For you newcomers, (1) welcome to the NRC and (2) a designation of "1000/500" means the station will operate with 1000 Watts during the daylight hours and will use 500 Watts at night.

THE FCC HAS DISMISSED THE FOLLOWING APPLICATIONS (Just to keep your records straight):

1010 - Palm Springs, CA -- was to have been a new station...but see 1010 below! 1540 - Frederiksted, V.I. -- also was to have been a new station.

The FCC dismisses (or rejects) applications either by the choice of the applicant or because of a faulty ("deficient") application or because the FCC finds that the station, as proposed, will cause interference to an existing station. There is no indication what happened to these two.

FCC staff every week as I do and chat about what's new. Any of you who have kept tabs on the number of new applications they receive, and compare the number of them with the number of granted construction permits can quickly see there's something wrong with the processing procedure at the Commission. I really feel for the present staff since they can't keep up due to (1) their small number and (2) the present review-of-application system which by any standards is archaic. Still, they try. Some of you may have seen recent press clippings about the new push to narrow the am broadcast channels down to 9 kHz -- that subject comes and goes. As I said to Sig Anderssen last week, I really don't see it coming along very soon -- maybe in a decade -- but none of the present broadcasters want it, no other Western Hemisphere country is pushing for it, and at least one (Canada) will fight it tooth and nail due to their complex antenna patterns already in place! As a last note, written way too late at night and without any DX News past copies in hand, I felt very odd last week while working at WHWH-1350 switching over

at 1:30 on a Sunday afternoon to pick up the Phillies baseball game when I had just read in DX News that WHWH doesn't carry the Phillies! There's a frog in the works somewhere! Seriously, WHWH does carry the Phillies and is the most northeasterly station to do so. See you in 30 days or so.

The Commission Announces a New Policy

THE Federal Radio Commission recently announced a long list of allocation changes which have been made with the purpose of improving the channels of a few of the leading stations of the country. The Commission it is ru-mored, will hereafter work on the theory that there are a few leading, national sta-

tions, which are the favorites of listeners all over the country and therefore deserve clear channels, entirely free of interference to the limit of their range. This is the basis upon which several years ago Secretary of Commerce Houver worked out the plan of Class A and Class B broadcasting stations and urged on the commission in these columns for more than a year.

HE'S LOUGHT A NEW HOUSE

MARE CONNELLY - 30 William Road - Billerica, Massachusetts - 01821 WALTON Address above is effective June 1979. The big news here is that Mary Lou & I have bought a new house, the address of which is given above. The new location has enough yard space for a couple of mased 80-metre longwires. Noise levels appear to be low. The house has light dimmers which I shall replace with conventional light switches. I've started a new taping project: a "Parade of ID's" tape w/ID's arranged in ascending order of frequency. Phase-I will be a complete tape of all daytime groundwave signals audible in metro-Boston. More info on this later. BILL WURTZEL's discussion of pirate stations was interesting; I'd like to see more data disseminated about DXing from ships & planes far at sea. I've had good "telephone QSO's" w/ERNIE COOPER, RICHARD ECKMAN, ELICE STRAUS, TOM FARMERIE, NEIL KAZAROSS, MARC DeLORENZO, BOB CURTIS & RAY ARRUDA. A question for Rhode Islanders: Why does WLKW, 50cw, have such a poor signal? WLKW is weaker than 5cw WJAR in all directions; in Boston, most of the 50kw NYC stations (at 200 miles, 322 km) outdo WLKW at 1 the distance; both routes are over land. Eclipse DX: None noted here, also no perceptible change in outdoor light level here. Re the nature of Musings: I mostly use the section for radio-related discussions other than straight loggings; I prefer to forward my loggings to IDED & DDED. Loggings that do fit well into Musings are receptions made while travelling (stations which could be common for a DXer living in the area visited), daytime DX, and charts of "normal dominants" on each channel (times/dates not used). Also valuable are loggings done as part of studies of propagation patterns, antenna design work, & RX comparisems/modifications; details of the work being do ne would be interspersed with the loggings. Casual DXers who log three stations in three months should use Musings as the items may be too old to be useful in DDXD. Ernie, that Irish show on WROL isn't the authentic sound of traditional Irish music, it's just Americanised pop schmaltz. WUNR's Sat, night show is better, but only the college FM stations like WHRB carry the "unaculterated product" as embodied by bands like the Boys of the Lough. WCAS-740 sametimes drops an Irish record in here & there. Medium Wave Circle member Mike McGovern in Dublin has sent me a good supply of traditional fidiling & piping in the form of tapes of RTE & RNG broadcasts. If any of you are interested in these Irish radio tapes, feel free to send me a cassette & I'll run off copies. For now, 73 & good Summer DX. (WUNR-1600's not listenable here nights!-RC)

Through my experiences this decade in ECB chibs, I have noticed many people come and ge, particularly in this town. Some think I've stayed too long. Others feel I haven't been here enough. Anyone who hasn't been verified or masn't written in yet, please let me know. Special toanks to MRCers ROBERT FIEN, HERE CHILDS, EDDIE BYAN, ROLLAND LINDBLADE, & SHELDON REMING-TON who took the time and expense to call me at the station during the TEST. The KEGN-10:0-TEST was similarly successful, judging by the calls received while the TEST ran, 4-7 am. I haven't seen the written results yet, but over the phone the station got as far as Chicago. On the WC, the TEST was benefitted by the SP of KPAY, which losen't happen nearly as often as the NRC Log says it loss. Speaking of which, another kudo to JOHN CALLARIAN for the latest updater. MIKE MAKES HIS HOBBY CRYSTAL CLEAR

MIKE TUGGLE - 909 Moores Mill Road - Bel Air, Waryland - 21014

As this Spring marks my 20th year of crystal set DXing (on & off), perhaps it might be appropriate to recount here how I got started in this fascinating hobby. But first, a bit of pre-history: the very first crystal set I ever tried as a youngster was an Official Cub Scout Set. This had a coil with metal wiper am for tuning, a galena crystal with cat 's whisker, a phone condenser and a single headphone. Metal strips were used for all the electrical commections, and the whole affair was assembled with muts and bolts (no soldering) onto the lid of the cardboard box the kit originally came in. Second inspiration came from a mid-50's Popular Electronics article - a fountain pen crystal radio which I thought would be neat for sneaking into school to listen to the World Series. The set

used a couple of "radically new" developments in electronic components: a 1N34 crystal diode detector and a loopstick antenna coil. I never did manage to fit these inside a fountain pen, but used a small plastic parts box instead. Both sets worked admirably on the local stations (all two of them) but nothing else - after all, crystal sets aren"t supposed to receive more than 25 miles, right? But then, in Spring 1959, this youngster sat at his basement workbench, slightly bored with nothing much to do. In the mess on the bench lay a neat little metal chassis, a tuning capacitor, loopstick and diode... Soon once again yet another crystal set came into being. And once again the locals came in great (six of them at this Boanoks Country, Va. location). I don't know what inspired me to try the little gadget out late in the evening, but I did - and, lo and behold, in came the likes of WOWO, KDEA, WLAC & even WWL! This completely unspected result nearly blew my mind, & a new hoby was born. A total of 28 stations were logged that Spring including WDEJ-960 (now WFIR), KYW-1100 in Cleveland, and WFAA in Dallas, then operating on 820 w/a full 50kw power.

WFIL-560 IS TESTING AM STEREO

Greetings from 'radio-active' Pennsylvania! WFIL is testing its AM stereo until June 12. An announcement every 2½ hours or so gives the average listener instructions on how to tune in upper & lower sidebands of 560 kHz and balance volume. They're also asking for comments on separation, distortion, loudness and any differences in normal mono reception. Here at 20 milesWMV I tuned in the lower sideband on my Dymek DA5 tuner & right sideband with audio outputs from both sets commected to the hi-fi system. It sounded pretty good & I didn't notice any deterioration in signal/noise ratio, signal strength, modulation, distortion, or frequency response. 73's until the next time.

GARY SIEGEL - 2728 106th Street - Toledo, Ohio - 43611 I've also seen the importance of local stations when it comes to unusual WX conditions. In many electrical stoms the QRN can be so bad that only the most local signal can cut through. I know there have been times when I wish that a Napoleon or Wausson, Ohio had stations within ear range to determine the severity of approaching weather be it snow or rain storms. I can only imagine that this problem is compounded ten fold in more wide open and more sparsely populated states than Ohio. What service can a WEZprovide Kansas? How useful is KOA to Toledo? When it comes to wanting the latest in specific information which might effect me I'll turn to a WSPD or a WTOD or any of my other locals. Tell me, fellow DXers, who do you turn to when you need the most vital of information which might effect you? I think you all know the answer. As far as sports coverage is concerned, even the 50kw clears admit in some measure that they cannot cover the total area of their specific 'fandom' and must set up large radio networks to bring the fans the games. Only the "proud" WMAQ & WGN have failed to establish large BB networks. I would also point out that many of the broken down clears still afford their dominant stations more than acceptable coverage. Would anyone deny that KXEL-1540 or WLAC-1510 or "TIC-1080 or KNBR-680 have very fine nighttime coverages? Surely the addition of more nighttime operations has not hampered these stations too seriously. So why all the fuss? What's wrong with allowing Ellsworth, Me. or Fairbanks . Alaska to operate on 820 kHz? Why should a precious few be allowed to continue to have unrestricted dominance on a specific frequency? I would cite & I hope the Louisville folks will not think I'm picking on their position but I believe the pride of having a nationwide clear in WHAS influenced their stand on continued clear channel protection. I know a certain feeling of civic pride surely enters the picture when one can travel to almost any place in the U.S. or Canada and can still hear his home town. I know I always try to dig out WSPD or a similar Toledo station when I visit an out of town location to check on local developments & also the desire to know my home town can make it to a "foreign" location. Don't we all do this at times? Such is my stand. I'll try to answer any bouquets or brickbats. 73s.

KEEP THE CLEARS CLEAR!

I haven't Mused for some time so I thought I would on the FCC's clear channel proposals. I, for one, am against reducing the protection given the clear channels. It is probably true in the larger cities a listener can get a variety of programming from several local stations without tuning in the clear channels. Here in Buffalo, the nearest station is KSIW-1450 in Woodward, Okla., 30 miles SW of here. Although they are strong in the daytime, at night they are completely unreadable. Their FM signal is steady day and night but it doesn't offer much variety (Beautiful Music) and they sign off rather early (10:15pm CLT). The 50kw Oklahoma stations can be received with varying degrees of signal strength but all three (KOMA, KRMG, KVOO) are subject to heavy interference around LSS & LSE from skip (I've heard little KSIB-1520 overriding mighty KOMA around LSS). So, if it weren't for the clear channels out here at night the AM dial would not offer any dependable reception plus there would be no variety of programming. Only one new verie: KQNK-1530 for DX TEST of several months ago. Verie to tale now stand at 576 verified on BCB from 43 states and 23 countries. 73 & good DX.

Originally from Adelaide, South Australia I moved to Auckland in 1970 and have kept in touch with home through DXing since 1974, & I will probably be back in australia permanently by the end of 1980. I have really been taking BGB DKing seriously in the last three years and check the band almost every night at some stage. My real interest has turned to DKing U.S. domestics and my first catch was KFBK-1530, and later KNX-1070. They waid they will go 24 hours if the FCC approves the non-protection of clear channels. They will TEST for us in the Fall w/sweep second tones. They have a permit for a new station at Pittsburgh, Ky. on 1600 w/signal due West, to be on air in October '79. They must protect a station in Hyden, Ky., also not on the air as yet. 73's to all.
