## FCC will try again <br> on clear channels

Commission says earlier efforts to extend night service were
ineffective; now it has new idea

The FCC has virtually admitted failure in its last major effort to provide primary nightime radio service to vast areas of the This time, it is considering a variety of op-tions-from permitting dominant clearchannel (I-A) stations to increase power bove the present so kw limit, to breaking down remaining unduplicated clears
The commission made its proposals last
week in a notice of inquiry and proposed rulemaking, in which it gave its first public assessment of the effect of the rules it adopted in the 1961 clear channel ulemaking and reopened that proceeding. Those rules were designed to authorize station each on 13 of the 25 unduplicated clear channels, to help bring radio service o about half the land area of the U.S. and some 25 million persons then without nightime primary service from $A M$ stations.

Fourteen years later, 10 new class II-A stations are operating, providing the first nighttime service to some 300,000 persons. While this may be a considerable achievement, the commission said, it is "have done little more than nibble at the fringes of inadequate nightime standard broadcast service." It also said that AM stations of other classes authorized since 1961 had not contributed appreciably to educing unserved areas
mission's latest proposal for providin radio service to unserved areas is the determination to consider the degree to which $F M$ is supplementing AM service
rend nightime service to unserved areas This would be in accord with commission policy to treat AM and FM as a single aural service.
The commission will study existing FM service and will make the results part of portion of the proceeding invites the participation of anyone developing programs aimed at exploiting FM's potential for extending nighttime service to all parts of the country.
But the commission also indicates it is prepared to consider fundamental changes in its basic patern of clear channel use.

This article is intended to provide the DX'er with information about the frequency checks that Cambridge Crystals (Cambridge Thermionics, Cambridge, Mass.) performs. Cambridge performs f/cis for the states of Connecticut, Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine. The state of Rhode Island is also a probabiltity. As far as 1 can determine, a goodiy number of these checks are done shortly after midnight Eastern Local Time (ELT).

Cambridge has never furnished Joe Fela with a list of their checks so discovering them is done by writing a station, visiting the station, or through actual monitoring.

Cambridge does have some checks that are done the same day each month, i.e. WSNG-610 which occurs on the second Friday, WASR-1420 on the fourth Wednesday, WMCS -1400 on the third Saturday, WTYM.1600 on the second Monday. The other checks are much more difficult to hear.

Cambridge usually performs a $f / c$ in the following manner: Cambridge phones the station and has the operator start a 1000 hertz tone. Cambridge hears the tone and has the operator stop it for a is inder is made.

It is unfortunate that the NRC doesn't have active DX'ers in the states of Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont that could contribute $\mathrm{f} / \mathrm{C}$ information to DX NEWS. The NJPC is pleased to report that the condition of the club has improved substantially in the first two years of operations in New Jersey. Our membership has grown from 515 in September 1973 to a total of 732 on October 1, 1975. Joins and re-joins for the year 1973-74 exceeded drops by about 75, while for the year 1974-75, the figure was an astounding 140! A large factor in the increases noted has been the excellent coverage we and our publications have received from the hobby press in the commercial sector. Another factor has been our reprint reference manuals, which have resulted in many new memberships. Still other factors may be credited, including massive mailings during 1973-74 to all former members of whom we had records; an article we were able to secure in Broadcasting magazine; and the resumption of sales of our publications through Gilfer Associates. Since taking over operations a little over two years ago, we have processed some 1800 requests for information on the club or its publications from non-members, which is also a record. As we have mentioned previously, another large part of our success in attracting members from these requests can be attributed to our producing an informative booklet for sending to all non-menbers inquiring about the club or its publications. These booklets have also bon-members inquiring about the number of persons referred to us through current members and from been sent to number of persons referred to us through curr

During our initial year, our costs remaned relatively stable, enabling us to build up a sorely-needed cash reserve to help us to continue with our special publications. In our second year of operations, we absorbed increases in printing costs, labels, and xerox reprints amounting to an average of over $20 \%$. Our publications sales enabled us to hold the line except for the reprints costs, which subsequently increased again. Postal increases, of course, continue to plague us. The magnitude of these in creases forced us to reise dues accordingly. The latest increase, we hope, will be able to hold us against another anticipated postal rate increase which we expect to follow the current one. These selfsame postal increases, have, however, cost us in overhead for normal operational postage, as well as in the areas of reprints and special publications. This has been one major factor in our move to reprint booklets. The other, of course, has been the savings to the club and the membership in publishing booklets as opposed to using xerox copies. The postal increases, combined with the inclusion of several additional reprint articles in the revised night pattern book, have forced us to increase the members-only price of the new book to $\$ 6.50$. With the new edition of the Domestic Log anticipated next year, the price of that volume will also have to be increased accordingly.

In the area of special publications, we have sold some 140 of the previous edition of the log, and have sold over $\$ 00$ copies of the current edition. We sold out our entire supply of nesrly 400 of the original pattern books. We have sold some 400 of our Antenn Manuals, and over 300 Receiver manuals. We have also sold nearly 150 copios of the two editions of "Getting Started in Medium Wave DX'ing" to non-members. copies of the two editions of Getting Started in Medium Wave During 1973-74, we processed some 12,000 pages of xerox reprints. During the year During 1973-74, we processed some 12,000 pages of xerox reprints. During the year just ended, a record 19,000 pages were sold, IN ADDIION To the aforementioned sale
of reference manuals. A new Latin American Log, joint project with IHCA is also of reference manuals. A new Latir American Log, joint project with THCA is al
underway. We likewise anticipate that within the coming year, second volumes of underway. We likewise anticipate that within the coming y
both the Antenna and Roceiver Menuals will be published.

Volume 41 of DX NEWS featured some 920 pages, or 40 pages less than we had profected. The difference was caused by an unexpected paucity of technical and feature articles. A breakdown of the content of this page count accompanies this report. The projection for Volume 42 was also 960 pages. The actual total was 980 , due primarily to several issues where there was too much urgent copy for a 24 pager and too little of any type of copy to round out to a 48. In short, the year just anded featured much time-dated material which could not be held according to the normal publishing procedure. A breakdown of the past year's bullet in page content also accompanies this report.

Briefly, our cash liquidity position is far better than it was a year ago, primarily due to the increase in memberships and the depletion of inventories of publications. In addition, new publications and increased sales overall have added to our current liquid assets. Edetailed financial statement also accompanies this report, for the year 1973-74. The report for 1974-75 is currently being prepared f'or our accountant, and will be published as soon as it is completed.

In the area of reprints, we have made several afforts to streamline the operation; we have completed the Antenna and Receiver Manuals, and a new and enlarged New Member Kit; ; we have transferred some articles to the new Pattern Book; and we have eliminated a number of articles which were either out of date, or which were very rarely ordered. This process will continue through the coming year in the hope that the reprints workload can be sufficiently reduced to be farmed out a way from HQ. We are desirous of obtaining a volunteer or volunteers away from HQ to take over reprints sometime after the first, of the year (1976). By this time, another revised reprint list will be in process, another weeding-out process will have taken place, and we Will have eliminated from xerox reprints all of the articles now contained in the three aforementioned manuals. Master reprints will still be retained by HQ, and we will obtain the xeroxing here, and ship completed copies via U.P.S. to the new Reprints manager. This sort of operation has been our goal in this area for the past two years, and we hope that it will finally come to pass.
As has been stated before, the NRC is now registered as a non-profit corporation in the State of New Jersey. This action protects the club, the eilitors, and the publisher as well. We also hope that we will be able to gain tax relief from the State sales tax, once our applications for Federal and State exemptions have been processed. We are also in the process of applying for an exemption from Federal Income Taxes which have been due for about 4 years according to our accountant. This measure, coupled with the anticipated exemptions, will save the club and its past and present officers from prosecution for this delinquency.

Additional plans for the future include a still further de-centralization of club activities. During the first year of our operations, Log and Pattern Book order completion was taken over by Frank Dailey; during our second year, distribution of the Antenna, Receiver, and Novice menuals was taken over by Ken Chatterton. Answering of non- and quasi-technical correspondence of a non-immediate nature was taken over by Phil Harris during our first year. Typing and re-typing for articles appearing in DX News and our other publications has been taken over by Glenn Cooper, Dale Whitehead, Don Erickson, John MColman, and Linda Brodsky. Additional typing for the coming year will be done by the same group plus Brian Vernon and Paul Wardell. The typing of labela and certain articles has been done by a professional typist locally, who performed this service at a very low rate. This has been done only in cases where time was of the utmost importance. Our information packet has been condensed into a DX-NEWS sized booklet for easy mailing to all comers, which has resulted in a further reduction of workload.

We are also planning to solicit responses from the membership regarding certain additional publications which we are not certain of the size of the potential market for, as well as regarding format preferences for the Domestic Log. The participation of the membership in this endeavour is vital so that we may produce the most convenient and useful types of publications.

Finally, we again apologise for the extensive delays in presenting the reports for the 1973-74 operating yaar. We did not anticipate the amount of time and work necessary to piece together the accounts not only for the past year, put for the prior years of Boston publication as well. All of this information had to then We hope that the process for the data for $1974-75$ will be far less trouble, and will be available around the first of the year.

FCC to be asked to OK

Kahn Research Laboratories, Freeport, N Y, expects to ask the FCC to permit AM radio stations to broadcast in stereo. The
Kahn AM stereo system has undergone a Kahn AM stereo system has undergone a
six-month test authorized by the commission on WFBR(AM) Baltimore. The test data will be submitted with the petition for general approval of AM stereo. One purpose of the Baltimore experibroadcasts could be received without distortion on monaural AM sets, the only kind now in general distribution. The station and Kahn officials reporled that no
complaint had been received during the entire test period.
Kahn spokesmen said the company has
no plans to enter the receiver no plans to enter the receiver market, even if it is opened to AM stereo.
The big plus for AM broadcas, going stereo, said Leonard Kahn, president of Kahn Laboratories, is in car radio
reception. Floyd Daisey, wFR chief reception. Floyd Daisey, wFBR chief with a " "sharp threshold," is sometimes lost to car reception because of changing terrain while an AM signal would be less susceptible to that problem. Harry Shriver, president and general manager of wFBR,
suggested that the AM stereo provides "self defense" against FM stereo.
RCA has demonstrated an AM
RCA has demonstrated an AM stereo broadcast system at the National Associ-
ation of Broadcasters' convention last spring (Broadcasting, April 14). RCA is currently working on a prototype system, with several refinements in the one dem-
onstrated at the NAB, to be field tested onstrated at the NAB, to be field tested
under the auspices of the National AM Stereophonic Radio Committee sponsored by the Electronic Industries Association.

WFBR, however, is the only U.S. commercial station that has tested an AM tereo broadcast system over the air. XTRA(AM) Tijuana, Mexico, has tested the The Kahn stereo
duces an asymmetrical sidast system proopposed to regular AM which signal, as symmertical sideband signal. The resultant phase-shift characteristics were a subdozen engineers and station management people on hand for an Oct. 31 demonstration of the Kahn system at wFrR. The question often raised was whether the
small-time delay in phase modulation on the carrier would create spurious sideband interference. According to Mr. Daisey,
there is no effect. There is a loss of 3 db there is no effect. There is a loss of 3 db
signal-to-noise ratio in the stereo mode, since the over-all power is split in half by separating the sidebands.
Preliminary text results showed no skywave interference to clear channels
from stereo AM broadcasting. Mr. Daisey also said that the Kahn system is adaptable for matrix quadraphonic broadcasting. Aside from RCA and Kahn, a group called Communications Associates in
Hicksville, N.Y., has also shown interest in developing a stereo AM system. The National AM Stereophonic Radio committee anticipates submitting a report to the
FCC on the various proposals for an AM FCC on the various proposals for an AM
stereo broadcast system in a "year or so " according to its chairman, Harold Kassens, who did not attend the wFBR emonstration.
