Paul Thomas reports that he has been tinkering with his equipment these days. "I've been doing a bit of DXing with my 'Nostalgia Radio'. It's a 1958 model GE clock radio with TRF. I took out the clock and installed an S-meter, and built an amplified ferrite loop for it. It's really amazing what it will do, I also builta 2-foot NRC amplified loop, and converted an MFI-956 preselector into an active antenna, uysing the preamp from 73 magazine and a 3-foot telescoping rod. It is really amazing. Signal strengths equal my loop and LW on BCB, and beat the LW by a couple of S-units



#### DX FILES: SOUTH CHINA SEA

By Jack Woods

In January my wife, Rose, and I were on a two-week cruise in SE Asia. The cruise ship, of British registry, left from Singapore and visited six countries which border the South China Sea and the Gulf of Thailand, ending the cruise in Hong Kong, where we stayed three days.

I took some time, usually during the "at sea" days, with my travel radio, on the ship's decks away from the superstructure. There was no noticeable ship-generated radio noise. During the daylight hours a scattering of stations could be heard. After dark the band is full. Most stations were in one of the several Asian languages with little chance of identification by me. English can be heard occasionally. Most if not all of the Asian countries teach English in their schools.

My travel radio is a Sangean ATS-180. I believe it was the first Sangean receiver sold in the U.S. It occupies little space, has the long wave broadcast band, has 9 kHz and 10 kHz spacing on medium wave and microprocessor tuning. Performance is adequate, and battery life is good.

stations were buzzy, distorted, wobbling in frequency, dropping the carrier, etc. On the more pleasant side, you should have heard the band after midnight when up in the Andes. Tweren't nothing but a Brazilian, a Chilean, a few Colombians and a Bolivian or two. You felt like you were as far away from the world as could be.

#### STATION NEWS

ALBANIA/MACEDONIA: UNID station still on air but moved to 851 kHz from 846 kHz; timecheck (ID?) and news at top of hour; best signal in Italy around 1700 UTC. [William Buchanan in MWN FEB 1997]

COLOMBIA: I wonder if this [Radio Net - see last issue] is affiliated with the Colmundo Net. Colmundo has just begun shortwave on 6065 kHz, which frequency is liscensed to the holder of 1040 kHz. If so, there may be a SW // for this net. [Moore-IA]

FRANCE: All medium wave stations carrying Radio France Inter (or Network A, as the WRTH calls it) are now silent as of JAN 1, due to budget cuts voted by the French Parliament. Listeners were told to tune to FM channels for France Inter. What's still unclear is whether the MW frequencies will come up again when major sporting events are on. These are normally carried on AM while the normal programme goes out on FM. If they are not reactivated on those days, people will have to tune to 162 kHz, which is poor in many areas. Antoern mystery is what will happen to the Lille transmitter on 1071 kHz, which at certain times carried Radio Urgence (the station for the homeless). The worst part of it all is the closure of the Marseille transmitter on 675 kHz (600 kW), as this was the only link many French nationals in North Africa kept with home. The Nancy transmitter on 837 (Radio Bleue, Network B) was also silent JAN 1, but it back with a greatly improved signal. My guess is that the engineers have converted the 1350 transmitter to 837 kHz. #### DANISH DXPEDITION

Blokhus DXP (Northern Jutlandia - DENMARK) A continuación, resumen de la DXP Danesa de Martin Elbe:

"Yesterday I came home from our DX-pedition to Blokhus, Northern Jutland in Denmark. We,

Karel Honzik, Czech Republic, from 27/12 to 13/1, using an AOR AR7030.

Finn Krone, Denmark, from 31/12 to 12/1, using a JRC NRD 535

Joachim Stiller, Germany, from 27/12 to 6/1, using an AOR AR7030

and me, 27/12 to 13/1, using an AOR AR7030 too.

Blokhus is a famous Danish seaside-resort, located about 40 km northwest of Aalborg. The cottage we used was situated directly in the first row behind the dunes. From the dunes it was about 150 m to the sea. Alas, it was not possible to bring the antennas into the water. There were too many curious tourists, cars on the beach etc. So we were confined to the area of the dunes. Our antennas were rather short, compared with other DX-peditions: Between 150 and 200 meters only. 4 antennas in the range 300 to 330 degrees, one at 270 and one at 240 degrees, all unterminated. I think, that in Finnland or Sweden you wouldn't call such short wires an antenna?:-)

But still the results were rather impressive. The area was very quiet, within 300 or 400 meters no other cottage was used, so we could really enjoy digging out even the thinnest signals. Conditions were good towards North America until Jan 9, afterwards lousy on MW, but good for Pacific on SW.

The weather was extremely cold, down to less than -15 degrees C, but blue sky, nice for a short walk during the daylight. However, that cold weather gave us a lot of trouble in opening/closing the main water-supply, as the valve was frozen. And of course we had to spend a fortune on energy to heat the cottage. Four persons was the maximum we could squeeze in, with the table covered with receivers, recorders and lists.

Our schedule was almost the same every day: Listening from around 1900 to 0000 UTC (when conditions were good also till 0200), then get some sleep till around 0600 UTC, and then the main listening period started, with the last signals fading out after 1400 UTC, when conditions were good. Otherwise fade-out was at 1200 UTC. Then we had some food, afterwards going through the tapes or listening to Asia, and then it was almost time to start again! The time-slot between 02-06 or 07 UTC was rather disappointing, by far the best time to catch rare birds was between 0800 and 1000 hrs UTC.

Here is the list of heard stations. Of course we will update it with listening times, dates, slogans etc. But this will take some time. First I have to write about 60 reception reports, and then the list will be made. So, this is only to show, what we heard":



## Postal dream? Try nightmare for some!

First, a review: Several months ago, I asked that NRC members keep track of delivery times and conditions of DX News, issues #8-15, simply to see whether or not the USPS has lived up to Postmaster General Marvin Runyan's promise that "... consumers will receive more accurate and timely delivery". I also stated (see V.64, #14, p. 2-3) that I believed that the USPS is the best delivery system in the world, and I'm not going to budge from that belief, even after reviewing what to me is a dismaying situation.

Thanks to over 70 of you who participated, I have now a more accurate picture of your delivery situation. In short, it is inconsistent; it is not always accurate, whatever that may mean, and it is timely perhaps only 60% of the time, leading me to state unequivocably that the USPS needs to take rapid steps to rectify a deteriorating situation.

The survey was not scientific nor "random-sample", let me emphasize. If you felt so moved, you sent in a report, and I had assumed that records would start with the requested #8. Yet, about a half-dozen provided delivery times reaching clear back into August, indicating some concern on your part already about deliveries. Fourteen reports of light damage (minor tearing, abrasive or black marks, but not including torn tape) were noted; ten reports of severe damage (a significant portion of DXN missing, or in one case, BLOOD on a badly bent copy), enough to require replacement were received; and five members reported at least one issue missing entirely during the reporting period. Even though the reporting period spanned the Christmas holiday, notable for creating postal problems, I consider this record dismal and completely unacceptable.

Most reporters were located east of Topeka (including one each from The Netherlands, England, and Sweden); only six reported from west of Topeka. The most consistent reports of continued damage to DXN's seemed to be from Billings, MT; the best delivery times and conditions were from Detroit. #7 apparently went by slow boat to Europe, as the three members reported an average delivery time of 55 days; on the other hand, #8, #9, and #10 made it to Sweden only one day after the masthead date, whereas in some places in the U. S. the same issues arrived up to three and as much as eight days after the masthead date. Our two reporters in Canada reported extremely slow arrival times: an average of about five days, and as many as nineteen after

the masthead date. On the other hand, our Florida, Washington (state), and Maine members reported an average of about two extra travel dates, with several deliveries in each state right on the masthead date.

I didn't really find an area of consistently late deliveries in the U.S., so I believe that the USPS transportation network is working as it should. The problem, I believe, lies in the policy of the USPS to break up carrier routes and to have them "absorbed" by other carriers, as one member, a mail carrier, testified. He has noted more mail stacking up in his post office and not delivered in a timely manner, and more carriers quitting to get away from the stress. He comments: "The Postal service has placed itself in a position of trying to do more work with less people." And he characterizes the current USPS as a temporary "warehouse" for mail. Another member says, "They don't care. Their attitude is - accept it; these are modern times." Finally, a third states: "I suggest to you that the USPS is really a conspiracy to test the patience and generosity of the American people." He reported an instance where a postmaster accused 40 homeowners in one area of being intellectually challenged (i. e., retarded) or conspirators in a plot to thwart the delivery of mail. A year or so later, the carrier who had served the area and had moved on was arrested for hoarding and destroying mail on his new route. Of course, no apology from the postmaster!

Strong words. And I believe that more and more of you feel the same way.

Is the USPS moving towards better service? I can't say, and I certainly can't determine improvement in mail delivery from this survey. But I don't feel that the USPS bureaucracy is going to improve service on its own; it's going to take perhaps hundreds and thousands of complaints before USPS management wakes up and starts a fix.

I would suggest, then, that if you are receiving sub-standard service, file formal complaints with your local USPS until you note an improvement. Keep accurate records of delivery times and conditions; there should be no place in the continental U. S. which would ever receive a DXN mailing later than Thursday, and on that date probably only if I should have to place DXN in the mail on Saturday (which I had to do with #18) or if a large natural disaster should stop all transportation services. And please continue to report substandard or damaged deliveries to me; I may be able to build enough of a case to file a complaint from this end.

Thanks to all for your help; now, let's get back to the dials and DX!
