Notes on calls: WGST-920 calls have moved to 640 kHz as noted previously. WFEN 1160 had previously asked for WACY but time period the FCC allows for changing calls ran out, thus this reapplication for the change to WACY. WEYZ-1450 bought the WRIE-1330 facilities and moved their call/format there, selling 1450 kHz to Pennsylvania State University who take over with the calls WPSE. WLEE went silent on 1480 kHz and has reappeared on the former silent 1320 facility of WANI, with new owners taking over the 1480 kHz facility as WJRW, not on the air yet. The famous WBBL which shared 1480 with WLEE for two hours each Sunday has moved to 1320 but is now being run as a church "remote" sans the WBBL calls. RUMOR has it that they will return as a separate "WBBL" operation when the 1480 facility is reactivated, sharing the XR/antenna as they did with WLEE on 1480 kHz. KDXF-1260, KFNI-1430 and WWKY-1450 all reflect call changes that were set aside, these calls were never used by these stations.

# DX Acapulco, A Time Warp ... by Paul Wetterhahn

(typed by Renae Evertson)

Hello, from Chicago, with the normal, what-happened-to-the-Clear-Channel Mystery. This is a small report to let you know that DX from the city of Acapulco is nothing short than a time warp. bo, without getting too involved, let's run down the AM band with a daytime glance.

We used the Panasonic RF-B40, which compares to the Radio Shack TRF in many ways and gives you the digital accuracy that you need in strange places. Acapulco is located at the bottom of Mexico and is equally distanced somewhat to both coast and the Midwest. The daytime DX is poor due to high RF from the locals on 550-500w 600-5000; 630-5000; 710-500; 750-5000; 810-silent; 1030-1500;1340-1000; 1400-750. The Mexican economy is poor to say the least, and many other stations which were on in the past are now gone (1430; 1450; 1460; 1520; 1600).

My old logs provided this info, and I just realized that they had adjacent channels on 1450 & 1460; I never heard them on at the same time, so I guess that this is the only share-time operation on adjacent channels! It does not matter as this year produced many "off-airs", and I wonder if the "FM" casuality factor is a part of this. The big ones on 540 and 900 are both heard on a regular basis, 900 being just barely audible in the day, 540 only at night, and solid. All of the locals are off at night, and this provides a sonic paradise. 630 stays on till 2 AM on some nights and goes off at 12 midnight on others. 1340 is the only local to stay on all night, and it goes off when ever it feels like it, so on any given nights you have no locals!

Here is a short rundown of what you can hear at night from midnight to 5 AM without going to great lengths. \*(\* = local, solid DX every night; 1-5 rating on signal strength usually follows call signs; no rating means that you really have to sit on it and listen.) 540-MEX; 550-540 Splash; 560 Beaumont, TX-1, and others including country, possibly WQAM; 570-mix; 580, 590- Spanish; 600-KII.T Houston; 610, 620, 630 unID Spanish; \* 640- solid KFI; 650- WSM-3; 660- a mess, but WFAN in there; 670- Spanish, but one night a solid WMAQ; 680, 690 unID; 700- solid WLW; 710, 720, 730 Spanish, no trace of WGN, but last year it was in perfect, new stations? \*740- solid, almost local KTRH, Houston, every night. 750- WSB- 2; 760, 770, a mess. 780-WBBM mix with Spanish, heard last year like a local. 790- splash from 800. 800- The Monster. 810- splash and WGY- Rare. 820-WBAP and not that good. 830-Spanish. 840- WHAS, would be solid if it was not covered by a dead carrier, every night except one night where WHAS won hands down. 850-KOA-1. 860- Spanish, 870- WWL-3, 880- WCBS fighting it out with Spanish, won some nights. 890-\* what a performance for WLS; in every night, better than anyone else. There were nights that it was like a local and actually splashed over 250,000 watt XEW! \* 900 - XEW the mountains mess up 250 kW real well, and with their low modulation & syncro stations it makes you scratch your head?! We will highlight from here: all channels have Spanish except for: 940-KIXZ, 950 KPRC,1020, KDKA; 1040- a good WHO;1070 a nice KNX with its beeping news headlines; 1080- KRLD- solid; 1120 KMOX- good; 1130-KWKH, in & out; 1160-KSL- good; 1200-WOAI- of course! All other channels are for those special nights when everything is cooking. No 1500, 1510, 1520 or 1530 that I could tell. The graveyards were all working properly. A nice station which did surprise me is 500-watt radio capitol from Mexico City on 1260, all top 40 with "Este es Radio Capitol" in between most songs. The regionals seemed to be very quite easy to DX for someone who is well versed in Spanish.

To sum things up, the warm weather (February 1-14 this trip ) - 90 degrees in the day to 78 degrees at night - made it a little difficult as the tropics kicked up a few with static, but not bad. We've visited Acapulco nine years in a row and have never seen a varience in the weather so that it caused poor DX'ing. In Chicago it seems to have been quiet with no skip on some nights in December and January, and we returned to normal with the cold weather.

Those of you with the Superadio or TRF will enjoy the same findings as did I with the Panasonic RF-B40. If you bring anything else, like a cassette radio combo or B.F.R. ( Big Funky Radio ) you will still have some super findings. WLS by far was outstanding and useful in planning our return to the cold as we listened for the weather in Chicago. If you are a loungelizard and love warm weather and need some special music, bring along the B.F.R. and the TRF plus a few cassettes and you got it made in the shade!

I've rejoined the NRC after six year's absence and DX inactivity. [Welcome Back to the fold -mike] Occasionally I would crank up the dials for fun, and of course I continue to spend half my life listening to baseball games as I can, using my DX'ers' ear to make out the Mets' action wherever I can find it. The switch last season from WHN to WFAN and then to 660 from 1050 (no more CHUM) sure improves a the lot of an expatriate maximumstrength Met fan. I can even get some of the day games, though WFAN is nowhere near as strong in Maryland as WOR, WABC or WCBS. My nightmare is that the FCC will license some superfluous all-night religious or ethnic station on 660 in the D.C. area or let someone as it fits between WMAL and WCBM. It's a revelation to me how many stations around the country have relocated in the last decade from higher frequencies to places like 640 and 890 with full-time clearance. I've already noticed by studying the latest NRC log and DXing evenings and pre-dawn hours that DX has changed markedly since the 1970's. Pests and full-time semi-locals are more numerous, truly clear channels no longer exist, and the gradual disappearance of music from AM makes it much harder to pick out ID's in a mess. If you have three stations on a graveyard and all are talkers, that's a pain compared to separating Reba McIntyre from Lawrence Welk from a basketball game. Still, I'm going to spend more time than ever on the GRAVEYARD channels; I never had the patience to work them very hard. Already I've added some catches from Pennsylvania, trans-Beltway Virginia and North Carolina on 1240, 1340, and 1490. I don't get much interference from WITH-1230, WYCB-1340 or WOL-1450; of the nearby Graveyard channels, only WWIN-1400 is really loud out here in the 'burbs. WCEM-1240 is a pest. I can keep WTOP out of the way of 1490; WBCB commonly makes it in. I need Hagerstown but that's been elusive. I lack just four stations in Maryland, one of my goals the next few months. I'm also going to learn about antennas and for the first time arm my General Electric World Monitor with a loop or a wire or something. That's the only way I'll ever hear any Western states or gets Trans-Atlantics beyond the simple ones. ### James J. Nahirniak - 20907 Behrendt - Warren, MI 48091

I recently drove to Toledo from Detroit (work-related meeting). Naturally the car's stock Chrysler AM stereo/FM stereo radio was put to good use. WOHO-1470 is now country. WTOD-1560 simulcasts their morning show only with WKKO 99.9 FM, and ID's as "K-100/WTOD" (both are country). There is a T.I.S. station on 1610 in downtown Toledo running a continuous loop of entertainment attractions (no ID caught). WSPD 1370 is the only C-QUAM stereo station I detected in Toledo. I was reminded of how many stations, especially on AM, don't seem to care about good audio. No wonder listeners are abandoning AM stations, especially music stations, for FM. The FCC is trying to drive listeners away from FM, too, by cluttering up the dial with more new stations. Between Detroit and Toledo the FM band is loaded with strong signals, but listening to most of them in a moving car is disrupted by interference from other stations. I switched to AM to find stations unaffected by chopping and picket-fencing. Even well after sunset, 500 watt WWCM-990 Ypsilanti was rock solid, with contemporary gospel music, great audio and AM stereo ... with a better overall sound than most stations on FM. The AM band needs a shakeout of bad facilities and bad operators. The present ratings woes could help accomplish this, but the FCC needs to ban all AM-FM simulcasting. Many stations will then be sold or go dark, allowing others to improve their facilities. With regard to the new expanded AM band of 1610-1700, the FCC should (at least initially) ban directional antennas. It's going to be hard enough to afford to operate on a band few listeners will have equipment to tune in to, without having to spend extra money on fancy directional antennas and extra land. There are no existing stations to protect, thus no need for directional antennas.

### Randy Seaver - 1154 Via Trieste - Chula Vista, CA 92011

1988 was a very poor DX year for me, partly because of the geomagnetic conditions (hearing only static at 3AM while hoping for the Far East or Down Under is not conductive to further DXing!) and in the evening due to the band congestion with new stations on former clear channels. I've also started a new hobby interest - genealogy - that has taken some free time. Unfortunately, I have spent no time doing propagation research or articles recently. I would be happy to answer any questions about nighttime skywave propagation of any of the members. One issue that may actually enhance long distance propagation is the new "anti-skywave" antenna systems; these systems direct more energy along the ground and a low angles to the ground at the expense of high incidence angle skywaves (that typically travel only 100-300 miles). The net result may be marginally increased field strength at distances over 1000 miles, since the skywaves we're receiving are "errant" ground waves. In April, 1988 I had a business trip to Toronto and was able to spend an evening with Gray Scrimgeour. Gray DX'ed from La Jolla in the mid-60's, and was a big influence in my DX life. He and his wife and two grown sons are well and happy, and it was great to relive some memories of the good old days of DXing. Gray and I put together the IRCC (IRC of California) editions of the mid-60's, the first IRCA "April Fool" editions. Gray, Larry Godwin, Art Peterson and I also tapesponded (reel-to-reel!) in 1965-66, playing our TP and LA DX for each other every two weeks. Our family took a Caribbean cruise in late August, visiting Cozumel, Cayman Islands and Jamaica about two weeks before hurricane Gilbert passed through. I tried to DX on my TRF at sea between Cozumel and Cayman, but it was difficult in a bad light on deck without a digital readout. My wife got me the little Sony for Christmas, and I've tried it out at home and in Le Havre, France. I did a bandscan between 5 and 7 AM in Le Havre, but it's difficult to tell the stations without a scorecard and with a radio that tunes in 10 KHz increments. Interesting, though, and very quiet in Le Havre at that time.

Greetings once again. DX around here has been on the downside lately, due in part to other activities and to unseasonably warm weather. Last week we hit the all-time winter high, 80 degrees! Of course, two days later, the high temperature was less than half that! That's what they say about Atlanta weather: if you don't like it, just wait a day or so,

it'll change! [Gee, they say that about Topeka, too ... how about 70 degrees on Feb. 25; 25 degrees and 6 inches of snow Feb. 28?? -pls] I have been making do with a longwire that is about 200' or so, and a few interesting things have been heard. The loop still is not fully functional; the amp works fine thanks to Chuck Hutton's efforts, but it still has a tendency to break into oscillation above, say, 1200 KHz. Looks like some more adjustments will be necessary. Also that same AM. surprised to hear KIOA-940 Des Moines, IA at 6:15am with rock oldies and "This Day in R&R"; this one has not been heard in quite a few years. 2/11, on 1590 KHz frequent mentions of "Shelby" turned out to be WCSL Cherryville, NC with "Carolina Country" promos. A new logging on 2/11 when WTZX-860 Sparta, TN heard at 6:31pm with C/W and "86 Country" slogan. A new "close -unheard" became "heard" on 2/17 when WKZD-1330 Murrayville, GA logged at 4:53pm with Country Western and "KZ Country" slogan. It was putting in a good signal, and this was my first official logging, although it was heard during my recent sojourn to North GA for a bandscan. 2/19 WQBB-1040 Powell, TN noted at 5:30pm with "Big Band 1040 -- WQBB -- Keeping you informed". [you did send these and the others to DDXD-East right? thanks. - mike] Only a couple of new veries have found their way to me since my last Muse: WPHC-1060 and WTOE-1470, both with verification letters.
