This is likely la Voz de Bogota

which has been well heard on about 692.4 khz. Radio Mundial has not been here for several years. (ED)

-AUSTRALIA 2NR Grafton, NSN heard 9/29 w/mx of NSN at 1355 and s/off at 1400. Heard ABC mentioned but not call. Only fair level in mull of JOKD. First time I've heard an Australian s/off. (Freeman)

-UNID Sounded like Radio Sudasenda, perhaps the Radio Sutatenza noted in 9/30 IDED, but 9/18 w/mmindo noticias and Colombian datelines, sounded like "HJCG en Barranquilla" call given 0455. Faded, and 2nd SS broke thru 0456, sounded like "Radio Cardena fool de Quatemala", in tandem w/2 other stns like a network; the other 2 seemed to be Radio Internacional and maybe Radio Espinola. Help! (McCurdy) First stn likely Radio Sutatenza, HJCI in Cali. 2nd probably TCHR Radio Mundial in Guatemala City. TIHB Radio Reloj in San Jose is also often heard here. (ED)

-ANDORRA Sud Radio very good at 2347 w/instrumental mx on 10/7. We sign of minut at this time. (ED) ** Noted w/FF talks hetting WHAP o/u and later u/ Morocco on same freq. Had some piano mx too. At 0500 9/7. (Shaftan)

-MOROCCO Rabat noted w/AA wailing just after Sud Radio came in a/Will on 820 and later o/Andorra. Some MGI slop didn't help. Thanks to RJE for ID on this. 0503/9/7. (Shaftan)





If Gov. Wendell H. Ford's request to the U.S. secretary of transportation to change Kentucky time zones is granted, the change will affect counties Oct. 27 as follows: Counties in black will go from Eastern Daylight to Eastern Standard Time; counties in

white will shift from Central Daylight to Eastern Standard time; western counties (thin black stripes) will shift from Central Daylight to Central Standard Time. Only the black and shaded counties' clocks will actually change.

U.S. is to revert to former six-six split in fall of 1975, barring action by Congress in wake of hearings set by Magnuson for next year

The Senate passed by unanimous voice vote last week a measure (H.R. 16102) that would end the nation's experiment with year-round daylight saving time. The bill would restore standard time for four months this winter—from the last Sunday in Cetober until the last Sunday in February 1975. It has now passed both houses and proceeds to President Ford who is expected to sign it into law.

Ford who is expected to sign it into law. The bill amends the Emergency Daylight Saving Time Energy Conservation Act, passed in December 1973 as an energy-saving measure. All other provisions of the emergency law will remain in effect until it expires the last Sunday in April 1975. That includes the section from which the FCC derived authority to grant emergency relief to daytime radio stations which suffered from the loss of a morning hour of broadcast time. In all, about 1,165 daytime stations were given emergency authority to sign on in the early morning darkness last winter while many people were on their way to work or school. That relief will continue during March and April next year when daylight saving will again be in effect.

When the 1973 emergency act expires the country will return to the former system of six months standard time and six months advanced time. Barring further legislation, March and Aprili will again come under standard time.

Many daytime stations—those on Canadian clear channels—did not receive emergency relief last winter because of treaty arrangements with Canada. An FCC spokesman said a tentative agreement has been reached between the U.S. and Canada to allow some 200 of those stations to sign on before sunrise during winter daylight saving. The spokesman did not know, however, how that agreement would be affected by the new bill. The spokesman said an agreement has been firmed with the Bahamas so that American stations on the Bahamian clear channel can sign on before surrise during winter daylight saving as long as they do not interfere with the signals of Bahamian stations.

One broadcaster who was outspoken last winter against the adoption of year-round daylight saving, Clint Formby of KPAN-AM-FM Hereford, Tex., said the reinstatement of standard time for four months would be good, but would not solve the whole problem created by the emergency act. He would prefer a return to the old system of six months standard time. KPAN is a daylime station on a Canadian clear channel and was one, that did not receive emergency relief last winter.

Mr. Formby, who retired two months ago as radio board chairman for the National Association of Broadcasters, said the added daylight hour in the evening last winter did not compensate for the lost morning hour, which his station needed to broadcast weather and market information to early-rising farmers. KFAN is the only AM, he said, in one of the most agriculturally productive counties in the nation. "Sometimes Washington misses the point . . . of that one hour in the morning," he added.

Senate Commerce Committee Chairman Warren Magnuson (D-Wash.) has said his committee will hold hearings next summer to study the merits of continuing a system of four months standard time and eight months daylight saving. That meeting, according to a committee aide, will follow a report the Department of Transportation is to make to Congress by next Aug. 1 assessing the successes and failures of the daylight savings experiment.

Cutback of DST prompts commission to revise concessions to daytimers

The FCC last week began adjusting its rules governing presunrise operation by daytimers to the realities of the law enacted two weeks ago and will return the nation to standard time between Oct. 27, 1974, and Feb. 23, 1975.

The commission rescinded, effective Oct. 27, the emergency orders that authorized 1,165 daytime-only radio stations to begin operating at least one hour before sunrise and with 50 w of power. At the same time, it announced

that it intends to act early in 1975 to permit the daytimers to operate presunrise on generally the same terms as at present between Feb. 23 and April 27, 1975, when most of the country returns to daylight saving time.

The commission was authorized to grant emergency early sign-on authority to daytimers in the same legislation in which Congress last year placed the country on year round daylight saving time as an energy-saving measure. The emergency measures were designed to enable daytimers to continue providing the kind of early-morning service to which their listeners had become accustomed.

The commission in its order last week said it would exceed the authority granted it under the year-round daylight saving time act if it permitted the emergency sign-on authorizations to remain in effect beyond Oct. 27. It would also, the commission said, deprive fulltime stations, whose service is affected by the early sign-on of the daytimers, of hearing rights to which they are entitled under the Communications Act.
