# If you don't like this station's music, wait till tomorrow

FRESNO, Calif. - It used to be that AM radio listeners here could flip on

AM radio listeners here could flip on KARM and bear just what they ex-pected: old-fashioned, foot-stemping couldry music. Now listeners don't know what they're going to hear. One day the sta-tionaplays rock 'n' roll oldies. The next day'it switches to big band music. And

then there are days the station reverts to country music.
From day to day, KARM jumps

from one sound to another without warning.
The man pulling the switches is Bill

Weaver, program director at KARM and general manager for Davis-Fowl-er Broadcasting, which bought the station July 16.

Weaver doesn't have a name for his new varied programming, but he does have high hopes for it. And a lot has been wagered on his experiment.

"If we're wrong, it's going to cost us a bundle. . . . I'd guess a half a million or more," be said.

The idea was hatched shortly after the new management came in and started playing different styles of mu-sic in hopes of finding what would go over best with the public and potential

advertisers.
"We started doing this to find out what kind of reaction we'd get, and people started saying. 'Hey, that's nice. You play different music every day," " recalled Sean O'Callaghan the station manager.

Now the station picks one style of music at random and plays it for an entire day. Listeners don't know what they'll hear until they turn on their radios.

The decisions are made about two The decisions are made anout two weeks in advance so advertising can be sold for each format. But the choice of what will be played each day is kept from the public. The only fitting that listeners can bank on is that the station won't use the same format two

days in a row. To confuse things further, the station advertises seven formats. It actunon advertises seven turnats. It actu-ally has nine: Big Bands, Fabulous '50s (1949-64), Golden Oldies (1985-64), Solid Gold (1965-70), Superstars of the '70s (1970-77), Current Hits (1978-80), Country, Million Sellers and the Best

of Requests.
While the changes may turn some listeners off, Weaver said be thinks it will broaden the station's audience for

two reasons.

People are bored, be said, and they are looking for something different. With the varied format, the sudlence gets something different every day.

Weaver said he also believes the

contrasting styles will bring in differ-ent age groups that are willing to sit through what they don't like to hear what they do like.

Most radio stations aim formats at

narrow age groups, but Weaver is doing the reverse. He said he wants to attract all listeners over the age of 24.

Whether he'll succeed is a question that will be answered this month when the new radio ratings for the Fresno area come out.

Stations all over the country soon may be switching to Weaver's format. Or, the program director conceded, a lot of Fresno residents may be back to stomping their feet to the country bal-lads of Waylon Jennings.

CHAPTER CLIX - PROFILE OF WNLC (Part II) In an effort to increase WNLC's power, Mr. Morey filed for, and was granted, a CP to go from 250 watts at 1490 kHz to 5,000 watts (DA-2, eight tower array) on 1510 kHz, around 1961. A few years later, WNLC went to 10,000 watts as Connecticut's second largest AM station.

FM began to increase in popularity by the late 1960's. However, the spectrum space for a nice Class "B" facility like the former WNLC-FM was no longer available. Both WNLC and WSUB (Groton, CT) wanted FM outlets at this time. WNLC desired 105.5 mHz, as it was sort of under 1510 kHz on a slide rule dial. WSUB wanted 100.9 mHz for the same reason with their 980 kHz spot. The mileage separations required a "flip-flop" of these frequencies, and WNLC got 100.9 mHz, while WSUB received 105.5. The new Thames Broadcasting Corp. FM station signed on around 1970 as WTYD and is known as "TIDE", corresponding with its proximity to the ocean.

WNLC/WTYD were sold in 1976, and are now owned by Mercury Broadcazting Corp. (licensee of WWCO, Waterbury, CT). Mr. Randy Barrett, a fine electrical engineer, is Chief Engineer of the stations. Er. Barrett is a pioneer in the experimentation of continuous tape units for broadcast application (commonly known today as "cart machines".

During 1975-1977, I did morning and mid-day shows at WNLC, and served as announcer for WTYD. While at the New London stations, I received the opportunity to do everything from copy writing, to talk show hosting, to shoveling the snow-covered front steps while a long record was spinning, etc. All in all, WNLC provided me with a great learning experience, and continues to provide local listeners with contemporary music and local (as well as CBS) news. Note: WMLC has also served as an outlet for the Yankee. Mutual. and ABC networks. (Who's the v/s for WTYD, Peter? -ERC)

ON PRESERVING VERIES & DX MEMORABILIA MARK CONNELLY - 30 William Road - Billerica, MA - 01821 Dec. 19, 1980 With the recent deaths of MORT MEEHAN, JOE BRAUNER, & NORM MAGUIRE, all highly respected DXers, it may again be time to discuss the disposition of DX-related material left behind. Such material includes logbooks, tapes, verifications, photographs of DX meetings, loops, receivers, & radio station promotional material. For someone 75 years old who has DXed since radio began in his teenage years, the amount of material could be staggering. DXers should make arrangements to donate certain items to their radio clubs - especinlly those items which have little monetary value but are priceless as DX memorabilia. Equipment, of course, should be sold, preferably through Club bulletins, with the money going to the legal heirs. A related issue is the preservation of veries & tapes from fire, flood, criminal action, or other disasters. Duplicate tapes & veries may be stored in a safe deposit box or at another's home (relative, friend, etc.) My approach is one of reporting all loggings to the two major clubs bulletins & of dispersing narrated tapes of some of my better catches to DXers around the world. I also have Xerox copies of the foreign MW DX veries I got during my verie-chasing period in 1966-67; these are stored at my parents' house on Cape Cod. If tragedy struck, I could rapidly re-establish a record of my loggings by purchasing copies of the last few IRCA Foreign Logs & by Xeroxing domestic columns, Musings, Forums, & feature articles from the magazine collections of friends. Also, I could get duplicates of my old tapes by borrowing the DX cassettes I have sent toothers. Insurance, of course. would cover equipment losses. On other matters, I feel a major focus of technical articles in 1981 should be Superadio modifications of the same nature as those done with the Realistic TRF: tighter selectivity, digital readout, S-meter etc. I am on the look-out for a digital readout portable RX w/20db more gain than a TRF, switchable 2/4/10 kHz selectivity positions, & excellent strongsignal handling capability; physical size/weight no greater than the Superadio. If you know of such a unit, please write to me. If there's no such animal, maybe a Superadio or one of the Panasonic RF-series could be doctored to meet these specifications. A tight-selectivity position is essential to me for foreign splits. Also, a digital car RX, of comparable capability is desired. These receivers must tune continuously, not in 10 kHz. steps.

I hope some of the active DXers in the Pacific NW will try to exploit this potential before the end of Jan. when the Northerly moving sun will break the path. This path seems far enough away, relatively speaking, from the Au oval to have a reasonable chance of working. GEORGE SHERMAN's Musing about DX in the 60's brings back memories for me too, especially the MMs when it was possible to log ten or 12 Cal. on regional channels with little difficulty. I recall taping a clear jingle from KPOI-1380 on my halftrack monaural Webcor & clumsily getting a s/on from never-before-heard WKKS-1570 on the other track. Figuring the Hawaiian would make it in on other occasions, I erased that tape & sent was was left to WKKS, who unexpectedly (you're expecting Murphy's Law, eh?) did verify my report. However, KPOI disappeared forever at my shack. Now I dream of the several reels of tape with those early IDs I had from my 1957-61 High School years that, save one reel, have disappeared years ago. Many DXers put down the dullness of "looking at boxes of tape" but I would give my eye teeth to be able to hear, just once again, my tapes of KGMS, KWIZ, KERN & such staples as old favorite KTOP in Topeka who used to dominate 1590 MMs. How many remember good old Henry Guck, the beleagured CE of KTOP who signed a millennia of veries for Eastern DXers 20 years ago? I sure wish I had kept my tape of their signal, & other old friends as WJXN-1450. MS. the KFJB-1230. KXEO-1340 f/c. etc. I could go on & on. Remember the VOUS-1480 s/on @ 4:30am w/50 watts from Argentia, NF? Or the old standby at 5am, WIVV-1370 Vieques, PR. Perhaps subconsciously now, I am compelled to tape & save all interesting DX as I never tire of hearing yearsold stations again, not to mention marveling at the low noise levels I had then. GENE MARTIN. I agree with you about the FCC & their decisions. It is a long & sorry record. There are only three commissioners at present I think have any kind of knowledge of the industry they are charged with regulating. One is Lee. I think he is a good man but Ferris has really twisted his arm on this 9 kHz business. It's interesting to look at Lee's former healthy skepticism on 9 kHz then one day, bingo! He can't speak highly enough of it. I'll bet there is a real story there. Just like the case where the NTIA took a copy of GLENN HAUSER 's "Short Waves" column (P. 51 of the Sunday Denver Post for Dec. 10, 1978) in which appeared an account of GENE MARTIN's logging New Zealand on 756 after the allocations switch, & used this in their pleading before the FCC to claim N.Z. was "causing interference" in Denver! This to help justify their claim the U.S. should adopt 9 kilz. They also used Conakry-1403 (then) as a "representative sample" of the interference we could expect from Europe. I'm sure GENE will be chagrined to learn he is indirectly responsible, in part, for the success so far of the 9 khz proposal! I learned this with help from a Washington attorney working with the Freedom of Information Act - the scientists at ITS in Boulder saw the clipping, sent it to Washington, and the rest is history. See, I told you there is a lot to this. 73.

REED III - 544 Milton Avenue - Amsterdam, NY - 12010 scan for you all but gave up for the season, what with WLW, KMOX, WSAI, CHGB, WABK, CIHI & such all bombing in here like locals at noontime. I see this is not the season for a groundwave bandscan, hi. I'm not complaining though; many daytime DX hours have proved interesting, if not earthshaking. For some reason WCCC has been all over WNBF on 1290 lately. Are they still 500w? And WABK is in all day, every day, & nearly alone, on 1280. The CE up there tells me that the prevailing winds, along with the snow, are reasons why. And CHVD is an utter pest on 1230! They are at least as wideband as WKMC, & they block the channel here, even intruding at times during the day! WTLB is playing it cool with the cleanest signal on the dial: they're after 5,000w on their regular 1310, & want to be certain the FCC finds all in order at visiting time. The Commission might just bust WCSS, however, for distorted audio, & splatter that at times covers from 1200 to beyound the high end of the band! During the day this area is served by several MYL outlets of packaged & automated nostalgia: WFAL, WRMV, WMYL (ex-WIZR), WUHN, WQCW & at times WXKS & WHLI. (Have I left anyone out? Hi).
