Carroll Seth, Erie, PA mentioned the time he mistook 2NR for WLW. He also mentioned that CR9A6 in Macao was country #100 verified. Club officials were Joseph Becker, Sr., pres.; Harold Wagner, Secy-Treas; and Board members Thomas Carberry, Jr. (also VP), Ray Edge (Board Chairman), Eldon Addy, Pat Reilly, Len Kruse, and Ralph Johanns.



NRC Member Makes Contact with Soviet MIR

NRC member Pete Kemp, amateur radio operator KZ1Z, helped forge a bit of radio history November 20th, when at 0803 UTC, he made conact with the orbiting Soviet Space Station MIR, on 145.525 Mhz. The exchange with cosmonaut Musa Manarov, U2MIR, was brief, but the affect of this contact will be longlasting. Pete notes that the following frequencies have been active during this operation: 145.55, 145.525 and 145.575 for amateur radio contacts in English, 143.625 yielding cabin conversations in Russian. Amateur radio contacts have been primarily on weekends, with weekday operations a possibility in the future. The MIR's signals have been heard on programmable scanners, with external as well as the standard telescoping whips. Should you have a computer, a number of tracking programs for Apple, IBM and Commodore are available from AMSAT (AMSAT-NA, P.O. Box 27, Washington, DC 20044) and other sources. Up to date Keplerian data for use with these computer programs is available from: AMSAT Bulletins, ARRL Bulletins, and a number of computer BBSs, both commercially, e.g. Compuserve and locally, e.g. Fido.

"Call changes" $\underline{\mathtt{don't}}$ count; what I meant by frequency changes counting was for a station that moved to a frequency not previously in use in that area, a change that didn't involve a 2nd station for frequency swap, or selling of a frequency & equipment. So if you heard, for example, WFAN &/or WHN on 1050, & WFAN &/or WNBC on 660, it counts as 2 stations; if you heard WHN & WUKQ on 1050, it counts as 1 station; if you heard WNBC & WFAN on 660, it counts as one station.

QUESTIONS? Need copy of rules? Write, or phone 10AM-10PM, NO collect calls (CLT) If it seems too complicated I will add up your score for you.

The Computer-Assisted DX'er ... by Wayne Heinen

A computer assisted DX'er? You may ask yourself, "What does he have that I don't have?" The answer is more TIME!

The computer assisted DX'er has the speed of the computer. As the editor of Veri Signers, my time involved in producing my column went from approximately 6 to 7 hours per column down to roughly 2 hours per column. My time to write a reception report went from approximately 20 minutes each down to roughly 5 minutes each. Follow up reports take about 3 minutes each.

Since every one is not an editor, I'll start with some of the basic functions of DX and the way my Apple][e has changed my time allotment to DX'ing. The use of a data base record was my first endeavor. Since I am basically a Veri collector, I don't keep a "heard" log. So the things I've done will be different than what you might do, but the principles are the same.

To start, I designed a data base of verifications that dealt with the things that "I" felt were important to know about my Veri collection. The easy ones are the logbook entries, Call, Freq, Location. then I stopped here. I like to know how many stations I've heard from a particular state, to do this I had to break the location into the catagories of: City and State, and since I also have foriegn Veris, I added a "Country" entry. Appleworks allows a single record layout with almost unlimited possiblities. Below is my final record with an annotation of each column type.

CALL: KRDO

FREQ: 1240

CITY: Colorado Springs

STATE: CO

Country-: USA

QTH: CS (I lived in Colorado Springs when the Station was heard)

YR: 1983 (Year Verified)

COUNT: 1 (Counter for Verie Count enter "1") Status: (D for Deleted Station or F for Foriegn)

Miles: 3 (tracks Graveyard Miles)

C. Country: (enter "1" for the first station from each Country)

FVC: (= "1" if not a Domestic Verie)

State Count: (enter "1" for the first entry from each State)

Prov Count: (enter "1" for the first entry from each Province)

Logged/CO: (If veried in NY enter "1" if heard in CO)

Allocation: 1 (As a courtesy to my friends, I can tell you the number of veries I have without including call changes)

Depending on who you are and what you want to know about your veries or loggings, you may use a few more or a few less catagories

than I did. As most of us in the hobby seem to be sticklers for both detail and statistics, the computer allows almost instantaneous updates to the totals that a DX'er might be interested in.

After I do an update to my Verification data base I pull up my "Total Veries" spreadsheet that does my calculating and keeps track of my percentage return rates and totals. By using a variety of calculating formula, the sheet automatically calculates changes in the statistics that I wish to track. This includes the count of the number of Veries from each DX location that I have collected from and a track of my countries both MW and SW. Plus breakdowns for reporting to Domestic DX Achievments. Some entries must be manually made, like the breakdown by continent catagory, but this just means a few key strokes and my totals are up to date. The above includes the latest verie, KCCR-1240, complete with an update for my Graveyard total of 122 veries.

Speaking of Graveyards I've got a sheet shown below that helps me track what I've Veried and compare it to the all time records from Bill Hales column. The one with the asterisk is a record I hold. Sterling is one that hasn't yet been tracked.

The above shows my new stations and my "Target List" stations from the begining of the contest thru the reporting date shown on the

report heading. November 25, 1988 is the date that I'm writing this, which shows the current date of this print out. Below is the calculator that I use. There is much more to this than I can print. A large lookup table is out of sight. This table coupled with the use of a few formula can check the frequency and add the proper amount of points for regionals and graveyards then, in a separate section, calculate the level points and the handicap points. Other columns further over on the sheet allow me to score my new loggings (That's the column furthest on the right), s/on's, s/off's, Most Wanted etc. I usually run a new sheet off for myself after every score change. That way I can keep track of which states I need to find suitable substitutes in, in order in increase my score.

Most of us type individual reports, but there are certain things that almost always stay the same. Here's a sample of what can be done with a "boilerplate" or "templated" letter.

If my report is found correct I'd appreciate a verification from Call to add to my collection from over 1200 BCB stations. Also, if available any bumper stickers or station promo items to help decorate my "DX Den". Thank You in advance for your time and consideration in anwsering this report and helping me with my hobby.

Let's dissect one of my reception reports. By using Key words, and a simple replacement command (Mine is a key called the "Open Apple" key and the letter "R" pressed simultaneously) you simply type the new data and the letter is adjusted. #1 is "Date" you'll find two of these, I can simply replace one at a time if the report and the reception date aren't the same or if they are 1 can have the program replace "All". #2 is the inside address, please note also that #8 is the same. Since I use my own letterhead for my reports, I use a single sheet printer. This also allows me to use #8 to print the address on the envelope at the same time. #7 is the new page command that stops the printer and feeds through my letter then, the program waits for me to insert my envelope and tell it to print the address.

#3 is a standard paragraph with the pertinent info for the report. Using the replacement command, Freq & Call are replaced. By replacing all the Call's the two "standard" paragraphs under #6 are completed. Then replace TIME1, TIME2 and Zone. Under # 4 I replace "Case Sensitive Text" (all Caps), So all the AM's can be made PM's or vise versa. TIME1 and TIME2 are already replaced. So I use the overstrike cursor to complete the remainder of my program data. My program has two cursor selections. One simply inserts text and moves the existing text to the right. This is the "Insert" cursor. The other is the "Overstrike" cursor. This erases the text in front of it as you type in new text. When done, I delete the unused entries. If needed I can add more entries in the middle. The TIME2 area just keeps sliding down the page intact. The format of #4 is set up to properly indent all the times and program data. The area at #6 is also available to add any other comments concerning the reception. As I type my new paragraph the other paragraphs just slide down the page. By proofing the letter carefully, the Key words will make sure you remember to send all the needed data. Have you had a negative reply from a station because you left out the Date or Frequency? I have and have found it rather embarrassing to type a new letter and include the proper data. In a related use, the same "templated" letter method is what Jeff Tynan and I use in our current CPC effort. Since the data is mostly just date, time frequency and station address, the speed that they can be produced at is limited primarily by the speed of the printer!

After the letter is done, I assign it a new unique file name and save it on a diskette. KKKKReport. This then is my "carbon copy" just in case KKKK decides not to anwer my first report. After a few months have gone by I check my list of recent reports, this is my substitute for a logbook. I do track all the stations I've reported.

I usually ask the report to print all those after a given date where "Verified" is blank. That gives me my working list for

sending out my follow ups. From there I get the report from the file disk and do a very simple edit for my first follow up. Under #6 there is a paragraph that begins "If my report...", this paragraph is deleted and the one below is inserted using a replace command to change KKKK to the proper call

This is the second report of this reception to KKKK, evidently my first report never arrived or was mislaid. I would appreciate receiving a verification from KKKK radio to add to my collection of over 1200 cards and letters from stations on the Standard Broadcast Band. Thank you in advance for your time and consideration in answering this letter.

Then I simply print the letter and envelope! I make a note in my Report log and wait. If KKKK is really a tough nut, I'll end up with my "method of last resort" a second follow up and a prepared card. One again, I get my letter off the disk and delete the last paragraph then I use this paragraph.

This is the second follow up report of this reception to KKKK, evidently my first two reports never arrived or were mislaid. Please find enclosed a prepared verification card. Although I would prefer a written letter from KKKK, I realize that sometimes this is very difficult for the station staff, I would appreciate it if you could sign the card and drop it in the mail to me, in lieu of a more personal reply.

Thank you for your time and consideration in helping me with my hobby.

From there it's print the letter and send it away with my prepared card and hope that this is what I get back.

This gets printed on a standard USPS postcard for inclusion with my report. It definitely is better than most of the other prepared cards that are designed for SW DX'ers.

There are other things that a computer can do for you. Printing your own return address labels or, you can use it when writing to your fellow DX'ers and keep track of who owes who a letter. You can even save your letters so that "on going" dialogs don't get messed up because you forgot "exactly" what you said as oppposed to "exactly" what you meant to say! You can use it to write articles for DX NEWS or (heaven forbid!) send a Musing to H.T.!

There are a few drawbacks, one, if you're a veteran DX'er with many records to enter, the conversion can take awhile. I remember back in 1985 entering over 1000 verification records into my database. It took a week of evenings to do. Two, it will cost you a few dollars. Today however, there are used machines available as well as some systems that can be bought for an initial investment of under \$1000.

Some of the other things that I've done that make my computer investment worthwhile in terms of DX'ing include a Multiplan (a different Spreadsheet program for Apple) sheet that will

heading sheet that will give the bearing from True North that a DX'er should direct his loop for optimum reception of a given station.

My Veri Signer column is totally computerized. The sort features of the program allow me to type in contributions when

My Veri Signer column is totally computerized. The sort features of the program allow me to type in contributions when they arrive. When I have enough contributions for a column I simply instruct my program to sort it. First the calls are sorted alphabetically, then the frequencies are sorted numerically. To edit the column I simply scan the calls to find the duplicates! On a manual typewiter, I had to do all the sorting by frequency and type them in order! I currently maintain a data base of over 2800 verie signers and can also look up when the stations last known signer was submitted. Since Paul has become the publisher and obtained use of a very good printer, the look and readability of the Verie Signers column has improved even over the fine results that Mike Knitter had.

A DX'er who wishes to organize his listening times and create "target lists" can have an absolute field day. Since most data bases will sort by chronological, alphbetical and numerical catagories, there is no limit to the organization that can be brought to a DX'ers targetting project.

As Secretary for our local listeners group, I keep track of our 100+ name mailing list and see to it that our annual calendar is typed and published. It takes all of a few hours a year.

Other advantages? There are tons of them. My checkbook has balanced to the penny since 1985! I store complete records of home improvements against the day the IRS may need to know about them. It becomes a snap to keep any record that you used to keep by hand. My filing cabinets are now mostly reading material that I might wish to refer to later. My basement is where the "hard copies" of all my receipts and records go, stored in boxes and cataloged using a computer data base. I also keep track of my political activities using my computer and my varied outside business interests.

All of the above is done with commercially available software. I don't know anything about programming or programming languages. In the early 1980's I found I had less "time" to devote to DX'ing and collecting verifications, but with the help of my computer I now have more "time" to do more things, including "time" at the dials and "time" for collecting verifications.

Radio Roundup ... by Pete Kemp

Commercial AM/FM/TV Station Identification Regulations

Broadcast station identification announcements shall be made:

At the beginning and ending of each time of operations, and
 Hourly, as close to the hour as feasible, at a ntural break in program offerings.

Television broadcast stations may make these announcements visually or aurally.

- (b) CONTENT
- (1) Official station identification shall consist of the station's call letters immediately followed by the community or communities specified in its license as the station's location:

PROVIDED, that the name of the licensee or the station's frequency or channel number, or both, as stated on the station's license may be inserted between the call letters and sation location. No other insertion is permissible.

(2) A station may include in its official station identification the name of any additional community or communities, but the community to which the station is licensed must be named first.

Frequency Deviations ... by Raymond F. Cole

In reply to Paul Sawyer's technical questions concerning apparent frequency deviations, I first must say that he is far from the first to ask some of theee questions - altho he does get into them a little deeper than most. These are a complex puzzle.

I am not a hi-tech person, but two radio engineers spent several hours here and have since been of some assistance to me. Also the Missouri Stata Coordinator of Communicatios spent five and a half hours here going over every detail. One of the engineers is responsible for the operation of two AM and two FM stations in the area. His parting comment wes that this "sure rattled our brains". Yes, a whole lot of unanswered questions.

With my receivers, a Radio Shack TRF 12-656, and a GE 7-2660B, both with completely new sials, plus a magnifying glass and a tuning meter on the TRF, I never have found, as in the case mentioned, any signal except the 1228 deviation of the 1220 station signal. And I have searched for them.

However, when my setup was in operation to automatically mechanically "fan" across a predetermined frequency at set intervals, the Rustrack recorder's chart showed something that no one has yet been able to explain, which may be some sort of important clue - and since the "fan" covered about 15 Khz. it indicates a lack of any other signals also.

"A" equals the recorder timing from the start of a cycle, "X", to where the peak signal \underline{should} be when no deviation is occurring.

NO DEVIATION A PRESENT DEVIATION ON TRE

Note the "fuzziness" at arrow. Only extremely occasionally would this appear, and only to a minor degree, at the center of the peak when no deviation was present on the TRF. For this setup a GE 7-2660C is used, and still here as a setup in my shack, but not presently in use. The charts are in my records.

I am sending Mr. Sawyer 17 photocopies of scientific reports on similar or related discoveries which have been sent to me by others in the past 8 months or so. These are findings which I was totally unaware of in Dec., '86, when I discovered this phenomena here - in fact, some of the reports are dated afetr Dec..'86.

A Russian scientist with the Moscow Academy of Science contacted me from Boulder and again later from NASA in Maryland. He is researching along this line at extremely low frequencies. Because it is not at BC Band frequencies, I am not including a copy of his scientific report.

So, in reply to Mr. Sawyer I must say that I cannot answer his technical questions, and I don't know anyone who really can - - yet. But quite a few are gathering clues. A retired chemistry professor in Wisconsin with an R-2000 found and reported similar apparent deviations there, but to a very much lesser degree.

Just recently I have gotten a homebrew receiver in satisfactory operation to monitor, in particular, 2 Khz., thanks to Ken Cornell, editor of "The Low and Medium Frequency Radio Scrapbook". And I suspect I may already be on the track of another small clue, but it is too early to tell for sure.

For the past month or so, apparent deviations have been extremely small, almost non-existent - -and there have been virtually no local seismic disturbances, either. However I have found as a matter of experience, and records, that this could change drastically in a matter of hours.

P.S. A question of my own - could apparent deviations be caused by an electro-magnetic effect on coils? But not on the ferrites because this discovery was originally made with a Tuggle circuit - a fantastic crystal set with three air core coils.

Radio Study Claims AM Getting Bum Rag

Chicago — Recent report by McGavren Guild Radio suggests that AM has received a bum rap regarding its ability to deliver listeners.

Study, issued by McGavren Guild's marketing research division, states that despite widespread misconceptions about the band's advertising efficacy, many AM radio stations are major factors in some of the country's largest markets.

In terms of listeners 18-plus, 60% of the No. 1 stations in top 10 markets are AMES, per report, including four of the top five territories: New York, Los Angeles, Chicago and San Francisco. Likewise, when counting audience over the age of 18, 40% of the most-listened-to-radio stations in the top 10 markets occupy positions on the AM dial.

Spring Survey Results

All results are based on broadweek AQH figures from Arbitron's spring survey.

Report further illustrates AM's clout by comparing hypothetical 4-week ad buys in selected markets to determine which statement and the

The AM/FM combination showed

"It is a critical mistake to underestimate the value of an AM radio station," the report concludes. "Any buy that does not consider an Assation is leaving itself open for potentially serious reach gaps."

Soviets quit jamming U.S. radio broadcasts

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Kremlin has shut down thousands of broadcast jamming devices, allowing Radio Liberty and Radio Free Europe to be heard "loud and clear" across the Soviet Union and most of Eastern Europe for the first time in 38 years, government officials said Wednesday.

The Soviet action came so quickly that radio engineers were only becoming aware of it as Secretary of State George Shultz said in a broadcast to Europe Wednesday morning that radio jamming was one area where progress was still needed with the Soviets.

Soviet jamming of Germany's Deutsche Wella and KOL Israel also stopped Tuesday, officials said.

"It's another marker in the Soviet march (oward trying to be an acceptable citizen of the world community as against the pariah that they have been," said Charles Z. Wick, U.S. Information Agency director.


Wick said he and other U.S. officials have raised the issue of jamming, which is illegal under international agreements, several times with the Soviets — most recently in a September visit by U.S. broadcasting officials to Mascow.

He said the move was likely timed to coincide with the meeting of Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev with President Reagan and President-elect George Bush next week in New York.

The jamming shutoff means that millions of Eastern European and Soviet citizens will hear American and other Western news and analysis in their own languages of events in the Soviet bloc. Voice of America, which has not been jammed anywhere except in Afghanistan since May 1987, focuses more broadly on U.S. and world affairs.

However, jamming was still continuing against Radio Free Europe broadcasts to Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria, said Gene Pell, president of Radio Liberty.
