

Due to space restrictions, the list will not be printed in DXN but will be available as a special reprint; sent electronically to all those who contribute to it; and possible will be made available elsewhere.

Richard D'Angelo, outgoing ANARC Executive Secretary, has informed us that its publication UPDATE, the group's publication is not "dead" although it has been absent in 1996. At riple edition will be published this month but will be the last issue. D'Angelo will "publish" the fourth quarter UPDATE "electronically" with a plain paper version going to all Club Representatives not on email. The few hobbyists that have been receiving UPDATE will then receive refunds for any remaining issues not sent.

If you are now receiving DX News with a stamp on it, it's because your address, as you provided it to us, is not on the official USPS database, possibly because we had to include additional information that you provided in the same line that the rest of your street address appears. Also, for some reason, several addresses with P. O. Boxes are not on the database with which we have to correct our subscription list (it's on a CD ROM disc, and a few keystrokes plus about 20 minutes of waiting does

the trick). We'll receive a new CD in a week or so, and if you are still receiving DXN with a stamp on it in November, you might just check with your local post office to see why we have to mail you DXN at 32¢ instead of 26.1¢ postage. I'd be highly interested if now, with the bar code, any DXN's are arriving late, damaged, or not at all. The new system is supposed to be cheaper and more consistent with arrival times, and I'd appreciate knowing if you're having problems. Also, as far as I know, all DXN's leave Topeka after being sorted in excellent shape, and if your DXN arrives in less than "excellent" condition, I would strongly suggest that you file a formal complaint with your local USPS office.

25 years ago ... from the October 23, 1971 DXN: The "NRC Monographs" service was announced; it was to provide longer articles too lengthy to fit in DXN and too limited in scope to be of interest to most members. The first was a 17-page article by Dave Fischer on the geometry and mathematics of great circle signal paths; the second, a G. P. Nelson article entitled "Analysis of the Electrostatically Perturbed Loop Antenna", a 40-page mathematical treatise.

10 years ago ... from the October 20, 1986 DXN: No reports were submitted to DDXD-West ... many formerly-daytime-only operations were adding night-time operations after the broadcasting accord signed between the U. S. and Mexico in late August.





DX'ing 'smart', with shared tips and requests by NRC members

The Compleat DXer Revisited

Welcome to the return of Target DX. After a short "silent period" (OK, more like a year), several columns are in the works, covering a wide variety of topics to enhance skills and enjoyment of the hobby. In trying to develop a misson statement for the column, I came across an interesting article by Mark Connelly that appeared in DX News V53 No. 26, June 9, 1986. Rather than "re-invent the wheel", I thought excerpts from the article said it best and were worth repeating to define the goals of Target DX

"The Compleat DXer (Page Taylor's spelling), much like a private investigator, must be multidimensional. A working knowledge of all the following can increase one's loggings totals: business aspects of broadcasting and related media, electrical engineering, ionospheric physics, geography, world history, climate / weather patterns, current affairs, sports, popular and traditional music, religion, effective use of English and at least one foreign language, and regional characteristics (in advertising, local holidays, food, speech patterns, etc.).

"The DXer, therefore, should be well-read, and not only in DX-specific literature. Even novels could conceivably offer insights, especially when they are of the international-intrigue type which deal with actions occurring in a number of different countries. Bible knowledge can enhance one's ability to send intelligent reception reports to religious broadcasters.

"Catalogs can be valuable for reference as well as for ordering parts. Of course, the catalogs of receiver vendors are considered first, but generalmerchandise catalogs can increase brand-name knowledge: this is the knowledge which sometimes makes the difference between determining the product in an interference-garbled commercial or missing forever this important piece of reception reporting material. Catalogs from merchants that don't sell DX receivers can still produce some useful "shack" enhancements. DXers have built homebrew loops and other antennae from plumbing-supply and boating-supply hardware and from automotive parts ordered from J.C. Whitney. Many times a mechanical or electrical part never designed to be used for a DX application will serve better than pieces available from electronics-supply houses such as Mouser and Dick Smith.

"The serious DXer does well to adopt a holistic approach to the hobby. A wide variety of life-experiences (rather than a single-minded obsession with DXing) benefits one's enjoyment of DX and builds the knowledge base so useful to effective pursuit of new stations. A good question to pose (at least subconsciously) when faced with new knowledge-sources is "Can this (book, product, tool, store, location, person, software program, etc.) expand my ability to DX effectively?" This question should be addressed even if, on the surface, no immediate DX-related relevance is perceived.

"The DXer must be organized. This point was well presented in Page Taylor's classic "Compleat DXer" article, written well before the home computer came along to take much of the drudgery out of data-organizing. During a DX session, materials of immediate value should be readily accessible: these include previous loggings lists. recent DX magazines, and NRC log/WRTH and the like. Otherwise, finding out if someone had previously reported the station you think you're hearing (or if that station has a parallel or if it's supposed to be on the air at that time) may take so long that you could blow the catch or waste time during which other DX catches could have been made. It's one thing to have a wide variety of DXrelated and quasi-DX-related reference material; it's another thing to be able to put your hands on the right information quickly enough to meet the challenges of "real-time" DXing." - A DX Intelligence-Gathering Effort, Mark Connelly. WAIION, 25 April 1986. Page Taylor's "The Compleat DXer" appeared in the 1975 edition of the NRC new member booklet "Getting Started In Medium Wave DXing".

Upcoming columns will cover the diversity of the hobby for the makings of the "Compleat DXer", from the cultural to the technical. A beginner's guide to setting up a home electronics lab, and a look at the DX targets and ambience of Bermuda are lined up for the next editions of Target DX. Future editions will cover antenna topics, electromagnetic compatibility issues, the world wide web, and more DX target areas including cultural, historical, and geographical insights. And of course, I'll look forward to receiving your ideas, suggestions, and contributions for future editions. 73

Time for the annual reintroduction. I am 34 years old, a lawyer by trade and have been an NRC member for nearly 2 decades now. I first started DXing in 1974 but really didn't become interested in AM DX until late 1976. I have been DXing since then, although I've heard very little that I would consider exciting in the past 10 years or so. The present location is rather noisy and certainly not favorable for hearing lots of exotic DX. Aside from a law school stint in 1985-88, all of my DXing has been from Toronto. At last count, the Toreonto totals were 1372 heard and 440 verified from about 30 countries.
