From Mark Stutterheim, new Daytime AM Station applications are on hold at FCC. More on this next issue.

From Ed Schober, in a letter, look for a new station testing on 1160, 150 watts, with up to 40Hz frequency offset, into one tower of the WNSG, Cornwall, NY antenna system. The transmitter will be unmodulated except for station identification. Hours of operation will be daytime until March 1, 1987. Other news from him, a new station, WZZD is now on with New DA pattern - much more day signal to West and more signal North & South at night. WMMX is getting ready for power increase within 60-120 days. WBSO & WMJZ will be on in spring.

Music from Cuba startles listeners in Iowa cooperate with a Federal Commu-WHO, sportscar erate.

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) -WHO-AM radio listeners suddenly found themselves hearing Spanish music, courtesy of the Cuban government and much to the chagrin of station officials and federal authorities.

"I've received about 18 to 20 calls from listeners in Oskaloosa, Omaha [Neb.], and a couple other towns," said Dan Reed, WHO's technical director. "They said they could hear bing-bang, Spanish-type music loud and clear."

The source eventually was traced to a Cuban government station that boosted its power to cover North America to honor the 30th anniversary of the start of Fidel Castro's revolution, WHO General Manager Steve Shannon said.

Shannon said the interference led WHO, located at 1040 kilohertz, to



WBBM's tower is located on 56 acres north of Thorndale Avenue and west of Int. Hwy, 290. CBS has put a \$12 million price tag on the land and has had the property on the market for the last year, sources said.

A spokesman for Trammell Crow declined to comment. Ef-forts to contact a CBS spokesman in New York were unsuccessful.

Roselle officials, however, con-firmed that representatives of CBS and WBBM have applied for special-use permits to allow a 680-foot radio tower on 24 acres of marshand northwest of Crest and Medinah Roads.

The new antenna, about 1% miles west of the present one, would be built on land owned by Vantage Co., an Arlington Heights-based developer, according

to Steven Jones, assistant village administrator of Reselle. Jones estimated that the tower would be about 1,100 feet from the nearest residential areas of Reselle and the adjoining commu-nities of Elk Grove Village and Medinah.

A real estate broker who asked not to be identified said CBS de-cided to sell the Itasca site "be-cause it's a valuable property with

expressway frontage in a very de-velopable area ... land that could become a business park with of-fice, research and distribution buildings."

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Jones said the broadcaster also has indicated that the 30-year-old WBBM transmission facility "is antiquated ... and since they can't just plop down a new anten-na next to it, they have to go to

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another site and get a new anten-na built and operating before switching over power."

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Wantage, acting on behalf of CBS, is seeking permission for the antenna's height, the equivalent of a 60-story building; flood-plain construction; satellite dishes greater than 10 feet in diameter; and barbed-wire security fences that would surround the base of


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the mast, guy wire anchors and a small transmission building. The Roselle plan commission approved the CBS proposal on Dec. 4, and the zoning board of appeals is scheduled to consider the project on Dec. 17 before making a recommendation to the village board, which woold have the final say, Jones said.

Radio Moscow on your AM dial? Stay tuned

To President Reagan, it sounded like Wick and Yakovlev discussed such posan intriguing offer, put on the table almost casually by Mikhail Gorbachev in the first hours of the Reykjavik summit. The Soviets, said the Kremlin boss, would stop jamming Voice of America hroadcasts to the U.S.S.R. if the White House would help Moscow gain regular access to American airwaves. Former radio announcer Reagan was noncommittal, but less than 10 hours later, he dispatched his longtime friend, U.S. Information Agency Director Charles Wick, to Soviet headquarters at the Saga Hotel to see his counterpart, Aleksandr Yakovlev, a rising star of Gorbachev's team. The result was a series of proposals that, though still in the talking stage, would add up to one of the most curious deals in the annals of U.S.-Soviet relations. The possible terms, U.S. News learned last week, have set off an acrimonious behind-the-scenes debate in Washington.

In return for an end to the jamming of VOA, what Wick offered the Soviets was an arrangement that would put Radio Moscow on the AM dial in the U.S. so that whenever American listeners became bored by disc-jockey nattering they could tune in to a Gorbachev speech-translated into English-on collective farms. The problem for the Soviets is that while Radio Moscow beams 224 hours of programs a week to North America in English, few Americans listen. The transmissions are now carried on shortwave bands, which are about as popular in the U.S. as stockmarket reports might be in the U.S.S.R.

To boost Radio Moscow's ratings,

sibilities as allowing the Soviets to lease time from an American network (by law foreigners can't own U.S. broadcast media), assigning an AM frequency to a Soviet station that might he established in Cuba, or permitting the Kremlin to rent time on a U.S. domestic satellite from which programs could be picked up by interested American stations. High-level people in the State Depart-

ment are boiling. They view Wick as a political unsophisticate whose diplomatic role should stop at the water's cdge. One official says he fears the U.S. might be "suckered into" arrangements that could lead to Russian cheating. He warns that if the Soviets are given an AM frequency in the U.S., they may later strained. One top Radio Free Europe resume VOA jamming-perhaps in a crisis such as Solidarity's rise in Poland, as they did in 1980-while counting on American traditions of free speech to protect their AM frequency from reprisals. Another State Department official,

(CLI) Monday, Sept. 1, 12:30 pm; clouds move in as I've left New Castle to Phoemixville, home of Spanish Radio WYIS-690. A white and green fluorescent "WYIS 7" sign hands over the entrance to an older storefront building. The door is locked, it being Labor Day, but soon 1 in greeted by my tour guide Brent, a part-time announcer who was tending to clerical duties and who once taught at a religious school near home. The current sked lists SS mx/programs 10-2 pm, so although I'm not sure, I assume WYIS is all Spanish. Offices are on the first floor with studios on the second along with my v/signer's office whom I meet, (N) José Rivera. With a bit of difficulty, I find my next stop, MYL er WPAZ-1370, located about 3 miles north of Pottstown. The setting is smallar to a mountain resort as the station is in a very well-designed 2-story lodge-type building surrounded by trees and a large stone, though on a small piece of land as the tower is in the back. Again the door is locked, but soon I meet 2 DJ's as the second, Jay Warren, shows me around. The facilities inside are also very nice as offices are on the first and studios on the ground floor. I can understand about the call as I based my logging on the slogan "Charlotte Christian Radio" but I don't know how I got the wrong frequency. In my own logbook I listed it correctly as 1390, so I guess I miscopied my notes when sending in my report. Sorry about that! (Oh, well, when you're gonna make 'em, make real blunders, not just piddly ones, hi! -pls)

Recently I participated in an Ontario DX Association DXpedition to Gravenhurst, ONT, about 100 mi. N. of Toronto. Mediumwave conditions were not outstanding, but it was nice not to have to contend with piles of locals. My DX-302 which overloads badly here, particularly on a longwire, did quite well up there.

Speaking of longwires, a couple of ODXA ers from Oakville, ONT, helped me put up a new 150-ft. longwire here in Milton. The DX-302 is unusable with the lw on mediumwave because of overloading, but my Hammarlund HQ-150 with its superior strong signal handling capabilities does quite nicely. The longwire has give me good reception from MI, WI, and MN with new catches like WSDS-1480, WIDY-1480, WWIC-850, WISO-1070, WIDG-940, and WXGY-1130.

I've been DX'ing mainly 0100-0630 and 1700-2000 CST. The period of 0100-0630 has given me the most pleasure of all, what with Mexican agreements and the GY's all (or most) at 1000 watts at night. Also, it makes for more DX possibilities.

730 seems to be the most active of the Mexican (former) clears in the U.S. But it seems like 900 has been kicking its heels up a bit.

It's nice to see the DX tests making a comeback in the club. We were stagnant for awhile there. Of the 8 that were scheduled between 10-27 and 11-24, I received 2 of them, not many, but it's 2 stations I didn't have before. It would be nice to see DX tests performed during a station's known silent period. For instance on Tuesday mornings when WCFL-1000 is off, KOMO could test.

Speaking of off, WIND-560 was off Monday morning ll-24 as they have been doing since they went Spanish, and I've been trying every Monday to get tother stations on this frequency. (Reminds me of the SSS frenzy when they were off a week or so when they changed ownership.) And it finally paid off ll-24 3:30-3:34 am CST, KLZ Denver with ckw mx coming through. I went to 850 to see if KOA was there like it usually is and it was but not nearly as strong as KLZ, so you can't always look to the 50,000-watt station to be your guide as to what else comes out of the area. (So right ... and if we can use the frequency/power relationship chart in the "Night Pattern Book" as a guide, KLZ and KOA have approximately the same range, assuming ND patterns -pls)

All my DX is done on a Sony ICF-2010 with no external antenna. I used to listen on car radios and my boom box, anything I could get my hands on: clock radios, Sony Walkman, you name it. But now I can DX on professional equipment at an amateur's price, hi.

Totals: As of 11-24-86 now at 576 received with 63 of these Canadian, 3 from the Caribbean, and 2 from Mexico. Of those 576, 12 were on DX tests. Counting my vacation spots in SE portions of the country, the total is up to 723 stations. Mediocre, but not minor - right? (Right! We'd all be into the thousands if we had time! -pls)

In the ll-24 issue of DXN, DDXD-E, I listed a reception of WYAT-990 New Orleans. Bill put in day power as listed in '84 Log, but this was a night reception, so I wonder what the Mexican agreement power is? That will be a subject of interest in the '88 Log.
