## SPECIAL METHODS THAT CAN INCREASE POSSIBILITY OF <br> LONG DISTANCE DX TEST RECEPTION <br> Frank Dailey

1. IF MUSIC IS PLAYED:

Use distinctive music - marches \& polkas stand out. Few stations play them and there is usually high modulation in them. Over the years DXers have been accustomed to use of them as DX test material.
2. TEST TONES:

Use stepped tones as opposed to sweep tones. Try to stay within a limit of 500 Hz to 3 kHz in audio frequency as many communications receivers are designed to clip the highs and lows. An excellent example could be:

$\frac{15 \text { seconds...................... }}{1 \text { minute }}$ station identification
3. USE OF PHONETICS:

Many calls sound similar especially when the signal is weak or there is another more powerful station on the frequency. "B" "C" "D" "G" and Several phonetic ID's can help. "This is KGBT - King, Golf, Bravo, Tango conducting a test.
4. MORSE CODE ID'S:

While use of pure CW, A-1, Morse code by actually keying the transmitter is not permitted on standard broadcast stations, it is possible to record several Morse Code ID's on a "cart" or cassette and play that over the air. Several stations do just that for their regular frequency checks with monitoring companies. This "Morse Code" enables DXers to drastically reduce receiver bandwidth, cut interference, and possibly hear the DX station in "Code" when voice can't make it.

## RECEI VER COMPARISONS: WHA DO THEY WENC

Certain problems come about when comparing product sumarles, actual moer reviewn ard comparisons, and other information on receivert found in DX News. An article on this sumect by Russ Edmunds appeared in DX News on March 24, 1977 . A condensation of it follows.

Any information we uan provide a proupective recelver purchaner, prearuminc it Is nedther gressily Inaccurats or inlelesdine, we feel, is to his advantage.
A product sumary must depend upon readily vailable infornation such as advertising misterial, technical reviews, and, very frequently, specifications provided by the manufacturer. Such specifications, however, may not prove entlrely aceurste cutside of the test environment. For our purposes, what counts is how the receiver performs for broadcast band Deing. For these pur-
poess, it myy seen that any veteran BCB DXer, who has experlenced a number of
 receive
terms.
 In our cane, whether the recelver be portable, comunications receiver, $A M-F M, B C B$ inly, eto., we are interented in how the recelver compares to some generally-knoven and Eenerally-accepted eriterlon. Portalles are generally compared to the bealistio of that genre. Coowindeati ons recelvers are oumpared to the "state of the art", the farnarlund HQ-1B0. Sometives other standards are used. Sinilarly, nultibsend portables aay be eompared to the frundig line, al thou $h$ this ine is less widely inver.

If a multiband communications receiver is compared to an $\mathrm{HQ}-180$, it is not because it will fall short, but rather because most DXers know something of an HQ-180, even if all they know is that a large number of DXers use them, and hear good DX on them. It is a standard, and thus, comparisons can be made which are meaningful to the Dxer. Such a comparison by a veteran BCB DXer, will be worth more by far to the potential buyer than a product summary, a specification sheet, or an advertisement. Why? Because it suits his an ticipated application.
Along the sane lines, there ars ether sorte of standarde relating to what a rig ill dealgned to do. Sone are denigned to cover nany hands adequately. others are designed for ane band or bas graup unly. Still othern are for Iintening, not for bxine. Nhile it in usefal for un to mow what the recelver is not fisinished by this, because whet the receiver does do in more inportan than what it in deaigned to do. Many bXerm hear aboat a rls, and start wondering sbout it. Hearing what is or ls nat designed to do in usefal, but not ua Ing sbout it. Hearing what ills or is
much mo min tuowine whit it will to.

My old Blaupunkt Eremen automobile radio has good audio response, and it is a treat to hear how much good andio is broadcast in al. ighest fre highest fdelity supposed to be 15 k or so. Most MM stations routinely broadcast mx to at least 7 k . However, there is a reason why MM receivers have such poor audio response - the 10 k whistie from the station on the next channel. During the day my Blaupunkt sounds wonderful, but around one bour before sss I start to hear this shrill whistle, even on strong local stations. There a tone sritch to eliminate it, but I have a loudspeaker with a tweeter cone, so I can still hear that annoying whistie. Easiest way for a radao designer to eliminate this problem is to
 have a 5 k filter, while standard ef IF broadcast RXes for use in Zurope would need a 9 k filter. have a Sk riter, while stanalard have to be aware that high audio frequencies are being broadcast and no amount of filtering will renove this sideband splash when we are trying to hear split channels, or DX right next to local stations.
