Yep - off wont their carriar, and immediately as it did, on came another, and in Brooklyn, it had the volume of the signal which had just left the airwaves - maybe a little botter. "Wow" I mused - what a signal KFPM is going to put in - this'll o a cinch logging for me! 11 After about a 15 second wait for the opening announcement, sure enough, on it came. "Good Morning, ladies and gentlemon. This is a apecial DX program for the NATIONAL RADIO CLUB. This is Radio Station -- no - not KFPM - but - This is Radio Station - Hixit, in Buffalo, New York." In those days, there was no intorclub co-operation, you ses, and unbeknownst to the NRC, the NNRC had arranged that DX from KFPM at the same time NRC had asked WFBR to DX. The "Amsterdam Effect" In Iran

It has been found that super-power transmitters may cause interference to the
sky wave signals of lower powered transmitters by actual modification of the properties of the lonosphere. The reader is referenced to "Proceedings of the IEEE" for July 1975 in which a discussion of National Bureau of
Standards experiments on Ionospheric modifiStandards experiments on Ionospheric modifi-
cation, as it applies to VHF and UHF communications, is contained.
One of the first indications that low requency intermodulation was occurring was found in the Netherlands due to Ionospheric modification caused by a super-power trans"Amsterdam Effect" is common throughout Europe and the Mid-East.
Your author, on a recent field trip to Iran, witnessed the results of intermodulation measurements being conducted at several of the sites I visited throughout Iran. National Iranian Radio and Television operates a
2 megawatt transmitter on 535 kHz at a site near the capital, Tehran. This power is capable of causing intermodulation of lower powered stations due to an increase or decrease in the lonization levels of the atmosphere that actually follows the modulaon of the super-power transmitter.
witnessed was made at Ardebill. 250 Km Northwest of Tehran. The station envelope we were displaying was a Harris $\mathrm{BC}-20 \mathrm{H}$, 20 kW transmitter operating on 1214 kHz located at Chalus. Chalus is about 200 Km
North of Tehran and 250 Km East of Ardebill. The 2 megawatt was modulated $100 \%$ at various frequencies while the Chalus trans: mitter was unmodulated. The following intermodulation was noted:

We see from these figures that the ionosphere can apparently only be altered at lower frequency rates. In a measurement made by N.I.R.T., at Chalus, observing the
Ardebill BC -20H ( 1320 kHz ), at one point the intermodulation of the Ardebill signal approached $100 \%$ at 60 Hz , but was less than $3 \%$ at 1 kHz . Measurements by N.I.R.T. are continuing throughout Iran as the installation of seven new sites of paralleled 100 kW Harris VP-100A transmitters proceeds. The
concern was that in some remote areas, the 200 kW output from the paralleled transmitters might interfere with lower powered sky wave signals.
The conclusions, at this point, suggest that the intermodulation is never audible (on smaller speakers) when the lower powered
signal is modulated and that, even in extreme cases, the high frequency cut-off characteristics of this effect would prevent intelligible intermodulation. It appears that the effect is an interesting phenomena without the possibly serious problems of audible intermodulation if the high roll-off effect did not
exist. Measurements using a 100 kW transmitter suggest that a minimum power of 500.1000 kW is required before this phenomena becomes measureable.

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
