My son who works in Frankfurt and gets along well in German listened to the voices on that tape during his summer visit here and could not confirm the language as German. My daughter-in-law Ellen who knows German and Russian also doubted the language was German. Re-checking that tape, I think a second station may have faded in in the final minutes. Could it have been the German recovering the frequency as the clock was about 7:15 AM in Romania? My notations on reception that morning called it a northern European opening. Postugal was missing, along with Dakar, after 0600. Some of the voices are buried in noise, but a slight amount of filtering on this tape might clear them up. Will send a copy of the tape to anybody who would like to hear it. I did have Germany there with no question about it on 10/20/79. Finally, I find it not implausible that a megawatt Romanian might override the Germans at the distance to western US. (Martin) Send me a copy of the tape if you wish. I will run it through a continuously variable high-low-band pass filter and have native German and active SW DX'er Ralf Munster take a close liaten-CH)(By the way Romania is not exactly rare to the average east coast TA DX er but certainly not an easy or common catch-CH)

Here is what I've heard on a regular basis using a Hammarlund HQ-150 W/SM-2 or 25' wire and a TRF w/no external antenna; 550- CHNO, Sudbury, barely audible u/CJKL splatter. 560- WJVL Kirkland Lake. 580- CKAP Kapuskasing, poor to fair w/some CJEL splatter. 600_ CFCH North Bay, fair. 620_CFCL Timmins, good. 680_ CKGB Timmins, good. 710- CKVM Ville Marie, P.Q. good. 730- CJNR Blind River, barely audible. 790- CKSC Sudbury, good. 900- CFBR Sudbury, fair, & CHVO Val d'Or, P.Q. Pair w CFBR mulled. 930- CKNS Espanola, weak. 1090- CBON-1 Kirkland Lake, excellent (40 watts). 1110- CBON-10 Matachewan, weak with some CBON-1 splatter. 1230- CJTT New Liskeard, good. 1240- CKIS La Sarre, P.Q. good. 1340-CHAD Amos, P.Q. fair. 1400- CKRN Rouyn, P.Q. good. 1450- CBMA Noranda, P.Q. weak (40w). Using the SML2 another CBC outlet is barely detectable u/CBMA - probably CBIQ Latchford, Ont. (also 40w). Nothing is audible above 1450 kHz! I might add that this list reflects Summer CX, While wisiting here last Christmas many Toronto and other Southern Ontario stations were audible on the TEF even at noon but this was probably residual skywave. CHAPTER CXLVIII - STATION PROFILE - K N B R It was in 1921 that an ex-Navy man, Joe Martineau, talked the Hale Brothers into letting him put an experimental 50 watt radio station atop their dry goods store at Fifth and Market in San Francisco. The cost was \$2,400 and KPO took to the air, April 17, 1922, as one of the first 15 stations in the United States. In the beginning KPO was on the air for one hour a day programming local singers and planists. Programs were subject to their own program practices "it would not offend the sensibilities of a mother with children in the home". Broadcasting progressed quickly. KNB had many firsts. In 1925 it aired a football game directly from the field (California vs. Stamford), and an opera from the Civic Auditorium, and even a program from a ship at sea (The Shell Ship of Joy, en route to Hawaii). In 1932 the San Francisco Chronicle went into partnership with the Hale Brothers and NBC purchased the station in 1935. In 1947 the call letters were changed to KNBC and in 1962 the present call letters KNBR were adopted. From its Radio City building at 420 Taylor Street, KNBR moved to new facilities on the seventh floor of the Fox Plaza, where they presently reside. Many famous personalities found fame via this pioneer station, amoung these; Art Linkletter, Harold Peary (The Great Gildersleeve), Kay Kyser and Kavier Cugat to name but a few.
