## CHANGES

As you may have noticed, the $H Q$ phane \# has been stricken from the back page and is no longer operative. The primary reason for this was lack of general use -- we felt that it wasn't worth the outlay for it. Only people aside from editors \& other officers (who will shortly be supplied a confidential phone list of all others suchlike) were calls to yak, and not to pass on info, thus no need for an HQ phone. If you call just to yak, you're out of luck.

Firstly, a f'ew notes on CPC: CPC info is not available from $H Q$, but rather from the CPC chairman, Jerry Starr, c/o WHOT, 401 No. Blaine, Youngstown, OH 44505. Further, in order for the majority of members to benefit from a test, NRC HQ must hav at least 2 weeks advance notice of the test or it will not appear in DX NEWS until AFTER the test has been aired. POSTAL RATES \& DUES........
The U.S.P.S. now claims that all first classmail will receive the same treatmer as airmail, and is actively disoouraging the use of Airmail by offer ing exchanges on domestic airmail stamps \& envelopes. They have also announced an "interim" rate hike effective $12 / 28 / 75$ which will eliminate airmail as a class domesticwise and raise first class rates to 134 . We will continue for the time being to send Air bulletins via air, but would welcome comments from those who receive via air in the same geographical area as others receive by 1st. We may well put all members onto our mailing permit to save us trouble. As of $1 / 1 / 76$, all domestic members
will be charged $\$ 15.00$ dues. The club will take a small loss over the current will be charged $\$ 15.00$ dues. The club will take a small loss over the current
situation this way, but we have already prepared for it ( 3 per oz x 40 oz/yr $=1.20$ ).

For this reason, THERE WILL BE NO PRORATE. For the relatively small amount of money involved, the amount of work needed and the amount of confusion created by a prorate is just not worth it, hi.

PUBLISHERS' CORNER
As the NRC enters its 43rd year of service to DX'ers and as the NJPC enters its third year of publishing chores it is time to make a few observations. When we inherited the club two years ago, it had 515 members, about 15 of them foreign. Currently, we have 730 members, of whom nearly 30 are foreign. The club now is in the best financial shape ever, thanks to better publicity in the trade and hobby magazines than we have ever had before, and thanks to the introduction last year of reprint reference manuals, a concise new member booklet, and a likewise concise and informative information booklet. In all respects, the club has enjoyed its best year ever. We have not had a month in which membermonth of the regular DX season as well as of the non-DX season during the 19741975 year has shom marked increase over the some month in the previous season in terms of sample requests, memberships, reprint orders, and log and pattern book orders. On tap for the upcoming season are the revised pattern book, which should arrive off the presses this month; the new edition of the NRC Domestic Log, which, we hope, will be published next sumner; the NRC/IRCA joint LA Log, which we hope to have available this winter; a new (second) antenna manual; a new (second) receivers manual; and, possibly manuals in additional subject areas.
Over the past two years, we can safely say that no mailing of bulletins was delayed by more than two days. We can likewise say that in the same period de have not found it advisable to hold over copy from any of the regular weekly columns. Our original switch to negative and plate printing has remproved a very readable bulletin, and several format changes have, we feel, umn placement from issue to issue, which we had not realised was an issue of major importance to the membership until we were congratulated for correcting t. In the area of reprints, we have exceeded 20,000 pages of reprints sold for the past Volume year, which far exceeds our previous record set the previous year. This record is all the more impressive when it is considered that the same year saw the introduction of the repreint reference manuals, which ticles through regular an overan reduction the the rer int list has amdergone a selective "weed ing out" process during the past year to eliminate articles which sold very poorly or which were outdated. Thus, during the past year, we sold over 20,000 pages of reprints in xerox form PLUS about 375 Reeiver manuals and 250 antenns manuals. ( over 20,000 more pages of the foror manual alone !). We are still, as noted above, in the process of streanining reprints in the hope that we can eventually reduce it to the point where e can safely farm its operations out from HQ. This has been our plan for the long range ever since we took over publication in 1973.
We have several technical articles in preparation by sevaral authors, and we trust that we will have several more later in the season. This effort, we ther -- namely the pucity of technical articlea over the past tuo yoars We realise, however, that this aspect of the bulletin is not even significantly within our control as we cannot print articles we do not receive. We have only one member of the HQ crew - RjE - who has written technical articles before, and not all of them were of an even moderately sophisticated nature, and he has been engaged himself with research for a sooner-or-later-to-be-upcoming article which has become far more time consuming than had been origirnlly anticipated. Only a few of the veteran members who have contributed articles in the past have done so recently, therefore we have had technical bent, and who might be interested in writing articles for DX NEWS to do so regardless of their longevity with the club.

Our only major apology at this time is that we have as yet not been able to present our annual report for the 1973-74 season as of this date. As we had explained earlier, this delay is due to major backup of straightening out our financial records. In the process of incorporation, which will protect he club as well as its eators and publishers, all the while hoperully net ing us a tax exemption, we found it necessary to have our accountant audit the books for the past five yeers of operations in order to present the picture necessary to gain our tax exemption. Due to the fact that previous HQ crews had not done this, nor had they haded filed tax returns as required under the law when a rau data at the present time, and will publish it, along vith the regular annus report for '73-174 as soon as possible. The reports for '74-'75 will follow as soon as the figures are available from our accountant.

This is not a product review, as the writer has not tried the set out! The SSR-1 is a brand new receiver, though, and we feel mention of it is in rder. The set is a product of the highly-regarded R.L. Drake Co. and was introduced to convention-goers at the ANARC meeting in Montreal In August, having been brought there by Perry Ferrell of Gilfer. Perhaps if some NRC'er as at ANARC and tried the set on medium-wave, he'll share his thoughts on it with the club membership.

The receiver is offered in the $\$ 350$ price class. Considering that few eceivers (outside the multi-kilodollar professional class) are coming on the new-equipment market at this time, including broadcast band coverage of course, we feel there'll be lots of curiosity about just what the set offers the MW DX'er. Therefore, the following paragraph quotes the company's flyer:

PRELIMINARY SPECIFICATIONS: Coverage 500 khz to 30 mhz . Frequency can be read accurately to better than five khz. (emphasis added-ed.) Sensitivity typially 0.5 microvolts for $10 \mathrm{db} \mathrm{S}+\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{N} \mathrm{SSB}$ and 2 microvolts for $10 \mathrm{db} \mathrm{S}+\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{N}$ AM. (Ed. note: These are likely figures on the SWBC bands, and it is possible results are less on BCB, if extra conversion stages are used.) Selectable Sidebands. Built-in power supply: $117 / 234$ VAC $\pm 20 \%$. If the AC power source fails, the unit switches automatically to an internal battery pack which uses 8 D-cells (not supplied). For reduced current drain on DC operation, the dials do not light up unless a red pushbutton on the front panel is depressed. the flyer goes on to suggest applications for the receiver such as a stand-by amateur or novice amateur receiver, SWBC, CB monitor or general-purpose lab receiver.

Now, for the author's corments. erewith, an illustration of the unit. Along the top row we ind the S-meter and a dual concentric tuning dial. The op row of controls, from the eft to the right, are: Mmz une (driving the inner dial) reselector, and khz tune (the arge knob driving the outer large knob driving the oute
cale, Along the bottom, from L to R: Phone jack, off-on/volume, the 4 -pos ition bandswitch ( $500-1500 \mathrm{khz}, 1.5-5 \mathrm{mhz}, 5-12 \mathrm{mhz}$ and $12-30 \mathrm{mhz}$ ). Next to that is a 3-posttion mode switch: AM, Upper SB and Lower SB. Finally, there's "clarify" control which functions as a fine tuning adjust for SSB reception astly, the speaker is self contained.

We feel this set is related to the SW-4A and the Barlow-Wadley XCR-30 in general concept, application and operation. Tuning appears to be in 1 mhz increments or jumps, and fine tuning scale reads in 10 khz graduations. This should be good set for general scouting through the SWBC bands, but the serious DXer should note the absence of the following: Importantly, there's NO adjustment of bandwidth or selectivity, and there is no rejection notch. Less critically, there's no RF gain adjust, no preselector tune calibration, and no calibrator for dial check, though that shouldn't ordinarily be of any real concern. In my opinion, the absence of any IF selectivity and rejection tune functions make the set unsuitable for the advanced DXer seeking reception of split-frequency MW BCB staions. However, this is necessary in today's world if one is to market a receiver at this attractive price. The set should make a good second receiver for the $M \mathbb{N}$ DXer, an excellent adjunct for portable operation/ power outage operation and of course it's great for tuning SWBC when exact frequencies must be found.

FCC Proposes Traveler's Info Radio Station
The FCC has recently proposed that the
requencies 530,1606 , and 1612 KHz be allocated for the use by local government agencies to provide certain kinds of information to travelers on the nation's highways.
For some time the Commission, working logether with other government agencies,
has been studying the need for low power radio transmitters to communicate certain types of information to travelers. For ex ample, radio might be used to aler
motorists to road hazards, to inform them of available food, gasoline, lodging, or to direct them to local points of interest. Federal agencies have also expressed a
desire to use radio at arks and other nadesire to use radio at parks and other na-
tional tourist areas to inform and advise travelers and to control traffic durin emergencies such as forest fires. It is obvious that the use of radio offers many advanages over road signs and other methods

The proposed rules would establish new category of station which will use
transmitters of approximately 10 watts output on either of two frequ 10 wati above or one frequency just below the AM broadcast band. The Commission is pro posing these frequencies because limited
studies have shown that many automobile studies have shown that many automobile
AM receivers have the capability of tuning just past the edges of the band. Therefore, many motorists with AM radios could start using the service immediately without hav ing to buy special equipment.
"Tre new type of station would be called a would than 10 watts which a pould por not more age over a radius of about one mile. age over a radius of about one mile.
The intent of the new class of station is $t$ serve the safety and convenience of travelers. As a result, commercial advertising will not be permitted and licenses will only
be issued local government be issued local government agencies accepted by the FCC. The Commission noted that if the new rules are adeopted, due consideration would be given to AM broadcast stations
operating on frequencies of 530,1590 , and 1600 kHz to insure that no interference would be caused.

I purchased y NC200 in April 1973, used, for $\$ 35$. From comments in the omer's manual, I believe it was built during or shortly after WW II. I have no way of knowing what sort of care it received before I bought it, and I'w pretty sure it could stand a thorough tune-up, but, as one of the fow NPGer's using a National. I thought I'd offer a few opinions.

The NC200 is general coverage receiver, $.5-30 \mathrm{MHs}$, split up into six bands, plus four bandspread ranges covering the ham bands. Wall ourrent or battery operations are possible. Controls on the front of the receiver ares off/atandby/on, AVC/MVC/CWO, a variable limiter, RF gain, bandswitch/tuning knob, AF gain, phasing, selectivity (6 pos. switch), tone, and CW oscillator. There is a signal strength meter, in williamperes. The tuning dial is lighted. There is a hi-z headphone output, and phone jack input. The antenna terminals (unbalanced operation only), rewote standby connections, speaker jack, and battery connector tion only), remote standby connections, speaker jack, and battery connector
jack are on the rear. In separate case are the inal output transformer jack are on

I have repleced a couple tubes and one oapacitor, and, as I mentioned before, the set could use good tune-up. However, I'll offer a few opinions which wight be of interest to the prospeotive buyer.

First, complaints. The AM band is split, as on many general coverage receivers, and bandswitching is noisy. The switching process is all mechanical, with several sets of contacts to be switched all at once. If jour Dr'ing situation involves being quiet at night, (so othere can sleop, etc.) you J find jourself having to pick one half of the band ( 540 1000 or $900-2100 \mathrm{KHs}$ ) and sticking to $1 t \operatorname{ll} \mathrm{night}$. h second complaint is that the receiver seems quite sensitive to changing from an amplified antenna (SM-2) to an unamplipied (longuire) ons, and has to be rum for an hour or so before things stop sounding strange. This is herd to explaing, mayb it's just my ears; but I've found that hooking up the SM-2 aftor a session on the longwire requires some warmup tim Jofore the loop really becomes effective. Thirdly, the set seem to be tough on fliter capacitors; the one I replaced was not originml, and I' going to noed a now once again pretty soon I fear. The result of this is internittent buss problems turning the set to standyy for a few seconds has proven to be a emporary remedy, but that's not alvays convenient.

Other minor complaints would include the fact that the S-metor is not lighted, and som tubes are hard to parchase. I heven't heard asy splitchamel $D X$ yet, but I don't know if this is dee to a fault in partion alar receiver, Nationals in general, wy IEIng techniques, or whetever.

On to what I Like about Mationil. Gemerally, the MC200 has boen quite reliable - I can think of oniJ once when I rissed a BI sessicn due to receiver probleas. Use of the phasing, seleotivity, and Iiniter controls has done ponders in elibinating co-chamel splash (alang rith the SN-2). The tone control is quite pective ithoup ther hove beem time when Ir tone mecilar is lao iltion receiver is also pretty good for non-DK listening, and can be adjusted to pat o

The MC200 seews to have a "personality" of its own; when DX'ing, you really begin to relate to the radio as more than just box of con ponents. The controls and such keop the DX'or involved with what's going or, and you really get a sense of trying to squeese that last little bit I'm not oure, but thetis the foeling I got. Whether this is good or bad, I'm not sure, but that's the feeling I get.

I don't have anviling to really compare ny MC200 with, but I would close by saying that. I-think wil-cared-for Mational receiver in the hands of dedicated bivor could be a vory potent set-up. The reliebility and flexibility of the IC200 have made me feel I definitely got my men's worth, and more.

CHTN is presently operating with a temporary power output of 1,000 watts. Conversion to 10,000 watts will take place in February, 1975.
