## JUST HOW DOES ONE COMPRRE RECEIVERS MND WHAT DOES IT YSNN 9??

It seom that recent commenta in DKN about the Dymeir DR-22 and Iaceu FRG-7 have prompted bit of a controveray. Mill on both aets of corsmenta has beun generilly in agreemmit, but some hes been received in opposition, fa noted last week, product sumaries are provided to apperficially acquaint the prospective purchaser with some idea of the potertilal of the produot reviewed. Aotual user reviews or comparisons are to give a inl 'or good working view of wht the item will or will not do. Somewhere in between is the aort of canual comments often oontained in Masinga.

Ong feeling is that any information whioh we ons provide is good, sasuring that it is neithar gromely inacourate or intentionaliy mialeading, inasmuch as kowbedge of a produat in highly advantagecus to the burer.

Thare ara, however, cortain probless. A produot aumary must depend upon that informotion whith ogn be readis obteined, and nore often then not, this is divertising moterisil, techoical revious, or specificetions mearided hy tha manufacturar. Thus, moterial, technical reviens, or speciricetions meoraded hy tha manufacturer. Thus, it may atill not be worthwhilo. Specs may holp, but they do not necessarily prove out to be entirely accurate beyond the paramars of the test circumstances. What comta, for our purposes, is how the thing performa in context, namely, ib applied BCB DX. For theos purpotea, then, it may be soen that any DK'or who has experienced $B C B D X$. For theae purpotea, then, it nay bo soen that any DK or who has experienced
a number of rsceivera, and has DX ed $B C B$ a fow years, is reasonably competent to a number of rbceivera, and hat DK ed BCB I fow Je

Also importsint in what type of comparison is mede. There are numarous different type of receiveras portebix, commications receivers, AM-FMM, BCB-only, otc., ond there ore obviously overiape. Some will insist that comparisons must be mede omly within the partionher type and aubtype. For on accurate, scientific comparian this in true. In our oase, though, we are interested in how the roceiver comperen to some generally-kown and generaliynecepted oriterion. Portsbles are genorally compared to the Realistic TRF, which is the mont popular and very close to the heat of that genre. Commonications receivera are compered to the "state of the art BCB rign, the BQ-180. Sometimes other atandarda are used, if they fulfill the two criterik noted above. Likewiee, multiband portables nay be compared to the Grumig line, although this is leas widely imove.
If a maltibend commanioatione receiver is comparsd to an HO-180, it is not because it will fall abort, but rather beceuse mont CX'org kow tomithing about an Ho-180, oven if all thay know is that a large number of Dx'era use them, and hear good mX on them. It in atandard, and thus, comparisons can be made which are maningtill to the WIer.

A curacory cramination of receiver performano, compered to kown atandard of refarcese, by a Dre who fits the bill noted at the outsot, will be worth more by far to the DX'er wo in a poteantisl buyer then will a produot aumany, enpeos sheet, or an advertisarsent. Why ? Because it auits his anticipated appliontion.

Along the same limes, there are other acorta of standards relating to what mig is dentened to do. Some are dedigned to oover may mands gequately. Othara are deaigned for one bend or band group anly. Others are deaigned for listening, and not Ix'ing. While it is userul for un to know what the receiver is designed to do and not do, the value of comparison to a hown atapisrd is not diminished by
 it. Hearing what is or is not designed to do is useful, but not mach so as it. Hearing what is or is

A receiver which is designed to compromise between two disparate consider tions, in this case, high-fidelity and DX; or, in the case of the Berlow-Wiadley XCR-30, between large band coverage and portability end DX; must, by necessity, be just that - a compromise. The nature of suah a compromise is to detract from each in order to serve the other, and, in general (although not necessarily alweys) the result is ascrifice of ench of such proportions that neither is served more than adequately. This is the nature of the beast, and, given its intent, it does fulfill a purpose, but that purpose is not necessarily that of a good BCB DX receiver.

Thus, in the optimurn, we should know what a receiver is designed to do, and elso what it does do. Either one is informative and helpful; we have noted a preference between the two; and both would be best. As publishers, we strive to publish the most information in this aren which we can, which is severely limited by what is submitted to us. We have nsked for info on various rigs, and, receiving none, heve had to wait for it. In some ceses, it never comes, ond in others, cursory comments
 run them, and moke references to them in onswer to members' questions. That's why run them, and make reierences to them in answer to members questions. That's why we must rely on comparing it to something which is "out of its cless".

In elosing, we justify our position simpiy, and to do so\% we quote member Rendy Tomer, who said in m recent card: "Why spend $\$ 300$ on (doleted) when you csn have on HQ-180 for the seme price or less, given the former's drewbecks ?" We think that smys it all.

Again, we suggest that those of you interested in purchesing rigs consult the NRO Receivers Menuel, for comparisons/reviews; reprints for seme; "Hem Trader" (the radio classified pages, available from A. I. Brand, WA9MBJ, P.O. Bax 311, Srcamore, $\mathrm{I}_{\mathrm{L}} 60178$ ) for locating, it (the most recent issue had such rigs as $H Q-180$, $\mathrm{R}-390 \mathrm{R}$, SP600 t reasonable prices); also "Buwers and Sellers" (sample copy from Dopt. Box 73, Kenmore Sta., Boston, MA 02215) for same; or for brief write-ups of may older, rigs including tube H, ocverages, conviersions (in the tuming stages; originglly, not add-ons, hi) yemr of manufacture, etc., order one of Ham Trader's Equipmont Eurers Guides, deacribed in each issue of HT. Most readers of DX NEWS foreign sections ere now swre of the existence of the Most readers of DX NEwS foreign sections are now abnre of the existence of the of the existence of two major Russion transmitters on thet frequancy ot the presm ent $t$ ime, Ihoberovak, corrying the Fmr Epstern Service, and Noscow, cerrying the Mojak Service. At various times, many other transmitters have been hypothesized here. In 1973, Bob Bumy, former member DX'ing from Truk, in the Ceroline Isids. noted the Chinese as "Poking" nid the FES Rusaimn as wall in IDXD. Gordon Nolson, pessing on info from Beagt Erisson, also in IDXD, noted a transmitter in the ares of Krashovodsk on 1529 kHz in 1974. A station ruming Fes wha also suspected on this frequanoy, but Dever completely confirmed.

Page Taylor, then vantioning in Scotinnd, noted the Moscow transmitter and the Chineae on 1525 in 1972. Severs 1 DX'ers on the West Const have reported the Russian FES transmittar, and tentative receptions of the Chinese since 1973.

In mid-1971, the first reported reception of Urumahi appers from Page Thylor, quickiy followed by one from the author. During the period from its discovery up until the present, the following DX'ers, per IDXD reports have definitely heard the Urumohi atation:

In 1ste 1973 and onrly 1974, this muthor prepared a lengthy article, prompted by the first of these receptions, exploring the liklihood of such receptions and the possible explanations for them. at thet time, amp wis used to designate those arens where receptions of stations t Urumchi might be expected to be noted in the Enstern U.S. It is interesting to note that 11 of the definite receptions of the atation ot Urumchi, es well as the Fes Russisns on 1525 gnd 1529 have fellon within that predicted aren, and thet the two tentatives are nepr the edgea of $1 t$.

Despite these facts, little has been henrd of the 1529 transmitters since 1973, and only Urumch1 has been reported since 1974. No other treng-polar receptions have been noted. Recent info indicates the probsbility of enother Chinese et Urumehi on 1335 ktic , (approx.). The 1977 WRTH indicates several Eastern Russians which migat be poasible, sithough these would be likely mao oniy in mid-winter. Some East-Centrel Russiana, however, within about 500 miles of Jrumohi might indoed propegate in a similar fashion, given aufficient power. As of this writing, none of those listed aproach Urumchi's power, although the strength of that one is such that we can assume that somewhet lesser power might make it also.

Thare is one remining posaibility, however, reletive to Urupichi, and thet is that inasmuch es it is protty much generally mecopted that this is. Foreign Sarvice tramamitter, and inasmuch as it tremamits primarily Russien langunge, it is entire if within the realm of probability thet this transmitter msy in fact be direction. 1 in genersily northerly and northwesterly direction, thus accounting for itd rather afngular receptions in North Americe and Europe.
Urunchi is audible throughout much of the yenr, wheress the Russians were not. It isn ${ }^{\text {th }}$ too late to ahed some more light on this this senan, and the euthor will be gain looising for this one and others someuht more aystemeticelly next fall. Lot gan looking for this one and others will be ale to add some additionsl loggings to the picture, ond that we mar be sble to mdd others to the list of trang-polar receptions. When the 1525 signel is strong, thit's the time to check the other frequencies for Rusisns nith Chinese of the Pole.

x£ there" $s$ one thing tha American public has plenty of it"s AM radio stalions and if there's one thing the radio broadcasters of Anorica don't need it's more AM stations. But there is presently under consideration by the FCC, in preparation for the General World Administrative Radio Conference, a terien of roposals to expand the AM band, perhaps from 525 hhe to 1805 khz and/or to reduce channel
 available $A M$ channela. (Docket No. 20271)

On February 7th, NRB filed comments opposing these proposals but, much to our aurprise, nother bradeanter organization band. delow are excerpts from the commentis our General Counsel filed with the Cormission. We think they constitute a compelling argunent againnt the proposil.

1. The NRBA opposes any such action. An increase in available AM radio facilities in the United States will only serve to increase competition which has already reached a destructive detriment to the public interest it is intended to promote Therefore, the NRBA urges the Commision not to propose allocation of any additional spectrum to AM broadcast service, or at least to propose any such allocation on a shared basis, so that the frequency may be put to a non-broadcast use in the United States. The NRBA further asks the Commission not to propose reduction of minimum channel spacings in Region 2. An increase in AM radio station would result in destructive lev ls of competition and would not serve the public interest.
2. Broadcast financial data for 1975 released by the Commission in Hovember, 1976, reveal that fully 398 of commercial AM stations and AM/FM Sombinations in the United States and $59 \%$ of independent comercial FM stations in the United States sustained net lossell in 1975. This represents ar increase in unprofitable AM stations and AM/FM conbinations from $35 \%$ of all such stations in 1974 , $31 \%$ in 1973: the
percentage of FM stations which are unprofitable remainea approximately constant. Further, another $19 \%$ of AM stations and $24 / F H$ combinations made $\$ 10,000$ or less in profit in 1975. Thus, over half of the commercial stations are either losing money or are only marginally profitable, and the trend is for more stations to lose money every year. with such a financial situation prevailing in the industry, it is hard to see how additional AM stations would be able to survive, particularly if they were assigned to new frequencies not presently receivable on the radio receivers owned by potential listeners.
3. In view of these facts, the NRBA submits that there is simply no need for additional AM stations. While in the abstract it may be in the public interest to increase the number of broadcast services available to listeners virtually to infinity, in reality such a goal is technically and financially impossible of achievement. Only a finite nüber of radio stations can support themselves financially in any particular radio market. The addition of new stations on a large scale basis would not necessarily result in viable new service to any significant extent, since many of the new stations would simply fail, or by succeeding would drive existing stations out of business.

In fact, the creation of additional AM stations might very well result in a detriment to the public interest. Finere a $\|$ new station is able to stay afloat in a market, the increased level of competition for advertisers will lead to a reduction in revenues, inevitably many will have to reduce costs by cutting back on the expensive staff and resources necessary to produce high quality local news and public affairs progranming. Thus, where programming services are ostensibly increasef, valuable public service will often undergo a net decrease.
4. Further, if the Comission's hope is to increase the availability of broadcast facilities for minority groups, increasing the absolute number of $\lambda M$ facilities available woula be an extremely ill-advised way of doing so. Minority group broadcasters obtaining licenses for such facilities would be handicapped from the start by having to compete for revenues and listeners against existing stations with established audiences and revenue bases. If the Commission chose the alternative of expanding the AM band, these broadcasters would also suffer the disadvantage of operating on frequencies which could not be received on the radios of most potential listeners. As the Commission is aware, it has taken both FM radio and UHF television years to establish themselves, at least in part because the potential audience did not guickly r.place their existing equipment with equinment capable of

receiving such stations. During the years it might take for isteners to buy new radios with an expanded AM band, many stations on the new frequencies would fail. Such operations would have a far greater chance for survivial if they were established by purchase of existing stations rather than creation of new ones.
5. In short, the overall detrimental effect on the public interest of an absolute increase in the number of AM stations in the United States would far outweigh any speculative benefits which might result. Further, as set forth in more detail below, even a marginal increase in benefits to the public interest obtained by increasing the number of $A M$ stations would be offset by the technical and practical difficulties presented by the two proposals.

## 6. Realistically, there is no need for additional AM radio facilities in the United States. Establishment of

 additional stations would lead to destructive competition, the methods proposed for creating new channels would be financially burdensome to listeners and/or stations themselves, and the task of effecting change (at least in the case of the proposal to reduce minimum channel spacing) would be monstrously difficult and time-consuming. The Commission should propose neither the allocation of additional spectrum space to AM broadcast service nor the reduction of minimum channel spacings in Region 2. At least, if additional spectrum space is to be allocated to brcadcast service in the International Table of Frequency Assignments, such an allocation should be made on a shared basis, so that such spectrum space may be used for other purposes in the United states.
