MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS

☐ A big welcome back to this column goes to Don Kaskey, who sent a great report from his San Francisco DX shack. It <u>has</u> been a while.

□ Bruce Winkelman reports he found a topic in a rec.radio.amateur newsgroup that's intriguing. In a discussion of phased arrays for the ham bands, a ham in Texas noted that any metal mast within about 600 feet of his 80 meter phased array significantly altered the expected directional patterns the array generated. He went on to note that a budding industry within the AM radio engineering community advises on the effect of cellular telephone towers on a BCB station's directional array. According to this ham, it seems that the cellular towers are wreaking havoc on directional patterns of BCB stations when erected within a mile or so of the antenna towers. Wonder if any of the engineer types in the NRC have any knowledge or experience with this reported phenomenon. This might also be a potential explanation for any unexpected reception of a highly directional station. Comment?

Robert says: The new Quantum Loop 2 is really great. 1 had originally purchased it to use with one of my back up receivers (currently not hooked up), but after trying it, it has become my primary antenna. It blows the Radio West loop totally out of the water with far better nulls & about 20db more gain. Compared to the KIWA Loop, the Quantum has slightly better nulls & about 7-10 db higher gain. Not bad for antenna costing \$150 less than the Kiwa.

For about the past six months or so I have had the pleasure of using a database viewer program written by NRCer Neil Adams. It's designed to view data in the FCCs AM database which is available in their WWW Mass Media area. Use of the viewer proved invaluable in the preparation of the new NRC Nighttime Antenna Pattern Manual, as well as currently keeping up-to-date on FCC actions. THE LATEST SOLAR WEATHER

Solar cycle 23: The first group (Sunspots - Jim) belonging to the new cycle was observed on August 12, 1995. Only a few other cycle 23 groups appeared in 1995 and there were no such groups in 1996 until May when two groups showed up. It is now believed that the solar flux minimum won't occur until late 1996 or early 1997 while the sunspot minimum was expected to occur during summer 1996 (note that cycle 22 and 23 groups are appearing at almost the same rate, however, cycle 22 regions are still in the majority). Due to the increasing number of sunspots over the last months, it seems likely that the sunspot minimum has already occurred, probably in April or May, although this won't be verified until the end of the year. 

The last time I Mused was early in the year (on some of my best veries] and since then I have joined with you to visit Al Merriman at Chincoteague, bought a new R8A, installed two 80-foot slopers, and put to good use the DL2 Al built for me. I am quite happy with the Drake R8A and have sent the HO-180 to the attic as a spare. Took only two trips this summer, both in July. Went to Gloucester, Ma. with English friends to go on a whale watch [saw 65 whales] Had the R8A along with the KIWA loop and DXed from our hotel at Bass Rocks, hearing lots of strong TA s, some like locals. Speaking of KDKA, I recall visiting their studios [as a teenager] first in the William Penn Hotel, and then in the Grant Building. Attended their gala opening there. Again, since I last Mused, I have verified country #122, VOA Sao Tome-1530, and have recently sent verie requests to what I hope will be numbers 123 and 124 for Slovakia-1098 and Croatia-1134. Had such beautiful signals from those two I couldn't resist reporting although they are, of course, regulars here. And the other night I enjoyed a good but short period of reception, just after 10:00 PM, of VOA Kuwait-1548, so I expect to write for potential country # 125. They surely must be running more than the 100KW listed in WRTH. I've heard lots of TAs since the first of Sept., and I won't list them. One of the highlights was on Sept. 5 around 1:00 AM when French stations were signing on topped by fine signals from Paris-864, Bordeaux-1206, Rennes-711, and Nancy-837. Around midnight here on what was between 0353 and 0405 Friday Sept. 27 1 had strong O.C's from several Italians at sign-on time, followed by the regular sign-on announcements and news from such as 1116, 1296, 1332, 1368, 1449 and 1575. But the most interesting signal was on 1386. Here I heard very clearly what sounded very much like Greek popular ballads sung by a man, and then a woman, accompanied by a guitar and other string instruments. On the hour was an announcement by a man, and I feel sure it was in Greek, and I believe he then read the news. So I think I had Athens. If you draw a great circle line from Athens to my location it runs right through Italy. [In fact, if you draw a great circle line from Kuwait it takes the same route, and we all know how strong VOA Kuwait has been recently, which I now see has upped to 600KW] I also note from my DX Edge map that sunrise in Athens occurs just about the time of my reception, and all these signals son were gone. So take a look.

About my attempts to get rid of my buzz. First, both antennas #1 and #2 are now grounded to an 8 foot copper rod outside and my DL2 has been so modified. The grounds can be removed if desired by just unplugging them. The switch that Al put on the back can be set to "noise reducing" or "common" whichever works better. This ground system actually does reduce any buzz.

Second, I have installed a third sloper so these three wires are shaped like a "Y" with the bottom part being the new wire. The first two run toward the power line at the back of

my property but stop short of it. The third wire runs from the same roof mast to the front of my property. There is also a power line running along the street in front, but the new line is considerably short of it and there I think is the reason for my success. Anyway, by connecting line three to the number two antenna post on the DL2 and not connecting any antenna to #1 there is no buzz when it is going full blast on my two Sony radios and 1 can still phase with it, and TA and LA reception is excellent. I also do very well with one of the first two wires on post #1 and wire 3 on post 2. So it would seem that the new wire has made the difference, even though it is shorter. As far as phasing with only an antenna in #2 I guess it is working with the ground system?

I'm going to send a letter to Athens and check out my logging on 1386. If that doesn't solve the problem, I will be in Athens in February on a tour. [Ben Dangerfield]
