The program transmitted is mainly "ERF2", the second programme of ERF (also available on ASTRA satellite since November 1995) with christian pop music and hymns and not so much speeches like on ERF1 (which is on shortwave and sometimes on 1467 from TWR Monaco), at times they also transmit ERF1. ERF is very interested to know about the coverage of this new used transmitter. [Udo Deutscher e-mail via Mark Connelly]
- CLANDESTINE (HAITI) 1035, R Democratie, airborne EC-130 over Haiti, prepared FR and EG cards signed, also nice color Xerox PR photo supplied to me by Lt. Col. Jim Zambo, EC-130 Command Solo, PA Air Nat'l Guard in person at the MacDill Air Force Base "Airfest 96" (13-14 April). The EC-130 can transmit TV, FM and MW. Unlike last year, visitors were allowed to tour the plane, and it wasn't roped off. Zambo half-seriously chastised me ("I remember you from last year, you're the guy whose magazine [DXSF] published our address and flooded me with mail..."). He said that reports subsequently came in from as far away as Japan. They've not carried out a mission since Haiti, 1994. [Krueger-FL]

#### Changes in programming status; reported by listeners

Welcome to your Formats column. My report in the last column that WNEB-1230 was testing at low power in March was erroneous....as the station was not on the air when I drove through downtown Worcester, MA, on a mid April trip. I did note that WESX-1230, Salem, MA., makes it to about five miles east of Worcester. On the same trip..."AM-900", Brunswick, ME, I still have as yet to hear a legal ID. It runs a continuous tape, ID'ing as "AM-900, The Shopping Channel". "AM-900" runs all shopping at local businesses at 30% off, "and, of course, we take Visa, Mastercard, cash, and checks". And, locally, WALK-1370, Patchogue, has dropped its simulcast with its powerful FM to air adult standards. It slogans "Sunrise 1370", and competes with WLUX-540, several LIRR stops away, in Islip, WHLI-1100, and WQEW. Also on Long Island, on 5-6-96, WGSM-740, which has been formatting satellite-fed country music, now simulcasts news country outlet WMJC-94.3, Smithtown with automated country music. This accounts for why the two person WGSM on air staff has not been heard from in the past couple of weeks. The WGSM ID is heard only on the hour.

### The AOR-7030 Receiver: A Review

#### by the staff of Radio Netherlands

This review was compiled with the assistance of the World Radio TV Handbook, Amsterdam. Radio Netherlands has no financial connection with the WRTH, nor with AOR, the manufacturer of the AOR-7030. It was broadcast on Thursday 7th March 1996. (This transcription was reproduced from the Worldwide DX Club's March 1996 issue of Medium Wave Circle -pls)

We've followed the development of the new AOR-7030 receiver from the start. First announced in 1995, around 20 early production models have appeared at selected dealers and on loan to reviewers. The receiver company is Japanese, but this particular model is designed and built in the UK. Design engineer John Thorpe, who designed most of the HF series of receivers for the Lowe company, went freelance and signed a deal with AOR to design the 7030. We've been testing one for the past 6 weeks under various conditions, and to double check the findings we also did the same series of measurements on a second off-the-shelf sample taken from the first production run.

#### First impressions

It's clear that people in Europe and particularly the UK will look at this receiver in a different light than, for example, in North America. That's because the radio in Europe is priced alongside communications receivers like the Lowe HF-250 and it is considerably cheaper than the Kenwood R-5000. The 7030 is the cheapest in the UK, where it retails for 799 pounds sterling including VAT. In other parts of the world the radio has other more semi-professional competitors and the value is different, but more on that later.

#### Compact and Clever

The AOR 7030 is a small, compact communications receiver that covers from 0 to 32 MHz continuously. It has a cabinet design which is similar in some respects to other British receivers. Corners are rounded, there is a minimum of control knobs, and the metal cabinet is beautifully built and engineered. The quality of the workmanship inside the cabinet is fine. The radio measures 240 by 90 by 25S millimetres and without the external power supply weighs just over 2.2 kilos. Most listeners will use it at home, although we found it small enough to use on a DXpedition up in northern Finland.

The front panel is deceptively simple, sporting just 9 push buttons, two rotary controls, plus a large tuning knob with a

dimple in the face for serious band-scanning. You set the radio on the table, connect the power supply and some form of external antenna and switch on. The back-lit dot matrix display springs to life as the radio goes through a start-up sequence before presenting the last tuned frequency. The display is easy to read from most angles, even if you tilt the set towards you by unfolding the foot at the front.

#### Lots of options

After some 80 hours of tuning this set, we've made the following conclusions. You get quite a lot of options for your money, and because the radio is software driven, a lot of things can be adjusted. There are four built-in filters, for instance. A high quality ceramic filter is used for single-side band and is rated at 2.2 kHz at -6 dB. There are three other lowcost ceramic filters designed for listening to shortwave broadcast stations with bandwidths of 5.5, 6.5 and 10 kHz. The radio has an ingenious system for measuring the filters response and displaying the results. There are also two slots to add extra filters. This receiver also offers passband tuning which is extremely useful if you're trying to dig a weak station out of nearby interference.

Most antennas present the entire short and medium wave band at the input terminals of the receiver...in other words, thousands of signals, some of them very strong. The job of the receiver is to pick out the desired channel and reject the rest. Compromises have to be made. If the radio is too sensitive, then stronger signals overload the delicate input circuitry in the radio and drown out the weaker stations. In low signal-strength areas of the world, like the northern part of Canada or the middle of Australia, you need all the sensitivity you can get. AOR has decided to use a wideband input design without RF bandpass filters. But there is a relay driven RF attenuator at the front end of the set, allowing attenuation up to 40 dB or the addition of a 10 dB preamplifier in six steps. If you select the steps carefully, you can set the radio's sensitivity for maximum performance, and you do this more accurately on the 7030 than with most other sets in this price category. The use of relays instead of diodes reduces intermodulation problems. You can adjust other settings too, like the recovery time of the automatic gain control or switch the AGC off all together. All of this is useful for serious listening.

You can use this radio for different modes of listening. AM is of course standard for broadcasting stations, upper and lower sideband for amateur radio operators, and commercial traffic like ship-to-shore communications. You can select the CW mode for Morse code, and there's what's termed a data mode which sets the radio for the midfrequency needed by most radio teletype decoders. Narrow Band FM is also available, although not such a popular mode below 30 MHz. But that might be of use when VHF converters become available for this receiver.

We've done some intensive lab measurements on the radios so-called "Direct Digital Synthesiser". It is a different design to most mid-priced communications receivers. The synthesiser is smooth since it moves in very fine 2.7 Hz steps so you can't hear it "chuff" as you move up and down the dial.

In addition, this is an extremely low sideband noise design. Our measurements confirm AOR's specifications on this. Spurious signals generated by this type of synthesiser have been adequately damped and as a result the dynamic selectivity of the receiver is not influenced. We found the AOR-7030 better than many older and more expensive receivers on this particular point.

So far so good. This British design uses the minimum of external controls, relying instead on software control. The down-side of this is that each control has several functions, and you need to get some practice before you can use it easily. There's quite a complicated tree of menus, and after a while you either love it or get annoyed with it. In our case, we would have preferred a larger radio with more pushbutton controls. But it is true that you can connect a computer to this radio, and in that case you can make it even easier to use. The radio comes with an infra-red remote control, which does ease tuning somewhat. You get 100 memories with this receiver. That is fine for most applications, although on a medium wave DXpedition we could have done with some more to store all the possible medium wave frequency combinations for European and North American channel spacings.

The overall design of the synchronous detection mode is a weak point. On an ordinary radio, when the ratio between the strength of the carrier and the two sidebands gets out of step because of ionospheric fading, you get annoying distortion. Synchronous detection inserts an artificial carrier of constant strength, and the effect should be a better overall sound. Frankly, we found that because the radio is so stable, listening in upper or lower sideband mode is just as good in most circumstances. The synchronous detection does lock on with the weakest of signals, and the AOR 7030 also has an automatic tuning feature which exactly

matches the carrier frequency.

But our measurements show that on both our test receivers the audio distortion rose instead of dropped, as you would expect. The AM audio distortion on this set was around 3% on the mid-range bandwidth settings, rising to 10% when you switch to sync AM. We expected it to be the other way round. Unlike on some portables, you can't switch between upper and lower sideband in the sync mode.

The manual supplied with the radio is in the development phase. It is rather confusing at the moment, and we're told a new version is being worked on. British magazine articles have used the manufacturers specifications to praise the set to the skies. If you believe those stories, then the AOR 7030 outperforms sets costing almost three times the price. However, if you're going to compare receiver specifications you must compare like with like. For instance, the sensitivity quoted by AOR is 0.5 microVolts in AM, but the manual doesn't say that this is with the preamplifier switched on. With it off the figure comes at 1.5 microVolts for 10 dB signal to noise ratio, which is fine because atmospheric noise levels picked up by the antenna are higher than that.

#### Third Order Intercept Points

The intercept points of several receivers is also a point for comparison. The manufacturer's brochure claims the figure is better than 30 dBm, which looks way ahead of the Lowe HF 250 which scores at +5 DBM. But AOR doesn't say that you can only achieve this figure by switching in all the attenuation possible to a point where the receiver is deaf to all but the strongest of signals. Our measurements show that when there is no attenuation switched in, without the preamp, the third order interception is 0 dBm or +2dBm on the two examples we tested. Not a bad figure, but there's not much in it between the AOR 7030 and the Lowe HF-250. Likewise the dynamic selectivity of the cheaper AM filters is nothing like the higher priced ceramic filter used for SSB reception. The calibration of the 70 segment signal strength meter turns out to be quite accurate for most purposes.

#### Conclusions

In short, the new AOR-7030 is a good value receiver in Europe. It produces well-above average performance in its price category, but we don't agree with the current hype on the Internet that says the specifications or the tuning convenience makes this radio much better than semi-professional sets from Japan Radio Company or Watkins Johnson costing several times the price. If you can spend a little more on the

receiver, a set of mechanical filters for 5 or 7 kHz will give better selectivity for serious broadcast listening. We haven't tested the computer control software, but that may well improve the tuning convenience.

In North America the AOR-7030 is priced at just under 1400 dollars, so more expensive than the Japan Radio Company's NRD-535. If you live in that continent and have that sort of money to spend on a communications

receiver, then look at all the receivers in that range side by side before you make a choice. The price in Japan is 129,800 Yen.

# An Introduction to Longwave DX'ing by Shawn Axelrod

#### INTRODUCTION

Over the last three years I have been listening to the other AM Broadcast band when the conditions are right. The "other" AM band, you ask? Where is that located? Well, just take a look down, way down, and it is there hiding amongst the beacons and GWEN stations and other non-voice transmissions between 153 and 279 kHz. In this longwave area of the radio spectrum you will find AM broadcast stations from Asia, Africa, and Europe. Just as an aside, this was the area of the radio spectrum that Marconi used for his first transmissions across the Atlantic. Maybe he knew what he was doing. This band is still well-used outside of the Americas and can make for interesting DX. I listened to it quite often on my trip to Europe in the fall of 1995. The first thing you notice is how clear and clean the signals are. There are two good reasons for this.

#### **POWER**

The first is power. These are not local stations by any stretch of the imagination. Yes, there is a smaller 10,000-watter on 189 kHz from Italy, but all of these longwave stations are running over 100,000 watts except for about 8 stations world wide. One to two million watts of power is used by at least thirty stations. Yes, million watts! This kind of super-power station run with strict government regulations on transmission quality makes it is easy to see why the signals are clean. It also means that you have a good chance to hear these stations, even if you are like myself in the heart of the continent.

#### CLEAR FREOUENCIES

The second reason is that many frequencies are occupied by only 3 to 5 stations. Forget the crowded regional frequencies or supposed clears of North

America. The longwave frequencies are clears in the sense it was intended to mean. There is the odd frequency with 10 stations on it, but most are sparsely inhabited. Now these figures are for stations world-wide, not for just one country or continent. Look at these longwave stations as a re-birth of the good old days when super stations such as WLW was the only station you would hear at night on their frequency.

The next thing you notice is that they are spaced in a 9-kHz pattern. This pattern will be familiar to DX'ers who have heard stations from Asia, Africa, Europe and the Pacific before. The frequencies used in the longwave spectrum are as follows:

153	162	171	177
180	183	189	198
207	216	225	234
243	252	261	270
279	202	201	270

You will notice two odd frequencies: 177 and 183 kHz, which are splits on this band used by Germany, while the other 15 frequencies follow the 9 kHz pattern.

#### WRTH

These stations do make it to North America on a regular basis, especially for the DX'ers on the East or West coasts of the continent. However, living in the middle of the continent as I do, I thought at first that these stations except for the giant million-plus watt stations were a no-go for us land-locked DX'ers. That was a wrong assumption. After becoming more attuned to the stations available by looking at the back of the WRTH (World Radio and TV Handbook) while in Europe I thought I would get serious once I returned home to Canada. The WRTH, which many of us use for regular AM band and shortwave DX, is a wealth of information on these stations. The WRTH has an up-to-date listing of these stations located at the back where stations are

listed in frequency order. These lists are broken down by region of the world so you will have to look at the Europe/Africa section as well as the Asia/Far East section to note all stations. Once you have located a station, more information about it will be found under the country it is located in. This will include sign on and sign off times, languages, programming and verification information.

#### **EASIER FIRST CATCHES**

This has been a banner year for longwave DX here in Manitoba. While concentrating more on these frequencies I've added many new stations to my stations heard from Europe, Africa and the Far East and Siberian regions of Russia.

The main stations that we seem to hear here in Manitoba have always been:

162 Radio France Inter. Allouis France

183 Europe 1 Felsberg Germany

198 Radio 4 UK Droitwich England

These are our regulars, so to speak, especially France on 162 kHz. This is the station we often use as a beacon to see if the band is open to Europe. They run 2,000,000 watts of power as does the Europe 1 station on 183. Radio 4 UK only runs 500,000 watts. If you cannot hear at least one of these stations, odds are the others are not there from Europe at sunset and in the evenings.

#### TIMES TO LISTEN

When to listen is also important. Everyone knows about sunrise and sunset enhancement of signals so I will not go into an explanation here. This enhancement seems to be even greater on longwave DX. For my location in the middle of Canada the best times in the winter to DX longwave seem to be around:

2200-0100 UTC Our sunset 0300-0600 UTC European sunrise 1200-1400 UTC Our sunrise

The first two times will bring in the stations from Europe and northern Africa, while the last time slot brings in the stations from Siberia and Asia. From loggings in several issues of DX publications it is clear that you can hear longwave DX from either coast and from the center of North America. This may well be a great way to log TP's and TA's from your location.

#### **TUNING TIPS**

We have found that the best bet to finding these stations is to use either USB or LSB instead of AM to locate them. Most receivers are more sensitive on single sideband than they are on AM. Also, most receivers have narrower filters for SSB than on AM. It never hurts to get a boost when digging out stations that are quite some distance away. By looking for hets you will more easily find these stations amongst all of the other non-voice stations that surround them here in North America. Zero beat their frequencies to pick up the voice and log a new one. You will also find yourself switching between USB and LSB to dig some of these guys out of the beacons. This technique will help you get rid of the interference on one side or the other of the longwave broadcast station you are looking for. Take a look through some DX publications such as this one and see what people are hearing, and look for those stations you see logged most often.

#### **ANTENNAS**

As for antennas you can use a loop with more windings to go lower than you would with a BCB loop cut for 530-1710 kHz. The other option is a longwave ferrite loop like that available from Radio Plus. However the best is still the beverage antenna. These antennas, which are easy to put out, do take up space (as they are over 500 feet in length) work better than anything I have used. You are saying but who has a 500- or 1000-foot back yard? Not me, but a trip to the country side has always proven to be rewarding for DX. Lay some wire down a ditch on a country road and listen in the car if you want. Nothing fancy needed here, just a radio the WRTH and wire. Oh ves patience wouldn't hurt either.

#### CONCLUSION

I hope that this brief introduction to longwave DX'ing helps get your appetite for this much forgotten part of the radio spectrum going. For those of you who live on either coast, try it out a few times and see what comes in. Obviously what you will hear will depend on conditions and your location. For those of you who live in the middle of the continent, as I do, keep trying and you will be successful. There may be times when nothing comes in but when that time comes when the band opens up I know you will be more than pleased with all of those new stations.

For the most part, these lists were taken verbatim from the magazine. All FM's have been omitted.
