Greetings from Snowdenville (population 25), a rural area five miles SSE of Pottstown and 35 miles NW of Philadelphia. I'm 29, married, a dental lab owner/technician and an MW DXer since 1962. RX is the Dymek DA5 tuner & AM5 antenna which is very effective in almost completely nulling the only two semi-locals: WPAZ & WYIS, both five miles. Also, I have a Zenith M660A tube multiband with untuned LW plus several portables & auto radios (JVC 9406, Pioneer KP-4000 & a Blaupunkt) a'l with decent specs. At age 12 my MW DX interest began when I'd hold a pocket radio to the electric meter (inductively coupled) outside the house for hours. At night the ultimate quest was to log KFI and all the other clear channels. Fading nighttime signals added a certain mystique to my favorite personalities of the mid-sixties especially Joey Reynolds (WKBW), Hy Lit (ex-WIBG), Jerry Elavat (WHAT & WCAM), Cousin Brucie (WABC), Murray the "K" and Mad Daddy (WINS), Armie "Woo Woo Ginsberg (WMEX) and countless others. My nostalgia for those days began in 1968 when I started taping anything and everything unusual or exciting in radio. Friends at Penn State & Temple U. campus stations added to my collection of direct dubs of mid-sixties station jingles which everybody seemed to have. Other taping obsessions since then include the Dom Imus years at WNBC and big events like the 9/77 week-long farewell of ex-WIBG (a return of mid-60's jocks & jingles before the station changed to WZZD). A similar event happened last weekend as WAEB celebrated its 30th anniversary and brought back all their moldy oldies I grew up with. I had to drive 30 miles up to Allentown and shiver for hours in my car to tape it after dark because we're excluded from their nightime pattern. After graduating from college in Allentown I got to do some DXing for six weeks in Europe from two locations: London, England, and Cliwice, Poland. What a fantastic RX at the latter location - the MW band was super selective and spread out into two bands (MW-1: 530-1000kHz, MW-2 1000-1620KHz) which was really great for those split frequencies. No luck at TA since the antenna was just a short piece of wire but I logged lots of interes ting stations & the WRTVH came in real handy! Lots of fun listening to "208 Radio Luxembourg" which was an even mix w/Syktyvker USSR until about 10pm (local Gliwice time). Besides MW, I also DX FM & TV especially during prime season, & am a member of WTFDA. Anyone with tapes of mid-sixties jocks (especially Joey Reynolds)? My 30 lines are up. 73s, and catch you on Mothball Memories of WIBG.

MOTHBALL MEMORIES CHAPTER CV - MORE ON THAT MEMORABLE MONDAY MORNING DX SESSION -by GARY SIEGEL Then, he completed that call and said, "We'll take more calls at 923-3055 with Jim in just a moment on 'Contact'. It's 11:43 on a Sunday evening at KORL' KORL' Both of us suddenly had realized a lifetime DX dream! It was Hawaii! Hawaii in the form of KORL-650 Honolulu! The station was taped with an ad for the Penthouse VI a hotel we'd guessed on a street we could neither spell nor adequately figure out. Never mind, it was there and almost immediately after that initial station IDing we both let out a series of yelps and screams that woke Dan's parents and his sister and brought them to Dan's door wondering what on earth happened? We told them but for some reason they didn't think it was worth so much howling and screaming. They said "That's mice" and went back to bed. Meanwhile we kept listering to KORL still not believing that it was coming in. Finally at 3:48am MDRL faded, never to return. It occurred to us that KCRL's TEST was now to be on. Fortunately WBBM was also off that AM and we heard some faint classical music, then at 3:58am an ID. It was almost too much to take. Two new states in one morning and for me 12 new stations but after hearing KORL and even KCRL was anticlimatic! At 4am Dan & I both treated ourselves to a beer and both heartily congratulated ourselves for what we somehow knew would be the chance of a lifetime to have heard Hawaii from Toledo, Ohio! We both remarked to each other that in all likelihood we'd probably never hear Hawaii again here unless we moved there. As it has turned out nearly seven years later this prediction has held true. We heard what we could only have thought to be a pipe dream for a fleeting five minutes, but what a five minutes! If I DX for a hundred years I don't believe a bigger thrill could be had (unless it's Alaska, which we all know is impossible, hi!), which I'm sure Dan would agree with. The KORL tape is still a prize possession. Offhand I couldn't tell you what the other nine new stations heard that day were as they most certainly were overshadowed by the likes of KLUC, KCRL, & KORL with the latter overshadowing both Nevadans. A sense of reality grows out of all this in that now KORL aside from being on tape is now destined to be only a memory now that WSM has seen fit to remain on all the time with their Ralph Emery show. But even before WSM devastated 650 surely the Colombian did! Sadly enough newer DXers won't get the chance to have the thrill of hearing a KORL on 650, but WSM is not to blame entirely because all nighting has become the sign of the times, our affluence has been as much a part of it as anything. Likewise WBEM had ended the hope of hearing KCRL and while WRVA has not eliminated hearing Nevada or Idaho on 1140 that some day soon will pass, sad to say. Many other stations beyond WSM & WBEM are a part of this trend. Also I don't believe overnight conditions are as good in the upper atmosphere these days what with the sunspot cycle hindering the long range reception to some degree. But the 1972 CX will return some day, but many frequencies surely won't be as open as they were then, but still stations do take occasional rests ala the CKLW-800 midnight to 5am EST silent period of recent days while they were converting to AM stereo. So the new DXer has the challenge to find those rare openings when they occur, and yes, some very good DX can still be had, but Hawaii heard in the Midwest, well, likely not. But then, who knows, maybe Dan & I will hear KORL again and then hear still another English station mixing with them with WSM off. Maybe Alaska, just maybe! Some day, maybe! Maybe this time KEN ROM-STADT will be over to hear it. It took us both a while to work up the courage to tell him what we heard, but he does have the consolation of knowing it was heard thanks to his antenna. Some consolation. The other irony in this memorable DX session came in the QSL department. (to be concluded next week)

Continuing to build up the logs here, I'm now up to 177 heard from 30 states and two provinces. Still not much, but that's about 40 stations more than a month ago. Here's a brief rundown of some of recent DX: 1/11- KRMG-740 blasted everything, but not heard before or since. On 1/12 I got home about 7:15pm & for some reason I had the dial on 680, & there was WCHS with the Herbert Hoover - Stonewall Jackson game, first time anything but Cuban Spanish has been heard here between 560 2 600. On 1/13, I heard a mess of Southern stations, starting at SSS with the crowd on 940, WFNC, WMAZ & WCPC, all in orderly procession after the power changes. I quickly added WSPA-950 and WERC-960, WJCW-910, WGOW-1150 & WFBC-1330, and around 9:30pm got a good signal from WRUF-850, first time I've ever heard that one anywhere. On 1/28, another SSS from the South. WIZO-1380. That one used to kill the channel in Charleston. A little bit of GY action that SM, the 28th: WGBB-1240 heard very strong alternating with a weak WWOO, both in around 12:30am. I fell asleep but awoke at 4am with a loud signal, local-like, from WROV Roanoke, easily the highlight of the morning. One other GY catch of note, WHAP-1340, overpowered weak WYCB signal on 2/10 @ 7:15am. 1340 could be a promising channel for SRS & SSS GY DX. Another newie on 2/10, WNJR-1430 way atop semi-local WNAV @ 6:30am. Annapolis is 25 miles E of here, & oddly enough WNAV is rather difficult to hear at night and in critical hours, though its daytime signal seems as loud as WFBR. WFBR, by the way, will be the flagship for the Orioles' games this season, replacing WBAL, which had been the only station to air the team's games since it moved to Baltimore from St. Louis in 1954. One personal note - I'm very displeased to see the FCC action to discontinue the clear channel stations, because I've made it almost a ritual to follow baseball , especially the Mets, by tuning in the likes of WGN, WLW, KMOX, KDKA, KYW, WWWE. By limiting their range teams will lose thousands of fans from outside their immediate metro areas, which probably could mean a cut in radio revenues, and one more squeeze on the hard-pressed owners who have to come up with ridiculous sums like \$800,000 just to sign above-average players. I'm running over - end of editorial, and 73s.

KADE-TEST REACHED BOTH COASTS - 'TWAS INDEED A LEGAL TEST! BOB GREENLEE - 4840 Riverbend Road - Boulder, Colorado - 80301 I'm due for Muse to give you the results of the KADE CPC TEST conducted on I've always felt CX are the most important ingredient to DXing. Great antennas & super-sensitive receivers help, but CX must be right. To date we have received 43 reports for verification of reception and I have been able to verify 42. Reports came in from Califormia & Washington State all the way to Florida and New England. Four of the reports came in from Canada. I want to thank each and every one who attempted to tune us in and thank all of those who took time to write. In turn, I attempted to answer each verification request personally. Our kilowatt seemed to do well even though KLIF, KAYQ, & KEK were all on and operating. (WOWO was also noted on testing by several persons). Along with the CPC TEST, our contract engineer was able to conduct a number of tests in anticipation of conducting a full proof of performance in early February. Under such conditions, our TEST is completaly legal under FCC rules. It may be true that a TEST just to see how far a station can get out doesn't conform to the regulations; however, my reading of the rules indicates a station may test at any time after midnight for cause. In addition, CID's may be transmitted. However, a station must give a standard vocal ID. I hope that clears up what may be a matter of concern to some people. I've been asked if we'll try it again sometime. Sure. We'll give it a go about the same time in 1979 at about the time we do our regular PoP. By that time we may have our application granted for 5,000 watt operation. Again, thanks to all of you who participated in the TEST. 73's. P.S. I noted some FM DK on 1/24. Four stations in San Diego were heard on my tuner from about 7-9pm MST.

BACK DXING AGAIN BUT NOT VERIFYING DAVID GLEASON - Box 101 - Guaynabo, Puerto Rico - 00657

After an absence from these pages of about a year, & a similar period of inactivity. I have a new RX & have spent some time at the dials. In the manner of a re-intro, I have been an NRC member almost continuously since 1959 & am currently the GM of WQII & WZNT(FM) in San Juan. I just received a Dymek DR-33 RX w/an optional 1.2 kHz mechanical filter installed. It has sent the R-390 & the SPR-4 to the closet. As I live within two miles of four 10kw stations, the ability of the DR33 to avoid saturation & images is life-saving. I converted the Sanserino loop to a non-amplified version, & have been routinely separating stations as close as 500 cycles apart, & can get within 5kHz of some locals, & 10 to the others. I do not intend to ask for verifications, as I know first-hand how bothersome reports are to station staff members. I will probably be looking for LA's, TA's, & CA's, due to my location. Most of my loggings will go to IDXD. 73. (Dave, do you know anybody at WOSO-1030 who'll verie?

DX continues to be poor here. Not much was noted over the weekend, only XEAA-1340 new & they've been heard plenty of times before, just my laziness in IDing them. KOWL-1490, rare but unn, on top of frequency all MM. None of the DX TESTs made it - KKIO because of local KBDF-1280, & WILI & WJWL because of, well, poor CX, I guess, hi. The highly touted KNBR SP Feb. 2-3-4 was also a dud. I took my TRF along to work Feb. 2 & 3, & heard lots of action on the vacated 680, but no time or CX to go after any of them. Feb. 4, when I COULD DX, the frequency was dead. Life, I guess. I was surprised to note the highly negative reaction in DX NEWS to the FCC's clear channel proposals. Agreed, the proposals are not the best that could have happened for DX, but neither is the alternative, superpower. The FCC is determined that the status quo won't be preserved; if clear channels hadn't been limited, they probably would have been successful inlobbying for superpower. In my opinion, anyway, superpower is a far greater disservice to the listening public. Few of the 1-A's have dedmonstrated that they are as concerned with serving a large regional audience, as an expanded market for advertising and greater buck. Local stations are far more likely to provide satisfactory service at a local level, even without the money & resourses of larger stations. Besides which, the new regulations are more likely to result in more nighttime & regional stations than an onslaught of tiny stations. Consider that a good half of the AM stations now operating are breaking even or in the red, it's just not likely that there are a lot of profitable markets and openings left. What will probably happen is more of a weeding process; as stations with aggressive, solid management move in or are formed, other stations will be forced out. The ease of forming new stations will make the business even more treacherously competitive than it already is. In any case, it ought to be interesting to watch the developments in the next few years. More thoughts on the upcoming FCC proposals next time. 73's.

Tues. 12/12 @ 8 on 1600, KLAK, Lakewood, Colo. s/on, faded. At 1:32pm on 710, KFIA IDed, testing from Carmichael, Cal. Fri. 12/15 @ 7:29 I heard no XETRA but KKUA was playing music, & @ 7:33 KGGF, Coffeyville, Kan. name the town & gave the news, steadily. There was an unID FF speaker there, CFRG?? Also, Sat. 12/16 7:30 to 7:50. Wed. 12/20 on 1480 @ 8:23 KPHX IDed as "Kah Pay Achay Eckes" from Phoenix, Ariz. Fri. 12/22 @ 8:15 the radio went dead. I found out, after many checks of the receiver, that there was at least one broken wire in the Sanserino Loop Pre-amp box. I brought in the old TV cable, installed a long wire, tried a borrowed SM-2, and bought a Radio Shack TRF 12-655; but none of them worked as well as the SPR-4 & loop had worked. I finally called GRANT MANNING of "Radio West" and he said to bring them all down. I left Monday, Jan. 29th & he put on a new two-FET Preamp box. For a while they fed WABC down the line then the settled on WPLJ. A little better than a test tone. I do have a couple of updates of the NRC Log from my area. Whatever the case with you individual-17, time brings changes with it. The next decade should prove to be an interesting one in radio circles. Since we are near the end of another decade and the beginning of a challenging new one in our century, we should stop and ask ourselves some interesting questions and speculate a bit as to how the broadcasting spectrum changes will affect our hobby and our day to day lives. While a breakdown of the clear channels may mean few, if any, newcomers to the hobby, the proposed expansion to increase the BCB band in North America (particularly, the United States) to 1860 can bring us veteran and new DXers some temporary thrills. However, the thrills will probably be just that, temporary for the most part. The expansion probably won't make up for all of the loss by the clears being split up, just some of it. Since these new frequencies will be operating on more of a regional and local basis than distance the gain isn't complete for some. Disturbing even more to some in this hobby, the proposal to space out our frequencies to 9 kHz in North America will make foreign DX very difficult. However, there is an optimistic view to that. Just count your locals as a new station again, hi. How nigh are your totals going to increase then? Will KCBS be keeping its "Newsradio 74" slogan rounding it off to the nearest 10 kHz frequency or will they be calling themselves "Newsradio 738", 736, or whatever? In conclusion, perhaps even the structure of the hobby and the Clubs will move in another direction than many of us have been taking the past decades. What'll it mean individually to you? Think about it.

Goodnights @ 1:59 but nothing on hour. WNOX=990 Tenn. good w/rr & CBW Winnipeg s/off 2:10 for Province #3. TT u/WHO-1040; SS on 1030, drug talk on 1060. Trying to hear the Seaway on 1230 all I could get was WFAI, Fayetteville, N.C., sorry Gary, 2:32am. One up to 1240, good signal from WKDA Nashville w/c/w, Chevy spot, 2:43. Three on 1260, dreams of KYA danced in my head. WNDE was talking "Contact" show 3:05-3:27, one w/rr I suspect WWDC as they mentioned D.C. "tags" and the third had NBC NX, what sounded like a WBBG jx, & then segued oldies, like six in a row. Recent Muse shows WBBG as mx during off hours so no doubt now that they're not all talk. FAVORS BREAKING DOWN OF CLEAR CHANNELS

PHILIP BOERSMA - 15570 Clevel and - Spring Lake, Michigan - 49456 This Musing is to voice my opinion of the clear channel stations, an opinion which probably is in the minority in a DX club. I think, in the long run, the breakdown of the clear channels is a good thing. While it is true that in the past the clears offered wide variety to listeners who could not receive local mighttime service, I believe this no longer true. The wide-ranging signals of the 50 kilowatters are simply irrelevant to the majority of listeners outside the immediate vicinity of the station. In WX emergencies, for example, here in the West Michigan area, it does no one any good to tune in WBZ or WSM or even WBEM. Those stations simply do not have anything to offer during a blizzard, tornado, etc. for listeners in this area. Fortunately, we do have a number of satisfactory FMs, but anyone with an AM-only radio, who lives in Grand Haven, would be hard pressed during a blizzard to receive vital information. We simply have no local AM service at might. When WCHN -1370 leaves the air, & when Muskegon stations either sign off or go directional, there is no nighttime information source for people in this area, on AM. Thus, I can imagine the plight of a town in Wyoming with no AM service, no FM, who are facing an emergency. What can the clears provide for these persons? Nothing. Also, in the NX category, the clears are useless. If I need to know what is happening in my area, WOHN or WKBZ are about the only sources of information on AM. At night, neither is providing service to this area. And, listening to WBEM or WBZ or WCBS will not tell me what is going on in this part of the state! In short, although the clears offer some extraneous entertainment programming, the vital use of radio - information and news - cannot be serived by long-distance clear channel stations. Better to have a plethora of Class IV's for local purposes, than to have one Class I, which cannot possibly serve the local needs of its coverage area. A final word about DXing itself Let's face it, the hobby, like broadcasting itself, must change. Just as a radio station programmed now the way stations were in the 40's could not survive today, so DXing on the same basis, the same methods, which were used 30 years ago is no longer practical or desirable. New low-powered stations on the clear channels will offer great challenges to DXers who want them. And DXers & the clubs cannot afford to try to beat back an inevitable tide - all the grousing & lobbying in the world will not stop the trend towards more localized broadcasting, more NSP stations, & more stations per channel. Diers must learn to accept changes in the hobb. & in broadcasting, & make do with different - not necessarily worse si tuations. 73.
