These stations should be coming in earlier and earlier as we get into February, March, & April. By the way, the CHRIS MARTIN Pacific Asian Log is a MUST for serious TP DXers. Try it - you'll like it!

PREFERS THE SM-2 to the PALOMAR LOOP

On 10/15 I got the s/off of KBNO (ex-KFSC)-1220 in Denver @ 8: 15 in both EE & SS. 10/21 brought WONA-1570 Winona, Miss. s/off @7:30. Later KQNK (ex-KNHI)-1530 in Norton, Kan. s/off @ 8. On 10/22 I got KMAR-1570 Winnsboro, La. s/off @ 7:30. 10/28- I finally heard KPWB-1140 Piedmont, Mo. w/rr @ 7:15 up to 7:30 s/off. Thanks to a tip from ROB KEENEY, I finally logged KKAN-1490 Phillipsburg, Kan. @ 6:45pm. This leaves only the 1290 station in Pratt to complete Kansas (Nebraska is my only other 100% logged & verified state). On 1/6 I heard two ETs simultaneously on 900 @ 1:30 - WJTH, Calhoun, Ga. & WATV in Birmingham. On 1/15 both Keeney & I heard someone TTing on 1600 for a couple of hours but no ID. Later, I logged WQBC-1420 in Vicksburg, Miss. w/Miss. State-Ky. BKB @ 10. Total veries are now at 1,979. I agree with most of the people who have complained about the CPC efforts this year. I disagree, however, with a couple of the comments of JOHN KROMKA and his recent Musing. There wasn't a lot of CPC TESTs five years ago - only 24 NRC TESTs were sked (including 'no shows') of which I set up mine. The CPC effort was so poor, that at the Toledo Convention JERRY STARR declined to nominate anyone as CPCer of the year. We actually haven't had a real successful team effort since the 60's. As for another item that may be of interest to some of you, I would NOT recommend the Palomar Loop. I purchased one & was very dissatisfied. Although the nulling was satisfactory, the sensitivity of the antenna was poor. My \$20 homebuilt 2' unamplified loop outperformed the Palomar Loop. The unit I received also had a manufacturing defect. The antenna plugs into the amplifier via a phono-jack. This umit's jack had a short. I returned the unit to Palomar stating that some of the advertising was overstated, the unit had a manufacturing defect, & it was not worth \$115. They only refunded \$98, saying the difference was a restocking charge. For those of you looking for a manufactured loop, don't look past our own JOE WORCESTER's SM-2. Well, 73's for now & good DX.

WKEM in IMMOKALEE - PART I

STEVE KENNEDY - Box 231 - Immokalee, Florida - 33934 Greetings from the Ear of the Everglades. I hope Santa brought all a new RX or other DX goodle. All Santa brought me was another year in NRC! DX has been a bit fat zero for me - seems that it has been that way for quite a while. I have just moved into a trailer camp, and the AC utility wires are alive with noise. I am considering moving into an apartment some time this Spring, and the landlord said "no antennas." Looks like I may be shopping for a loop soon, because the apartment is Heaven if you want to compare it to what I am living in. Since I last sent ERC a Muse, I am now working fulltime a gain at WKEM-1490, and it's like old times. But now I am only a jock, and work 6-10pm Mon.-Fri. & Sat.-Sun., 2-10pm. I don't want any days off - I need the cash. As I did when I was in Avon Park, here is a mini-tour of WKEM_1490. If you hear us write me direct c/o the station, and you will get a speedy reply. Some of the more unusual of these catches: WGTO-540 in well nearly every night at amazing level, I don't see how they possibly could be using 250w of power. This could be possible as they were recently given 1,000w mights (but still s/off & opm). Speaking of s/offs, I may as well add my 2¢ about the various proposals to reduce or eliminate daytimers. The 9 kHz plan won't work, since all domestic frequencies will be 1 kc away from a Geneva plan frequency, & there will be hets galore all along the coasts. Ten kHz separation through 18-whatever kHz won't work either, since few radios are equipped to handle the new frequencies, and very few daytime stations would increase coverage by switching to 1730 kHz fulltime. It won't get the simulcasts that got FM off the ground. either. Lastly, the proposal to place 250-500w stations on 1-A frequencies is possibly the best from the DXers' standpoint (imagine MMs with a couple dozen GYers 750 miles away the only domestics on the air?) Either way, the loss of SSS DX for the most part is tragic, as for those who rise early it is the only way to add new stations. I'm glad I finally got 400 before the switch: Totals now 405/35d/8/21. 73 & good DX (what's left of it).

Noational listed three: NC-190 at \$219.95 & Gonset had their GR-212 at \$99.50. Hallicrafters S-120 was \$69.95. Lafayette HE-30 wired was \$99.95 & semi kit-320 \$79.95. Their HE-10 wired was \$79.95 & kit KT-200 \$64.50. The prices given were all amateurs net. DX wise, 1350 kHz is a good bet out on the WC for getting Hawaii's 5kw KIVM in Linue. It's been in strong following KSRO, Santa Rosa's s/off. Only problem is KIVM s/off G11pm Hawaii time which is 1am PST so you only have an hour after KSRO goes.off. ANOTHER BOOSTER OF THE G.E. TRF

BILL WURTZEL's comments on the new GE TRF were very interesting. I'm the only one in existance I know of who uses this RX, other than a DXer in Virginia (I'm unsure of his/her name). My 17-year-old TRF has served me well to date, easily outdoing a Realistic TRF. In 1962, when I was 2, the GE TRF sold for around \$60, according to my parents. My 1962 TRF has a 9" ferrite loop, and six IF's on AM. But, the speaker is only $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". If I ever decide to sell it (I doubt it), I won't ask less than what it cost back then. All of my 720 catches have been on this TRF, a fantastic portable. My model is known as a "Musaphonic 14 Transistor". Unfortunately, I've never seen a phonic Muse, hi. One new catch this week, HJAR-1000, #8 on 100, Colombia #5. Other new catches: KSRV-1380, KBCH-1380, KGEN-1370, KPCO-1370 (not heard in S.J. in 15 years, first time on RS), KEED-1450, KAHL-1410 f/c, KETY-1450, HJAJ-760 & KOKA-1550-ET. No reply to WCAW-680-TEST yet after a month. Do they verify? W. Va. is a rare state from the WC, so I'd like to get it veried! F/up sent. ERC, when is the new Log coming out?
