Actually only two of three are true. (Just kidding, hi) Please remenber that none of these are the case and that I look forward to receiving reports from everybody. I can't stress that point enough. Invariably a personal visit to a station with report in to a station out of your local area is out of the question in most cases. This is where the OSL Bureau comes in You are not alone in the verie bame, a large number of members who collect OSLs are in exactly the same situation as you If we were all willing to spend a couple of hours each month visiting our local stations with other member reports it is obvious that everyones verie total would be very close to $100 \%$ !
Mechanics of the system - After you have sent a verie request to your prized DX catch, give the station a reasonable amount of time to answer you. I was curious as co just what constitutes a reasonable" length of time, so I took of the stations responding with a OSL took between 0 and 30 days; 13 : 70.3\% 31 to 60 days, and those stations taking biotween 0 and 30 days; $13.3 \%$ took $16.2 \%$ with most answering within 90 days. not an unreasonable length of time to wait hefore taking follow days is follow-up action I am not talking about sending another report Use Bureau. Use the list of station "managers" and find the person who has volunteered to manage stations in the area vour holdout is located. Once you knowwho that is, send fim a copy of your report, S.A.S.E., and a nice little note thanking him for making a super effort to support brotherhood via DXing. This involves some amount of effort on behalf of the volunteer "manager", as it will require a personal visit to the station using some diplomacy.
Volunterr!!! - The only way this thing will work is for all of you to sign up right now. Simply send me a note telling what stations, or what geographic tions, all stations within a somile radius of Macon Gie: All metro L.A. sta''ll make sure that your name appears in print in periodic podaters in the lubs. to IRCA, NRC, and WTVFDA.
